1. Word: **Optimism** (आशावाद)

- Pronunciation: op-tuh-miz-uhm/ ऑप्टमिज़म
- Part of Speech: Noun
- Meaning: hopefulness and confidence about the future or the success of something.
- Synonyms: hopefulness, brightness, positivity
- Antonyms: pessimism, gloom, despair, hopelessness
- Usage in a sentence: The air-pollution board has reacted with cautious **optimism** to the announcement.

2. Word: **Perpetrator** (अपराधकर्ता)

- Pronunciation: pur-pi-trey-ter/ पर्पट्रेटर
- Part of Speech: Noun
- Meaning: a person who carries out a harmful, illegal, or immoral act.
- Synonyms: offender, violator, culprit
- Antonym: victim
- Usage in a Sentence: The **perpetrators** of racially motivated violence must be punished.



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3. Word: **Evade** (ढलनल)

- Pronunciation: ih-veyd/ इवेड
- Part of Speech: Verb
- Meaning: escape or avoid (someone or something), especially by guile or trickery.
- Synonyms: avoid, escape, elude, dodge
- Antonyms: accept, confront, embrace, encounter
- Usage in a sentence: The opponent launches a front kick, which you **evade** by stepping back.

4. Word: **Pronounced** (सुस्पष्ट)

- Pronunciation: pruh-nounst/ प्रनलउन्स्ट
- Part of Speech: Adjective, Verb
- Meaning:
 - a. very noticeable or marked; conspicuous. (Adjective)
 - b. make the sound of (a word or part of a word) in the correct or a particular way. (Verb)
 - c. declare or announce in a formal or solemn way. (Verb)
- Synonyms: clear, prominent, noticeable, distinct
- Antonyms: faint, concealed, indefinite
- Usage in a sentence: The temperature change in winter is less **pronounced** in maritime areas.

5. Word: **Indictment** (अभियोग)

- Pronunciation: in-dahyt-muh nt/ इन्डलइट्मन्ट
- Part of Speech: Noun
- Meaning: a formal charge or accusation of a serious crime.
- Synonyms: charge, accusation, allegation
- Antonyms: justification, apology
- Usage in a sentence: This research is a terrible **indictment** on the medical profession.

6. Word: **Intimidation** (संत्रलस)

- Pronunciation: in-tim-i-dey-shuh n/ इन्टिमिडेशन
- Part of Speech: Noun
- Meaning: the action of intimidating someone, or the state of being intimidated.
- Synonyms: threat, bullying, menace
- Antonyms: fearlessness, fillip
- Usage in a sentence: The defendant complained of political **intimidation** during the investigation.

7. Word: **Tamper** (दखल करनल)

- Pronunciation: tam-per/ टैम्पर
- Part of Speech: Verb
- Meaning: interfere with (something) in order to cause damage or make unauthorized alterations.
- Synonyms: meddle, tinker
- Antonyms: improve, repair
- Usage in a Sentence: We should not **tamper** with others' affairs.

8. Word: **Acquit** (दोषमुक्त करनल)

- Pronunciation: uh-kwit/ अक्विट
- Part of Speech: Verb
- Meaning:
 - a. free (someone) from a criminal charge by a verdict of not guilty.
 - b. conduct oneself or perform in a specified way.
- Synonyms: absolve, exonerate, clear, excuse
- Antonyms: condemn, accuse, convict, denounce
- Usage in a sentence: The judge directed the jury to **acquit** all the defendants.

9. Word: **Genesis** (उत्पत्ति)

- Pronunciation: jen-uh-sis/ जेनिसिस
- Part of Speech: Noun
- Meaning: the origin or mode of formation of something.
- Synonyms: origin, beginning, birth, inception, commencement
- Antonyms: end, conclusion, completion
- Usage in a sentence: The part played by peasants in the **genesis** of the reform has long been disputed.

10. Word: **Breakthrough** (महत्वपूर्ण खोज)

- Pronunciation: breyk-throo/ ब्रेकथू
- Part of Speech: Noun
- Meaning:
 - a. a sudden, dramatic, and important discovery or development.
 - b. an instance of achieving success in a particular sphere or activity.
- Synonyms: find, improvement, innovation, revolution
- Antonyms: throwback, decline, impasse, digress
- Use in a Sentence: We have achieved a real **breakthrough** in the search for peace.

