Kerala wins award for 'city with most sustainable transport system'

Why in News

 Kerala has won the award for the 'city with the most sustainable transport system'.

Key Points

- The award has been given in recognition of the projects implemented like Kochi Metro, Water Metro and e-mobility — to enhance the transport facilities in the city of Kochi.
- The formation of the Kochi Open Mobility Network, which digitized and integrated various transport facilities, also helped to win the award.
- The award would be presented in Delhi by **Union Minister for Housing and Urban Affairs Hardeep Singh Puri.**
- The **award** is given in recognition of the transport facilities in various states and Union Territories of India.

Uttar Pradesh to rename Faizabad Railway Junction as Ayodhya Cantt

Why in News

• The Uttar Pradesh government has decided to rename the Faizabad Railway Junction as Ayodhya Cantt Railway Station.

Key Points

• According to the procedure, the state government sends a proposal to the Ministry of Home Affairs, from where it goes to the Railway Board for final implementation.

Note:

- Earlier in 2018, the Yogi Adityanath government had renamed Faizabad as Ayodhya.
- The UP government had also changed the name of Allahabad to Prayagraj and the Central government had changed Mughalsarai Railway Junction as Pt Deen Dayal Upadhyay Junction.

India's 1st State government-owned Wildlife DNA testing lab inaugurated in Nagpur Why in News

 Maharashtra Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray inaugurated India's 1st State government-owned Wildlife DNA testing laboratoryat Regional Forensic Science Laboratory (RFSL) in Nagpur, Maharashtra.

Key Points

• At present, there are 2 central government-owned Wildlife DNA testing laboratories at Dehradun & Hyderabad.

Note:

• CM Uddhav Thackeray also launched **3 Fast Track DNA testing units** in Mumbai and Pune under the Central Government's **Nirbhaya Scheme to test human DNA samples.**

• The Labs will be exclusively dealing with cases registered under **Protection of Children From Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act, 2012.**

Bhaskarabda to be used in official Assam calendar Why in News

- The **Assam Government** has announced that **Bhaskarabda (Luni-Solar Calendar)** will be used in the official calendar by the state.
- Presently, the Assam government officially uses the **Saka calendar** and the **Gregorian calendar**.

Key Points

- Bhaskarabda, an era counted from the date of the ascension of a 7th-century local ruler, will be added to the Saka and Gregorian in the official calendar of the Assam government.
- The Bhaskarabda calendar differs from the Gregorian calendar by 593 years.
- Bhaskarabda began when Kumar Bhaskaravarman was crowned ruler of the Kamrupa kingdom. He was a contemporary and political ally of northern Indian ruler Harshavardhana.

- Vikram Samvat (Hindu lunar calendar)
- Saka Samvat (Hindu Solar calendar)

PM Modi inaugurates Kushinagar International Airport Why in News

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated Kushinagar International Airport in Uttar Pradesh.
- He participated in an event marking **Abhidhamma Day** at the Mahaparinirvana Temple in Kushinagar.
- He laid the foundation stone of Rajkiya Medical College, Kushinagar.

Key Points

- The Kushinagar International Airport, built at a cost of Rs 260 crore, has the state's longest runway with a length of 3.2 km and a width of 45 metres.
- With this, Uttar Pradesh now has 3 international airports.
- Apart from the Kushinagar International Airport, the two operational international airports are -- Chaudhary Charan Singh International Airport at Lucknow and Lal Bahadur Shastri International Airport at Varanasi.
- Kushinagar is the centre of the Buddhist Circuit.
- This region is witness to the entire journey from the **enlightenment of Lord Buddha to Mahaparinirvana.**

About Buddhist Circuit:

- In 2014-15, the Ministry of Tourism launched the Swadesh Darshan scheme with a vision to develop theme-based tourist circuits on the principles of high tourist value.
- The Ministry has identified Buddhist Circuit as one of the fifteen thematic circuits for development under the scheme.
- The Buddhist circuit is a route that follows in the footsteps of the Buddha from Lumbini in Nepal to Kushinagar in Uttar Pradesh in India, where he died.

Mount Harriet in Andaman to be named Mount Manipur Why in News

- The Central government has decided to rename **Mount Harriet**, an island peak in Andaman and Nicobar islands as a tribute to the **freedom fighters of Manipur.**
- It will now be known as **Mount Manipur.**

Key Points

- Manipur played a significant role in resisting the British in the Northeast during the 1857 revolution and in 1891.
- **Mount Harriet,** the third-highest island peak in Andaman and Nicobar islands, where Manipur's Maharaja Kulchandra Singh and 22 other freedom fighters were imprisoned during the Anglo-Manipuri war (1891).

New Species of Onion 'Allium Negianum' discovered in India Why in News

- A plant discovered in **Uttarakhand** has been newly confirmed as a new species of Allium the genus that includes many staple foods such as onion and garlic, among 1,100 species worldwide.
- The scientific name Allium Negianum honours the late Dr Kuldeep Singh Negi, an explorer and Allium collector.

