Important News: State

- 1. Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath inaugurated Shaheed Ashfaq Ulla Khan Zoological Park in Gorakhpur
- The Chief Minister said the zoo has been named after great freedom fighter Shaheed Ashfaq Ullah Khan.
- It will be the second biggest zoo in Uttar Pradesh after Kanpur Zoological Park.
- Note: Recently Uttar Pradesh government has organized Banana Festival in Kushinagar district under ODOP (One District One Product) scheme.
- 2. Arunachal Pradesh CM Pema Khandu launched 'Dekho Apna Pradesh'
- Arunachal Pradesh Chief Minister Pema Khandu launched 'Dekho Apna Pradesh' – an initiative of the chief minister himself, conceptualized on the lines of the union tourism ministry's 'Dekho Apna Desh' initiative.
- It aims to restart tourism activities and encourage citizens to take a pledge to visit at least 10 places in Arunachal Pradesh by 2022.
- About Dekho Apna Desh: It is an initiative of the Ministry of Tourism which was launched by Union Minister for Tourism Shri Prahlad Singh Patel at Konark, Odisha on 24th January 2020.
- 3. 'Anandam: The Center for Happiness' in IIM Jammu
- Union Minister of Education Ramesh Pokhriyal inaugurates 'Anandam: The Center for Happiness' at Indian Institute of Management (IIM) Jammu virtually.
- Lieutenant Governor, Jammu and Kashmir, Shri Manoj Sinha; Founder, Art of Living Foundation, Sri Sri Ravi Shankar virtually attended the occasion.
- It aligns with the **National Education Policy 2020** that aims to transform India's education system by 2021.

'Anandam: The Center for Happiness' will be divided into five broad categories, namely, Counselling, Holistic wellness, Elective courses on Happiness Development, Research and Leadership & Faculty Development

- 4. Uttar Pradesh government approves scheme offering affordable rental housing for urban migrants and poor
- The Uttar Pradesh government will start the **Affordable Rental Housing and Complexes (ARHC) scheme** for poor people living in cities and a proposal to this effect was approved by the state cabinet presided over by Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath.
- About ARHC scheme: It has been launched by the government of India through the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs under the 'self-reliant India' campaign.
- Note: The scheme will be implemented under two models in the state.

- **Model one** involves converting vacant houses funded by the central or state government into an ARHC through an agreement.
- Under the **second model**, ARHC will be built, operated and maintained by public/private entities on their available vacant land.

5. First-of-its-kind Cruise service starts between Surat and Diu

- Minister of State for Ports, Shipping & Waterways (I/C) Shri Mansukh Mandaviya flagged off the Cruise service from Hazira Port of Surat to Diu.
- Before 2014, there were 139 cruise calls at the Indian Ports but today there are 450 cruise calls in the country.
- The number before 2014 was one lakh and the number of tourists in 2019-20 was 4.5 lakhs.

Note: Indian coastline has a huge potential for the cruise tourism industry and 6 International cruise terminals are being planned on both the west coast (Mumbai, Goa, Kochi) and east coast (Visakhapattanam, Kolkata, Chennai) of India

6. Power Minister R K Singh launches 'GRAM UJALA' in Bihar

- Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Ministry of Power and Ministry of New and Renewable Energy, R K Singh launched the 'GRAM UJALA' programme in Arrah, Bihar.
- Under the GRAM UJALA programme, **Convergence Energy Services Limited (CESL)** will distribute high quality LED bulbs, at an affordable cost of 10 rupees per bulb in rural areas.
- The Village Ujala program will be funded entirely through **carbon credits** and will be the first such program in India.
- In the first phase of this programme, 1.5 crore LED bulbs will be distributed across villages of Aarah (Bihar), Varanasi (Uttar Pradesh), Vijaywada (Andhra Pradesh), Nagpur (Maharashtra), and village in western Gujarat.
- 7. Bihar becomes first state in country to implement 'Ethanol Production Promotion policy 2021'
- Bihar has become the first state in the country to implement 'Ethanol Production Promotion policy 2021'that would allow investors to directly make ethanol from maize, molasses, broken rice and rotten grains.
- The Central government has already given permission for direct production of ethanol in December 2020 in consonance with **National Policy of Biofuels**, **2018**.
- An investor will get an additional government subsidy of 15% of the cost of plant and machinery up to a maximum of Rs 5 crore, in addition to the existing incentives under the **Bihar Industrial Investment Promotion Policy**, 2016.
- Note: Currently, India produces 5.30 thousand barrel of ethanol, which is very low compared to countries like the USA and Brazil.
- At present, **Bihar** has been producing 12 crore litre ethanol per year and is the fifth highest ethanol-producing state in the country.
- Uttar Pradesh is the highest ethanol-producing state in the country.






- 8. Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister launches India's first FPO portal
- Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath launched '**UPFPO Shakti Portal**' as part of Kisan Kalyan Mission at an event in Gorakhpur.
- The Farmer Producer Organization-centric (FPO-centric) portal will bring farmers, producer groups, traders and the agriculture and other allied departments of the UP government on one platform.
- The portal was developed with technical and funding support from the **Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation (BMGF).**
- Note: The state currently has 576 FPOs comprising around 2.15 lakh farmers. Of these, 471 FPOs have registered themselves on the portal.

9. Asia's largest Tulip Garden in Srinagar opens

- In the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir, Asia's largest Tulip Garden in Srinagar has been opened for the general public and tourists.
- About Tulip Garden (Indira Gandhi Memorial Tulip garden): It is the largest tulip garden in Asia spread over an area of about 30 hectares.
- It is situated in the valley of the Jabarawan Hills on the banks of Dal Lake.
- The garden was opened in 2007 with the aim to boost floriculture and tourism in Kashmir Valley.



10. Andhra Pradesh to launch India's first "Government-run Ambulance Network" for animals

- The Andhra Pradesh government has decided to set up mobile ambulance services "Government-run Ambulance Network" for animals to boost the animal husbandry and veterinary sector in the state.
- The Animal Husbandry Department has been further directed to set up one Mobile Ambulance Veterinary Clinic at every assembly constituency.
- These mobile ambulances shall provide veterinary first aid services along with spot diagnosis and attending to emergency cases.
- Facts about Andhra Pradesh: Capital: Amaravati Governor: Biswabhusan Harichandan Chief Minister: Y.S. Jaganmohan Reddy

11. Shri Sanjay Dhotre releases Commemorative Postage Stamp on 100 years of first visit of Mahatma Gandhi to Odisha

- Shri Sanjay Dhotre, Minister of State for Education, Communications and Electronics & Information Technology digitally released a Commemorative Postage Stamp on 100 years of first visit of Mahatma Gandhi to Odisha.
- This Commemorative Postage Stamp celebrates an important event of Indian History which is the **first visit of Mahatma Gandhi to Odisha on** 23rd March, 1921.





• It energized the Non-Cooperation movement and strengthened the cause of the freedom struggle.

12. India's largest floating solar power plant at Telangana to be commissioned by May 2021

- India's largest floating solar power plant of **100 MW capacity** is being developed in Telangana's Ramagundam and is likely to be commissioned by May, 2021.
- It is one of the solar plants being developed by the energy conglomerate NTPC, which is all set to commission around 217 MW floating solar capacity in the next few months.
- The other renewable energy plants that are likely to be commissioned this year are 92 MW floating unit at Kayamkulam gas plant in Kerala and 25 MW unit at Simhadri power plant.
- Note: The world's largest solar power plant with 600 MW capacity is being set up on Omkareshwar Dam on Narmada river in Madhya Pradesh. The project is expected to start power generation only by 2022-23.

13. Kalanamak Rice Festival

- Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath inaugurated a three-day 'Kalanamak Rice Festival' in **Siddharthnagar district** on March 13, 2021.
- Kalanamak rice has been recognised with a geographical indication (GI) tag.
- It is under **ODOP** (**One District One Product**) scheme of the state government.
- Kalanamak rice is rich in micro-nutrients such as Iron and Zinc. Regular intake of Kalanamak rice can prevent Alzheimer's disease.
- Note: Earlier, the Chief Minister had inaugurated the Strawberry Festival in Jhansi and the Jaggery Festival in Lucknow.

14. Bengaluru airport launches India's first dedicated express cargo terminal

- The Kempegowda International Airport in Bengaluru now has India's first dedicated Express Cargo Terminal exclusively for export and import of international couriers.
- The two lakh square feet built to suit facility will be operated by **Express Industry Council of India.**
- Note: Recently, Bengaluru airport has bagged global recognition from the Airports Council International (ACI) World's 'Voice of the Customer' award.

15. India's first AC railway station 'Sir M Visvesvaraya Terminal' to function soon in Bengaluru

- Named after one of the foremost civil engineers, Bharat Ratna Sir M Visvesvaraya, the nation's first centralised AC (Air Conditioned) railway terminal at Baiyappanahalli in Bengaluru is set to become operational soon.
- India's first AC railway terminal, built at an anticipated cost of Rs 314 crore, is all set to be inaugurated later this month.
- Byappanahalli is the third coach terminal sanctioned in 2015-16.