11. Word: **Lopsided** (असंतुलित, एकतरफ़ा)

- Pronunciation: lop-sahy-did/ लाप्साइडिड
- Part of Speech: Adjective
- Meaning: with one side lower or smaller than the other
- Synonyms: uneven, unequal, irregular, unbalanced, disproportionate, partial
- Antonyms: level, balanced, even
- Usage in a Sentence: After all, such **lopsided** enthusiasm indicates that you feel well equipped to tell judges how to do their jobs.

12. Phrase: **Cut from the same cloth**

- Pronunciation: कट फ़ॉम द सेम क्लॉथ
- Meaning: of the same nature; similar.
- Synonym: two of a kind
- Antonym: completely different
- Usage in a sentence: Back on the surface, not all ships are **cut from the same cloth**.

13. Word: **Cumulative** (संचयी)

- Pronunciation: kyoo-myuh-luh-tiv/ क्यूम्युलटिव
- Part of Speech: Adjective
- Meaning: increasing or increased in quantity, degree, or force by successive additions.
- Synonyms: increasing, accumulative, growing, progressive
- Antonyms: decreasing, declining, decremental
- Usage in a sentence: The **cumulative** effect of using so many chemicals on the land could be disastrous.

14. Word: **Pip** (बुरी तरह से पछाड़ देना)

- Pronunciation: pip/ पिप
- Part of Speech: Noun, Verb
- Meaning:
 - a small hard seed in a fruit. (Noun)
 - defeat by a small margin or at the last moment. (Verb)
- Synonyms: defeat, overthrow, conquer
- Antonyms: win, succeed, achieve
- Usage in a sentence: The ultimate deal-breaker, helped India **pip** Pakistan in the football match.

15. Word: **Linger** (रुका रहना)

- Pronunciation: ling-ger/ लिंगर
- Part of Speech: Verb
- Meaning:
 - stay in a place longer than necessary because of a reluctance to leave.
 - spend a long time over (something).
 - be slow to disappear or die.

- Synonyms: loiter, stay, remain, wait
- Antonyms: rush, hurry, leave
- Usage in a sentence: There's no need to **linger** over this stage of the interview.

16. Word: **Tussle** (कशमकश)

- Pronunciation: tuhs-uh l/ टसल
- Part of Speech: Noun, Verb
- Meaning:
 - a vigorous struggle or scuffle, typically in order to obtain or achieve something. (Noun)
 - engage in a vigorous struggle or scuffle. (Verb)
- Synonyms: fight, scuffle, struggle, skirmish, brawl
- Antonyms: agreement, consensus, accord
- Usage in a sentence: After quite a **tussle**, I finally wrenched the letter from him.

17. Word: **Agog** (उत्सुक)

- Pronunciation: uh-gog/ अगाग
- Part of Speech: Adjective
- Meaning: very eager or curious to hear or see something.
- Synonyms: eager, anxious, excited, keen
- Antonyms: spiritless, uninterested, lackadaisical, averse
- Usage in a sentence: I've been **agog** all afternoon, waiting for the next part of your story.

18. Phrase: **Dish out** (बांटना)

- Pronunciation: दिश आउट
- Meaning: to give or say things to people without thinking about them carefully
- Synonyms: distribute, deal, hand out, dispense, allocate
- Antonym: take
- Usage in a sentence: Ann's mother asked her to **dish out** the beans.

19. Word: **Engrossing** (चित्तकार्षक)

- Pronunciation: en-groh-sing/ एन्ग्रोसिंग
- Part of Speech: Adjective
- Meaning: absorbing all one's attention or interest.
- Synonyms: absorbing, fascinating, gripping, captivating
- Antonyms: boring, jejune, dreary
- Usage in a sentence: Walton is convincingly **engrossing**, and an elegant and forceful stylist.

20. Word: **Pièce de résistance** (सर्वोत्तम रचना)

- Pronunciation: pyes duh rey-zee-stahns/ पीएसडरज़ीस्टान्स
- Part of Speech: Noun
- Meaning: (especially with reference to creative work) the most important or remarkable feature.
- Synonyms: masterpiece, showpiece, prize
- Usage in a sentence: The waiter suggested we try the restaurant's **pièce de résistance**: the chocolate soufflé.