Key Points

- The new species found in Uttarakhand is described in journal the PhytoKeys.
- It grows at 3,000 to 4,800 m above sea level and can be found along open grassy meadows, sandy soils along rivers, and streams forming in snow pasture lands along alpine meadows.
- With a narrow distribution, this newly described species is restricted to the region of western Himalayas.

Punjab Chief Minister launches 'Mera Ghar Mere Naam' Scheme Why in News

- Punjab Chief Minister Charanjit Singh Channi launched 'Mera Ghar Mere Naam' Scheme to give ownership rights to people living in houses within the "Lal Lakir" of villages and cities.
- "Lal Lakir" refers to land that is part of the village habitation and is used for non-agriculture purposes only.

Key Points

- 'Mera Ghar Mere Naam' Scheme will give much needed assistance to all the people, especially those from needy and underprivileged strata.
- Earlier this scheme was launched only for the residents of villages but now it is being extended to the eligible residents of the cities within the "Lal Lakir".
- All the eligible residents after proper identification or verification will be given the property cards (sanads) to give ownership rights to them in a time-bound manner.

- Actor Sonu Sood had been appointed as the brand ambassador for the programme. Key Points
- Under this programme, the 9 lakh students of classes 9 to 12 in Delhi government schools will be connected with noteworthy citizens who will offer them career and general guidance.
- Interested citizens from across the country can become mentors by registering on the **Desh Ke Mentors app.**
- The app was developed by a team from **Delhi Technological University (DTU).**

Jim Corbett National Park may be renamed as Ramganga National Park Why in News

• **Jim Corbett National Park**, a world-renowned tiger reserve in Uttarakhand, may be renamed as **Ramganga National Park** in the future.

Key Points

- Union Minister of State for Forest and Environment Ashwini Kumar Choubey hinted about the change in name of India's first national park.
- However, for some time in between it was also named Ramganga National Park as the Ramganga, a tributary of the Ganges, passes through it.

About Jim Corbett National Park:

- Jim Corbett National Park is a national park in India located in the Nainital district of Uttarakhand state.
- It is spread over an area of about 521 km.
- The first national park in India, it was established in 1936 and named Haily National Park after a governor of the United Provinces in which it was then located.
- In 1956, it was renamed Corbett National Park after the hunter and naturalist Jim Corbett.

The park was the first to

come under the Project Tiger initiative.

Note: It is one of the thirteen protected areas covered by the **World Wide Fund For Nature** under their Terai Arc Landscape Program

Telangana develops India's first smartphone-based eVoting solution Why in News

 Telangana government has developed the country's first smartphone-based eVoting solution.

Key Points

- The solution has been successfully developed and tested and its dry run in the form of a dummy election is being conducted in Khammam district and the dummy voting on October 20, 2021.
- The initiative has been driven by the Telangana State Election Commission (TSEC) with the implementation support of the Emerging Technologies Wing of the IT Department of the State and the Centre for Development of Advanced Computing (CDAC).

Nationwide River Ranching Programme launched in Uttar Pradesh Why in News

- The Union Minister for Fisheries, Animal Husbandry & Dairying, Parshottam Rupala launched the River Ranching Programme at Brijghat, Garh Mukteshwar, Uttar Pradesh.
- At the same time, other 4 states namely, **Uttarakhand, Orissa, Tripura and Chhattisgarh** also participated in the nationwide River Ranching Program.

Key Points

- Total 5 states have participated in the National Level River Ranching program launching and a total of **8.85 lakh fingerlings** were ranched.
- "River Ranching Programme" is introduced as a special activity under the Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana (PMMSY) scheme.
- The Department of Fisheries, Ministry of Fisheries has designated **National Fisheries Development Board, Hyderabad** as the Nodal Agency under the Central Sector component of PMMSY for implementing River Ranching across the Country.

New Tiger Reserve in Chhattisgarh Why in News

- The National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA) approved the Chhattisgarh government's proposal to declare the combined areas of the Guru Ghasidas National Park and Tamor Pingla Wildlife Sanctuary as a Tiger Reserve.
- The new Reserve is located in the northern part of the state, bordering Madhya Pradesh and Jharkhand.
- This will be the **fourth Tiger Reserve in Chhattisgarh**, after the Udanti-Sitanadi, Achanakmar, and Indravati Reserves.
- It will be the 53rd of the country's Tiger Reserve.

Key Points

- The proposal was considered by the 11th Technical Committee of the NTCA on September 1, and approval was granted a month later under Section 38V (1) of The Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972.
- The Tamor Pingla Wildlife Sanctuary was identified as part of the Sarguja Jashpur Elephant Reserve in 2011.
- The Guru Ghasidas National Park used to be part of the Sanjay National Park in undivided Madhya Pradesh.
- Guru Ghasidas National Park is in Koriya district; Tamor Pingla is in Surajpur district in the northwestern corner of Chhattisgarh.

New Pamban Bridge, India's first vertical lift Railway Sea Bridge Why in News

• The **new Pamban Bridge in Rameswaram, Tamil Nadu**, is the country's first vertical lift Railway Sea Bridge, which is expected to be ready for use by March 2022.

