#### 1. Word: Instinctive (स्वाभाविक)

- Pronunciation: in-stingk-tiv/ इन्स्टिंगक्टिव
- Part of Speech: Adjective
- Meaning:
  - a. relating to or prompted by instinct; done without conscious thought.
  - b. (of a person) doing or being a specified thing apparently naturally or automatically.
- Synonyms: natural, spontaneous, involuntary, intuitive
- Antonyms: deliberate, conscious, calculated
- Usage in a Sentence: The instinctive reaction of a mother is to protect her children

#### 2. Word: Inflict (प्रयुक्त करना)

- Pronunciation: in-flikt/ इन्फिलक्ट
- Part of Speech: Verb
- Meaning: cause (something unpleasant or painful) to be suffered by someone or something.
- Synonyms: impose, force, wreak
- Antonyms: annul, abstain, deter
- Usage in a Sentence: These insects are capable of inflicting a painful sting.

- 3. Word: Referendum (जनमत-संग्रह)
  - Pronunciation: ref-uh-ren-duh m/ रेफरेन्डम
  - Part of Speech: Noun
  - Meaning: a general vote by the electorate on a single political question which has been referred to them for a direct decision.
  - Synonyms: plebiscite, popular vote, ballot,
  - Usage in a Sentence: The issue was decided by referendum.
- 4. Word: Denudation (अनाच्छादन)
  - Pronunciation: den-yoo-dey-shuh n/ डेन्य्डेशन
  - Part of Speech: Noun
  - Meaning:
    - removal of something important b. stripping off all covering or surface layers
  - Synonyms: stripping, baring, uncovering, exposure
  - Antonyms: hiding, covering
  - Usage in a Sentence: Excessive logging has denuded the hillside of trees.
- 5. Word: Apprehension (डर)
  - Pronunciation: ap-ri-hen-shuh n/ ऐप्रिहेन्शन
  - Part of Speech: Noun





- Meaning: anxiety or fear that something bad or unpleasant will happen.
- Synonyms: dread, fear, anxiety, worry
- Antonyms: confidence, calmness, ease
- Use in a Sentence: The change in the law has caused apprehension among many people.

#### 6. Word: Accentuate (अधिक स्रूपण्ट करना)

- Pronunciation: ak-sen-choo-eyt/ ऐक्सेन्च्ऐट
- Part of Speech: Verb
- Meaning: make more noticeable or prominent.
- Synonyms: highlight, emphasize
- Antonyms: degrade, belittle
- Usage in a Sentence: The director uses music to accentuate the rising dramatic tension.

#### 7. Word: Backdrop (पृष्ठभूमि)

- Pronunciation: bak-drop/ बैक्ड्राप
- Part of Speech: Noun, Verb
- Meaning:
  - a. a painted cloth hung at the back of a theatre stage as part of the scenery. ( Noun) b. lie behind or beyond; serve as a background to. (Verb)
- Synonyms: background, setting, scenery, context
- Antonyms: foreground, forefront
- Usage in a Sentence: The mountains provided a perfect backdrop for the wedding photos.

#### 8. Word: Fray (कलह)

- Part of Speech: Verb, Noun
- Meaning:
  - a. (of a fabric, rope, or cord) unravel or become worn at the edge, typically through constant rubbing. (Verb)
  - b. a situation of intense competitive activity. (Noun)
  - c. a battle or fight. (Noun)
- Synonyms: fight, brawl, ruckus, conflict
- Antonyms: harmony, agreement, improve, tranquillity
- Usage in a Sentence: Aroused by the death of his friend, he returns to the fray and kills Hector.

#### 9. Word: Detractor (आलोचना करके कलंकित करने वाला)

- Pronunciation: dih-traktor/ डीट्रैक्टर
- Part of Speech: Noun

- Meaning: a person who disparages someone or something
- Synonyms: critic, attacker, slanderer
- Antonyms: benefactor, ally, supporter
- Usage in a Sentence: The detractors say they are relative newcomers who would have constituted a gamble.

#### 10. Word: Appellation (उपाधि)

- Pronunciation: ap-uh-ley-shuh n/ ऐपलेशन
- Part of Speech: Noun
- Meaning:
  - a. a name or title.
  - b. the action of giving a name to someone or something.
- Synonyms: designation, label, name, title, denomination
- Usage in a Sentence: Somehow, though, the appellation doesn't quite suit her.