21. Word: **Thrilling** (रोमांचक)

- Pronunciation: thril-ing/ थ्रिलिंग
- Part of Speech: Adjective
- Meaning: causing excitement and pleasure; exhilarating.
- Synonyms: mind-blowing, exciting, exhilarating, amazing
- Antonyms: boring, unexciting, jejune, tiresome, dreary
- Usage in a Sentence: The match had a **thrilling** finale, with three goals scored in the last five minutes.

22. Word: **Iconic** (प्रतिष्ठित)

- Pronunciation: ahy-kon-ik/ आइकनिक
- Part of Speech: Adjective
- Meaning: relating to or of the nature of an icon.
- Synonyms: famous, emblematic, well-known, distinctive
- Antonyms: unrecognizable, unimportant, insignificant, unknown
- Usage in a Sentence: Apart from the **iconic** Venus flytrap, many other kinds of carnivorous plants exist.

23. Word: **Definitive** (निर्णायक)

- Pronunciation: dih-fin-i-tiv/ डिफिनिटिव
- Part of Speech: Adjective
- Meaning:
 - a. (of a conclusion or agreement) done or reached decisively and with authority.
 - b. (of a book or other text) the most authoritative of its kind.
- Synonyms: conclusive, final, ultimate; decisive, unconditional,
- Antonyms: doubtful, inconclusive, ambiguous
- Usage in a Sentence: The **definitive** version of the text is ready to be published.

24. Word: **Pulsate** (कम्पायमान होना)

- Pronunciation: puhl-seyt/ पल्सेट
- Part of Speech: Verb
- Meaning:
 - a. expand and contract with strong regular movements.
 - b. produce a regular throbbing sensation or sound.
 - c. be very exciting.
- Synonyms: beat, pulsate, vibrate, pump, undulate, hammer
- Antonyms: defuse, desist, exude, repair
- Usage in a Sentence: The thumping, **pulsating** music shook the kitchen walls.

25. Word: **Demeanour** (आचरण)

- Pronunciation: dih-mee-ner/ डिमीनर
- Part of Speech: Noun
- Meaning: outward behaviour or bearing.
- Synonyms: manner, air, attitude, appearance, conduct
- Antonyms: deter, indecency, annihilation, indisposition
- Usage in a Sentence: While not exactly threatening, her **demeanour** was hard and off-putting.

26. Word: **Detract** (घटाना)

- Pronunciation: dih-trakt/ डिट्रैक्ट
- Part of Speech: Verb
- Meaning:
 - a. diminish the worth or value of (a quality or achievement).
 - b. cause someone or something to be distracted or diverted from.
- Synonyms: diminish, disparage, depreciate, belittle
- Antonyms: increase, boost, aggrandize, contribute
- Usage in a Sentence: Her striking mannerisms **detract** from the reality of the character.

27. Word: **Vanquish** (पराजित करना)

- Pronunciation: vang-kwish/ वैंगक्विश
- Part of Speech: Verb
- Meaning: defeat thoroughly.
- Synonyms: conquer, defeat, beat, crush
- Antonyms: surrender, fail, lose
- Usage in a Sentence: Courage alone cannot **vanquish** all evils.