Key Points

- The New Pamban Bridge is being developed by Railway Vikas Nigam Limited.
- The new bridge, which would be 2.07 kilometres long, will be a boon for devotees and pilgrims who wish to embark on a spiritual tour to Rameswaram and Dhanushkodi, Tamil Nadu.
- The existing Pamban Bridge was India's first sea bridge and became operational in 1914.

Varanasi to become first Indian city to start ropeway service in public transportation Why in News

• Varanasi will soon become the first Indian city to use ropeway services in public transportation.

Key Points

- The world's third and India's first public transport ropeway is proposed to be constructed from Cantt Railway Station (Varanasi Junction) to Church Square (Godauliya) to ease the traffic congestion.
- The commencement of this ropeway will give easy access to Kashi Vishwanath Temple and Dashashwamedh Ghat.

- The famed white onion of Alibag in Maharashtra's Raigad district was given the Geographical Indication (GI) tag, for its unique sweet taste, no-tears factor, as well as its medicinal properties.
- Wada Kolam, also known as Zini or Jhini rice, is a traditional variety grown in Wada in Palghar district of Maharashtra, with the grain being off white in colour.

- Chinnor rice produced in Balaghat district, Madhya Pradesh got GI tag.

Key Points

152 SAKSHAM Centres launched

Why in News

 As part of Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav, a total of 152 Centre for Financial Literacy & Service Delivery (SAKSHAM Centres) across 77 districts of 13 states launched under Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana - National Rural Livelihoods Mission (DAY-NRLM) of the Ministry of Rural Development.

Key Points

About SAKSHAM Centres:

- Centre for Financial Literacy & Service Delivery (CFL&SD) would act as a one stop solution/single window system for basic financial needs of Self-Help Group (SHG) households in rural areas.
- The main objective of the center is to provide financial literacy & facilitate delivery of financial services (savings, credit, insurance, pensions etc.) to SHG members and rural poor.
- These Centers will be managed by SHG network, largely at the level of the Cluster Level Federations (CLFs), with the help of trained Community Resource Persons (CRPs).

SAKSHAM App:

• The app will help the community resource person to know the penetration of various financial services for each SHG & village.

About Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana-National Rural Livelihood Mission:

• It is a centrally sponsored programme, launched by the Ministry of Rural Development in June 2011.

Why in News

- **Prime Minister Narendra Modi** launched PM Ayushman Bharat Health Infrastructure Mission from **Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh.**
- He also inaugurated 9 Medical Colleges in Uttar Pradesh. These are in the districts of Siddharthnagar, Etah, Hardoi, Pratapgarh, Fatehpur, Deoria, Ghazipur, Mirzapur and Jaunpur.

Key Points

About PM Ayushman Bharat Health Infrastructure Mission:

- It is one of the largest pan-India schemes for strengthening healthcare infrastructure across the country.
- It is in addition to the National Health Mission.
- The objective of the Mission is to fill critical gaps in public health infrastructure, especially in critical care facilities and primary care in both the urban and rural areas.
- It will provide support for 17,788 rural Health and Wellness Centres in 10 High Focus States. Further, 11,024 urban Health and Wellness Centres will be established in all the States.
- Under the Mission, a National Institution for One Health, 4 New National Institutes for Virology, a Regional Research Platform for WHO South East Asia Region, 9 Biosafety Level III laboratories, 5 New Regional National Centre for Disease Control will be set up.
- The mission targets to build an IT enabled disease surveillance system by developing a network of surveillance laboratories at block, district, regional and national levels, in Metropolitan areas.

Air Quality Early Warning System (AQEWS)

Why in News

- Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) Science & Technology Dr Jitendra Singh has launched Air Quality Early Warning System (AQEWS).
- Indian Institute of Tropical Meteorology (IITM), an autonomous Institute of Ministry of Earth Sciences has developed a new **Decision Support System (DSS)** and extended the ability of the existing **Air Quality Early Warning System (AQEWS)** to have decision-making capability for air quality management in **Delhi NCR region.**

Key Points

- The need was stated by **Commission for Air Quality Management** in the National Capital Region and Adjoining Areas (**CAQM**, which was recently formed by the Union Minister for MoEFCC with the approval of both the houses of parliament) during the meeting held in January 2021.
- IITM, Pune has also developed a **new website for DSS**.
- The website is designed to deliver quantitative information about the contribution of emissions from Delhi and the surrounding 19 districts to the air quality in Delhi.

Indian Railways to dissolve IRSDC Why in News

• The Indian Railways has ordered to dissolve Indian Railway Stations Development Corporation (IRSDC).

Key Points

• This is in line with recommendation from the cabinet secretariat to integrate, and undertake structural reforms in various bodies under the Railways Ministry.

- These recommendations were part of a report on the Rationalisation of Government Bodies under the Ministry of Railways prepared by Sanjeev Sanyal, Principal Economic Advisor, Ministry of Finance.
- The stations managed by IRSDC shall be handed over to respective Zonal Railways.

About Indian Railway Stations Development Corporation (IRSDC):

• IRSDC, the nine-year-old special purpose vehicle (SPV), is a joint venture between the Indian Railway Land Development Authority and IRCON.

