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1. Word: **Aversion** (विरक्ति)

- **Pronunciation:** uh-vur-zhuh n/अवर्शन
- **Part of Speech:** Noun
- **Meaning:** a strong dislike or disinclination.
- **Synonyms:** antipathy, hatred
- **Antonyms:** desire, alacrity
- **Use in a Sentence:** Many people have a natural and emotional **aversion** to insects.

2. Word: **Exacerbate** (खराब करना)

- **Pronunciation:** ex-aca-bate/इगज़ैसर्बेट
- **Part of Speech:** Verb
- **Meaning:** to increase the severity or worsen/make (a problem, bad situation, or negative feeling) worse.
- **Synonyms:** aggravate, make worse, worsen, inflame
- **Antonyms:** calm, reduce
- **Use in a Sentence:** She doesn't want to **exacerbate** the situation.

3. Word: **Bellwether** (नेता)

- **Pronunciation:** bel-weth-er/बेल्वेदर
- **Part of Speech:** Noun
- **Meaning:**
 - a person or thing that assumes the leadership or forefront, as of a profession or industry
 - a person or thing that shows the existence or direction of a trend; index.
- **Synonyms:** influencer, leader, guide
- **Antonyms:** laggard, straggler
- **Use in a Sentence:** Paris remains the **bellwether** of the fashion industry.

4. Word: **Resilient** (प्रत्यास्थी)

- **Pronunciation:** ri-zil-yuh nt/रिज़िल्यन्ट
- **Part of Speech:** Adjective
- **Meaning:**
 - (of a person or animal) able to withstand or recover quickly from difficult conditions.
 - (of a substance or object) able to recoil or spring back into shape after bending, stretching, or being compressed.
- **Synonyms:** stiff, strong, stable
- **Antonyms:** fragile, brittle
- **Use in a Sentence:** More individual lives make the ecosystem more **resilient**.

5. Word: **Volatility** (अस्थिरता)

- **Pronunciation:** vol-uh-tl-ity/वालटिलिटी
- **Part of Speech:** Noun

- **Meaning:** liability to change rapidly and unpredictably, especially for the worse.
- **Synonyms:** impulsiveness, inconstancy
- **Antonyms:** permanence, stability
- **Use in a Sentence:** The **volatility** of the underlying agreement fell to an annual rate of 9 percent.

6. Word: **Speculation** (विचार)

- **Pronunciation:** spek-yuh-ley-shuh n/स्पेक्युलैशन
- **Part of Speech:** Noun
- **Meaning:**
 - a single instance or process of consideration.
 - a conclusion or opinion reached by such contemplation
- **Synonyms:** hypothesis, guess
- **Antonyms:** fact, truth
- **Use in a Sentence:** The company moved quickly to cancel **the speculation** that it is losing money.

7. Word: **Fluster** (घबड़ाना)

- **Pronunciation:** fluhs-ter/फ्लुस्टर
- **Part of Speech:** Noun, Verb
- **Meaning:**
 - make (someone) agitated or confused.
- **Synonyms:** turmoil, upset, panic
- **Antonyms:** comfort, calmness, relieve
- **Use in Sentence:** She was put in a **fluster** by the unexpected guests.

8. Word: **Novice** (नौसिखिया)

- **Pronunciation:** nov-is/नाविस
- **Part of Speech:** Noun
- **Meaning:**
 - a person new to and inexperienced in a job or situation.
 - a person who has entered a religious order and is under probation, before taking vows.
- **Synonyms:** amateur, beginner, neophyte
- **Antonyms:** professional, expert, veteran
- **Use in Sentence:** The computer program is easy for even a **novice** to master.