#### 11. Word: Sarcastic (व्यंग्यात्मक)

- Pronunciation: sahr-kas-tik/ सार्कैस्टिक
- · Part of Speech: Adjective
- Meaning: marked by or given to using irony in order to mock or convey contempt.
- Synonyms: sardonic, ironic, ironical, satirical; derisive, scornful, contemptuous, mocking
- Antonyms: diplomatic, gracious, polite respectful
- Usage in a Sentence: Memes are what inspired her jewellery line, which is meant to appropriate stereotypes about Asian Americans in a sarcastic way.

#### 12. Word: Approbation (अनुमोदन)

- Pronunciation: ap-ruh-bey-shuh n/ ऐप्रबेशन
- Part of Speech: Noun
- Meaning: approval or praise
- Synonyms: approval, acceptance, assent, endorsement, encouragement
- Antonyms: contempt, criticism, disapprobation, condemnation, shame
- Usage in a Sentence: The company has even received the approbation of its former critics.

#### 13. Word: Discord (अनबन)

- Pronunciation: dis-kawrd/ डिस्कॉर्ड
- Part of Speech: Noun, Verb
- Meaning:
  - a. disagreement between people. [Noun]b. lack of harmony between notes sounding together. [Noun]
  - c. (of people) disagree. [Verb]



- Synonyms: dissension, strife, dispute, disharmony
- Antonyms: peace, sympathy, agreement, concord
- Usage in a Sentence: A note of discord surfaced during the proceedings.

#### 14. Word: Deliberate (इच्छित, विचार करना)

- Pronunciation: dih-lib-uh-reyt/ डिलिबरट
- Part of Speech: Adjective, Verb
- Meaning:
  - a. done consciously and intentionally. (Adjective)
  - b. careful and unhurried. (Adjective)
  - c. engage in long and careful consideration. (Verb)
- Synonyms: intentional, ponder, consider, premeditated, reflect
- Antonyms: accidental, unintentional, inadvertent, abrupt
- Usage in a Sentence: The leader's speech was a deliberate attempt to embarrass the government.

#### 15. Word: Adhere (समर्थन करना, चिपकना)

- Pronunciation: ad-heer/ ऐड्हीर
- Part of Speech: Verb
- Meaning:
  - a. stick fast to (a surface or substance).b. closely follow, observe, or represent.
- Synonyms: accede, observe, hold, meet
- Antonyms: abandon, abandon, vacillate
- Usage in a Sentence: Once in the bloodstream, the bacteria adhere to the surface of the red cells.

#### 16. Word: Edify (उपदेश देना)

- Pronunciation: ed-uh-fahy/ एडफाइ
- Part of Speech: Verb
- Meaning: instruct or improve (someone) morally or intellectually
- Synonyms: enlighten, inform, teach, educate
- Antonyms: discourage, befuddle
- Usage in a Sentence: Help me speak words of blessing to edify those around me today.

- Part of Speech: Noun
- Meaning: a source of help in a difficult situation.
- Synonyms: resort, appeal, refuge
- Antonyms: avoidance, hindrance

## • Usage in a sentence: An order was made, against which he sought recourse in the Supreme Court.

#### 18. Word: Inordinate (अत्यधिक)

- Pronunciation: in-awr-dn-it/ इनॉर्डनिट
- Part of Speech: Adjective
- Meaning: unusually or disproportionately large; excessive.
- Synonyms: excessive, outrageous, exorbitant, extreme, unreasonable
- Antonyms: frugal, moderate, reasonable, inadequate
- Usage in a Sentence: Scientists have been criticized for devoting an inordinate amount of time to research on animals.

#### 19. Word: Naysayer (नकारी)

- Pronunciation: ney-sey-er/ नेसेयर
- Part of Speech: Noun
- Meaning: a person who criticizes, objects to, or opposes something.
- Synonyms: pessimist, defeatist, dissenter
- Antonyms: motivator, fan
- Usage in a Sentence: If a naysayer close to you has been difficult and critical, there's a good chance you've finally silenced that person.