Note: With this step, IRSDC is the second organisation under the Ministry of Railways to be shut down after the closure of the Indian Railways Organisation for Alternative Fuel (IROAF) on September 7, 2021.

• Union Minister of AYUSH Sarbananda Sonowal inaugurated 'Ayush Van', a dedicated forest for Ayurvedic plants in a program held at the **Deendayal Port Trust** (**DPT**) – **Rotary Forest** in Gandhidham area of Gujarat's Kutch.

Key Points

• The Ayush Van was set up in 30 acres of land allotted by DPT in green-belt area where tree plantation is being done to improve greenery in urban areas and increase density of tree cover in the Kutch region.

Key Points

Geospatial Energy Map of India Why in News

• NITI Aayog launched a comprehensive GIS Geospatial Energy Map of India. Key Points

- NITI Aayog in collaboration with Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) has developed a comprehensive Geographic Information System (GIS) Energy Map of India with the support of Energy Ministries of Government of India.
- The GIS map provides a holistic picture of all energy resources of the country which enables visualisation of energy installations such as conventional power plants, oil and gas wells, petroleum refineries, coal fields and coal blocks, district-wise data on renewable energy power plants and renewable energy resource potential, etc through 27 thematic layers.
- It leverages the latest advancements in web-GIS technology and open-source software to make it interactive and user friendly.
- The Geospatial Energy Map of India will be useful in planning and making investment decisions.
- It will also aid in disaster management using available energy assets.

Central Government notifies new abortion rules Why in News

- The Central Government has notified new rules in which the **gestational limit for termination of pregnancy** has been increased from **20 to 24 weeks** for certain categories of women.
- The new rules have been framed under the **Medical Termination of Pregnancy** (Amendment) Act, 2021 passed by Parliament in March 2021.

Key Points

- Categories of women include survivors of sexual assault or rape, minors and women whose marital status changes during an ongoing pregnancy.
- The new rules also include mentally ill women, cases of foetal malformation in which there is a substantial risk of physical or mental abnormalities and women in disasters or emergency situations as declared by the government.
- The 2021 Act was passed to amend the Medical Termination of Pregnancy (MTP) Act, 1971.
- Earlier, an abortion required the opinion of one doctor if carried out within twelve weeks of conception and two doctors if done between twelve and twenty weeks.

MyParkings app Why in News

 Union Minister for Information and Broadcasting Anurag Singh Thakur launched MyParkings app.

Key Points

- MyParkings app is a first-of-its-kind initiative where people can book parking slots online in areas under the jurisdiction of the South Delhi Municipal Corporation (SDMC).
- It is an Internet of things (IOT) technology-enabled end-to-end digital solution.
- It has been developed by **Broadcast Engineering Consultants India Limited** (BECIL) with **South Delhi Municipal Corporation (SDMC)** with the purpose to digitize all authorized parking under SDMC municipal limits.
- It will also be integrated with Vahan App., FASTag, E-Challan and other government initiatives.

- **Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited (BPCL)** a PSU under the Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas has announced the launch of "**UFill**" for customers.
- It is a digital customer experience which delivers on BPCL's promise of ensuring that their customers have complete control over Time, Technology and Transparency as part of their fuelling experience.

Key Points

- The UFill technology has been launched in 65 cities across India and will soon be launched across the country.
- The UFill functionality does not need any App download, is payment App agnostic (i.e. customer can use any payment app already downloaded on his / her phone like GPay, PayTM, PhonePe etc), offers real time QR and voucher code through SMS and is accepted at all BPCL Fuel Stations where the functionality is enabled.

Climate Resilience Information System and Planning (CRISP-M) tool Why in News

Union Minister of Rural Development & Panchayati Raj Giriraj Singh jointly launched Climate Resilience Information System and Planning (CRISP-M) tool for integration of climate information in Geographic Information System (GIS) based watershed planning under Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGS) along with Lord Tariq Ahmad, Minister of State for South Asia and the Commonwealth in the UK Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office.

Key Points

About CRISP-M tool:

- The CRISP-M tool will help embed climate information in the GIS based planning and implementation of MGNREGS.
- It was developed with the help of the British Government and all the stakeholders who supported the Rural Development Ministry.
- It will be used in 7 states (Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Bihar, Jharkhand, Chhattisgarh, Raiasthan and Odisha).

Note: The Ministry of Rural Development has already prepared GIS based plans for 1.82 lacs Gram Panchayats out of a total of 2.69 lacs Gram Panchayats of India, which is around 68%, with the help of Remote Sensing Technology, based on Ridge to Valley approach.

About Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGS):

- MGNREGS is one of the largest work guarantee programmes in the world.
- It was launched on February 2, 2006.
- The Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA) was passed on 23rd August 2005.

India re-elected to UNHRC for sixth term Why in News

- India was re-elected to the United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC) for the sixth term (2022-24) with an overwhelming majority.
- India got 184 votes in the 193-member assembly, while the required majority was 97.

Key Points

- The **76th UN General Assembly (UNGA)** held elections for **18 new members of the UN Human Rights Council** who will serve for a period of 3 years, starting in January 2022.
- India's current term was set to end on December 31 2021.

