- **Antonyms:** bolster, enhance, comply
- **Use in Sentence:** The man was sentenced to 10 years for plotting to **subvert** the government.

2. Word: **Inglorious** (अपमानपूर्ण)

- **Pronunciation:** in-glawr-ee-uhs/इन्ग्लोरीअस
- **Part of Speech:** Adjective
- **Meaning:**
 - a. (of an action or situation) causing shame or a loss of honour.

- **Antonyms:** divine, gorgeous, proud

3. Word: **Speculation** (विचार)

- **Pronunciation:** spek-yuh-ley-shuh n/ स्पेक्युलैशन
- **Part of Speech:** Noun
- **Meaning:**
 - a. a single instance or process of consideration.
 - b. a conclusion or opinion reached by such contemplation
- **Synonyms:** hypothesis, guess
- **Antonyms:** fact, truth
- **Use in a Sentence:** The company moved quickly to cancel **the speculation** that it is losing money.

4. Word: **Misdemeanors** (खराब आचरण)

- **Pronunciation:** mis-di-mee-ner/मिस्डिमीनर
- **Part of Speech:** Noun

 - a. a minor wrongdoing.

- **Pronunciation:** uh-kin/ ऐकिन
- **Part of Speech:** Adjective
- **Meaning:** of similar character.
- **Synonyms:** alike, identical, equivalent
- **Antonyms:** dissimilar, contradictory, inconsistent
- **Use in a Sentence:** Listening to her life story was **akin** to reading a good adventurous novel.

9. Word: Compliance (आज्ञापालन)

- **Part of Speech:** Noun
- **Meaning:** the state or fact of according with or meeting rules or standards.

- **Use in a Sentence:** The workers of the factory must be monitored to ensure **compliance** with the terms and conditions.

10. Word: Sheer (परिपूर्ण)

- **Use in a Sentence:** The boy giggled with **sheer** delight.

11. Word: Put off (स्थगित करना)

- **Pronunciation:** poot-awf/पुट ऑफ
- **Part of Speech:** Noun
- **Meaning:**
 - a. an off-putting or unpleasant quality or feature.
 - b. an evasive reply.
- **Synonyms:** postpone, delay, discourage
- **Antonyms:** succeed, carry out, achieve
- **Use in a Sentence:** Don't **put off** what you can do today till tomorrow.

18. Word: Curb (नियंत्रण करना)

19. Word: Entitlement (पात्रता)

- **Pronunciation:** en-tahy-tl-ment/एन्टाइटल्मन्ट

 - a. the fact of having a right to something.
 - b. the amount to which a person has a right.
 - c. the belief that one is inherently deserving of privileges or special treatment.

 - a) take apart (a piece of machinery or equipment) in order to examine it and repair it if necessary. [Verb]
 - b) overtake (someone), especially in a sporting event. [Verb]
 - c) a thorough examination of machinery or a system, with repairs or changes made if necessary. [Noun]
 - **Synonyms:** repair, improve, refurbish
 - **Antonyms:** break down, rupture
 - **Use in a Sentence:** The machinery needs a complete **overhaul**.
25. **Word: Rechristen (नया नाम देना)**

 - **Meaning:** used to emphasize how small or insignificant someone or something is.
 - **Synonyms:** sheer, scant, utter
 - **Antonyms:** powerful, blighted
 - **Use in a Sentence:** It was certainly more to than this **mere** opportunism.