28. Word: **Storied** (दास्तानी)

- Pronunciation: stawr-eed/ स्टोरीड
- Part of Speech: Adjective

- Meaning: celebrated in or associated with stories or legends.
 - Synonyms: celebrated, legendary, fabulous
 - Antonyms: inglorious, infamous
 - Usage in a Sentence: The **storied** intelligence agency was reorganized twice after the fall of the Soviet Union, finally becoming the Federal Security Service of the Russian Federation.
29. Word: **Testament** (इच्छापत्र)
- Pronunciation: tes-tuh-muh nt/ टेस्टमन्ट
 - Part of Speech: Noun
 - Meaning:
 - a. a person's will, especially the part relating to personal property.
 - b. something that serves as a sign or evidence of a specified fact, event, or quality.
 - c. (in biblical use) a covenant or dispensation.
 - Synonyms: evidence, will, testimony, confirmation
 - Antonyms: rebuttal, denial, repudiation, contradiction
 - Usage in a Sentence: The aircraft's safety record is a **testament** to its designers' skill.
30. Word: **Meltdown** (पूर्णगलन)
- Pronunciation: melt-doun/ मेल्टडाउन
 - Part of Speech: Noun
 - Meaning:
 - a. a disastrous collapse or breakdown.
 - b. an uncontrolled emotional outburst or a mental collapse.
 - Synonyms: breakdown, collapse, crash
 - Usage in a Sentence: The last few months have seen the progressive **meltdown** of the country's political system.
31. Word: **Compile** (एकत्र करना)
- Pronunciation: kuh m-pahyl/ कम्पाइल
 - Part of Speech: Verb
 - Meaning: produce (a list or book) by assembling information collected from other sources.
 - Synonyms: collect, gather, assemble, accumulate, compose, amass
 - Antonyms: scatter, disassemble, separate, disperse
 - Usage in a Sentence: It takes years of hard work to **compile** a good dictionary.
32. Word: **Purge** (परिशोध)
- Pronunciation: purj/ पर्ज
- Part of Speech: Verb, Noun
 - Meaning:
 - a. rid (someone or something) of an unwanted quality, condition, or feeling. (Verb)
 - b. remove (a group of people considered undesirable) from an organization or place in an abrupt or violent way. (Verb)
 - c. an abrupt or violent removal of a group of people. (Noun)
 - Synonyms: clear, purify, cleanse, purification
 - Antonyms: contaminate, maintain, corrupt
 - Usage in a Sentence: The judge ordered Vineet to **purge** his contempt by apologizing to the court.
33. Word: **Insurgent** (विद्रोही/बागी)
- Pronunciation: in-sur-juhnt/ इन्सर्जन्ट
 - Part of Speech: Noun, Adjective
 - Meaning:
 - a. a person fighting against a government or invading force; a rebel or revolutionary. [Noun]
 - b. rising in active revolt. [Adjective]
 - Synonyms: rebel, recusant, revolutionary
 - Antonyms: obedient, loyal, loyalist
 - Usage in a sentence: It was also a fight to consolidate his position within the **insurgent**.
34. Word: **Anachronistic** (कालभ्रमित)
- Pronunciation: uh-nak-ruh-nis-tik/ एनाक्रोनिस्टिक
 - Part of Speech: Adjective
 - Meaning: belonging to a period other than that being portrayed.
 - Synonyms: outdated, obsolete, tardy, incongruous
 - Antonyms: synchronous, current, contemporary
 - Usage in a Sentence: Some companies are keeping their options open on retaining or dumping **anachronistic** names.
35. Word: **Wrath** (प्रचण्ड क्रोध)
- Pronunciation: rath/ रैथ
 - Part of Speech: Noun
 - Meaning: extreme anger
 - Synonyms: rage, anger, fury, outrage
 - Antonyms: happiness, calmness, peace, delight
 - Usage in a Sentence: Jane braved the **wrath** of her parents by refusing to marry the man they had chosen.

36. Word: **Premise (परिसर)**

- Pronunciation: prem-is/ प्रेमसज़
- Part of Speech: Noun, Verb
- Meaning:
 - a. a house or building, together with its land and outbuildings, occupied by a business or considered in an official context. (Noun)
 - b. a previous statement or proposition from which another is inferred or follows as a conclusion. (Noun)
 - c. base an argument, theory, or undertaking on. (Verb)
- Synonyms: area, place, place, assumptions, assumptions
- Usage in a Sentence: Unaccompanied children are not allowed on the **premises** of the building.

37. Word: **Systematic (सुनियोजित)**

- Pronunciation: sis-tuh-mat-ik/ सिस्टमैटिक
- Part of Speech: Adjective
- Meaning: done or acting according to a fixed plan or system; methodical.
- Synonyms: regular, methodical, organized, consistent
- Antonyms: unsystematic, unsystematic, disorderly
- Usage in a Sentence: They had not found any evidence of a **systematic** attempt to rig the ballot.

38. Word: **Interference (हस्तक्षेप)**

- Pronunciation: in-ter-feer-uh ns/ इन्टर्फिरन्स
- Part of Speech: Noun
- Meaning: the action of interfering or the process of being interfered with.
- Synonyms: disturbance, hindrance, intervention, impediment
- Antonyms: aid, help, support
- Usage in a Sentence: The USA will not tolerate any external **interference** in its domestic affairs.

