1. Asia's Largest Solar Power Project – Rewa Solar Project in Madhya Pradesh

- The 750 MW ultra-solar power plant spread over 1,590 acres.
- It comprises multiple (3) solar generation units of 250MW which are located on around 500-hectare area within the 1500-hectare solar plant.
- The project has been built by Rewa Ultra Mega Solar Limited (RUMSL) which is a joint venture between Solar Energy Corporation of India (SECI) and Madhya Pradesh Urja Vikas Nigam Limited (MPUVN).

2. Indian Railways has set up Solar Plant in Bina, MP. It is now the 1st Organization in the World to Directly Supply Power to Railway Overhead Line.

3. World bank and central government have collaborated to convert the ravines of Chambal area into tillable land.

4. “Hamara Ghar-Hamara Vidyalaya” scheme

- The scheme provides a school like environment to the children taught at their home through online classes. iii. Under the scheme the school bells will be heard in the student's house and the teachers will begin the class of the students after the bell.
- The class timing will be for 3 hours from 10.00am to 1.00pm with 1 hour class for each subject.
- The scheme aims to provide the subject enhancement for the teachers of primary and secondary classes until class 8th.

5. Madhya Pradesh has started “Intzaar Aap Ka” Social Media Campaign to Attract Tourists.

- IntzaarAapKa which literally means waiting for you, is the campaign to promote the tour packages prepared by the tourism board with various guidelines regarding the pandemic situation.
- The board invites tourists on a safe trip to various religious and adventure tourist locations in the state of MP.

6. MP Govt has Launched '**Roko -Toko**', a Campaign for those who do not Wear Masks in the ongoing pandemic situation.

7. Madhya Pradesh Governor Lalji Tandon died at age of 85.

- He was the 28th Governor of Bihar.
- He was the 22nd Governor of Madhya Pradesh and he took charge of the office on July 20, 2019.
- He was elected to the 15th Lok Sabha from the Lucknow constituency in May, 2009