#### 20. Word: Exhortation (प्रोत्साहन)

- Pronunciation: eg-zawr-tey-shuh n/ एग्ज़ॉर्टेशन
- Part of Speech: Noun
- Meaning: an address or communication emphatically urging someone to do something.
- Synonyms: persuasion, encouragement, urging
- Antonyms: dissuasion, arbitration
- Usage in a sentence: After repeated exhortation by his comrades, he finally straightened out his thinking.

#### 21. Word: Incorporate (शामिल करना)

- Pronunciation: in-kawr-puh-reyt/ इन्कॉर्परेट
- Part of Speech: Verb, Adjective
- Meaning:
  - a. take in or contain (something) as part of a whole; include. (Verb)
  - b. having a bodily form; embodied.
- Synonyms: include, integrate, combine, embody
- Antonyms: exclude, separate, divide
- Usage in a sentence: The party vowed to incorporate environmental considerations into all its policies.





#### 22. Word: Desist (परहेज करना)

- Pronunciation: dih-zist, -sist/ डिज़िस्ट
- Part of Speech: Verb
- Meaning: stop doing something; cease or abstain.
- Synonyms: abstain, refrain, forbear, discontinue
- Antonyms: continue, carry on, endure
- Usage in a Sentence: They agreed to desist from the bombing campaign.

#### 23. Word: Cohere (संयुक्त रहना)

- Pronunciation: koh-heer/ कोहीर
- Part of Speech: Verb
- Meaning:
  - a, form a unified whole.
  - b. (of an argument or theory) be logically consistent.
- Synonyms: adhere, cling, stick, connect
- Antonyms: separate, divide, dispute, differ
- Usage in a Sentence: The empire could not cohere as a legitimate whole.

#### 24. Word: Intervention (हस्तक्षेप)

- Pronunciation: in-ter-ven-shuh n/ इन्टर्वेन्शन
- Part of Speech: Noun
- Meaning: the action or process of intervening
- Synonyms: interference, mediation, intrusion
- Antonyms: noninterference, nonintervention, challenge
- Usage in a Sentence: We would resist any armed intervention from outside in our country's affairs.

#### 25. Word: Ill-conceived (व्यर्थ)

- Pronunciation: il-kuh n-seevd/
- Part of Speech: Adjective
- Meaning: not carefully planned or considered.
- Synonyms: misguided, poorly planned, unwise, absurd
- Antonyms: wise, responsible, accountable, reasonable
- Usage in a Sentence: Meera made an illconceived attempt to save money.

#### 26. Word: Displace (विस्थापित करना)

- Pronunciation: dis-pleys/ डिस्प्लेस
- Part of Speech: Verb
- Meaning:
  - a. take over the place, position, or role of. b. emove (someone) from a job or position of authority.

- c. force (someone) to leave their home, typically because of war, persecution, or natural disaster.
- Synonyms: move, oust, misplace, remove, dislodge
- Antonyms: accept, appoint, install, remain
- Usage in a Sentence: The hurricane displaced most of the town's residents.

#### 27. Word: Rebellion (विद्रोह)

- Pronunciation: ri-bel-yuhn/ रिबेल्यन
- Part of Speech: Noun
- Meaning:
  - a. an act of armed resistance to an established government or leader.
    b. the action or process of resisting authority, control, or convention.
- Synonyms: revolt, uprising, revolution
- Antonyms: obedience, peace, alliance, compliance
- Usage in a Sentence: She's the head of a rebellion against the leaders of the party.

#### 28. Word: Militia (नागरिक सेना)

- Pronunciation: mi-lish-uh/ मलिश

- Meaning: a military force that is raised from the civil population to supplement a regular army in an emergency.

- Usage in a Sentence: The militia responded by saying it would retaliate against any attacks.

  - a. very weak or slight
  - b. very slender or fine; insubstantial
- Synonyms: insubstantial, flimsy, weak, fragile, dubious, thin, slender, delicate
- Antonyms: substantial, thick, stable, healthy, significant
- Usage in a Sentence: He could demonstrate only a tenuous claim to ownership.