16. Mumbai's CSMT becomes first railway station in Maharashtra to get IGBC Gold Certification

- Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Terminus (CSMT) Railway Station of Central Railway is the first railway station in Maharashtra to be awarded with Gold certification as per CII's Indian Green Building Council (IGBC) ratings.
- Central Railway has implemented various green initiatives across its zone, with plantations creating green areas, installation of solar panels, customer-friendly initiatives at many stations etc.
- Note: Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Terminus (CSMT) also known by its former name Victoria Terminus and It is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.
- The Indian Green Building Council (IGBC), part of the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) was formed in the year 2001. The council offers a wide array of services which include developing new green building rating programmes, certification services and green building training programmes.

17. Delhi government approves the formation of a separate school board in the city


- The Delhi government approved the formation of the **Delhi Board of School Education (DBSE).**
- The new Board will have a governing body headed by the Education Minister of the Delhi government and an executive body headed by a chief executive officer.
- Note: There are around 1,000 Delhi government schools and about 1,700 private schools, most of them affiliated to the CBSE, in the city.
- Facts about Delhi:

18. India's first 'Transgender Community Desk' opens in Hyderabad

- The Cyberabad Police launched India's first-ever 'Transgender Community Desk' at the Gachibowli Police Station in Hyderabad.
- The desk will provide support to file cases in offences related to violence or discrimination against any transgender person.
- Cyberabad Police chief VC Sajjanar inaugurated the desk.
- The desk will be managed by a police liaison officer and a transgender person who is designated as a community coordinator.
- **19.** President of India inaugurates conservation works at Singorgarh Fort in Madhya Pradesh





- The President of India Shri Ram Nath Kovind laid the foundation stone for the conservation works of Singorgarh Fort in Singrampur village of Damoh district in Madhya Pradesh.
- The President also inaugurated the newly carved Jabalpur Circle of Archaeological Survey of India.
- He also addressed the State Level Tribal Conference at Singrampur village in Damoh. The program was organized by the Ministry of Culture, Government of India and the Tribal Affairs Department of Madhya Pradesh.

20. Uttarakhand opens India's first 'forest healing centre'

- The country's first 'forest healing centre' was inaugurated by noted environmentalist Joginder Bisht at Kalika near Ranikhet, Uttarakhand.
- The country's first forest healing centre based on the concept of making people healthy by bringing them into direct contact with nature was opened to the public.
- Drawing inspiration from the **Japanese technique of forest bathing (shinrin - yoku)**, the healing centre has been developed by the research wing of Uttarakhand Forest Department.

21. Uttarakhand Chief Minister Trivendra Singh Rawat resigns

- Mr Rawat handed in his resignation to Governor Baby Rani Maurya just days short of completing four years in power.
- A first-timer, he was chosen by Prime Minister Narendra Modi after the BJP swept the Uttarakhand election in 2017, winning 57 seats in the 69-member assembly.

22. India's first 'World Skill Centre' in Bhubaneswar

- Chief Minister of Odisha Naveen Patnaik inaugurated the 'World Skill Centre' (WSC) at Mancheswar,
- It will provide skills training to 3000 students in eight trades.
- The State government has partnered with **Institute of Technical Education Services** (**ITEES**), **Singapore** to support **Odisha Skill Development Authority** (**OSDA**) in operationalising the centre.
- Note: The State will create Odisha Skill Vision 2030 that will guide all future efforts in the skill development sector.

23. Saras Aajeevika Mela opens at Noida Haat

- Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Minister Narendra Singh Tomar inaugurated Saras Aajeevika Mela 2021 (26th February to 14th March 2021) at Noida Haat.
- About SARAS Aajeevika Mela: It is an initiative by the Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana-National Rural Livelihoods Mission (DAY-NRLM), Ministry of Rural Development (MoRD), Government of India.
- Its aim is to bring the rural women Self Help Groups (SHGs) formed with support of DAY-NRLM, under one platform to show-case their skills, sell their products.
- The Mela is organised by the marketing arm of the Ministry, Council for Advancement of People's Action and Rural Technology (CAPART).

24. World's tallest Chenab rail bridge in Jammu & Kashmir





- The world's highest railway bridge is being constructed over Jammu & Kashmir's Chenab River.
- The iconic steel arch is almost complete and the completion of the mega infrastructure project is scheduled for March this year.
- Note: The bridge which is being built by Konkan Railway Corporation Ltd (KRCL) is a part of the 111- km Udhampur-Srinagar-Baramulla Rail link Project (USBRL) which aims to connect Kashmir Valley with the rest of the country through a railway line.

25. Fossils of world's oldest animal Dickinsonia discovered inside Bhimbetka in Madhya Pradesh

- Researchers are of the opinion that has traced Dickinsonia on the roof of *Auditorium Cave* at Bhimbetka, which dates back 570 million years.
- The fossil was discovered by chance by two experts from the Geological Survey of India (GSI) when they went ahead to explore Bhimbetka ahead of the 36th International Geological Congress.
- About Bhimbetka rock shelters: The Bhimbetka rock shelters are an archaeological site in central India. It is located in the Raisen District of Madhya Pradesh.

It is a **UNESCO World Heritage Site** that consists of seven hills and over 750 rock shelters distributed over 10 km.

26. 'Udaipur Science Centre' inaugurated in Tripura

- The Governor of Tripura Ramesh Bais has inaugurated the 'Udaipur Science Centre', at Udaipur, Tripura.
- Udaipur Science Centre has been developed at a cost of Rs 6.00 crore funded jointly by the Ministry of Culture, Govt. of India and Dept. of Science, Technology & Environment, Government of Tripura.
- Note: Udaipur Science Centre is the 22nd Science Centre which has been developed by NCSM and handed over to the State Governments under the Ministry of Culture's Scheme for Promotion of Culture of Science.

27. Haryana implements 75 percent reservation for locals in private sector jobs

- The Haryana Governor has approved a bill (**The Haryana State Employment of Local Candidates Bill, 2020**) that reserves 75 percent of the private sector jobs, that includes companies, societies and trusts, with gross salary upto ₹ 50,000 per month for the people of the state.
- The Bill was passed by the state assembly last year.

- 1. PM Modi's Bangladesh two day (26-27 March, 2021) visit
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi arrived in Dhaka on March 26, 2021 to take part in Bangladesh's 50th Independence Day celebrations.
- This is the historic visit to celebrate **Mujib Borsho- the birth centenary of Sheikh Mujibur Rahman;** 50 years of the establishment of diplomatic ties between India and Bangladesh; and 50 years of Bangladesh's war of liberation.
- Key points: India and Bangladesh signed 5 MoUs in the fields of Disaster Management, trade, NCC, ICT and setting up of sports facilities.
- Swarna Jayanti scholarship for youths of Bangladesh announced.
- To invite 50 entrepreneurs of Bangladesh to visit India and join start-up initiative
- A Bangabandhu Chair will be established at Delhi University to facilitate Bangladesh studies.
- India and Bangladesh are together making a film titled Bangabandhu by the renowned film director Shyam Benegal.
- Note: This was PM Modi's first foreign trip since COVID-19.
- 2. New passenger train 'Mitali Express' inaugurated between India and Bangladesh
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his Bangladeshi counterpart Sheikh Hasina jointly inaugurated a new passenger train, 'Mitali Express', between Dhaka and New Jalpaiguri in West Bengal on the occasion of 'Bangabandhu' Sheikh Mujibur Rahman's birth centenary and golden jubilee of Bangladesh's Independence on March 27, 2021.
- Note: This is the third passenger train after Maitree Express (Dhaka-Kolkata) and Bandhan Express (Khulna-Kolkata) running between the two neighbouring countries.
- 3. Health Minister Dr Harsh Vardhan launches 'Tribal TB Initiative' in pursuit of TB Mukt Bharat
- The government accords top priority to ensuring Universal Access to free treatment and care for TB (Tuberculosis) across the country.





- Over ten crore tribal population is living with a huge diversity in their population dynamics.
- Note: The Union Territories of Lakshadweep and district of Badgam in Jammu and Kashmir have been declared TB Free on World TB Day 2021.
- India has 30 percent of the world's TB cases.
- 4. AYUSH Ministry set up interdisciplinary team to explore potential of Yoga
- The Ministry of AYUSH has set up an interdisciplinary team of experts to explore the potential of Yoga as a productivity enhancing tool for the population.
- The committee is chaired by **H. R Nagendra, Chancellor, Swami Vivekananda Yoga Anusandhana Samsthana** and its members include representatives from AIIMS New Delhi, IIM Bangalore, IIT Bombay, various leading Yoga institutions, the corporate sector and the AYUSH Ministry.
- The committee will submit its preliminary recommendations by May 2021.
- Note: The Sports Ministry formally recognised **Yogasana** as a competitive sport, which will enable the ancient practice to avail government funding.
- 5. Finance Minister Smt. Nirmala Sitharaman launches Central Scrutiny Centre and IEPFA's Mobile App
- Union Minister for Finance & Corporate Affairs Smt. Nirmala Sitharaman launched Central Scrutiny Centre (CSC) and Investor Education and Protection Fund Authority's (IEPFA) Mobile App two tech-enabled initiatives by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs (MCA).
- The **Central Scrutiny Centre** will scrutinize certain Straight Through Process (STP) Forms filed by the corporates on the MCA21 registry.
- The **Mobile App** aims at achieving the goal of financial literacy, spreading investors' awareness, education, and protection among investors.

