

Daily Word Power Series Day 23





Incessant (adjective): uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing

Synonym: ceaseless, unceasing, etc. Antonym: occasional, intermittent, etc.

Example: The incessant crying of a baby drives me nuts!

Learning Tricks: In (means not) + Cessa sounds like Cease (means To Stop); which does

not stop, and continues forever, hence uninterrupted and Unceasing.

Ascendancy (noun): the state that exists when one person or group has power over

another

Synonym: dominance, supremacy, etc.

Antonym: subordination

Example: The position of president comes with an ascendancy that has the authority to

speak on behalf of an entire nation.

Learning Tricks: Ascend means to rise, so as you rise you gain power and then you

dance. This is Ascendancy.

Disenfranchise (verb): deprive of voting rights

Synonym: abstain

Antonym:

Example: They disenfranchised poor people by making property ownership a requirement

for registering to vote.

Learning Tricks: Franchise means right to freedom. disfranchise means restricted

freedom; deprived of voting.

Discriminate (verb): recognize or perceive the difference

Synonym: differentiate, distinguish Antonym: confound, mingle, etc.

Example: My employer is a fair man who does not discriminate and treats everyone as his

egual.

Learning Tricks: Descri+minate= 'describe' in one minute. When someone can describe

something in one minute he can distinguish that.

Ingenuity (noun): the power of creative imagination

Synonym: inventiveness, creativity

Antonym: uncreativeness

Example: When Jack fixed the jeep, his friends were impressed with his mechanical

ingenuity.

Learning Tricks: 'Ingen' can be related to an 'engine' which is clever or skillful work

Obdurate (adjective): unable to be persuaded or moved emotionally; stubborn;

unyielding.

Synonym: stubborn, unbending, etc. Antonym: amenable, compliant

Example: Sometimes, you are too obdurate for your own good!

Learning Tricks: Ob+durate (Relate it to word durability) so anything which has

durability; has the resisting power and something which can resist, is stubborn.

Respite (noun): a pause from doing something (as work)

Synonym: rest, break Antonym: activity, change

Example: The land prospered rapidly during this respite from the horrors of war.

Learning Tricks: It's like Tarik pe Tarik which is Respite pe Respite.





Avid (adjective): marked by active interest and enthusiasm

Synonym: keen, eager, etc.

Antonym: apathetic

Example: Just a short drive from town there is a wetland area that is a haven for avid bird

watchers.

Learning Tricks: A person is always eager to be in avid (a video).

Elusive (adjective): difficult to capture or difficult to remember

Synonym: evasive Antonym: available

Example: She wanted something as **elusive** as the scent.

Learning Tricks: Illusive things are always difficult to understand.

Degrade (verb): reduce in worth or character, usually verbally

Synonym: debase, devalue Antonym: dignify, proud, etc

Example: He felt **degraded** by their remarks.

Learning Tricks: de(belittle)+grade means reduce the word of something
