## Daily Word Power Vocabulary Words

**Inure (verb):** to make accustomed to something unpleasant

- **Synonym:** Harden, toughen
- **Antonym:** sensitize
- **Example Sentence:** Raising three dramatic sons will inure you to temper tantrums.
- **Learning Trick:** inured means its 'in' 'ur' system... you are used to it

**Hobble (verb):** to hold back the progress of something

- **Synonym:** limp
- **Antonym:** stride
- **Example Sentence:** Bad weather has hobbled rescue efforts, making it difficult for crews to find bodies in the wreckage.
- **Learning Trick:** Hobble= Hop + Amble i.e. He is hopping to go from one place to another i.e., walking with great difficulty.

**Quisling (noun):** a traitor

- **Synonym:** Traitor
- **Antonym:** supporter
- **Example Sentence:** Hanging his head in shame, the spineless quisling was exiled from his country for treason.
- **Learning Tricks:** Split like 'QUIT+LINK' means a culprit quits and collaborate (link) with

**Bilious (adjective):** irritable; always angry

- **Synonym:** irritable, grumpy
- **Antonym:** good-humoured
- **Example Sentence:** Our bilious neighbour is known for his bad attitude.
- **Learning Tricks:** Bili-ili-ill.... So, it resembles like "ILL" in bile i.e., stomach.

**Conflation (noun):** An entity made by combination of two or more different elements.

- **Synonym:** Fuse
- **Antonym:** Differentiate, Discriminate
- **Example Sentence:** General Awareness Section is the conflation of current affairs and Static General Knowledge
- **Learning Trick:** Cornflakes are made by combining corn flour with other ingredients.

**Agog (adjective):** very excited while waiting to hear something



- **Synonym:** Eager, interested
- **Antonym:** uninterested, incurious
- **Example Sentence:** Samira was agog to hear the news of her best friend's wedding.
- **Learning Trick:** Take A gog as A dog. Dogs usually remain excited.

**Tedium (Noun):** the state of being bored

- **Synonym:** boredom, doldrums, ennui, restlessness, monotony, indifference, melancholy
- **Antonym:** enchantment, fascination, engagement, engrossment, involvement, invigoration, stimulation entertainment
- **Example Sentence:** The movie I watched yesterday was nothing but three hours of tedium.
- **Learning Trick:** Let's go to the stadium to get rid of tedium

**Solecism (noun):** a socially awkward or tactless act

- **Synonym:** faux pas, gaffe ‘
- **Antonym:** manners
- **Example Sentence:** The judge reprimanded the lawyer who exhibited a solecism in court protocols
- **Learning Trick:** SHOLEYcism: When you think of the movie who comes in your mind? GABBAR, everytime he used to make mistakes while speaking because of his rustic or wild accent.

**Litany (noun):** any long and tedious account of something

- **Synonym:** Prayer
- **Antonym:** criticism
- **Example Sentence:** Students had litany of grievances against the college for conducting offline classes.
- **Learning Trick:** Split the word LIT+ ANY. You are hoping god is going to show you light in the dark to show you the path in these wretched times. Light ANY path...