About United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC):

- UNHRC is a United Nations body whose mission is to promote and protect human rights around the world.

2021 Global Threat Assessment Report

Why in News

- The **Global Threat Assessment Report 2021** has revealed that COVID-19 had contributed to a significant spike in child sexual exploitation and abuse online.
- The report was launched by the **WeProtect Global Alliance**.

Key Points

• **WeProtect Global Alliance** is a global movement of more than 200 members, comprising 98 governments, over 50 private companies that are mostly tech firms, and more than 60 civil society organisations and charities.

Findings of the Report:

- The report details the scale and scope of the threat of child sexual exploitation online and aims to encourage action on the issue to reduce the risk to children and prevent abuse before it happens.
- The COVID-19 pandemic is undeniably one contributory factor behind the spike in reported incidents.
- The rise in child 'self-generated' sexual material is another trend that challenges the existing response with the Internet Watch Foundation observing a 77% increase in child 'self-generated' sexual material from 2019 to 2020.

Note: Another report published in 2020 stated that India has seen a 95% increase in internet searches for child sexual abuse materials during the COVID-19 pandemic.

- The **Group of Seven (G7)** nations agreed on **Digital Trade Principles** to govern cross-border data use and digital trade.
- **G7 Digital Trade Principles** were adopted by the Trade Ministers of G7 members at a meeting in London, Britain.

Key Points

- The deal agreed is a first step in reducing those barriers, and could lead to a common rulebook of digital trade.
- Digital trade is broadly defined as trade in goods and services that is either enabled or delivered digitally, encompassing activities from the distribution of films and TV to professional services.
- The deal sets out a middle ground between highly regulated data protection regimes used in European countries and the more open approach of the United States.

- **Founded:** 1975

China passes new land border law Why in News

- China's legislature has adopted a new land border law that calls on the state and military to safeguard territory and "combat any acts" that undermine China's territorial claims.
- The new land border law was adopted amid the continued standoff between Indian and Chinese militaries in eastern Ladakh.

Key Points

About the Law:

- The law, which becomes operational from January 1, 2022, stipulates that the sovereignty and territorial integrity of the People's Republic of China are sacred and inviolable.
- The law also stipulates that the state shall take measures to strengthen border defence, support economic and social development.

China's Border Disputes:

- China has a 22,000-km land border with 14 countries.
- India and Bhutan are the two countries with which China is yet to finalise the border agreements, while Beijing resolved the boundary disputes with 12 other neighbours.
- India-China border disputes cover 3,488-km along the Line of Actual Control, the China-Bhutan dispute covers about 400 km.
- On October 14, China and Bhutan signed an MOU firming up a three-step roadmap for expediting the boundary negotiations.

- During the talks, Secretary Blinken reiterated the Biden Administration's support for the Abraham Accords and normalization agreements and discussed future opportunities for collaboration in the region and globally.

About Abraham Accords:

• The Abraham Accords was signed by **Israel, UAE and the US** in August 2020 to normalise ties between Israel and the UAE.

WHO recommends first Anti-Malaria Vaccine Why in News

• The World Health Organization (WHO) has endorsed the first anti-malaria vaccine 'RTS, S/ASO1 (Mosquirix)'.

Key Points

- RTS, S/ASO1 (Mosquirix) is the first and, to date only, vaccine shown to have the capability of significantly reducing malaria, and life-threatening severe malaria, in tests on young African children.
- The vaccine is developed by British drugmaker GlaxoSmithKline (GSK).

About Malaria:

• Malaria is a life-threatening disease caused by parasites that are transmitted to people through the bites of infected female Anopheles mosquitoes. It is preventable and curable.

Note:

- In 2019, there were an estimated 229 million cases of malaria worldwide, and the estimated number of malaria deaths that year stood at 409,000.
- In 2019, India had an estimated 5.6 million cases of malaria compared to about 20 million cases in 2000, according to WHO.

Pandora Papers Leak Why in News

- The International Consortium of International Journalists (ICIJ) has come out with what is claimed to be a 2.94 terabyte data trove that exposes the offshore secrets of wealthy elites from more than 200 countries and territories.
- Pandora Papers are 11.9 million leaked files from 14 global corporate services firms.
- There are at least **380 persons of Indian nationality** in the Pandora Papers including 60 prominent individuals and companies.

Key Points

- The investigation is based on a leak of confidential records of 14 offshore service providers that give professional services to wealthy individuals and corporations seeking to incorporate shell companies, trusts, foundations and other entities in low or no-tax jurisdictions.
- Further, the **Government of India** has directed that, investigations in cases of Pandora Papers leaks appearing in the media under the name 'PANDORA PAPERS' will be monitored through the Multi Agency Group, **headed by the Chairman, CBDT**.
- Earlier similar such leaks- Panama Papers and Paradise Papers.

Heli-Borne Survey for Ground Water Management in Arid Regions Why in News

 The Union Minister for Jal Shakti, Gajendra Singh Shekhawat and Minister of State (Independent Charge) Science & Technology, Dr. Jitendra Singh jointly inaugurated the Heli-Borne Survey for Ground Water Management in Arid Regions.