9. Word: **Amok** (आपे से बाहर)

- **Pronunciation:** uh-muhk/अमक
- **Part of Speech:** Adverb
- **Meaning:**
 - behave uncontrollably and disruptively.
- **Synonyms:** possessed, furious
- **Antonyms:** balanced, normal, stable



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- **Use in Sentence:** The tiger escaped from the zoo and ran **amok** for hours.
10. **Word: Credibility (विश्वसनीयता)**
- **Pronunciation:** kred-uh-bil-i-tee/ क्रेडिबिलिटी
 - **Part of Speech:** Noun
 - **Meaning:**
 - a. the quality of being trusted and believed in.
 - b. the quality of being convincing or believable.
 - **Synonyms:** reliability, trustworthiness
 - **Antonyms:** dishonesty, betrayal
 - **Use in Sentence:** The report gives an appearance of scientific **credibility**.
11. **Word: Repudiate (त्याग करना)**
- **Pronunciation:** ri-pyoo-dee-eyt/रीप्यूडीऐट
 - **Part of Speech:** Verb
 - **Meaning:**
 - a. refuse to accept; reject.
 - b. deny the truth or validity of.
 - **Synonyms:** refuse, denounce, reclaim
 - **Antonyms:** accept, allow, embrace
 - **Use in Sentence:** The man used his position to **repudiate** the charge.
12. **Word: Dissident (मतभेद करनेवाला)**
- **Pronunciation:** dis-i-duh nt/डिसिडन्ट
 - **Part of Speech:** Noun, Adjective
 - **Meaning:**
 - a. a person who opposes official policy, especially that of an authoritarian state. [Noun]
 - b. in opposition to official policy. [Adjective]
 - **Synonyms:** nonconformist, discordant
 - **Antonyms:** confirming, affirmative
 - **Use in Sentence:** It almost makes you want to become a political **dissident**.
13. **Word: Infuriate (क्रोधित करना)**
- **Pronunciation:** इन फ्युरीएट / इन्फ्युरीऐट
 - **Part of Speech:** Verb
 - **Meaning:** make (someone) extremely angry and impatient.
 - **Synonyms:** enraged, furious, annoyed
 - **Antonyms:** agreeable, contended, soothed
 - **Use in a Sentence:** After the quarrel, Her silence **infuriated** him even more.
14. **Word: Contemtuos (तिरस्कारपूर्ण)**
- **Pronunciation:** kuhn-temp-choo-uhs/कन्टेम्प्यूअस
 - **Part of Speech:** Adjective

- **Meaning:**
 - a. showing contempt; scornful.
 - **Synonyms:** disdainful, disrespectful, insolent
 - **Antonyms:** admiring, respectful
 - **Use in Sentence:** The person was openly **contemtuos** of his elder brother.
15. **Word: Aftermath (परिणाम)**
- **Pronunciation:** af-ter-math/ऐफ्टर्मैथ
 - **Part of Speech:** Noun
 - **Meaning:** the consequences or after-effects of a significant unpleasant event.
 - **Synonyms:** outcome, effect, eventuality
 - **Antonyms:** cause, reason, beginning
 - **Use in a Sentence:** In the **aftermath** of the typhoon, many people's homes were destroyed.
16. **Word: Colossal (विशाल)**
- **Pronunciation:** kuh-los-uh l/कलासल
 - **Part of Speech:** Adjective
 - **Meaning:**
 - a. extremely large or great.
 - **Synonyms:** huge, massive, enormous, gigantic
 - **Antonyms:** diminutive, tiny, small
 - **Use in Sentence:** They were asking a **colossal** amount of money for the house.
17. **Word: Artifice (धूर्तता)**
- **Pronunciation:** ahr-tuh-fis/आर्टफिस
 - **Part of Speech:** Noun
 - **Meaning:**
 - a. clever or cunning devices or expedients, especially as used to trick or deceive others.
 - **Synonyms:** manoeuvre, trickery, scheme
 - **Antonyms:** honesty, openness, sincerity
 - **Use in Sentence:** Efficiency and effectiveness and all those other pieces of intellectual **artifice**.
18. **Word: Impunity (दण्ड से मुक्ति)**
- **Pronunciation:** इम्प्यूनिटी
 - **Part of Speech:** Noun
 - **Meaning:** Exemption from punishment or freedom from the injurious consequences of an action.
 - **Synonyms:** Exemption, Rescue, Salvation
 - **Antonyms:** Custody, Committal, Bonding
 - **Use in a Sentence:** I am surprised by the fact the man who kidnapped his wife was allowed to walk away with **impunity**!



