- **Pronunciation:** इन फ्युरीएट / इन्फ्युरीएट
- **Part of Speech:** Verb
- **Meaning:** make (someone) extremely angry and impatient.
- **Synonyms:** enraged, furious, annoyed
- **Antonyms:** agreeable, contended, soothed
- **Use in a Sentence:** After the quarrel, Her silence **infuriated** him even more.

2. Word: **Unveil** (रहस्योद्घाटन करना)

- **Pronunciation:** uhn-veyl/अन्वैल
- **Part of Speech:** Verb
- **Meaning:** show or announce publicly for the first time.
- **Synonyms:** reveal, expose, disclose
- **Antonyms:** hide, conceal
- **Use in a Sentence:** The panel will **unveil** its proposals tomorrow.

3. Word: **Fanatical** (कट्टर)

- **Part of Speech:** fuh-nat-i-kuhl/फनैटिकल
- **Meaning:**
 - a. filled with excessive and single-minded zeal.
 - b. obsessively concerned with something.
- **Pronunciation:**
- **Synonyms:** zealous, extremist, enthusiastic
- **Antonyms:** impartial, lacking interest
- **Use in a Sentence:** The man is **fanatical** about healthy eating.

4. Word: **Grandiose** (भव्य)

- **Pronunciation:** gran-di-ose/ग्रेन्डीओस

- **Part of Speech:** Adjective
- **Meaning:** extravagantly or pretentiously imposing in appearance or style/appearing to be impressive but not really possible or practical
- **Synonyms:** magnificent, impressive, grand, imposing
- **Antonyms:** unimpressive, humble, modest
- **Use in a Sentence:** Always producing **grandiose** plans will never work, until you work hard for them.

5. Word: **Nitty-gritty** (महत्वपूर्ण पहलू)

- **Pronunciation:** nit-ee-grit-ee/निटी ग्निटी
- **Part of Speech:** Noun
- **Meaning:** the most important aspects or practical details of a subject or situation.
- **Synonyms:** core, crux, centre, quintessence
- **Antonyms:** exterior, outside
- **Use in a Sentence:** It's time to get down to the **nitty-gritty** of how much this will cost.

6. Word: **Dissident** (असहमत)

- **Pronunciation:** dis-i-duh nt/डिसडिन्ट
- **Part of Speech:** Noun
- **Meaning:** a person who opposes official policy, especially that of an authoritarian state.
- **Synonyms:** objector, protestor, rebel, mavericks
- **Antonyms:** conformists, believers, followers

- **Use in a Sentence:** He was **fiercely** proud of his family traditions.

8. Word: Hardline (कट्टरपंथी)

- **Pronunciation:** hard-line/हार्डलाइन
- **Part of Speech:** Adjective
- **Meaning:** an uncompromising adherence to something (policy etc)
- **Synonyms:** strict, diehard, extreme, tough, inflexible
- **Antonyms:** compromising, flexible, changing
- **Use in a Sentence:** The bank has **hardline** rules regarding fulfilment of KYC.

9. Word: Lobby (प्रचार करना)

- **Pronunciation:** lob-ee/लाबी
- **Part of Speech:** Verb
- **Meaning:** seek to influence (a legislator) on an issue.
- **Synonyms:** persuade, influence, sway
- **Antonyms:** prevent, dissuade, repress
- **Use in a Sentence:** The group is trying to **lobby** against higher taxes.

10. Word: Sanctity (पवित्रता)

- **Pronunciation:** sangk-ti-tee/सैंगक्टिटी
- **Part of Speech:** Noun
- **Meaning:**
 - a. the state or quality of being holy, sacred, or saintly.
 - b. ultimate importance and inviolability.
- **Synonyms:** sacredness, divinity
- **Antonyms:** vileness, impureness
- **Use in a Sentence:** Numerous miracles were proof of his **sanctity**.

11. Word: Imperative (आज्ञार्थक, जरूरी)

- **Pronunciation:** im-per-uh-tiv/इम्पेरटिव
- **Part of Speech:** Adjective, Noun
- **Meaning:**
 - a. of vital importance; crucial. [Adjective]
 - b. giving an authoritative command; peremptory. [Adjective]
 - c. an essential or urgent thing. [Noun]
- **Synonyms:** necessary, obligatory, requisite

- **Antonyms:** nonessential, insignificant, needless
- **Use in a Sentence:** In an organization, a prompt reply is **imperative**.

12. Word: Precedent (पूर्व उदाहरण)

 - a. an earlier event or action that is regarded as an example or guide to be considered in subsequent similar circumstances.

- **Use in a Sentence:** The court's decision has set a legal **precedent**.

