 - (of a network) like a labyrinth; irregular and twisting.
 - (of a system) intricate and confusing.
- **Synonyms:** perplexed, complex, tricky

26. **Word: Schism (स्किज़म)**
- **Pronunciation:** siz-uh m/स्किज़म
 - **Part of Speech:** Noun
 - **Meaning:** a. a split or division between strongly opposed sections or parties, caused by differences in opinion or belief.
 - **Synonyms:** division, split, rift, breach, rupture, break
 - **Antonyms:** union, harmony, concord
 - **Use in a Sentence:** It seems that there is a **schism** in the ruling party over the plan.
27. **Word: Counterpart (प्रतिरूप)**

30. **Word: Tide Over (पराजित करना)**
- **Part of Speech:** Idiom

- **Meaning:** a. to supply someone until a certain time or until something happens

 - **Meaning:** a. limit or qualify (something) by conditions or exceptions.
 - **Synonyms:** evade, put off
 - **Antonyms:** expose, release
 - **Use in a Sentence:** Buying new flat may be a **hedge** against inflation.