6. Prime Minister Modi unveils new version of 'Exam Warriors'

- The new version of 'Exam Warriors' written by Prime Minister Narendra Modi is now available with many new mantras for students as well as for parents.
- The book reaffirms the need to remain stress free before an exam.
- The Exam Warriors module is also available on the NaMo App.
- Note: The initial version of the book 'Exam Warriors' was written by Prime Minister Narendra Modi and was published in 2018.
- 7. MoU signed towards execution of planned actions in time bound manner in 132 cities under National Clean Air Programme (NCAP)
- In the presence of Minister of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Shri Prakash Javadekar the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed by representatives of State Pollution Control Boards, Urban Local Bodies and Institutes of Repute for 132 identified cities for implementation of city specific action plans under National Clean Air Programme (NCAP).





- A National Knowledge Network comprising leading air quality specialists has also been constituted as a technical advisory group to support activities under NCAP.
- About National Clean Air Programme (NCAP): It is a long-term, time-bound, national level strategy to tackle air pollution problem across the country in a comprehensive manner with targets to achieve 20% to 30% reduction in Particulate Matter concentrations by 2024 (with 2017 as base year).
- 8. Shri Prahlad Singh Patel and Shri Shivraj Singh Chouhan inaugurates the 'Maharaja Chhatrasal Convention Centre at Khajuraho
- Shri Prahlad Singh Patel, Minister of State for Tourism and Culture (Independent Charge) and Shri Shivraj Singh Chouhan, Chief Minister of Madhya Pradesh inaugurated the 'Maharaja Chhatrasal Convention Centre at Khajuraho developed under **Swadesh Darshan Scheme** of Ministry of Tourism in Khajuraho, Madhya Pradesh.
- The UNESCO world Heritage site Khajuraho attracts tourists for its mesmerising temples. Adding on more to its features is the convention Centre with brilliant facilities, Named as Maharaja Chhatrasal Convention Centre Khajuraho, this venue will cater to all your business needs.
- 9. AYUSH Ministry in collaboration with Vinoba Seva Pratishthan organizes 'Ayurveda Parav'
- In a bid to promote Ayurveda as the mainstream treatment for the prevalent lifestyle related diseases, Vinoba Seva Pratisthan (VSP), in collaboration with the Ministry of AYUSH, has successfully organized 'Ayurveda Parav' in Bhubaneswar from 26th to 28thMarch 2021.
- The 3-days event was inaugurated by **Padma Vibhushan Dr Raghunath Mohapatra**, Hon'ble Member of Rajya Sabha along with **Shri Naba Kishore Das**, Hon'ble Minister of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of Odisha and **Shri Trilochan Majhi**, Director of AYUSH, Govt. of Odisha.
- During this Parv, nearly 25 research papers were presented by experts and researchers.
- **10. The Road Transport and Highways Ministry published the draft rules regarding concession in motor vehicle tax against scrapped vehicles** Under the draft rules, people will get 25 percent concession on the purchase of personal vehicles with vehicle scrappage certificate while on the purchase of commercial vehicles, the tax relief will be 15 percent.
- In case of personal vehicles, the tax concessions will be available up to 8 years while for commercial vehicles, it will be up to 15 years.
- The rules are proposed to come into force from October 01, 2021.
- Note: Recently, Minister for Road Transport and Highways, Shri Nitin Gadkari announced the "Vehicle Scrapping Policy".





- 11. Dr. Harsh Vardhan inaugurates Alignment and Awareness Event for Publicity of DSIR-PRISM Scheme
- Union Minister for Science & Technology, Earth Sciences and Health & Family Welfare, Dr Harsh Vardhan inaugurated Alignment and Awareness Event for Publicity of the Department of Scientific and Industrial Research -Promoting Innovations in Individuals, Startups and MSMEs (DSIR-PRISM) scheme at IIT Delhi.
- The innovation movement by DSIR-PRISM making synergy with three National Initiatives like Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, Smart India Hackathon and Rural Technology Action Group is unique.
- **Note:** Under the initiative, an innovator of Indian nationality student, professional and common citizen is provided technical, strategic, and financial assistance by DSIR-PRISM.
- **Recently,** Dr. Harsh Vardhan digitally participated in a panel discussion on vaccine production and distribution across Asia at the **"World Immunisation and Logistics Summit".**
- 12. Atal Innovation Mission launches 'AIM-PRIME', in partnership with BMGF &Venture Center
- Atal Innovation Mission (AIM), NITI Aayog launched **AIM-PRIME** (**Program for Researchers on Innovations, Market-Readiness & Entrepreneurship)**, an initiative to promote and support science-based deep-tech startups & ventures across India.
- In this regard, AIM has joined hands with **Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation** (**BMGF**) to launch this nationwide program which will be implemented by **Venture Center** a non-profit technology business incubator.
- The first cohort of the program is open to technology developers (tech start ups/scientists/ engineers/ clinicians) with strong science-based deep tech business ideas.
- About Atal Innovation Mission (AIM): It is a flagship initiative set up by the NITI Aayog to promote innovation and entrepreneurship in the country and was setup in 2016.

13. MA Ganapathy appointed as Director General of NSG

Mr Ganapathy, a 1986-batch IPS officer has been appointment as the Director General (DG) of National Security Guard (NSG) by the Appointments Committee of the Cabinet (ACC).

- He was serving as the DG of the Bureau of Civil Aviation Security (BCAS).
- About National Security Guard (NSG): NSG was raised in 1984 as the federal contingency commando force and its primary task includes undertaking specific counter-terrorist, counter-hijack operations and VVIP protection duties.

14. Prime Minister launches 'Jal Shakti Abhiyan: Catch the Rain' campaign

• The Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi launched the 'Jal Shakti Abhiyan: Catch the Rain' campaign on World Water Day.

- The campaign launched under the theme: 'Catch the Rain, where it falls, when it falls' will be implemented in all districts, rural as well as urban areas, of the country during the period March 22, 2021 to November 30, 2021 (the pre-monsoon and monsoon period).
- On the occasion, **A Memorandum of Agreement** was signed between the Union Minister of Jal Shakti and the Chief Ministers of Madhya Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh to implement the **Ken Betwa Link Project**, the first project of the National Perspective Plan for interlinking of rivers.
- About Ken Betwa Link Project: This project involves transfer of water from the Ken to the Betwa River through the construction of Daudhan Dam and a canal linking the two rivers, the Lower Orr Project, Kotha Barrage and Bina Complex Multipurpose Project.

15. Government forms experts committee for Startup India Seed Fund Scheme

- The government has constituted an experts advisory committee chaired by **H K Mittal** from the Department of Science and Technology.
- The committee will be responsible for the overall execution and monitoring of the Startup India Seed Fund Scheme.
- About Startup India Seed Fund Scheme (SISFS): It has been approved for the period of next four years starting from 2021-22.
- It will be implemented with effect from April 1, 2021.

Rs 945 crore corpus will be divided over the next four years for providing seed funding to eligible startups through eligible incubators across India.

16. Minister for Road Transport and Highways, Shri Nitin Gadkari announces the Vehicle Scrapping Policy

- The main features of the Policy:
- It is proposed that commercial vehicles be de-registered after 15 years in case of failure to get the fitness certificate.
- It is proposed that Private Vehicles be de-registered after 20 years if found unfit or in case of a failure to renew registration certificate.
- The scheme shall provide strong incentives to owners of old vehicles to scrap old and unfit vehicles through registered scrapping centres.
- The Ministry of Road Transport and Highways will promote setting up of **Registered Vehicle Scrapping Facility (RVSF)** across India.
- Note: Criteria to determine vehicle fitness will be primarily emission tests, braking, safety equipment, among many other tests which are as per the Central Motor Vehicle Rules, 1989.

17. Government to lunch Poshan Abhiyan for the Elderly

• The Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment aims to launch a Poshan Abhiyan for the Elderly, to provide nutrition support to the indigent elders, who are not staying in the Old Age Homes and are victims of severe malnutrition.





- The Gram Panchayats and Urban Municipalities will be the implementing agencies of the Scheme.
- The fund for the Scheme will be provided by the **Senior Citizens Welfare Fund**.
- About Poshan Abhiyan: Government is implementing Poshan Abhiyan, earlier known as National Nutrition Mission, since 18th December 2017 to address the problem of malnutrition in the country.
- 18. Government of India drives Enforcement of Contracts and Conciliation Mechanism
- In order to lay emphasis on Enforcement of Contracts and Conciliation Mechanism, **NITI Aayog has constituted two Task Forces.**
- **The Task Force for Enforcement of Contracts:** It will give its recommendation for a policy framework for Enforcement of Contracts.
- The Vice Chairman, NITI Aayog will be the Chairman of this Task force.
- The task force will also examine relevant provisions of the Commercial Courts Act, 2015.
- **The Task Force on Conciliation Mechanism:** It will give its recommendation for an effective Conciliation Mechanism.
- The CEO, NITI Aayog will be the Chairman of this Task force.
- The task force will also examine relevant provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996.
- Facts about NITI (National Institution for Transforming India) Aayog: Formed: 1 January 2015



- On this occasion Shaheed Bhagat Singh Smarak was inaugurated by the Union Minister of Education, Shri Ramesh Pokhriyal 'Nishank'.
- The existing collection of books on freedom fighters in the Bhagat Singh Smarak has been announced to be converted into "Shaheed Smriti Pustakalaya."

20. Parliament passes the National Capital Territory of Delhi (Amendment) Bill, 2021





- Rajya Sabha on March 24, 2021, passed the National Capital Territory of Delhi (Amendment) Bill, 2021. The bill was earlier passed in the Lok Sabha on March 22, 2021.
- The latest bill amends the Government of National Capital Territory of Delhi Act, 1991 which provides a framework for the functioning of the Government of Delhi and the Legislative Assembly.
- The Bill provides that the term 'government' referred to in any law made by the Legislative Assembly of Delhi will imply Lieutenant Governor, LG.