19. **Word: Confine (प्रतिबंधित करना)**

- **Pronunciation:** kuhn-fahyn/कन्फाइन
- **Part of Speech:** Verb, Noun
- **Meaning:**
 - keep or restrict someone or something within certain limits of (space, scope, or time). [Verb]
 - the borders or boundaries of a place, especially with regard to their restricting freedom of movement. [Noun]
- **Synonyms:** limit, enclose, detain
- **Antonyms:** free, release, liberate
- **Use in a Sentence:** He did not **confine** himself to the one language.

20. **Word: Abide (भुगतना)**

- **Pronunciation:** uh-bahyd/अबाइड
- **Part of Speech:** Verb
- **Meaning:**
 - accept or act in accordance with (a rule, decision, or recommendation).
 - be unable to tolerate.
- **Synonyms:** endure, obey, acknowledge
- **Antonyms:** reject, quit
- **Use in a Sentence:** You have got to **abide** by the rules.

21. **Word: Punitive (दण्डकर)**

- **Pronunciation:** pyoo-ni-tiv/प्यूनिटिव
- **Part of Speech:** Adjective
- **Meaning:** inflicting or intended as punishment.
- **Synonyms:** harsh, corrective
- **Antonyms:** rehabilitative, rewarding
- **Use in a Sentence:** The government is expected to take **punitive** steps against offenders.

22. **Word: Rampant (अनियंत्रित)**

- **Part of Speech:** Adjective
- **Meaning:** flourishing or spreading unchecked.
- **Pronunciation:** रैम्पन्ट

24. **Word: Merely (केवल)**

- **Pronunciation:** meer-lee/मीर्ली
- **Part of Speech:** Adverb
- **Meaning:** only as specified and nothing more; simply
- **Synonyms:** simply, solely, alone
- **Antonyms:** absolute, abundantly
- **Use in a Sentence:** There is no point in **merely** repeating what we've done earlier.

25. **Word: Hefty (ज़ोरदार)**

- **Part of Speech:** Adjective
- **Pronunciation:** hef-tee/हेफ्टी
- **Meaning:** done with vigour or force, large and heavy.
- **Synonyms:** massive, ponderous
- **Antonyms:** slight, diminutive
- **Use in a Sentence:** The film also contains a **hefty** dose of comedy.

26. **Word: Cite (प्रमाण देना)**

- **Pronunciation:** sahyt/ साइट
- **Part of Speech:** Verb
- **Meaning:**
 - refer to (a passage, book, or author) as evidence for or justification of an argument or statement, especially in a scholarly work.
 - praise (someone, typically a member of the armed forces) in an official report for a courageous act.
- **Synonyms:** quote, commend
- **Antonyms:** hide, enclose
- **Use in a Sentence:** Please **cite** my gratitude to him.

27. **Word: Barely (केवल)**

- **Pronunciation:** bair-lee/बैर्ली
- **Part of Speech:** Adverb
- **Meaning:** only just; almost not, in a simple and sparse way.
- **Synonyms:** hardly, scarcely, just
- **Antonyms:** completely, easily



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- **Use in a Sentence:** The act was **barely** justified by the circumstances.

28. Word: Noxious (हानिकारक)

- **Pronunciation:** nok-shuhs/नाक्शस
- **Part of Speech:** Adjective
- **Meaning:** harmful, poisonous, or very unpleasant.
- **Synonyms:** pernicious, toxic, baneful
- **Antonyms:** salubrious, curative, healthy
- **Use in a Sentence:** We must trace the source of these **noxious** gases.

