1. Ans. B.

The error is in the second part of the sentence. The verb "consider" must be followed by the present participle verb "giving" to indicate what should be considered.

Thus, the apostrophe (s) should be used with "mother" to indicate possession. The segment should read: "comes from the consumption of mother's milk".

4. Ans. A.

Option A has the grammatically incorrect part. The subject does not agree with the verb in this segment. The plural verb "have" must take the plural subject "thoughts".

5. Ans. A.

The error lies in the first part of the sentence. The usage of the determiner "much" is incorrect here as 'people' are being talked about and they are countable nouns.

6. Ans. C.
