

Year Wise Statistical Analysis of Candidates Appeared and Recommended for UPSC CSE

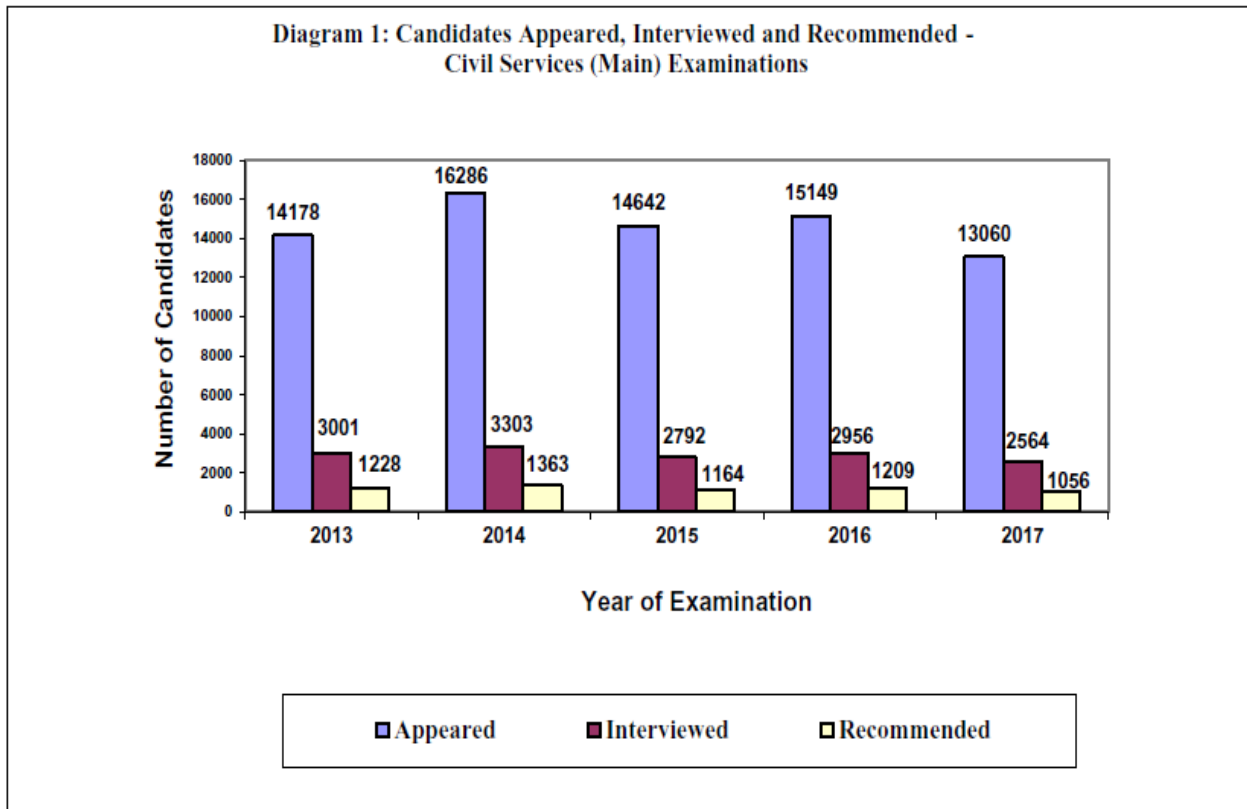
Year 2017

- In the year 2017, the number of candidates who applied for the Civil Services (Preliminary) Examination were 9,47,728.
- Out of which only 4,56,625 candidates appeared in this examination. That means 48.2 percent candidates appeared for this examination. In other words, 51.8 percent of the candidates had applied but did not turn up for the examination.
- On the basis of the results of Civil Services (Preliminary) examination, only 13,366, i.e., 2.9% of the candidates were declared qualified for taking the Main Examination.