29. Word: Dole out (दानशीलता करना)

- **Pronunciation:** dohl-out/डोल आउट
- **Part of Speech:** Verb
- **Meaning:** To distribute something, either physically or verbally.
- **Synonyms:** dispense, assign, administer
- **Antonyms:** amalgamate, collect, gather

31. Word: Scarce (अपर्याप्त)

- **Pronunciation:** स्केर्स
- **Part of Speech:** Adjective
- **Meaning:**
 - insufficient for the demand.
 - occurring in small numbers or quantities; rare.
- **Synonyms:** scanty, meager, sparse
- **Antonyms:** plentiful, abundant
- **Use in a Sentence:** The quantity of food was **scarce** during the war.

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44. Word: Overarching (अति महत्वपूर्ण)

- **Pronunciation:** oh-ver-ahr-ching/ओवरार्चिंग
- **Part of Speech:** Adjective
- **Meaning:**
 - comprehensive or all-embracing.
 - Synonyms:** very important, urgent, essential, all-important, top of mind
 - Antonyms:** insignificant, unimportant, trivial, frivolous
 - Use in Sentence:** The Supreme Court said that there has to be '**overarching**' guidelines to guard personal information in public domain.

45. Word: At Loggerheads (असहमत)

- **Pronunciation:** law-ger-hed/लॉगहेड
- **Part of Speech:** Phrase of loggerhead
- **Meaning:** in violent dispute or disagreement.
- **Synonyms:** clashing, quarreling
- **Antonyms:** agreements, understanding
- **Use in a Sentence:** The Prime Minister is **at loggerheads** with the chairman over public spending.

46. Word: Dissent (एतराज़ करना)

- **Pronunciation:** dih-sent/डिसेन्ट

 - the holding or expression of opinions at variance with those commonly or officially held. [Noun]
 - hold or express opinions that are at variance with those commonly or officially held.

- **Use in a Sentence:** There were murmurs of both assent and **dissent** from the crowd.



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47. **Word: Stance (अवस्थिति)**

- **Pronunciation:** stans/स्टैन्स
- **Part of Speech:** Noun
- **Meaning:**
 - a. the way in which someone stands, especially when deliberately adopted (as in cricket, golf, and other sports); a person's posture.
- **Synonyms:** standpoint, attitude, bearing
- **Antonyms:** unsteadiness, inaction
- **Use in a Sentence:** The man maintains a rigidly right-wing political **stance**.

48. **Word: Purview (नियम का लेख)**

- **Pronunciation:** pur-vyoo/पर्व्यू

- **Meaning:** the scope of the influence or concerns of something.

- **Use in a Sentence:** These are questions that lie outside the **purview** of our inquiry.

49. **Word: Legitimate (न्याय्य करना)**

- **Pronunciation:** li-jit-uh-mit/लिटिजिटमेट
- **Part of Speech:** Adjective, Verb
- **Meaning:**
 - a. conforming to the law or to rules. [Adjective]
 - b. able to be defended with logic or justification; valid. [Adjective]
 - c. make lawful or justify. [Verb]
- **Synonyms:** legal, valid
- **Antonyms:** illegal, invalid
- **Use in a Sentence:** It seemed a perfectly **legitimate** question.

50. **Word: Essence (निष्कर्ष)**

- **Pronunciation:** es-uhns/एसन्स
- **Part of Speech:** Noun

 - a. the intrinsic nature or indispensable quality of something, especially something abstract, which determines its character.
 - b. an extract or concentrate obtained from a plant or other matter and used for flavouring or scent.

- **Use in Sentence:** The **essence** of language is human activity.

 - a. a thing that prompts or encourages someone; an incentive. [Noun]
 - b. give an incentive or encouragement to (someone). [Verb]
- **Synonyms:** urge, encourage, motivate
- **Antonyms:** discourage, hindrance, obstacle
- **Use in a Sentence:** On the **spur** of the moment, we all decided to hold a dance party.