- The Central Ground Water Board, Ministry of Jal Shakti and CSIR-NGRI (National Geophysical Research Institute), Hyderabad have signed agreement for use of advanced Heli-Borne geophysical survey and other scientific studies in parts of the States of Rajasthan, Gujarat, Haryana, Punjab and Himachal Pradesh covering an area of 3.88 lac sq. km under the Aquifer Mapping Programme.
- The Heli-Borne Survey aims to conduct High resolution aquifer mapping using heliborne geophysical studies.

Outcome: The expected outcome includes selecting suitable sites for groundwater withdrawal and water conservation through artificial or managed aguifer recharge.

Phases:

- This survey will be carried out in **two phases.**
- Work for **Phase 1** has been sanctioned for 1.01 Lakh Sq.km in **Rajasthan**, **Haryana** and **Gujarat.**
- An area of 2.87 Lakh Sq.km will be covered under **Phase 2.**

• With **Himadri station** in Ny-Alesund, Svalbard, Arctic, India now belongs to the elite group of nations that have multiple research stations within the Polar Regions.

- It will be implemented at 53 airports across the country mainly focusing on Northeast and tribal regions.
- Technological convergence: Development of E-KUSHAL (Krishi UDAN for Sustainable Holistic Agri-Logistics). Platform to be developed facilitates in information dissemination to all the stakeholders. Furthermore, integration of E-KUSHAL with the National Agriculture Market (e-NAM) is proposed.

- The home robot is designed to take up tasks such as home monitoring, setting up routines and reminders, and can play music and TV shows while rolling around the house.

Issues Related to Privacy:

- Civil society is worried that the amount of data Amazon gets to fetch with the Astro, giving the company easy access to the household.
- There are concerns of stealing or hacking of the device.
- Due to this, the perpetrator can get access to the digital map that the robot creates of someone's home.

Micro snail species 'Georissa mawsmaiensis' discovered in Meghalaya's Mawsmai cave

Why in news

• A micro snail species named 'Georissa mawsmaiensis' has recently been discovered from Mawsmai, a limestone cave in **Meghalaya**, 170 years after the last such discovery was made.

Key Points

- Five species of cave-dwelling snails have been reported from the caves of Meghalaya.
- The discovery this time has been reported in the Journal of Conchology.
- The researchers involved in the discovery are Nipu Kumar Das and NA Aravind of the Ashoka Trust for Research in Ecology and the Environment (ATREE), Bengaluru.

Note: It was in 1851 that Georissa saritta, a member of the same genus as the latest find, was collected and described from the Musmai (Mawsmai today) valley near Cherrapunjee by WH Benson.

For the first time in the Major Ports in India, Radio over Internet Protocol system inaugurated at Syama Prasad Mookerjee Port, Kolkata

Why in News

- The Radio over Internet Protocol (ROIP) System at Syama Prasad Mookerjee Port, Kolkata (SMP, Kolkata), was inaugurated.
- ROIP system is being introduced as a marine communication mode, for the first time in any Major Indian Port.

- It shall cover the entire Hugli River Estuary from Kolkata to Sandheads, having base stations at 4 Locations.
- With this facility, vessels at Sandheads can be directly communicated via Radio, from Kolkata, specially during storms and inclement weather.

Why in News

Key Points

About 'Konkan Shakti -21':

- The maritime component of the exercise, to be conducted off the west coast of India, is scheduled to be held in two phases.
- The harbour phase is planned at Mumbai from 21 23 Oct 21, while at sea, the exercises will be conducted from 24 27 Oct 21.
- The land phase of the exercise is being conducted between Indian Army and UK Army at Chaubatia from 21 -27 October 2021 under the aegis of Golden Key Division of Surya Command.
- It aims to derive mutual benefits from each other's experiences and also showcase the continuing cooperation between the two countries.
- Maritime cooperation is a distinguishable symbol of the commitment of both nations in ensuring a positive climate at sea for enhancing strategic stability and promoting global economic prosperity.

Why in News

• 'ABHYAS' - the High-speed Expendable Aerial Target (HEAT) was successfully flight-tested by DRDO from the Integrated Test Range (ITR), Chandipur off the coast of Bay of Bengal in Odisha.

- **'ABHYAS'** is designed & developed by DRDO's Aeronautical Development Establishment (ADE), Bengaluru.
- The vehicle can be used as an aerial target for evaluation of various missile systems.
- The performance of the target aircraft was monitored through telemetry and various tracking sensors including Radars and Electro Optical Tracking System (EOTS).
- This indigenous target aircraft, once developed, will meet the requirements of Highspeed Expendable Aerial Targets (HEAT) for Indian Armed Forces.

Indian Army team wins gold medal in Exercise Cambrian Patrol 2021 Why in News

• A team from 4/5 Gorkha Rifles (Frontier Force) which represented the Indian Army at the prestigious Cambrian Patrol Exercise at Brecon, Wales, UK from 13th to 15th October 2021 has been awarded Gold medal.