21. Prime Minister inaugurates 'Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav' from Sabarmati Ashram; flags off Dandi Padyatra

- The Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi inaugurated the curtain raiser activities of the 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' (India@75).
- He flagged off the 'Padyatra' (Freedom March) from Sabarmati Ashram, Ahmedabad, Gujarat on March12, 2021.
- The Padyatra will cover a journey of 241 miles from Sabarmati Ashram, Ahmedabad to Dandi in Navsari and will end on 5th April, 2021 lasting for 25 days.
- Shri Prahlad Singh Patel, Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Culture & Tourism will lead the first lap of 75 kilometers of the Padyatra.
- The launch of the 'Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav' 75 weeks before 15 August 2022 will continue till 15 August, 2023.
- Note: Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav is a series of events to be organised by the Government of India to commemorate the 75th Anniversary of India's Independence.
- Mahatma Gandhi along with 81 persons had initiated the famous Dandi Padyatra from 12th March to 6th April, 1930.

22. Prime Minister addresses 4th Global Ayurveda Festival

- The Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi addressed the 4th Global Ayurveda Festival (12-19 March, 2021, Kerala) through virtual mode.
- The **National AYUSH Mission** has been started to promote AYUSH medical systems through cost effective AYUSH services.
- India's policy regarding Ayurveda and other Indian systems of medicine is already aligned with the Traditional Medicine Strategy 2014-2023 of the World Health Organisation.
- Note: The WHO has also announced the setting up of the Global Centre for Traditional Medicine in India.

23. Government launches 'Mera Ration' mobile app

- The Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food & Public Distribution launched the 'Mera Ration' mobile app in line with the "One Nation One Ration Card" (ONORC) scheme.
- This app will benefit especially those ration card holders who move to new areas for livelihoods.





- Note: The system which was started initially in 4 States in August 2019 has been swiftly rolled out in a very short span of time in 32 States/UTs by December 2020 and the integration of remaining 4 States/UT (Assam, Chhattisgarh, Delhi and West Bengal) is expected to be completed in next few months.
- At present, the system covers nearly **69 Crore NFSA beneficiaries** (about 86% NFSA population) in the country.
- The **ONORC scheme** is being implemented by the Department of Food & Public Distribution for the nation-wide portability of ration cards under **National Food Security Act (NFSA)**.

24. Union Minister Anurag Thakur appointed as Captain in Territorial Army

- Minister of State for Finance and Corporate Affairs Anurag Thakur became the first serving MP (Member of Parliament) to be appointed as Captain in the Territorial Army.
- Mr Thakur has been promoted to the rank of Captain at 124 Infantry Battalion Territorial Army (Sikh).
- Note: The four-time BJP MP from Himachal Pradesh's Hamirpur was commissioned into the Territorial Army as a Lieutenant by then Chief of Army Staff General Dalbir S Suhag in July 2016.

25. Government appointed GP Samanta as Chief Statistician of India


- Samanta will also hold charge as Secretary in the Ministry of Statistics and Program Implementation (MoSPI).
- He will replace Kshatrapati Shivaji who was given additional charge in MoSPI in September.
- Samanta is currently as an advisor in the Reserve Bank of India's department of statistics and information management.

26. Maths, physics, chemistry not compulsory for engineering admissions: AICTE

- In a major change in the eligibility criteria for engineering courses, the **AICTE** (**All India Council for Technical Education**) has made Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics (PCM) optional for students who wish to pursue technical courses like biotechnology, textile or agriculture engineering at the undergraduate level.
- However, PCM remains mandatory for most engineering subjects like computer science.
- About AICTE (All India Council for Technical Education): It is a statutory body, and a national-level council for technical education, under the Department of Higher Education.

27. Centre's Panel for air quality management in NCR dissolved within five months





- **The Commission for Air Quality Management** in the National Capital Region (NCR) and its Adjoining Areas, formed by the Centre last year in October, stands dissolved as the ordinance under which it was established has lapsed.
- Since ordinance was not introduced in Parliament within six weeks of its convention, it has lapsed and consequently, the commission also has been shut down within five months of its constitution.
- Note: The commission was headed by M M Kutty, former secretary to the Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas.
- Under the ordinance released by the Ministry of Law and Justice on October 28, the Environment Pollution (Prevention and Control) Authority (EPCA) was dissolved and replaced by the commission.

28. New scheme announced for tourist vehicle operators

- The Ministry of Road Transport and Highways has announced a new scheme, under which any tourist vehicle operator may apply for an "All India Tourist Authorization/Permit" through online mode.
- The new set of rules, to be known as, "All India Tourist Vehicles Authorization and Permit Rules, 2021".
- The new rules will be applicable from 01 April 2021. All existing permits shall continue to be in force during their validity.
- The step was discussed in the **39th & 40th Transport Development Council** Meetings.
- 29. Cabinet approves closure of Handicrafts and Handlooms Export Corporation of India Limited
- The Union Cabinet, chaired by the Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi has approved the closure of **Handicrafts and Handlooms Export Corporation of India Limited (HHEC),** a Government of India undertaking under the administrative control of the Ministry of Textiles.
- The Corporation has been continuously incurring losses since financial year 2015-16 and not earning sufficient income to meet its running expenses.

30. Centre appoints high-level team to review Medical Care & Public Health arrangements for Kumbh Mela at Haridwar

- Centre has deployed a three-member high-level central team to review Medical Care and Public Health arrangements for Kumbh Mela at Haridwar in Uttarakhand.
- The team is being led by **Dr SK Singh**, Director, National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC). **Dr SK Jain**, Additional Director and **Dr Meera Dhuria**, Deputy Director, both from NCDC are the team members.
- Note: The Kumbh Mela at Haridwar is held every 12 years at Haridwar, India.

31. Prime Minister Narendra Modi's Principal Advisor PK Sinha resigns





Sinha, a retired IAS officer of 1977 batch, was appointed as Principal Advisor to the Prime Minister in September 2019, after a brief stint as an officer on special duty (OSD).

- Sinha was made OSD to the Prime Minister in August 2019, after he had served four years as Cabinet Secretary.
- 32. Former PepsiCo CEO Indra Nooyi's memoir titled "My Life in Full: Work, Family and Our Future"

"My Life in Full: Work, Family and Our Future" will be published by Portfolio Books on September 28, 2021.

- Indra Nooyi was honoured with Padam Bhushan in 2007.
- She worked at PepsiCo for 24 years.
- 33. Rajya Sabha passes the Medical Termination of Pregnancy (Amendment) Bill, 2021
- The Rajya Sabha has approved the Medical Termination of Pregnancy (Amendment) Bill, 2021 to amend the Medical Termination of Pregnancy Act, 1971 on 16th March 2021.
- The Bill was approved in Lok Sabha on 17th March 2020.
- Some salient features of amendments:
- Enhancing the upper gestation limit from 20 to 24 weeks for special categories of women which will be defined in the amendments to the Medical Termination of Pregnancy Rules and would include survivors of rape, victims of incest and other vulnerable women (like differently-abled women, minors) etc.
- Opinion of only one provider will be required up to 20 weeks of gestation and of two providers for termination of pregnancy of 20-24 weeks of gestation.

34. The Government constitutes a National Committee headed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi to commemorate 75 years of India's Independence

- The committee has 259 members and includes dignitaries and eminent citizens.
- The Government intends to commemorate 75 years of India's Independence in a befitting manner at national and international level in the form of 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav'.
- The 75 years of India's Independence falls on 15th August 2022 and celebrations are proposed to be launched 75 weeks prior to this date on 12th March 2021.
- Note: 12th March is the 91st anniversary of the historic Salt Satyagraha led by Mahatma Gandhi.

35. Union Health Minister Dr. Harsh Vardhan launches 'CSIR Floriculture Mission'

- Harsh Vardhan encouraged scientists of CSIR laboratories across the country to develop the land available at each laboratory to be set up as a model under the "CSIR Floriculture Mission".
- CSIR Floriculture Mission has been approved for implementation in 21 States and Union Territories of India.
- Harsh Vardhan also launched CSIR's Societal Portal along with the Android App.





• Note: The Indian floriculture market was worth Rs 15700 cr in 2018. The market is projected to reach Rs 47200 cr by 2024 during 2019-24.


36. All major schemes of Women and Child Development Ministry classified under 3 Umbrella Schemes

- Indian Railway has integrated all railway helplines into single number 139 (Rail Madad Helpline) for quick grievance redressal and enquiry during the journey.
- Various Railway grievances helplines were discontinued last year. Now, Helpline no. 182 would also be discontinued from 1.4.21, and merged into 139.
- The Ministry of Railways has also launched a Social Media campaign **#OneRailOneHelpline139** to inform and educate the passengers.
- Note: Recently, Indian Railways' Western Railway zone has introduced a mobile train radio communication (MTRC) system to prevent the train accidents by effective communication.





38. Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi inaugurated the first-ever India Toy Fair 2021

- The Toy Fair is being organized from 27th February to 2nd March 2021.
- Note: Today India's share in the \$ 100 billion global toy market is very small. 85 % of the toys in the country are sourced from abroad.
- The **National Toy Action Plan** has also been prepared. It has included 15 ministries and departments to make these industries competitive.
- Recently, **Toyathon-2021** was also organized to promote Indian sports based toys and more than 7000 ideas were brainstormed.

