

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###ANSWERS###

1. Ans. A.
Indefinite Adjectives- Like the articles a and an, indefinite adjectives are used to discuss non-specific things. You might recognize them, since they're formed from indefinite pronouns. The most common indefinite adjectives are any, many, no, several, and few. Option A is the most viable response.

2. Ans. C.
Adjectives usually occur in a specific order. Otherwise, the sentence will not convey the information correctly. Usually, the accepted correct order of adjective is Quantity, Quality, Size, Age, Shape, Colour, Purpose.

In this statement, the speaker said that they met two very smart people. So out of these three

Adjective (smart, very, two) by order of Adjectives; 'two' will come first as it describe the number of people followed by 'very smart.'

3. Ans. A.
'her' and 'eye'. 'An' here is an adverb.

4. Ans. A.
is the correct answer: garrulous and busy.

5. Ans. C.
is the correct answer: soon-to-be, ecstatic and his

6. Ans. B.
The error is because of the usage of 'much'. We use 'much' for non-countable nouns while 'many' for countable nouns. Here, 'countries' is a countable noun, therefore, 'many' must be used instead of 'much'. Hence, **option B** is the correct answer.

7. Ans. B.
The sentence requires an adjective before the noun 'questions'. However, an adverb is used before it which is erroneous. It should be replaced with '**awkward**' which means 'causing difficulty; hard to do or deal with' to make the sentence grammatically correct. Therefore, **option B** is the correct answer.

8. Ans. B.

The usage of 'more better' is incorrect here. 'Better' is an adjective in the comparative degree and the usage of 'more' before it is redundant. Thus, 'more' should be eliminated to make the sentence grammatically correct. We can also use the determiner "much" here to increase the degree of comparison. In that case, it will be "much better".

Thus, **option B** is the correct answer.

9. Ans. A.

When you use an article with a superlative adjective (here it is earliest), it is always preceded by the definite article (the) rather than 'a' or 'an'.

Using a superlative adjective inherently indicates that you are talking about a specific item or items.

Therefore, **option A** is the correct answer.

10. Ans. C.

The error is because of the usage of 'farther'.

'Farther' refers to a greater physical distance, a distance that has been measured while '**further**' describes something that is beyond or additional.

Therefore, 'further' must be replaced with 'farther' to form a grammatically correct sentence.

Hence, **option C** is the correct answer.

11. Ans. B.

Option "B" is the right answer. Use "more than" in place of "more of". "More" is a comparative word it always takes preposition "than" after it.

12. Ans. C.

Option "C" is the right answer. Use "any" in place of "no". We always use "any" in negative sentences. Two negatives in a sentence cannot be used.

13. Ans. C.

Option "C" is the right answer. Use "a novel worth reading" in place of "a worth reading novel". Some adjectives are used after nouns. See example

E.g. I found a child asleep (R)

I found an asleep child (W)

14. Ans. B.



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Option "B" is the right answer. Use "many" in place of "much". We use "many" with countable nouns plural and "much" with uncountable nouns.

15. Ans. D.

The given sentence is correct.

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