39. Word: **Reputation (प्रतिष्ठा)**

- Pronunciation: rep-yuh-tey-shuhn/ रेप्युटेशन
- Part of Speech: Noun
- Meaning: the beliefs or opinions that are generally held about someone or something.
- Synonyms: fame, repute, prestige, distinction
- Antonyms: discredit, disgrace, disrepute, dishonour
- Usage in a Sentence: The rumours will do untold damage to his **reputation**.

40. Word: **Pluralist (बहुलतावादी)**

- Pronunciation: ploo r-uh-lizt/ प्लुरलिस्ट
- Part of Speech: Noun, Adjective
- Meaning:
 - a. an advocate of a system in which two or more states, groups, principles, sources of authority, etc., coexist. (Noun)
 - b. relating to or advocating a system in which two or more states, groups, principles, sources of authority, etc., coexist. (Adjective)
- Synonyms: multi-party, diverse, multiplicity
- Usage in a Sentence: A **pluralist** society allows its members to freely express their beliefs.

41. Word: **Reprieve (दण्डविराम)**

- Pronunciation: ri-preev/ रिप्रीव
- Part of Speech: Verb, Noun
- Meaning:
 - a. cancel or postpone the punishment of (someone, especially someone condemned to death). [Verb]
 - b. a cancellation or postponement of a punishment. [Noun]
- Synonyms: pardon, release, respite
- Antonyms: punish, charge, blame
- Usage in a sentence: The family has won a temporary **reprieve** from eviction.

42. Word: **Convict (अपराधी/ अपराधी ठहराना)**

- Pronunciation: kuh n-vikt/ कन्विक्ट
- Part of Speech: Verb, Noun
- Meaning:
 - a. declare (someone) to be guilty of a criminal offence by the verdict of a jury or the decision of a judge in a court of law. (Verb)
 - b. a person found guilty of a criminal offence and serving a sentence of imprisonment. (Noun)
- Synonyms: condemn, sentence, prisoner, condemned
- Antonyms: release, victim, acquit, absolve
- Usage in a Sentence: She walked through, feeling like a condemned **convict**.

43. Word: **Breach (विच्छेद/ दरार करना)**

- Pronunciation: breech/ ब्रीच
- Part of Speech: Noun, Verb
- Meaning:
 - a. an act of breaking or failing to observe a law, agreement, or code of conduct. (Noun)
 - b. a gap in a wall, barrier, or defence,

especially one made by an attacking army. (Noun)
 c. make a gap in and break through (a wall, barrier, or defence). (Verb)
 d. break or fail to observe (a law, agreement, or code of conduct). (Verb)

- Synonyms: violate, break, infringe
- Antonyms: bridge, fulfil, warranty
- Usage in a Sentence: A **breach** in the mountain wall permits warm sea air to penetrate inland.

44. Word: **Contention** (कलह)

- Pronunciation: kuhn-ten-shuhn/ कन्टेन्शन
- Part of Speech: Noun
- Meaning:
 - a. heated disagreement.
 - b. an assertion, especially one maintained in argument.
- Synonyms: conflict, disagreement, dispute, disputation, argument, variance
- Antonyms: peace, agreement, serenity, harmony
- Usage in a Sentence:
 - a. There is no **contention** between the two groups.
 - b. Columbus's **contention** that the earth was round turned out to be correct.

45. Word: **Espionage** (चारवृत्ति)

- Pronunciation: es-pee-uh-nahzh/ एस्पीअनाज
- Part of Speech: Noun
- Meaning: the practice of spying or of using spies, typically by governments to obtain political and military information.
- Synonyms: spying, surveillance, secret service
- Usage in a Sentence: The authorities have arrested several people suspected of espionage.

46. Word: **Castigate** (दण्ड देना)

- Pronunciation: kas-ti-geyt/ कैस्टगेट
- Part of Speech: Verb
- Meaning: reprimand (someone) severely.
- Synonyms: punish, reprimand, scold
- Antonyms: celebrate, praise, laud
- Usage in a Sentence: She could not find sufficient reproaches with which to **castigate** herself.

47. Word: **Annul** (रद्द करना)

- Pronunciation: uh-nuhl/ अनल
- Part of Speech: Verb

- Meaning: declare invalid (an official agreement, decision, or result).
- Synonyms: cancel, quash, nullify, revoke
- Antonyms: validate, confirm, continue
- Usage in a Sentence: His second marriage was **annulled** because he never divorced his first wife.