39. City Innovation Exchange (CiX) launched for Fostering Innovation in Urban Ecosystem

- The City Innovation Exchange platform was launched by Shri Durga Shanker Mishra, Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs.
- About City Innovation Exchange (CiX): CiX will connect cities to innovators across the national ecosystem to design innovative solutions for their pressing challenges.
- The Platform has more than 400 start-ups, 100 smart cities, more than 150 challenges statements and over 215 solutions at the time of launch.
- 40. Swachh Iconic Places Ministry of Jal Shakti announces selection of 12 sites for transforming them into 'Swachh Tourist Destinations' under Phase IV
- Under Swachh Iconic Places initiative of Swachh Bharat Mission Grameen (SBM-G), the Department of Drinking Water and Sanitation, Ministry of Jal Shakti has announced the selection of the following 12 iconic sites under Phase IV-

41. Election Commission of India announced the schedule for 2021 General Elections to State Legislative Assemblies of Assam, Kerala, Tamil Nadu, West Bengal and Puducherry

- Polls are to be held for 294 seats in West Bengal, 234 seats in Tamil Nadu, 140 seats in Kerala, 126 seats in Assam and 30 seats in Puducherry.
- Note: Recently, President's Rule was imposed in Puducherry.





42. MoHUA launches field assessment of Swachh Survekshan 2021

- Shri Durga Shanker Mishra, Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Housing Affairs (MoHUA) launched the field assessment of Swachh Survekshan (SS) 2021.
- It is the sixth edition of the annual cleanliness survey conducted by the Government of India.
- About Swachh Survekshan (SS): It was introduced by MoHUA in 2016 as a competitive framework to encourage cities to improve the status of urban sanitation while encouraging large scale citizen participation.
- Note: Every year, the on-field assessment for SS takes place between January 4-31. However, the same had been delayed by two months due to the COVID pandemic and will now be conducted between 1-28 March 2021.

43. Real-Time Monitoring System of Toll Plazas

- Union Minister for Road Transport and Highways Nitin Gadkari launched the Real-Time Monitoring System of Toll Plazas.
- It improves traffic congestion problem at toll plazas/ city roads/highways by using central monitoring system.
- It uses several technologies like Satellite Imagery, GIS, Remote Sensing along with a proprietary algorithm to remotely monitor the congestion status of the roads.
- Note: The government has made **FASTag** mandatory from the 15th February midnight and any vehicle not fitted with it will be charged double the toll at electronic toll plazas across the country.

44. Government notifies Information Technology (Intermediary Guidelines and Digital Media Ethics Code) Rules 2021

- The Information Technology (Intermediary Guidelines and Digital Media Ethics Code) Rules 2021 has been framed in exercise of powers under section 87 (2) of the Information Technology Act, 2000 and in supersession of the earlier Information Technology (Intermediary Guidelines) Rules 2011.
- The new rules have been widely introduced for social media and over-the-top (OTT) platforms.

45. Union Minister for Social Justice and Empowerment Shri Thaawarchand Gehlot launched "Sugamya Bharat App" and a handbook entitled "Access – The Photo Digest"

- The App and the handbook have been developed by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities under the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment.
- Sugamya Bharat App a Crowd sourcing Mobile Application is a means for sensitising and enhancing accessibility in the 3 pillars of the Accessible India Campaign i.e. built environment, transportation sector and ICT ecosystem in India.
- The handbook entitled "Access The Photo Digest" is a collection of photographs from across different States and UTs.
- This Book is envisaged as a tool and guide to sensitise stakeholders about 10 basic features of accessibility and related good-bad practices in easy to understand pictorial form.





46. Rajya Sabha TV and Lok Sabha TV merges, now to be known as Sansad TV

- Retired IAS officer Ravi Capoor has been appointed as its Chief Executive Officer of Sansad TV.
- The decision has been taken jointly by the Chairman of the Rajya Sabha, M. Venkaiah Naidu, and Speaker of Lok Sabha, Om Birla, based on the report of a committee set up to look into the integration of the two channels.

Important News: World

- 1. World's first ship tunnel to be constructed in Norway
 - The world's first ship tunnel 'Stad Ship Tunnel' is to be constructed in Norway.
 - As per Norwegian Coastal Administration, the construction on the engineering project is expected to begin in 2022 and get completed by 2025-26.
 - The ship tunnel is planned to run underneath the mountains in Norway's Stadhavet peninsula.
 - It is expected to measure 1,700 metres long, 37 metres high and 26.5 metres wide after completion.

2. Indo-Korean Friendship Park inaugurated

- India's First Indo-Korean Friendship Park was jointly inaugurated by Mr Suh Wook, Hon'ble Minister of National Defence, South Korea (Republic of Korea) and Shri Rajnath Singh, Hon'ble Raksha Mantri, at Delhi Cantonment on 26 Mar 2021.
- The park's significance is not only because of it being a symbol of strong India-South Korea friendly relations, but also as a monument to India's contributions as part of 21 countries which participated in Korean war 1950-53, under the aegis of the United Nations.
- Note: The South Korea's Minister of National Defence, Suh Wook visited India between March 25-27, 2021 with a focus on boosting bilateral defence and military cooperation.
- Facts about South Korea: Capital: Seoul President: Moon Jae-in Currency: South Korean Won
- **3.** The cargo ship 'Ever Given' stranded in Egypt's Suez Canal lifted off the side of the channel
 - The Suez Canal Authority has announced that the cargo 'Ever Given' which has blocked Suez Canal for almost a week has been freed and is now on the move.
 - About Suez Canal: It is an artificial sea-level waterway in Egypt, connecting the Mediterranean Sea to the Red Sea through the Isthmus of Suez and dividing Africa and Asia.





• About 15% of world shipping traffic transits the Suez Canal, which is an important source of foreign currency revenue for Egypt.

4. Iran, China sign a 25-Year 'Strategic Cooperation Pact'

- Iran and China signed a 25-year "Strategic Cooperation Pact" in the latest expansion of Beijing's flagship trillion-dollar Belt and Road Initiative.
- China is Iran's leading trade partner and was one of the biggest buyers of Iranian oil.
- The agreement, signed in Tehran by Iranian Foreign Minister Mohammad Javad Zarif and his Chinese counterpart, Wang Yi.
- Note: Iran's foreign ministry spokesman Saeed Khatibzadeh said that the pact had first been proposed during a visit to Tehran by Chinese President Xi Jinping in January 2016.


5. India takes part in 2nd Sherpas meeting of G7, guest countries

- The 2nd meeting of the Sherpas of G7 and guest countries was held on March 30, 2021.
- India's representative (Sherpa) Suresh Prabhu attended the meeting.
- The priority issues under the UK's G7 Presidency agenda were discussed, including preparations for the COP26 Summit and global health cooperation.
- Note: The United Kingdom has invited Prime Minister Narendra Modi to attend the G7 Summit as a guest, along with Australia, South Korea and South Africa.
- The G7 Summit is to be held on June 11-13, 2021.
- **Facts about G7:** The heads of government of the member states, as well as the representatives of the European Union, meet at the annual G7 Summit.
- Founded: 1975
- **Members:** United Kingdom, United States, Japan, France, Germany, Canada, Italy

6. 3rd phase of Indian Beamline Project for materials research in Japan initiated

- The 3rd phase of the Indian Beamline Project, a facility for materials research set up under India-Japan Scientific and Technological Cooperation, was initiated on March 23, 2021, with special focus on industrial application research.
- The phase would increase the number of young researchers from India to be trained in advanced X-ray techniques of material research.
- About Indian Beamline: The Indian Beamline has been constructed and maintained by Saha Institute of Nuclear Physics (SINP), Kolkata and Jawaharlal Nehru Centre for Advanced Scientific Research (JNCASR), Bangalore; in Japanese synchrotron light source Photon Factory (PF) of High Energy Accelerator Research Organization (KEK), with support from Nano Mission, Department of Science and Technology.

7. US India Artificial Intelligence (USIAI) Initiative launched





- On March 17, 2021, Indo-U.S. Science and Technology Forum (IUSSTF) has launched the US-India Artificial Intelligence (USIAI) Initiative.
- **USIAI** will serve as a platform to discuss opportunities for bilateral AI R&D collaboration.
- The Indo-U.S. Science and Technology Forum (IUSSTF) established under an agreement between the Governments of India and the United States of America in March 2000, is an autonomous bilateral organization jointly funded by both the Governments that promotes Science, Technology, Engineering and Innovation.

8. UNDP launches "Sahi Disha" campaign in rural India

- The UNDP has launched "Sahi Disha" campaign to celebrate women's livelihoods and entrepreneurship in rural India.
- The Disha initiative, a five-year collaboration between UNDP and the IKEA Foundation, enabled one million women through skilling and counselling services to access job and livelihood opportunities across five states - Delhi NCR, Haryana, Karnataka, Maharashtra and Telangana.

 - The **United Kingdom** became the first member state to leave the EU on 31 January 2020.

10. India, US to re-establish Homeland Security Dialogue

- **The Joe Biden administration** has announced the re-establishment of the Homeland Security Dialogue with India that was discontinued by the former President of the USA, Donald Trump.
- Homeland Security Secretary Alejandro Mayorkas and India's Ambassador to the US Taranjit Singh Sandhu agreed to re-establish the US-India Homeland Security Dialogue and to discuss important issues such as cybersecurity, emerging technology and addressing violent extremism.





