Essay has three main components namely: Introduction, Body and Conclusion

Introduction

We can start the introduction with some **anecdote, quotes, data from some organization or speech** of famous personality.

Body

- The body consists of a detailed analysis of the topic. We can approach the body in various ways. For example,
 - Political, Economic, Social, Technological, Legal and Environmental (**PESTLE approach**)
 - Individual, family, community, societal, institutional and state level
 - Past-present-future level (**Period of time**)
- The flow between the paragraphs needs to be maintained. Analysis should contain a critical evaluation of the topic.
- Give **contemporary examples** and relevant data to support it.
- Allocate appropriate space for **positive and negative arguments**.
- **Be positive** even **while writing negative points** (you should be hopeful even in the most tragic situation).
- **Don't** criticise constitutional establishments. Be politically neutral and gender-sensitive.

Conclusion

A conclusion should reflect the vision of the candidate. Examiner should feel that the candidate is able **to see the big picture of the topic**. A conclusion should contain hope, courage, the positive and innovative mindset of a candidate. Also, we can end the essay by some inspiring and successful story of change.



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
