

National Multidimensional Poverty Index (MPI)



- National Multidimensional Poverty Index (MPI): Baseline Report based on National Family Health Survey (NFHS)-4 (2015-16) has been developed by NITI Aayog
- According to **Global MPI 2021**, India's rank is 66 out of 109 countries.
- **Bihar** has the highest proportion of people, at 51.91 percent of the state's population, who are multidimensionally poor, followed by Jharkhand at 42.16 percent and Uttar Pradesh at 37.79 percent.
- **Kerala** registered the lowest population poverty levels (0.71%), followed by Goa (3.76%) and Sikkim (3.82%).
- Among the **Union Territories** (**UTs**), Dadra and Nagar Haveli (27.36 percent), Jammu & Kashmir, and Ladakh (12.58), Daman & Diu (6.82 percent) and Chandigarh (5.97 percent), have emerged as the poorest UTs in India.
- The proportion of poor in Puducherry at 1.72 percent is the lowest among the Union Territories, followed by Lakshadweep at 1.82 percent, Andaman & Nicobar Islands at 4.30 percent and Delhi at 4.79 percent.

November 27, National Organ Donation Day



- National Organ Donation Day is celebrated on 27th November every year.
- It is being celebrated on 27th of November every year in India since 2010.
- The total number of organ transplants done per year in the country has increased from 4990 in the year 2013 to 12746 in the year 2019 and India now ranks third in the world only behind the US and China as per the data available on the Global Observatory on Donation and Transplantation (GODT) website.
- Similarly, the organ donation rate has increased to about four times as compared to 2012-13.