13. Word: Reiterate (दुहराना)

- **Part of Speech:** Verb
- **Meaning:** say something again or a number of times, typically for emphasis or clarity.
- **Pronunciation:** ree-it-uh-reyt/रीइटरेट
- **Synonyms:** repeat, iterate, duplicate
- **Antonyms:** elapse, conceal, dismiss
- **Use in a Sentence:** Before an exam, my teacher **reiterated** all the important points.

14. Word: Merely (केवल)

- **Pronunciation:** meer-lee/मीर्ली
- **Part of Speech:** Adverb
- **Meaning:** only as specified and nothing more; simply
- **Synonyms:** simply, solely, alone
- **Antonyms:** absolute, abundantly
- **Use in a Sentence:** There is no point in **merely** repeating what we've done earlier.

15. Word: Crux (कठिन बात)

- **Part of Speech:** Noun
- **Pronunciation:** kruhks/क्रुक्स
- **Meaning:**
 - a. the decisive or most important point at issue.
 - b. a particular point of difficulty.
- **Synonyms:** essence, puzzle, basis
- **Antonyms:** exceptional, triviality
- **Use in a Sentence:** The **crux** of the difficulty lay in the lack of material.

16. Word: Landmark (सीमाचिह्न)

- **Pronunciation:** land-mahrk/लैन्डमार्क

- **Meaning:** a. an event or discovery marking an important stage or turning point in something.
- **Synonyms:** indicator, critical point, signal
- **Antonyms:** monotonous, expected, modest
- **Use in Sentence:** The farthest **landmark** visible is about 30km away.

19. Word: Niggle (नुक्ताचीनी करना)

- **Pronunciation:** nig-uh /निगल
- **Part of Speech:** Verb
- **Meaning:** a. cause slight but persistent annoyance, discomfort, or anxiety.
b. criticize or annoy (someone) in a petty way.
- **Synonyms:** quibble, complain
- **Antonyms:** support, appease
- **Use in a Sentence:** I don't react anymore when opponents try to **niggle** me.

20. Word: Adjudicate (निर्णय देना)

- **Pronunciation:** uh-joo-di-keyt/अजूडिकैट
- **Part of Speech:** Verb
- **Meaning:** a. make a formal judgement on a disputed matter.
b. act as a judge in a competition.
c. pronounce or declare judicially.

- **Synonyms:** examine, arbitrate, decide, settle
- **Antonyms:** defer, ignore, avoid
- **Use in Sentence:** I have been asked to **adjudicate** the matter.

21. Word: Appellate (अपील-संबंधी)

- **Pronunciation:** uh-pel-it/अपेलैट
- **Part of Speech:** Adjective
- **Meaning:** a. (especially of a court) concerned with or dealing with applications for decisions to be reversed.
- **Synonyms:** judicial, appeal, proceedings
- **Antonyms:** illegal, discriminatory, captivated
- **Use in Sentence:** The **appellate** court affirmed the judgement of the lower court.

22. Word: Unravel (स्पष्ट करना)

- **Pronunciation:** uhn-rav-uh /अन्रैवल
- **Part of Speech:** Verb
- **Meaning:** a. undo (twisted, knitted, or woven threads).
b. investigate and solve or explain (something complicated or puzzling).
- **Synonyms:** disentangle, resolve, elucidate, explain
- **Antonyms:** puzzle, perplex, bewilder
- **Use in Sentence:** It has proved very difficult to **unravel** the twists and turns of the proof.

23. Word: Professedly (प्रतिज्ञापूर्वक)

- **Pronunciation:** pruh-fes-id-lee
- **Part of Speech:** Adverb
- **Meaning:** ostensibly; apparently (used in reference to something claimed or asserted, possibly falsely).
- **Synonyms:** supposedly, allegedly, purportedly
- **Antonyms:** ambiguously, dishonestly
- **Use in Sentence:** The man is **professedly** guilty of the crime.

24. Word: Opacity (अस्पष्टता)

- **Pronunciation:** oh-pas-i-tee/ओपैसटी
- **Part of Speech:** Noun
- **Meaning:** a. the quality of lacking transparency or translucence.
b. the quality of being obscure in meaning.
- **Synonyms:** obscurity, density, enigma
- **Antonyms:** transparency, serenity, clarity



- **Use in Sentence:** He insisted that the mineral content of the water determined the **opacity**.

25. Word: Bonhomie (मिलनसारिता)

- **Pronunciation:** bon-uh-mee/बानमी
- **Part of Speech:** Noun
- **Meaning:** cheerful friendliness; geniality.
- **Synonyms:** affability, amiability, sociability
- **Antonyms:** aloofness, coldness, ferocity
- **Use in Sentence:** There was a casual **bonhomie** between the actors at rehearsals.