#### 30. Phrase: Prop up (संभालना)

- Pronunciation: प्रोप उप
- Meaning:
- a. to stop something from falling by putting something under it or against it
   b. to help a government, system,
  - b. to help a government, system, organization etc to continue to exist, especially by providing financial or military support





- Synonyms: support, bolster
- Antonyms: intimidate, repress
- Usage in a Sentence: The government introduced measures to prop up the stock market.

#### 34. Word: Doctrine (सिदधांत)

Part of Speech: Noun

- Meaning: a belief or set of beliefs held and taught by a Church, political party, or other groups.
- Synonyms: philosophy, belief, principle, dogma, tenet
- Antonyms: disbelief, scepticism,
- Usage in a Sentence: Many psychologists now question the doctrines of Sigmund Freud.

#### 35. Word: Integral (अविभाज्य, आधारभूत)

- Pronunciation: in-ti-gruhl/ इन्टग्रल
- Part of Speech: Adjective
- Meaning:
  - a. necessary to make a whole complete;
    essential or fundamental.
    b. included as part of a whole rather than supplied separately.
- Synonyms: essential, fundamental, basic, intrinsic, inherent, incorporated, fitted, component
- Antonyms: incidental, peripheral, extrinsic, partial, secondary, supplemental
- Usage in a Sentence: An integral part of Korean culture, these bathhouses are where people come to relax and enjoy a variety of beauty and health rituals.

#### 36. Word: Ambiguity (संदिग्धता)

- Part of Speech: Noun
- Meaning: the quality of being open to more than one interpretation; inexactness.
- Synonyms: vagueness, obscurity, uncertainty
- Antonyms: certainty, clarity
- Usage in a Sentence: There was an element of ambiguity in the president's reply.

#### 37. Word: Envision (कल्पना करना)

- Synonyms: visualize, imagine, envisage, picture
- Antonyms: misread, disregard, unforeseen
- Usage in a Sentence: She envisioned a better life for herself.

#### 38. Word: Deter (डराना)

• Pronunciation: dih-tur/ डिटर

Part of Speech: Verb





- Meaning: discourage (someone) from doing something by instilling doubt or fear of the consequences.
- Synonyms: discourage, dissuade, hinder
- Antonyms: encourage, support, persuade
- Usage in a sentence: These measures are designed to deter an enemy attack.

#### 39. Word: Stagger (विचलित करना)

- Pronunciation: stag-er/ स्टैगर
- Part of Speech: Verb, Noun
- Meaning:
  - a. walk or move unsteadily as if about to fall. [Verb]
  - b. astonish or deeply shock. [Verb]c. an unsteady walk or movement. [Noun]
- Synonyms: stumble, surprise, shocked
- Antonyms: comfort, relax, calm
- Use in a Sentence: It seems they stagger from one crisis to the next.

#### 40. Word: Punitive (दंडात्मक)

- Pronunciation: pyoo-ni-tiv/ प्युनिटिव

  - a. inflicting or intended as punishment.b. (of a tax or other charge) extremely high.

- Meaning: the action of returning a military attack; counter-attack.
- Synonyms: revenge, vengeance, reprisal
- Antonyms: mercy, forgiveness, acceptance
- Usage in a sentence: He, in retaliation, has launched against them the most concentrated onslaughts that he has been able to devise

#### 42. Word: Adversary (प्रतिवादी)

- Pronunciation: ad-ver-ser-ee / ऐड़वर्सेरी
- Part of Speech: Noun
- Meaning: one's opponent in a contest, conflict, or dispute.
- Synonyms: opponent, competitor, enemy
- Antonyms: friend, ally, supporter

• Usage in a sentence: He saw her as his main adversary within the company.

- Pronunciation: vahy-uh-buhl / वाइअबल
- Part of Speech: Adjective
- Meaning: capable of working successfully; feasible.
- Synonyms: strong, sound, feasible
- Antonyms: unsustainable, unfeasible
- Usage in a sentence: The committee came forward with one viable solution.

#### 44. Word: Enigmatic (रहस्यपूर्ण)

- Pronunciation: en-ig-mat-ik/ एनिग्मैटिक
- Part of Speech: Adjective
- Meaning: difficult to interpret or understand; mysterious.
- Synonyms: mysterious, puzzling, inexplicable, baffling, perplexing, bewildering
- Antonyms: straightforward, clear, obvious
- Usage in a Sentence: The discovery of the abandoned ship in mid-ocean remains one of the most enigmatic episodes in seafaring history.