Key Points

- Ex Cambrian Patrol organised by the UK Army is considered the ultimate test of human endurance, team spirit and is sometimes referred as the **Olympics of Military Patrolling** among militaries in the world.
- The Indian Army team participated in the event and competed against a total of 96 teams which included 17 international teams representing Special Forces and prestigious Regiments from around the world.
- This year, out of 96 participating teams, only three international patrols have been awarded a gold medal.

BSF's area of jurisdiction expanded in 3 states Why in News

- The Ministry of Home Affairs has extended the jurisdiction of the BSF (Border Security Force) up to 50 km inside the international borders in Punjab, West Bengal and Assam.
- The BSF's powers which include **arrest, search and seizure** were limited to up to 15 km in these states.
- The Ministry has reduced BSF's area of operation in **Gujarat** from 80 km from the border, to 50 km.

Key Points

- It amends the schedule of an earlier notification of July 3, 2014 in terms of the BSF's jurisdiction, which it outlines as: "the whole of the area comprised in the States of Manipur, Mizoram, Tripura, Nagaland and Meghalaya and Union Territories of Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh and so much of the area comprised within a belt of 50 kilometres in the States of Gujarat, Rajasthan, Punjab, West Bengal and Assam, running along the borders of India".
- Its jurisdiction has been extended only in respect of the powers it enjoys under Criminal Procedure Code (CrPC), Passport (Entry into India) Act, 1920 and the Passport Act, 1967.

- The Malabar series of exercises began as an annual bilateral naval exercise between India and the US in 1992.
- In 2015, Japan Maritime Self Defence Force joined Malabar as a permanent member.
- The 2020 edition witnessed the participation of the Royal Australian Navy.

- The Guideline mandates ICT based procurement from identified "Trusted Sources" and identified "Trusted Products" or else the product has to be tested for Malware/Hardware Trojan before deployment for use in the power supply system network when system for trusted product and service is in place.

Note: Recently, the **Ministry of Power** released Framework for Implementation of **Market Based Economic Despatch (MBED) Phase1** for lowering the cost of power purchase to consumers.

2021 Nobel Prize for physics awarded to scientists from Japan, Germany, Italy Why in News

- 2021 Nobel Prize for Physics is awarded with one half jointly to **Syukuro Manabe** and **Klaus Hasselmann** "For the physical modelling of Earth's climate, quantifying variability and reliably predicting global warming".
- And the other half to **Giorgio Parisi** "For the discovery of the interplay of disorder and fluctuations in physical systems from atomic to planetary scales"
- This is the first time climate scientists have been awarded the Physics Nobel.

Key Points

- **Syukuro Manabe** (Princeton University, USA) demonstrated how increased levels of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere lead to increased temperatures at the surface of the Earth.
- **Klaus Hasselmann (**Max Planck Institute for Meteorology, Germany) created a model that links together weather and climate, thus answering the question of why climate models can be reliable despite weather being changeable and chaotic.
- **Giorgio Parisi** (Sapienza University, Italy) discovered hidden patterns in disordered complex materials.

Ranks and Indices

Global Food Security Index 2021 Why in New

- India is ranked at 71st position in the Global Food Security (GFS) Index 2021 of 113 countries.
- The GFS Index was designed and constructed by **London-based Economist Impact** and is sponsored by Corteva Agriscience.

Top Rankers:

• Ireland, Australia, the UK, Finland, Switzerland, the Netherlands, Canada, Japan, France and the US shared the top rank with the overall GFS score in the range of 77.8 and 80 points on the index.

India's Rank:

- India held 71st position with an overall score of 57.2 points on the GFS Index 2021 of 113 countries, far better than Pakistan (75th position), Sri Lanka (77th Position), Nepal (79th position) and Bangladesh (84th position).
- Pakistan (with 52.6 points) scored better than India (50.2 points) in the category of food affordability. Sri Lanka was even better with 62.9 points in this category on the GFS Index 2021.
- However, over the past 10 years, India's incremental gains in overall food security score were lagging behind that of Pakistan, Nepal and Bangladesh.
- India's score improved only by 2.7 points to 57.2 in 2021 from 54.5 in 2012.
- Global food security has decreased for the second year in a row after seven years of progress towards the **Sustainable Development Goal of achieving Zero Hunger by 2030.**

UNEP Production Gap Report 2021 Why in News

- The United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) has released the Production Gap Report 2021.
- The report is produced by the Stockholm Environment Institute (SEI), International Institute for Sustainable Development (IISD), Overseas Development Institute (ODI), E3G, and UNEP.

Key Points

- The report, first launched in 2019, measures the gap between governments' planned production of coal, oil, and gas and the global production levels consistent with meeting the Paris Agreement temperature limits.
- Two years later, the report released found the production gap largely unchanged.
- Despite increased climate ambition and net-zero commitments, governments still plan to produce more than double the amount of energy from fossil fuels in 2030, than the amount that would limit global warming to the Paris Agreement level of 1.5°C.
- Over the next two decades, governments are projecting an increase in global oil and gas production, and only a modest decrease in coal production.
- Taken together, these plans mean that fossil fuel production will increase overall, to at least 2040.
- The production gap to achieve the climate goal is the widest for coal: Production plans and projections by governments would lead to around 240 percent more coal, 57 percent more oil, and 71 percent more gas in 2030 than global levels.