26. Word: Abide (भुगतना)

- **Pronunciation:** uh-bahyd/अबाइड
- **Part of Speech:** Verb
- **Meaning:**
 - accept or act in accordance with (a rule, decision, or recommendation).
 - be unable to tolerate.
- **Synonyms:** endure, obey, acknowledge
- **Antonyms:** reject, quit
- **Use in a Sentence:** You have got to **abide** by the rules.

27. Word: Plethora (अधिकता)

- **Pronunciation:** pleth-er-uh/प्लथॉर
- **Part of Speech:** Noun
- **Meaning:** a large or excessive amount of something.
- **Synonyms:** superabundance, surplus, plenty
- **Antonyms:** scarcity, dearth, shortage
- **Use in a Sentence:** The forensic report contains a **plethora** of detail.

28. Word: Reprieve (दण्डविराम करना)

- **Pronunciation:** ri-preev/रीप्रीव
- **Part of Speech:** Verb, Noun
- **Meaning:**
 - cancel or postpone the punishment of (someone, especially someone condemned to death). [Verb]
 - a cancellation or postponement of a punishment. [Noun]
- **Synonyms:** pardon, let off, rescue
- **Antonyms:** punish, blame, penalty
- **Use in a Sentence:** Because of a legal review, the criminal was granted a **reprieve** on his sentence.

29. Word: Vow (प्रतिज्ञा करना)

 - a solemn promise. [Noun]
 - solemnly promise to do a specified thing. [Verb]
 - dedicate to someone or something, especially a deity. [Verb]

- **Antonyms:** recede, abjure
- **Use in a Sentence:** The man has broken his **vow** of silence on the issue.

30. Word: Embezzlement (धोखाघड़ी)

 - hold or express opinions that are at variance with those commonly or officially held.
- **Synonyms:** conflict, disagree
- **Antonyms:** ascent, approve
- **Use in a Sentence:** There were murmurs of both assent and **dissent** from the crowd.

32. Word: Allusion (संकेत)

- **Pronunciation:** uh-loo-zhuh n/अलूशन
- **Part of Speech:** Noun
- **Meaning:** an expression designed to call something to mind without mentioning it explicitly; an indirect or passing reference.
- **Synonyms:** reference, implication, indication
- **Antonyms:** demand, caution, overtone, hint
- **Use in Sentence:** The committee made no **allusion** to the President in its report.

33. Word: Pummel (परास्त कर देना)

- **Pronunciation:** puhm-uh I/पमल
- **Part of Speech:** Verb



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- **Meaning:**
 - strike repeatedly with the fists.
 - criticize severely.
 - **Synonyms:** beat, thrash, chastise
 - **Antonyms:** praise, compliment
 - **Use in Sentence:** Intense hurricane winds **pummel** the shoreline.
- 34. Word: Slip-up (चूक)**
- **Part of Speech:** Phrasal verb of slip
 - **Pronunciation:** slip-uhp/स्लिप अप
 - **Meaning:** make a careless error.
 - **Synonyms:** blunder, miscalculate, mistake
 - **Antonyms:** achievement, advantage, correctness
 - **Use in a Sentence:** The whole situation only happened because of a **slip-up** by the bank.
- 35. Word: Cry wolf (अकारण शोर मचाना)**
- **Pronunciation:** krah-y woo lf
 - **Part of Speech:** Phrase of wolf
 - **Meaning:** call for help when it is not needed, with the effect that one is not believed when one really does need help.
 - **Synonyms:** false alarm, alert, admonish
 - **Antonyms:** disenchant, honest, undeceive
 - **Use in Sentence:** One does not **cry wolf** with panic buttons.
- 36. Word: Acrimony (कठोरता)**
- **Pronunciation:** ak-ruh-moh-nee/ऐक्रिमोनी
 - **Part of Speech:** Noun
 - **Meaning:** bitterness or ill feeling.
 - **Synonyms:** Antipathy, Hatred, Rage
 - **Antonyms:** Benevolence, Courtesy, Peace
 - **Use in a Sentence:** At last, the dispute ended without **acrimony**.

 - **Antonyms:** pacifist, friendly, amicable
 - **Use in a Sentence:** She has some **contentious** opinions on education.
- 38. Word: Accede (मान लेना)**
- **Pronunciation:** ak-seed/ऐकसीड
 - **Part of Speech:** Verb

- **Meaning:** to agree with someone or give in to his or her wish
 - **Synonyms:** consent, acquiesce, concur
 - **Antonyms:** deny, demur, disagree
 - **Use in Sentence:** I am not prepared to **accede** to that submission.

 - comprehensive or all-embracing.

 - **Antonyms:** insignificant, unimportant, trivial, frivolous
 - **Use in Sentence:** The Supreme Court said that there have to be '**overarching**' guidelines to guard personal information in the public domain.
