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###ANSWERS###

1. Ans. C.

Contextually, A connects with E but there is a grammatical problem in the part E. The phrase "struggling within their family income" is an absurd use of the word 'within.' The correct sentence would have been "struggling with their family income."

C and D could have formed a contextually synonymous sentence but there is a problem in the latter as part C mentions 'satellites' i.e. in plural but part D used the verb in singular.

Only B and F form a contextually relevant and grammatically correct pair.

Therefore, option C is the correct answer to this question.

2. Ans. D.

While part E is a logical follow up to part A, it doesn't fit in grammatically. The choice of adverb at the beginning is wrong – to be a correct sentence, the adverb 'where' should have been used instead of 'there.'

Part B and part F are complimentary pairs in sense but the tense is in conflict. Part B is in past tense as it is talking of all fires since beginning of the year but part F is in present continuous tense, thus making the combination incorrect.

Parts C and D are both logically consistent with each other and can be combined to form a grammatically correct sentence.

Therefore, option D is the correct answer to this question.

3. Ans. A.

While parts A and E are complimentary contextually, there is a grammatical error in the verb in the second part i.e. E. The phrase "for national teams to preparing for" is wrong and the correct expression would be "for national teams to prepare for." This invalidates A-E as an appropriate pairing.

Parts B and F are contextually consistent and do not contain any grammatical errors, thereby making a complete sentence.

Parts C and D also come together to give a contextually relevant sentence, which is also grammatically correct.

Thus, option A is the correct answer.

4. Ans. C.

While A and E are synchronous in context, there is problem with the second part from a grammatical angle. The word 'through' means moving in one side and out of the other side of (an opening or location). It is clearly a wrong word to connect the two parts. The term that needed to be used here is the conjunction 'though' which would have made a correct sentence.

While F is a logical concluding part to B, there is a grammatical conflict in the fragment. If we read the two parts, we can see that the verb is in plural. But the closing word is incorrect as it says 'patient' i.e. singular.

C and D are the only pair that form a logically coherent sentence that is also grammatically correct.

This makes option C the correct choice among the given option.

5. Ans. A.

A and E are contextually synonymous as E provides a logical follow-up to the introduction in A. But part E is grammatically inconsistent due to use of the pronoun



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'that' which is wrong in this case. The right pronoun to use here is 'what' which would have made the sentence correct.

B and D is a logically coherent pair as the former introduces us to Alzheimer's disease while the latter explains the disease in detail.

C and F are also logically coherent, but the tense is inconsistent between the two parts. The first part is in past tense but the verb 'is' in the second part doesn't complement it. Hence this pair cannot be combined to form a correct sentence.

Therefore, option A is the correct answer to this question.

6. Ans. B.

We have to join two parts of a sentence in a way that they form a meaningful and grammatically correct sentence. In the given question A joins with D, B joins with F and C joins with E to make correct sentences. A talks about the huge amount of writing and D completes it by saying on which subject the writing was all about. B and F can be joined easily. B tells about farmers and as said in F they are the ones who make food that we eat. C tells us about the restrictions that are put on freedom of speech in the constitution and E tells us that they are put on may grounds and are stated in the constitution.

Thus, option B is the correct answer.

7. Ans. C.

We have to join two parts of a sentence in a way that they form a meaningful and grammatically correct sentence. In the given question A joins with F and C joins with E to make correct sentences. B can be joined with D only if 'are' is omitted with which D starts. The subject is 'history' in B which is a singular subject, so 'are' should be replaced by 'is'.

Thus, option C is the correct answer.

8. Ans. B.

We have to join two parts of a sentence in a way that they form a meaningful and grammatically correct sentence. In the given question A joins with D, B joins with F and C joins with E to make correct sentences. A-D says that owls are not as beautiful as peacocks are but they look human. F tells that birders' were not able to spot the species as said in B that is why it was lost-and-found. Thus B-F is a grammatically correct and contextually meaningful pair. C-E also makes a grammatically correct and contextually meaningful sentence when joined together.

Thus, option B is the correct answer.

9. Ans. D.

We have to join two parts of a sentence in a way that they form a meaningful and grammatically correct sentence. In the given question B joins with F and C joins with E to make correct sentences. B and F say that on the occasion of International Women's Day lady officers will run most of the police stations. Similarly, E says that artificial intelligence can be used in education thus completing the idea of C. Although A and D look fine for a sentence but if joined there will be a grammatical error in it. In D after 'to' base form of verb is required. So, instead of 'putting' base verb 'put' should have been correct.

Thus, option D is the correct answer.

10. Ans. E.



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We have to join two parts of a sentence in a way that they form a meaningful and grammatically correct sentence. In the given question A joins with E and C joins with F to make correct sentences. E tells us about the length the women priests have travelled to administer marriages as stated in A thus completing the idea. F tells us that age-old customs take away the progress of a society and as stated in C independent women are against it. Thus C-F makes a pair. B and D could have made a contextually correct sentence only if in D the adjective 'important' was replaced by noun 'importance'.

Thus, option E is the correct answer.



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