- 13,366 candidates qualified the Preliminary examination and 13,060 i.e. 97.7% had appeared in the written part of Civil Services (Main) Examination, 2017.
- Out of these 13,060 candidates, only 2,568 (19.7%) candidates qualified the Main Examination and appeared in the interview and thereafter, a total of 1056 candidates have been recommended by the Commission for appointment to the civil services against 1058 vacancies in the year 2017.



Year 2016

- In the year 2016, the number of candidates who applied for the Civil Services (Preliminary) Examination were 11,28,262.
- Out of which only 4,59,659 candidates appeared in this examination. That means only 40.74 percent candidates appeared for this examination.
- In other words, 59.26 percent of the candidates had applied but did not turn up for the examination.
- On the basis of the results of Civil Services (Preliminary) examination, only 15,452 (3.4%), i.e., 3.4% of the candidates were declared qualified for taking the Main Examination.

- 15452 candidates qualified the Preliminary examination and 15,149 i.e. 98% had appeared in the written part of Civil Services (Main) Examination, 2016.
- Out of these 15,149 candidates, only 2,961 (19.5%) candidates qualified the Main Examination and appeared in the interview and thereafter, a total of 1209 candidates have been recommended by the Commission for appointment to the civil services against 1209 vacancies in the year 2016.

Year 2015

- In the year 2015, the number of candidates who applied for the Civil Services (Preliminary) Examination were 9,39,735.
- Out of which only 4,63,391 candidates appeared in this examination. That means only 49.3 percent candidates appeared for this examination.
- In other words, 50.7 percent of the candidates had applied but did not turn up for the examination.
- On the basis of the results of Civil Services (Preliminary) examination, only 15,008 (3.2%), i.e., 3.22% of the candidates were declared qualified for taking the Main Examination.

- 15,008 candidates qualified the Preliminary examination and 14,642 i.e. 97.6% had appeared in the written part of Civil Services (Main) Examination, 2015.
- Out of these 14,642 candidates, only 2,797 (19.1%) candidates qualified the Main Examination and appeared in the interview and thereafter, a total of 1164 candidates have been recommended by the Commission for appointment to the civil services against 1164 vacancies in the year 2015.

Year 2014

- In the year 2014, the number of candidates who applied for the Civil Services (Preliminary) Examination were 9,47,428.
- Out of which only 4,46,623 candidates appeared in this examination. That means only 47.1 percent candidates appeared for this examination.
- In other words, 52.9 percent of the candidates had applied but did not turn up for the examination.
- On the basis of the results of Civil Services (Preliminary) examination, only 16,933 (3.8%), i.e., 3.8% of the candidates were declared qualified for taking the Main Examination.

- The dropout rate in the Civil Services (Preliminary) Examination, 2014 was 52.9 %
- 16933 candidates qualified the Preliminary examination and 16,286 i.e. 96.2% had appeared in the written part of Civil Services (Main) Examination, 2014.
- Out of these 16,286 candidates, only 3,308 (20.3%) candidates qualified the Main Examination and appeared in the interview and thereafter, a total of 1363 candidates have been recommended by the Commission for appointment to the civil services against 1364 vacancies in the year 2014.

Year 2013

- In the year 2013, the number of candidates who applied for the Civil Services (Preliminary) Examination were 7,55,103.
- Out of which only 3,18,184 candidates appeared in this examination. That means only 42.1 percent candidates appeared for this examination.
- In other words, 57.9 percent of the candidates had applied but did not turn up for the examination.
- On the basis of the results of Civil Services (Preliminary) examination, only 14,959 (4.7%), i.e., 4.7% of the candidates were declared qualified for taking the Main Examination.

- The dropout rate in the Civil Services (Preliminary) Examination, 2014 was 57.9 %
- 14,959 candidates qualified the Preliminary examination and 14,178 i.e. 94.8% had appeared in the written part of Civil Services (Main) Examination, 2013.
- Out of these 14,178 candidates, only 3,003 (21.2%) candidates qualified the Main Examination and appeared in the interview and thereafter, a total of 1122 candidates have been recommended by the Commission for appointment to the civil services against 1228 vacancies in the year 2013.
