

SOLUTIONS

- 1. Ans. D.
- At present, interest rates on loans are linked to a bank's marginal cost of fundbased interest rate, known as the Marginal Cost of Lending Rate (MCLR).
- Existing loans and credit limits linked to the MCLR, base rate or Benchmark Prime Lending Rate, would continue till repayment or renewal.
- Those customers wanting to switch to the repo-linked rate can do so on mutually acceptable terms.
- 2. Ans. E.

There is **no limit – either minimum or maximum** – on the amount of funds that could be transferred using **NEFT**. However, the maximum amount per transaction is limited to **Rs.50,000/-** for cash-based remittances within India and also for remittances to **Nepal under the Indo-Nepal Remittance Facility Scheme**.

- 3. Ans. B.
- India's central bank the 'The Reserve Bank of India' is going to set up a Central Payment Fraud Registry.
- This Registry will monitor digital payments related frauds on a real-time basis and provide customers with periodic aggregated data of risks associated with individual payments operators
- This will improve customer confidence in these channels.
- A detailed framework on the proposed registry would be released by the regulators in October.
- Currently, RBI has a mechanism in place for banks to report all banking frauds to the Central Fraud Monitoring Cell of the Reserve Bank.
- 4. Ans. B.

As per the relaxed ECB end-use provisions, the RBI has permitted ECBs with a minimum average maturity period of 10 years for working capital purposes and general corporate purposes. Borrowing by NBFCs for this maturity for on-lending for the above purposes is also permitted.

ECBs, with a minimum average maturity period of seven years, can be availed by eligible borrowers for repayment of rupee loans availed domestically for capital expenditure, as also by NBFCs for on-lending for the same purpose. For repayment of rupee loans availed domestically for purposes other than capital expenditure and for on-lending by NBFCs for the same, the minimum average maturity period of the ECB is required to be 10 years.

The RBI said eligible corporate borrowers will be allowed to avail ECB for repayment of rupee loans availed domestically for capital expenditure in the manufacturing and infrastructure sector if classified as SMA-2, or NPA, under any one-time settlement with lenders.

5. Ans. D.

- The RBI has announced a task force headed by its former deputy governor
 Usha Thorat to examine issues to address concerns related to offshore rupee markets and recommend policy measures to ensure the stability of the external value of the domestic currency.
- The task force with eight-member will assess the causes behind the development of the offshore rupee market and study its effects of the offshore markets on the rupee exchange rate and market liquidity in the domestic market.
- The task force will submit its report by June- end.
- 6. Ans. C.
- Maharashtra state-reported around 233 cases of ATM fraud in 2018-19. Reserve Bank of India (RBI) data revealed a data showed that Delhi grabbed the second spot with 179 cases. This is followed by Tamil Nadu with 147 cases. In Maharashtra, people lost Rs 4.8 crore to bank fraud and in Delhi, people lost around Rs 2.9 crore in bank fraud.

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- Assam, Arunachal Pradesh and Tripura are the only three states that didn't report a single incident.
- 7. Ans. C.
- * RBI board has finalized a three- year roadmap named **Utarsh 2022** to improve regulation and supervision, among other functions of the central bank.
- * It is in line with the global central banks' plan to strengthen the regulatory and supervisory mechanism.
- * It is a three-year road map for medium-term objectives to be achieved for improving regulation, supervision of the central bank.

8. Ans. B.

The Asset Reconstruction Companies have been allowed to acquire financial assets from other ARCs, in the view of amendment to the Securitisation and Reconstruction of Financial Assets and Enforcement of Securities Interest (SARFAESI) Act, 2002.

- * The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has permitted Asset Reconstruction Companies (ARCs) to acquire financial assets from peers i.e. other such entities. However, RBI, the apex banking regulator cleared that all such transactions have to be settled in cash.
- * This decision by RBI will help improve liquidity in Asset Reconstruction Companies' market.
- 9. Ans. B.
- Leverage ratio: It is a kind of financial ratio that tells the level of debt incurred by an organization. This ratio gives an indication that how company assets and business operations are financed.
- RBI has relaxed the Leverage ratio to 3.5% for banks and 4% for DSIB's banks.
- Currently, there are 3 banks that are categorized as DSIB namely SBI, ICICI, AND HDFC.

10. Ans. B.

The Reserve Bank Friday set an average base rate of 9.18 percent for non-banking financial companies and micro institutions to be charged from their customers for the quarter beginning July 1.

- The applicable average base rate to be charged by non-banking financial companies and microfinance institutions (NBFC-MFIs) to their borrowers for the quarter beginning July 1, 2019, will be 9.18 percent.
- RBI sets the average base rate for NBFC-MFIs on the basis of the average of the base rate of the five largest commercial banks. The central bank in a circular in 2014 had communicated to NBFCs and MFIs regarding pricing of credit on the last working day of every quarter.

11. Ans. D.

RBI Deputy Governor Viral V Acharya has resigned from his post, six months before the scheduled end of his term. Mr. Acharya joined the Reserve Bank in January 2017 and was RBI's youngest deputy governor, post-economic liberalization.

Acharya will be returning to New York University as CV Starr Professor of Economics.

12. Ans. C.

The theme this year Financial Literacy Week is - 'Farmers and how they benefit by being a part of the formal banking system'.

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) observed 'Financial Literacy Week' across the country from 3rd to 9th of June.

Financial Literacy Week is an initiative of RBI to promote awareness on key topics every year through a focused campaign. 13. Ans. B.

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has announced an extension of timings for customer transactions through Real Time Gross Settlement (RTGS) by one and half hours from 4:30 PM to 6:00 PM. According to the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) notification, the new timing will be effective from 1st June.