48. Word: **Precedent** (उदाहरण/ अग्रगामी)

- Pronunciation: pres-i-duh nt/ प्रेसिडन्ट
- Part of Speech: Noun, Adjective
- Meaning:
 - a. an earlier event or action that is regarded as an example or guide to be considered in subsequent similar circumstances. [Noun]
 - b. preceding in time, order, or importance. [Adjective]
- Synonyms: model, example, preceding
- Antonyms: after, following, later
- Usage in a sentence: The judgment on pension rights has established a **precedent**.

49. Word: **Emulate** (अनुकरण करना)

- Pronunciation: em-yuh-leyt/ एम्युलेट
- Part of Speech: Verb
- Meaning: match or surpass (a person or achievement), typically by imitation.
- Synonyms: imitate, mimic, follow
- Antonyms: neglect, disregard, divest
- Usage in a Sentence: The organisers hope the unofficial event will **emulate** last weekend's annual rugby sevens tournament.

50. Word: **Implement** (उपकरण/ कार्यान्वित करना)

- Pronunciation: im-pluh-muh nt/ इम्प्लमेन्ट
- Part of Speech: Noun, Verb
- Meaning:
 - a. a tool, utensil, or other piece of equipment that is used for a particular purpose. (Noun)
 - b. put (a decision, plan, agreement, etc.) into effect. (Verb)
- Synonyms: carry out, apply, fulfil, execute
- Antonyms: cancel, exempt, reject
- Usage in a Sentence: The government promised to **implement** a new system to control financial loan institutions.

51. Word: **Propel** (उकसाना)

- Pronunciation: pruh-pel / प्रपेल
- Part of Speech: Verb
- Meaning: drive or push something forwards.
- Synonyms: thrust, drive, push
- Antonyms: restrain, hold, keep

- Usage in a sentence: We must first calculate the horse-power needed to **propel** the ship.
52. Word: **Hinterland** (अंतर्क्षेत्र)
- Pronunciation: hin-ter-land/ हिन्टर्लैन्ड
 - Part of Speech: Noun
 - Meaning:
 - a. the remote areas of a country away from the coast or the banks of major rivers.
 - b. an area lying beyond what is visible or known.
 - Synonyms: interior, outback, countryside, remote areas
 - Antonyms: urban centre, metropolitan area, heartland
 - Usage in a Sentence: The trade between the Adriatic ports & their **hinterland** has grown.
53. Word: **Channelise** (दिशा देना)
- Pronunciation: chan-l-ahyz/ चैनलाइज़
 - Part of Speech: Verb
 - Meaning: direct towards a particular end or object.
 - Synonyms: manoeuvre, steer, direct, guide
 - Usage in a Sentence: An idea is a force which when nurtured and cultivated would **channelise** the events to initiate the process of achievement.
54. Word: **Disparity** (विषमता)
- Pronunciation: dih-spar-i-tee/ डिस्पैरिटी
 - Part of Speech: Noun
 - Meaning: a great difference.
 - Synonyms: discrepancy, difference, dissimilarity, distinction
 - Antonyms: similarity, likeness, agreement, correspondence
 - Usage in a Sentence: There is a great **disparity** between the amount of work that I do and what I get paid for it.
55. Word: **Coercive** (बलपूर्वक)
- Pronunciation: co-ar-cive/ कोअर्सिव
 - Part of Speech: Adjective
 - Meaning: relating to or using force or threats.
 - Synonyms: authoritarian, imperious, high-handed.
 - Antonyms: conditional ,constitutional ,discretionary
 - Usage in a Sentence: The president relied on the **coercive** powers of the military.
56. Word: **Foray** (आक्रमण करना)
- Pronunciation: fawr-ey/ फॉरे

- Part of Speech: Noun
 - Meaning: a sudden attack or incursion into enemy territory, especially to obtain something; a raid.
 - Synonyms: despoil, charge, attack
 - Antonyms: idleness, relax
 - Usage in a Sentence: After an unsuccessful **foray** into diplomacies, Sham went back to his law practice.
57. Word: **Liability** (उत्तरदायित्व)