- Note: An initiative of the Obama administration, the first India-US Homeland Security Dialogue was held in India in May 2011.
- The second India-US Homeland Security Dialogue was held in Washington DC in 2013.

11. First Quad Leaders' virtual summit 2021

- Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi virtually participated, along with Prime Minister of Australia Scott Morrison and Prime Minister of Japan Yoshihide Suga and President of U.S.A. Joseph R. Biden, in the first Leaders' Summit of the Quadrilateral Framework on 12th March 2021.
- The Leaders discussed regional and global issues of shared interest and exchange views on practical areas of cooperation towards maintaining a free, open and inclusive Indo-Pacific region.
- Note: Quad Leaders agreed to pool financing, manufacturing and distribution capacity to send 1 billion coronavirus vaccines across Asia by the end of 2022.
- About Quad: The Quadrilateral Security Dialogue also known as the Quad is an informal strategic forum between Australia, India, Japan and the United States.

12.1st Meeting of the BRICS Contact Group on Economic and Trade Issues held

- The BRICS Contact Group on Economic and Trade Issues (CGETI) held their first meeting under India's Chairship from 9-11 March 2021.
- The theme of BRICS this year is -"BRICS@15: Intra BRICS Cooperation for Continuity, Consolidation, and Consensus".
- Note: The 13th BRICS Summit will be held under India's Chairship in 2021, and it will be the third time India will host the BRICS Summit after 2012 and 2016.
- Facts about BRICS: Formation: 2009 Countries: Brazil, Russia, India, China, and South Africa

13. Prime Minister Narendra Modi addresses International Conference on Disaster Resilient Infrastructure (ICDRI) 2021

- Coalition for Disaster Resilient Infrastructure (CDRI), in partnership with member countries, organisations and institutions, is hosting the International Conference on Disaster Resilient Infrastructure (ICDRI) 2021, a three-day virtual Conference scheduled to be held from March 17 to March 19, 2021.

15. Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurates 'Maitri Setu' between India and Bangladesh

- 'Maitri Setu', 1.9 kilometres long, joining Sabroom in India with Ramgarh in Bangladesh, has been built over the **Feni River** which flows between the Indian boundary in Tripura and Bangladesh.
- Due to this bridge over Feni River, Agartala will become the nearest city to an international sea port in India.
- Note: Two ships of Indian navy (INS Kulish and INS Sumedha) arrived at the port city of Mongla in Bangladesh to commemorate the ongoing 'Swarnim Vijay Varsh'.

16. France launches first military exercises in space

- France launched its first military exercise in space to evaluate its ability to defend its satellites and other defense equipment from an attack.
- The exercise, codenamed "AsterX" in memory of the first French satellite from 1965, will be based on 18 simulated events in an operations room.
- Note: The French Space Forces Command was created in 2019 and is set to have 500 personnel by 2025.

17. Pakistan to remain on FATF 'Grey List'

- Financial Action Task Force (FATF) decided to keep Pakistan on its terrorism financing 'Grey List' till June 2021.
- Note: In October 2020, the FATF had kept Pakistan on the grey list citing its failure to fulfill six out of 27 obligations of the global money laundering and terrorist financing watchdog.
- Pakistan has been on the FATF's grey list since June 2018.

18. UN body recommends Bangladesh graduation from LDC

- The United Nations Committee for Development Policy (CDP) has recommended graduation of Bangladesh from the category of Least Developed Country (LDC) as it fulfilled the eligibility criteria in terms of per capita income, human assets and economic and environmental vulnerability.
- This is the second consecutive time since 2018 that the CDP has made recommendation for Bangladesh for graduation from LDC category.
- The proposal will be sent to the United Nations Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) for endorsement in June to be finally approved by the UN General Assembly (UNGA) in September this year.
- Note: Bangladesh will get time upto 2026 to prepare for the transition to the status of a developing country.

19. Israel officially receives first ever UAE ambassador

- Israel formally received the first-ever ambassador from the UAE (United Arab Emirates), following last year's historic agreement between the countries to normalise ties.
- The UAE's first ambassador to Israel, Mohamed Al Khajah delivered his credentials to Israeli President Reuven Rivlin at a ceremony in Jerusalem.
- The UAE was the first country to agree to establish full diplomatic relations with the Jewish state under the **Abraham Accords**, a pact brokered by former US president Donald Trump.
- Facts about Israel:

20. UN General Assembly adopts India's resolution to declare 2023 as 'International Year of Millets'

- The resolution titled 'International Year of Millets 2023' was initiated by India with Bangladesh, Kenya, Nepal, Nigeria, Russia and Senegal and was co-sponsored by over 70 nations.
- The primary objective of the proposal is to increase awareness and direct policy action for nutritional and health benefits for consumption of millet and their suitability for farming in adverse and changing climatic conditions.
- Note: In April 2016, the UN General Assembly had proclaimed the UN Decade of Action on Nutrition from 2016 to 2025, recognizing the need to eradicate hunger and prevent all forms of malnutrition worldwide.

- 1. Finance Minister Smt. Nirmala Sitharaman attends 6th Annual Meeting of Board of Governors of New Development Bank
- Union Minister of Finance & Corporate Affairs and India's Governor in New Development Bank (NDB), Smt. Nirmala Sitharaman attended the 6th Annual Meeting of Board of Governors of New Development Bank on March 30, 2021.
- The meeting was also attended by Governors/Alternate Governors of Brazil, China, Russia and South Africa.
- This year's Annual Meeting theme was "New Development Paradigms: The Evolution of Infrastructure".
- Note: Sitharaman mentioned that India is going to set up a new Development Financial Institutions (DFIs) with initial paid-up capital of around \$3 billion with a lending target of \$69 billion in next three years.
- About New Development Bank (NDB): Headquarters: Shanghai, China President: Marcos Prado Troyjo
 Founder: BRICS countries (Brazil, Russia, India, China, and South Africa).
 Founded: 15 July 2014
 First President: K. V. Kamath

2. NITI Aayog releases report 'Investment Opportunities in India's Healthcare Sector'

- NITI Aayog released a report outlining the range of investment opportunities in various segments of India's healthcare sector, including hospitals, medical devices and equipment, health insurance, telemedicine, home healthcare and medical value travel.
- The report was released by NITI Aayog Member Dr VK Paul, CEO Amitabh Kant, and Additional Secretary Dr Rakesh Sarwal.
- India's healthcare industry has been growing at a Compound Annual Growth Rate of around 22% since 2016. At this rate, it is expected to reach USD 372 billion in 2022.
- As per estimates by the National Skill Development Corporation, healthcare can generate 27 lakh additional jobs in India between 2017-22.





- 3. Insurance (Amendment) Bill, 2021 passed in Rajya Sabha; Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) limit increased from 49 to 74 %
- The Rajya Sabha has passed the Insurance (Amendment) Bill, 2021. It seeks to amend the Insurance Act, 1938 which will increase the limit of foreign investment allowed in Indian insurance companies.
- The Bill provides to increase the foreign direct investment limit from existing 49 percent to 74 percent.
- Note: The Act was first amended during Atal Bihari Vajpayee's tenure when 26 percent FDI was allowed in the insurance sector.
- In 2015, the law was amended further to allow 49 percent FDI.
- 4. Government to launch 'Atmanirbhar Niveshak Mitra' portal for handholding and facilitation of domestic investors
- In order to further strengthen efforts to promote domestic investments, the **Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT)** is in the process of finalising the 'Atmanirbhar Niveshak Mitra' digital portal.
- The portal is in testing phase and the final version will be ready for launch by 15th May this year.

Some of the special features of the Atmanirbhar Niveshak Mitra portal include One-stop-shop to access all MSME portals; Information about the Approvals, Licenses, Clearances, Incentives & Schemes applicable to specific businesses across different sectors and Information on Manufacturing Clusters and Land Availability.

- 5. US becomes India's second biggest oil supplier
- The United States overtook Saudi Arabia as India's second biggest oil supplier in February 2021, as refiners boosted cheaper U.S. crude purchases to record levels to offset OPEC+ supply cuts.
- The trade data is released by Reuters.
- India's imports from the United States the world's top producer rose 48 percent to a record 545,300 barrels per day (bpd) in February 2021.
- Saudi Arabia, which has consistently been one of India's top two suppliers, slipped to No. 4 for the first time since at least January 2006.
- India is the world's third biggest oil importer and consumer, shipping in about 84% of its crude needs, and relies heavily on the Middle East.
- Note: Iraq is the India's first biggest oil supplier.
- 6. India's Foreign-exchange reserves (Forex reserves) have become the fourth largest in the world, surpassing Russia
- As per the Reserve Bank of India (RBI), India's foreign currency holdings, which dropped \$4.3 billion to \$580.3 billion on March 5, 2021, surpassed Russia's \$580.1 billion.
- As of March 2021, International Monetary Fund (IMF) table, China has the largest Forex reserves followed by Japan and Switzerland.





- **Foreign-exchange reserves:** Foreign exchange reserves are cash and other reserve assets such as gold held by a central bank or other monetary authority that are primarily available to balance payments of the country, influence the foreign exchange rate of its currency, and to maintain confidence in financial markets.
- 7. RBI asks banks to implement image-based Cheque Truncation System in all branches

Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has asked banks to implement the image-based Cheque Truncation System (CTS) in all branches by September 30, 2021.