#### 45. Word: Affirm (अन्मोदन करना)

- Pronunciation: uh-furm/ अफर्म
- Part of Speech: Verb
- Meaning:
  - a. state emphatically or publicly.
  - b. offer (someone) emotional support or encouragement.
- Synonyms: confirm, assert, verify, approve
- Antonyms: deny, negate, nullify, disavow
- Usage in a Sentence: We cannot affirm that this painting is genuine.

#### 46. Word: Tenure (कार्यकाल)

- Pronunciation: ten-yer/ टेन्यर
- Part of Speech: Noun, Verb
- Meaning:
  - a. the conditions under which land or buildings are held or occupied. [Noun] b. give (someone) a permanent post, especially as a teacher or lecturer. [Verb]
- Synonyms: term of office, occupancy, tenancy
- Usage in a Sentence: During his tenure as the head coach, the team won the championship twice.

#### 47. Word: Alignment (एकत्रीकरण)

• Pronunciation: uh-lahyn-muh nt/ अलाइन्मन्ट





- Part of Speech: Noun
- Meaning:
  - a. arrangement in a straight line or in correct relative positions.

b. a position of agreement or alliance.

- Synonyms: adjustment, arrangement, alliance, correspondence
- Antonyms: disorder, nonalignment
- Usage in a Sentence: New alignments have been created within the political party.

#### 48. Word: Unequivocal (असंदिग्ध)

- Pronunciation: uhn-i-kwiv-uh-kuhl/ अनिक्विवकल
- Part of Speech: Adjective
- Meaning: leaving no doubt; unambiguous.
- Synonyms: clear, unambiguous, unmistakable, indisputable, incontrovertible
- Antonyms: equivocal, ambiguous, vague
- Usage in a Sentence: His views turned out to be staunch and unequivocal.

#### 49. Word: Flinch (हिचकना)

- Pronunciation: flinch/ फ्लिन्च
- Part of Speech: Verb, Noun

- Meaning:
  - a. care for and protect (someone or something) while they are growing. [Verb] b. the action or process of nurturing someone or something. [Noun]
- Synonyms: foster, nourish, cherish, nurse, raise, sustain
- Antonyms: neglect, ignore, deprive, negligence
- Usage in a Sentence: Teachers should nurture their students' creativity.

#### 51. Word: Exemplary (अन्करणीय)

- Pronunciation: sangk-shuhn/ इंग्ज़ेम्प्लरी
- Part of Speech: Adjective

- Meaning: serving as a desirable model; very good.
- Synonyms: admirable, commendable
- Antonyms: outrageous, sinful, unworthy
- Usage in a sentence: His behaviour in the aftermath of the Hillsborough disaster was exemplary.

#### 52. Word: Strain (क्षति पहुँचाना/विकृति)

- Pronunciation: streyn/ स्ट्रेन
- Part of Speech: Verb, Noun
- Meaning:
  - a. force (a part of one's body or oneself) to make an unusually great effort. [Verb] b. a force tending to pull or stretch something to an extreme or damaging degree. [Noun]
- Synonyms: stress, pressure, struggle
- Antonyms: relax, rest, compress
- Usage in a sentence: The transport service cannot cope with the strain of so many additional passengers.

#### 53. Word: Assiduously (परिश्रम से)

- Pronunciation: uh-sij-oo-uhs/ असिड्वस्ली
- Part of Speech: Adverb
- Meaning: with great care and perseverance.
- Synonyms: diligently, industriously, sedulously, strenuously
- Antonyms: casually, indolently, negligently, inattentively, inadvertently
- Usage in a Sentence: They labour assiduously for the benefit of future generations.

#### 54. Word: Courting (प्रणय निवेदन)

- Pronunciation: kawrt/ कॉटिंग
- Part of Speech: Verb
- Meaning:
  - a. be involved with (someone) romantically, with the intention of marrying. b. pay special attention to (someone) in an attempt to win their support or favour. c. risk incurring (misfortune) because of one's behaviour.
- Synonyms: wooing, pursuing, inviting, attracting, provoking

- Synonyms: trouble spot, crisis point

- Pronunciation: ret-er-ik / रेटरिक