Climate report: Africa's rare glaciers soon to disappear Why in News

- Africa's rare glaciers will disappear in the next two decades because of climate change according to the report of the World Meteorological Organisation (WMO).
- **WMO** is a specialized agency of the **United Nations** responsible for promoting international cooperation on atmospheric science, climatology, hydrology and geophysics.

Key Points

- The report, released ahead of the UN climate conference in Scotland that starts October 31, 2021, is a grim reminder that Africa's 1.3 billion people remain "extremely vulnerable" as the continent warms more, and at a faster rate, than the global average.
- And yet Africa's 54 countries are responsible for less than 4 percent of global greenhouse gas emissions.
- The new report shows on the shrinking glaciers of Mount Kilimanjaro, Mount Kenya and the Rwenzori Mountains in Uganda as symbols of the rapid and widespread changes to come.
- Estimates of the economic effects of climate change vary across the African continent, but "in sub-Saharan Africa, climate change could further lower gross domestic product by up to 3 percent by 2050".
- Already, the UN has warned that the Indian Ocean island nation of Madagascar is one where "famine-like conditions have been driven by climate change".

World Energy Outlook (WEO) Report 2021 Why in News

- The International Energy Agency (IEA) released its annual World Energy Outlook (WEO) Report 2021.
- Investment in renewable energy will need to triple by the end of this decade if the world's climate pledges are to be met.

Key Points

Key Findings of the Report:

- Renewable energy sources, such as solar, wind, hydropower and bioenergy, need to form a far bigger share in the rebound in energy investment after the coronavirus pandemic.
- The IEA noted that demand for renewables continues to grow.
- However, this clean energy progress is still far too slow to put global emissions into sustained decline towards net zero by 2050, which the IEA believes will help limit the increase in global temperatures to 1.5 degrees Celsius.
- More than 40% of the required emissions reductions would come from measures that pay for themselves, such as improving efficiency, limiting gas leakage, or installing wind or solar in places where they are now the most competitive electricity generation technologies.

Global Girlhood Report 2021: Girls' Rights in Crisis Why in News

- Recently, Save the Children released the "Global Girlhood Report 2021: Girls' Rights in Crisis" on 'International Day of the Girl Child' (11th October).
- Save the Children is India's leading independent child rights' NGO, which works in 18 states of the country.

Key Points

Key Findings of the Report:

- **Child marriage** kills more than 60 girls a day globally and six girls a day in South Asia.
- South Asia sees 2,000 child marriage-related deaths every year (or six every day), followed by East Asia and the Pacific with 650 deaths (or two every day), and Latin American and the Caribbean, with 560 annual deaths (or nearly two a day).
- More than an estimated 22,000 girls a year are dying from pregnancy and childbirth resulting from child marriage.
- However, West and Central Africa has the highest rate of child marriage in the world and accounts for nearly half (9,600) of all estimated child marriage-related deaths globally, or 26 deaths a day.
- Although nearly 80 million child marriages globally have been prevented in the last 25 years, progress had stalled even before the COVID-19 pandemic, which has only worsened inequalities that drive child marriage.
- A further 10 million girls are now expected to marry by 2030, leaving more girls at risk of dying.

Over 5 billion people could face water shortage by 2050: United Nations Why in News

 More than 5 billion people globally are expected to face a shortage of water by 2050, a United Nations (UN) agency (World Meteorological Organization-WMO) report '2021 State of Climate Services' has warned.

Key Points

- According to figures cited in the report, 3.6 billion people had inadequate access to water at least one month per year in 2018. By 2050, this is expected to rise to more than 5 billion.
- In the past 20 years, terrestrial water storage the summation of all water on the land surface and in the subsurface, including soil moisture, snow and ice has dropped at a rate of one centimetre per year.
- The situation is worsening by the fact that only 0.5 percent of water on Earth is useable and available freshwater.
- Since 2000, flood-related disasters have risen by 134 percent compared with the two previous decades.
- Most of the flood-related deaths and economic losses were recorded in Asia.

- A total of 707 district hospitals across all States and Union Territories participated in the performance assessment.
- The Health Management Information System (HMIS) data for the year 2017–18 has been used as the baseline for this exercise.

Categories: The framework classifies hospitals in three categories: Small Hospitals (less than or equal to 200 beds), Mid-sized Hospitals (between 201–300 beds) and Large Hospitals (more than 300 beds).

 Overall, 75 district hospitals across 24 States and Union Territories emerged as top performers.

Key Findings:

• A district hospital in India has on an average 24 beds per 1 lakh population, with Bihar having the lowest average of 6 beds and Puducherry the highest of 222.

Note: Indian Public Health Standards 2012 guidelines recommend district hospitals to maintain at least 22 beds per 1 lakh population.

• Only 27% of the total 707 districts assessed met the doctor-to-bed ratio of 29 doctors per 100 beds in a hospital.