- The move is aimed at faster settlement of cheques resulting in better customer service.
- Last month, the RBI had announced pan-India coverage of CTS by bringing all bank branches under the image-based clearing mechanism.
- Note: There are about 18,000 bank branches that are still outside any formal clearing arrangement. The CTS is in use since 2010 and presently covers around 1,50,000 branches.
- 8. India home to 4.12-lakh millionaire households, Mumbai tops the chart: Hurun India Wealth Report 2020
- According to Hurun India Wealth Report 2020, there are 4.12-lakh millionaire households / affluent households in India with a networth of at least Rs 7 crore.
- Region-wise, the top 10 states are home to 70.3 percent of millionaire households in the country. Maharashtra has the highest number of millionaires (56,000), followed by Uttar Pradesh, Tamil Nadu.
- There are 16,933 millionaire households in Mumbai, which contributes about 6.16 percent to the country's GDP.
- Note: The report has identified a novel household category in India the 'New Middle Class' with an average savings of Rs 20-lakh per annum.
- 9. Union Cabinet approves 'Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Nidhi' as 'single non-lapsable reserve fund'
- The Union Cabinet approved the 'Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Nidhi' (PMSSN) as a 'single non-lapsable reserve fund' for share of Health from the proceeds of Health and Education Cess levied under Finance Act, 2007.
- The use of this fund will be utilized for the **flagship schemes of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare** namely: Ayushman Bharat - Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana, Ayushman Bharat - Health and Wellness Centres, National Health Mission and Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojana.
- Note: In the budget speech 2018, the Finance Minister while announcing Ayushman Bharat Scheme, also announced replacement of existing 3% Education Cess by 4% Health and Education Cess.

10. APEDA organizes first ever Virtual Trade Fair (VTF)



- In a first of its kind initiative for boosting export potential of India's agricultural and processed food products during COVID19 pandemic, APEDA launched its first Virtual Trade Fair on 10thMarch 2021. The fair will conclude on March 12, 2021.
- The fair with a theme 'India Rice and Agro Commodity', will focus on showcasing the exports potential of various agricultural commodities.
- Facts about Agricultural and Processed Food Products Export Development Authority (APEDA):

- It highlights the role of finance in India's transition to electric vehicles (EVs) and analyses that the transition will require a cumulative capital investment of USD 266 billion (Rs 19.7 lakh crore) in EVs, charging infrastructure, and batteries over the next decade.
- The report also identifies a market size of USD 50 billion (Rs 3.7 lakh crore) for the financing of EVs in 2030.
- Rocky Mountain Institute (RMI), an independent non-profit founded in 1982, transforms global energy use to create a clean, prosperous, and secure low-carbon future.
- 12. "India Telecom 2021"- a platform for convergence of technologies and business exchange
- **TEPC** (**Telecom Equipment Export Promotion Council**) has organized 'India Telecom 2021' (March 3- 4, 2021) - an Exclusive International Business Expo under Market Access Initiative Scheme (MAI) of Department of Commerce, Government of India and with support of Department of Telecommunications & Ministry of External Affairs.
- Note: The government has announced the **Production Linked Incentive (PLI)** schemes for various sectors, including telecom sector, to become a part of the global supply chain.
- About TEPC (Telecom Equipment Export Promotion Council): TEPC has been set up by the Ministry of Commerce & Industry and Ministry of Communications, Government of India to promote and develop of Export of Telecom Equipment and Services.

13. Government amends Insurance Ombudsman Rules, 2017

• The Union Government on 2nd March 2021 notified comprehensive amendments to the Insurance Ombudsman Rules, 2017, with a view to improve the working of the





Insurance Ombudsman mechanism to facilitate resolution of complaints regarding deficiencies in insurance services in a timely, cost-effective and impartial manner.

• The amended rules have enlarged the scope of complaints to Ombudsman from only disputes earlier to deficiencies in service on the part of insurers, agents, brokers and other intermediaries.

Note: The Ombudsman mechanism was administered by the Executive Council of Insurers, which has been renamed as the **Council for Insurance Ombudsman**

1. Asha Bhosle to be honoured with Maharashtra Bhushan Award

- Legendary singer Asha Bhosle will be honoured with the prestigious Maharashtra Bhushan Award for the year 2020.
- A committee chaired by Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray decided to select Asha Bhosle for this award.
- About the Maharashtra Bhushan award: It is a highest and prestigious award presented annually by the government of Maharashtra state in India. The Maharashtra Bhushan was first awarded in 1996.
- Note: Asha Bhosle was also honoured with the Dadasaheb Phalke Award in 2000.

2. Mahinder Giri, Range Officer, won International Ranger Award

- Mahinder Giri, range officer of Rajaji Tiger Reserve became the only ranger from Asia to win the prestigious International Ranger Award for his contribution towards conservation.
- The award has been announced for 10 professionals across the world by the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) and World Commission on Protected Areas (WCPA).

3. Marathi writer Dr Sharankumar Limbale to receive Saraswati Samman 2020

- Noted Marathi writer Dr Sharankumar Limbale will receive Saraswati Samman, 2020 for his book **Sanatan**.
- Limbale's Sanatan has been published in 2018. Sanatan is an important social and historical document of dalit struggle.
- About Saraswati Samman: It, instituted by K K Birla Foundation in 1991, is recognised as the most prestigious and highest literary award in the country.
- The award carries fifteen lakh rupees, a citation and a plaque.

4. Rajinikanth to be honoured with 51st Dadasaheb Phalke Award

- Union Minister for Information and Broadcasting Shri Prakash Javadekar announced the recipient of the 51st Dadasaheb Phalke Award.
- The award for 2019 will be conferred to legendary actor Shri Rajinikanth.

- The award carries an amount of Rs. 1 crore, a citation, a plaque and an exquisite traditional handicraft/ handloom item.
- 7. Hindi writer Prof. Sharad Pagare to be conferred with Vyas Samman 2020 Well known Hindi writer Prof. Sharad Pagare will be conferred with the prestigious Vyas Samman - 2020 for his novel 'Patliputru Ki Samragi.'
 - Note: The Vyas Samman, started in 1991, is given by K K Birla Foundation for an outstanding literary work in Hindi authored by an Indian citizen published during the last 10 years.
 - It carries an award of four lakh rupees along with a citation and plaque.

- The decision to hold the joint exercise **"Pabbi-Antiterror-2021"** was announced during the **36th meeting of the Council of the Regional Anti-Terrorist Structure (RATS)** held in Tashkent, Uzbekistan.
- Note: The next meeting of the Council of the RATS SCO is scheduled to be held in September in Uzbekistan.
- **RATS**, headquartered in Tashkent, is a permanent organ of the SCO which serves to promote cooperation of member states against terrorism, separatism and extremism.
- Facts about SCO: Shanghai Cooperation Organisation or Shanghai Pact, is a Eurasian political, economic and security alliance.

5. 'Vajra' commissioned to the Indian Coast Guard

- Indian Coast Guard Ship 'Vajra' was commissioned by General Bipin Rawat, Chief of Defence Staff at Kattupalli in Chennai.
- This is the **sixth in the series of seven Offshore Patrol Vessels** constructed by M/s Larsen & Toubro Ltd.

Vajra will be based under the Operational and Administrative Control of Coast Guard District (Tuticorin) and will be deployed extensively for surveillance in exclusive economic zones in the Indian Coastal region.

- 6. Indian Army to procure Mobile Integrated Network Terminal (MINT) systems
- The Indian Army is in the process of procuring Mobile Integrated Network Terminal (MINT) systems under Make II Category of DAP 2020.
- The system is envisaged as a lightweight, portable, state of art integrated communication solution with satellite backhaul and wireless access system to support voice, video and data.
- Development of MINT systems will enhance the operational communication capability of the field army in consonance to the self-reliance vision of "Aatmanirbhar Bharat" for Defence production.
- 7. SIPRI Report: India's import of arms decreases by 33 percent
- According to the report by the **Stockholm International Peace Research Institute (SIPRI)**, Arms imports by India decreased by 33 percent between 2011-15 and 2016-20.
- India's top three arms suppliers during 2016-20 were Russia (49% import), France (18%) and Israel (13%).





- **Globally,** the five largest arms exporters in 2016-20 were the US, Russia, France, Germany and China, while the top importers were Saudi Arabia, India, Egypt, Australia and China.
- Note: India's Export Level: India accounted for 0.2% of the share of global arms exports during 2016-20, making the country the world's 24th largest exporter of major arms.
- 8. India commissions Nuclear Missile Tracking Vessel 'INS Dhruv'
- **INS Dhruv (codenamed as VC 11184),** the Ocean Surveillance and Nuclear Missile Tracking Vessel, was commissioned into Indian Navy in a secret manner in October 2020.
- It is capable of monitoring missile launches at long distances, enhancing the testing programme and adding a crucial part to a national missile defence system.
- It was constructed at Hindustan Shipyard Ltd, Visakhapatnam.
- It will be operated by a joint crew of the National Technical Research Organisation (NTRO), the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) and the Indian Navy.
- Note: At present, only the US, France, China and Russia operate similar vessels that are used to track missile launches at sea.
- 9. DRDO conducts successful flight test of Solid Fuel Ducted Ramjet
- **Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO)** successfully carried out a flight demonstration based on **Solid Fuel Ducted Ramjet (SFDR)** technology from Integrated Test Range Chandipur off the coast of Odisha.
- During the test, many new technologies were proven, including Solid Fuel based Ducted Ramjet technology.
- Note: Last month, the DRDO had successfully launched an indigenously-designed and developed Vertical Launch Short Range Surface to Air Missile (VL-SRSAM).