The RTGS is an online fund transfer system, supported by the RBI, which enables money transaction on a real-time basis.

The minimum amount for the transaction under this system is Rs 2 lakh.

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There is no upper limit on the value of funds that can be transferred via the RTGS system.

14. Ans. E.

Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has constituted a six-member committee headed by TN Manoharan (Chairman, Canara Bank) on the Development of Secondary Market for Corporate Loans to come up with recommendations to increase the efficiencies of the debt market and aid in the resolution of stressed assets.

The committee will make recommendations on required policy/regulatory interventions for facilitating the development of the secondary market in corporate loans, including loan transaction platform for stressed assets.

Housing loans are given by RRBs and SFBs to individuals up to INR 35 lakh in metropolitan centers (with a population of 10 lakh and above) and INR 25 lakh in other centers.

- The Reserve Bank of India has decided to enhance the housing loan limits for Regional Rural Banks (RRBs) and Small Finance Banks (SFBs) for eligibility under priority sector lending, in a bid to give them a level playing field with other Scheduled Commercial Banks.

- Economic Intelligence Unit released the Safe Cities Index (SCI) 2019 which ranks 60 countries worldwide across five continents.
- It measures the multi-faceted nature of urban safety, with indicators categorized as digital, infrastructure, health and personal security.
- Tokyo ranks first for the third time while Singapore and Osaka came second and third in the list
- Mumbai was at 45th position while Delhi stood at the 52nd position.
- Cities in the Asia-Pacific region made up six of the top-10 safest cities. 17. Ans. A.
- Power Minister R K Singh launched the State Rooftop Solar Attractiveness Index -SARAL in New Delhi.

- As per the Ministry of New and Renewable Energy survey, Karnataka has emerged as the best state for setting up a rooftop solar project according to the State Rooftop Solar Attractiveness Index-SARAL.
- The state rooftop solar attractiveness index (SARAL) released by the Ministry of New and Renewable Energy.
- Four states (Karnataka, Telangana, Gujarat and Andhra Pradesh) have been graded A++.
- The state of Jammu and Kashmir has been ranked last

18. Ans. C.

India is ranked at the 86th position in the Henley Passport Index 2019 with a mobility score of 58. India shares the position with Mauritiana and Sao Tome and Principe.

In 2018, India was ranked at the 79th position.

Henley Passport Index 2019 has recently published on its website that shows **Japan and Singapore** holds first position collectively as most powerful passports in the world.

Australian think tank Institute for Economics & Peace has released the Global Peace Index (GPI) 2019. The report revealed that since 2008 global peacefulness has deteriorated by 3.78 per cent. India's ranking in the index has slipped five places to 141 among 163 countries.

Iceland remains the most peaceful country in the world, a position it has held since 2008. It is joined by New Zealand, Austria, Portugal, and Denmark.

Afghanistan is now the least peaceful country in the world, replacing Syria, which is now the second least peaceful. South Sudan, Yemen, and Iraq comprise the remaining five least peaceful countries.

In South Asia, Bhutan topped the index with 15th rank, followed by Sri Lanka 72, Nepal 76 and Bangladesh 101. Pakistan has been ranked 153rd in the index.

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Countries with the highest risk of multiple climate hazards - China, Japan, India, Philippines, Myanmar, Vietnam, Indonesia, Pakistan and Bangladesh (total 9 countries)

Countries with the largest total military expenditure – US, China, India, Russia and Saudi Arabia.

- Kerala took the top spot among larger states for overall performance on health indicators in a NITI Aayog report, followed by Andhra Pradesh and Maharashtra.

- It was developed by NITI Aayog with technical assistance from the **World Bank** in consultation with the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW).

- India has ranked 74th place in terms of money parked by its citizens with Swiss banks by the end of 2018.
- While with maximum holdings, UK (United Kingdom) has remained top in the list.
- The report is compiled by the Swiss

National Bank (SNB).

- India was ranked 73rd in 2018.
- The US remains on the second with CHF 144 billion accounts 10.3% of foreign funds.
- India was also the lowest-ranked among the BRICS nations, Russia is ranked the highest (20th) followed by China (22nd), South Africa (60th) Brazil (65th).
- India's neighboring nations are ranked lower, with Pakistan(82nd), Bangladesh (89th), Nepal (109th), Sri Lanka (141st), Myanmar (187th) and Bhutan (193rd).

- India's rank in the **World Press Freedom Index 2019** dropped down to **140**th **from 138**th in 2018, two points

- The Reporters Without Borders (RSF) on April 18th, 2019 released the World Press Freedom Index 2019, reflecting growing animosity towards journalists.
- This year, the index has been topped by Norway again for the third year, followed by Finland and Sweden at second and third positions, respectively.

- **Sweden** remains on the top and is followed by Switzerland and Norway in the top three.

- Only one in five children in Kerala and Goa (20% each) are stunted. About Stunting:
- Stunting is the impaired growth and development that children experience from poor nutrition, repeated infection, and inadequate psychosocial stimulation. 109. Ans. B.



Hemis Festival of Ladakh is celebrated every year on the birth anniversary of Guru Padamsambhav. It is a two-day celebration which marks the victory of good over evil. The legend has it that Lord Padamsambhav defeated the dark forces with the help of Vajrayana Buddhism. And, therefore, the people of Ladakh celebrate the day of his birth on a huge scale.

- v. Angad Vir Singh Bajwa (24) shot 44 in the final & got Bronze medal. He had made it to the finals with the third-best of 122/125 score. The gold was won by Nicolas Vasiliou of Cyprus with 56 hits. Angad represented India in his first senior world cup in Acapulco 2015.