10. India-Uzbekistan joint military exercise "DUSTLIK II" commenced in Chaubatia, Uttarakhand

- This is the second edition (March 10-19, 2021) of the annual bilateral joint exercise of both armies.
- 45 Soldiers each from Uzbekistan and the Indian Army are participating in the exercise.
- In the exercise, the troops of the two countries will share the war techniques, introducing high-tech battle skills.
- Note: The first edition of the exercise was held in Uzbekistan in Nov 2019.

- Six Scorpene-class submarines are being built in India by the Mazagon Dock Shipbuilders Limited (MDL) Mumbai, under collaboration with M/s Naval Group, France.

12. Indian Air Force (IAF) participation in Exercise Desert Flag-VI

- Ex Desert Flag is an annual multi-national large force employment warfare exercise hosted by the United Arab Emirates Air Force.
- The exercise is scheduled from 03 March to 27 March 2021 at Al-Dhafra airbase, UAE.
- Note: The Indian Air Force is participating for the first time in Exercise Desert Flag-VI along with air forces of United Arab Emirates, United States of America, France, Saudi Arabia, South Korea and Bahrain.

- 5. ISRO develops radar (SAR) for joint earth observation satellite mission with NASA
 - Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) has completed the development of a **Synthetic Aperture Radar (SAR)** capable of producing extremely high-resolution images for a joint earth observation satellite mission with the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA).
 - NASA-ISRO SAR (NISAR) is a joint collaboration for a dual-frequency L and Sband SAR for earth observation.
 - **NISAR** will be the first satellite mission to use two different radar frequencies (Lband and S-band) to measure changes in our planet's surface less than a centimetre across.
 - Note: The mission is targeted to launch in early 2022 from ISRO's Sriharikota spaceport in Andhra Pradesh's Nellore district.
- 6. India's PSLV-C51 launches Brazil's Amazonia-1, 18 other satellites
 - India's Polar rocket successfully launched Amazonia-1 of Brazil and 18 other satellites from the launch pad of the Satish Dhawan Space Centre, Sriharikota, in the first mission of the year for space agency ISRO.
 - The 18 co-passenger satellites placed in the orbit are -four from ISRO's Indian National Space Promotion and Authorisation Centre (three UNITY Sats from consortium of three Indian academic institutes and the SD-SAT from Chennai- based Space Kidz India-SKI, which is engraved with a picture of Prime Minister Narendra Modi) and 14 from NSIL.
 - SKI's Satish Dhawan Satellite (SD-SAT) also carried Bhagavad Gita in a Secured Digital card format.
 - Note: PSLV-C51 is the first dedicated commercial mission of NewSpace India Limited (NSIL), ISRO's commercial arm.
- 7. Dr Harsh Vardhan inaugurates the three-day Global Bio India 2021
 - The Union Minister for Science & Technology, Earth Sciences and Health & Family Welfare Dr. Harsh Vardhan inaugurated the second edition of Global Bio-India-2021 (1stto 3rd March 2021).
 - The theme for this year is "Transforming lives" with the tag line "Biosciences to Bio-economy".

- The port is a key connectivity project that is aimed at boosting trade ties between India, Iran, and Afghanistan.

- The report is prepared by the IQAir (Swiss- Air Quality Technology Company).

- In the report (2021), India had a score of 67 out of 100.





- Note: India had been rated as "free" in Freedom House's reports for 2018, 2019 and 2020.
- About Freedom House: In 1973, Freedom House launched the Freedom in the World report, which assessed the level of freedom in each country and ranked them with a numerical score and declared them as "free", "partly free" or "not free".

5. QS World University Rankings by Subject 2021

- Union Education Minister Shri Ramesh Pokhriyal 'Nishank' addressed at the unveiling of QS World University Rankings by Subject 2021.
- **12 Indian institutions have** made it to the top 100 of the world IIT Bombay, IIT Delhi, IIT Madras, IIT Kharagpur, IISC Bangalore, IIT Guwahati, IIM Bangalore, IIM Ahmedabad, JNU, Anna University, University of Delhi, and O.P Jindal University.

- The report estimates that around 931 million tonnes of food waste was generated in 2019, 61 percent of which came from households, 26 percent from food service and 13 percent from retail.
- On a global per capita-level, 121 kgs of consumer-level food is wasted each year, with 74 kgs of this happening in households.
- In India, the household food waste estimate is 50 kg per capita per year, or 68,760,163 tonnes a year.
- Estimates suggest **8-10 per cent of global greenhouse gas emissions** are associated with food that is not consumed.

- Afghanistan was ranked the least happy nation.
- India ranked 139 out of 149 countries in the report.

3. March 20, World Sparrow Day

• It is an international initiative by the **Nature Forever Society of India** in collaboration with the Eco-Sys Action Foundation (France) and numerous other national and international organisations across the world.

Note: The first World Sparrow Day was celebrated in 2010 in different parts of the world.

4. March 21, International Day of Forests

- The theme for 2021 is "Forest restoration: a path to recovery and wellbeing".
- The United Nations General Assembly proclaimed 21 March the International Day of Forests in 2012.
- On each International Day of Forests, countries are encouraged to undertake local, national and international efforts to organize activities involving forests and trees, such as tree planting campaigns.

5. March 22, World Water Day

- The theme for 2021 is 'Valuing Water'.
- World Water Day raises awareness about water and the global water crisis and the main focus of the day is **Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) 6: water and sanitation for all by 2030.**





• The United Nations General Assembly adopted a resolution by which 22 March of each year was declared World Day for Water, to be observed starting in 1993.

6. March 23, World Meteorological Day

- The day is observed as the foundation day of the World Meteorological Organization which was established on 23rd March 1950.
- It showcases the essential contribution of National Meteorological and Hydrological Services to the safety and wellbeing of society.
- The theme for 2021 is "The Ocean, our climate and weather."

7. March 15, World Consumer Rights Day

- World Consumer Rights Day is an annual occasion dedicated to highlighting the power of consumers and their rights for a fair, safe and sustainable marketplace for everyone.
- The World Consumer Rights Day 2021 theme is to gather all the consumers in a fight to **'Tackle Plastic Pollution'.**
- Note: India: On July 20th, 2020, the new Consumer Protection Act, 2019 came into force in India, replacing the previous enactment of 1986.
- National Consumer Day is celebrated on 24 December.

8. March 16, National Vaccination Day


- India observes National Vaccination Day also known as National Immunization Day every year on March 16.
- It was first celebrated at the time when the **National Pulse Polio vaccination** drive was launched, in 1995.

9. March 07, Janaushadhi Diwas

- Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi addresses the 'Janaushadhi Diwas' celebrations on 7th March, 2021.
- He dedicated to the nation the **7500thJanaushadhi Kendra at NEIGRIHMS**, **Shillong** during the event.
- 1st March to 7th March was celebrated as 'Janaushadhi Week' across the nation, with the theme of "Jan Aushadhi Seva bhi, Rozgar bhi".
- About Janaushadhi Diwas: The 'Janaushadhi Diwas' was observed across the country on March 7, 2019. On the occasion of the 'Janaushadhi Diwas', the Prime Minister Narendra Modi interacted with owners of Janaushadhi Kendras and beneficiaries of the **Pradhan Mantri Bhartiya Janaushadhi Pariyojana (PMBJP)** across the country.

- The day is celebrated every year on 28th of February to commemorate the discovery of the 'Raman Effect'. On this day, Physicist CV Raman announced the discovery of the 'Raman Effect' for which he was awarded the Nobel Prize in 1930.
- The theme for National Science Day 2021 is 'Future of Science and Technology and Innovation: Impact on Education Skills and Work'.
- Note: With a view to promote science and innovation, the government presents the National Science Communication Awards every year on this day.

12. February 27, World NGO Day

- The day aims to inspire people to become actively involved with NGOs (Non-Governmental Organizations), both in the public and private sectors.
- Note: The first World NGO Day was observed by the United Nations in 2014, although it was officially recognised and declared in 2010 by 12 member nations of IX Baltic Sea NGO Forum of the Council of the Baltic Sea States.

13. March 03, World Wildlife Day


- On 20 December 2013, the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) proclaimed 3 March – the day of signature of the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES) in 1973 – as UN World Wildlife Day to celebrate and raise awareness of the world's wild animals and plants.
- World Wildlife Day 2021 theme is "Forests and Livelihoods: Sustaining People and Planet."

14. March 03, World Hearing Day

- World Hearing Day is a campaign held each year by the Office of Prevention of Blindness and Deafness of the World Health Organization (WHO).
- The theme of the campaign for 2021 is 'Hearing Care for All'.
- Note: As per first World Report on Hearing released by World Health Organisation (WHO), 1 in 4 people projected to have hearing problems by 2050 worldwide.

15. March 04, National Safety Day

- This year's theme is 'Sadak Suraksha (Road Safety).'
- The National Safety Week is also celebrated from 4 March to 10 March.
- Note: National Safety Day was first observed on the foundation day of the National Safety Council in 1972.
- About the National Safety Council: It was set up by the Ministry of Labour and Employment on 4 March 1966 to develop and bring into practice a voluntary routine on Safety, Health, and Environment.

- Malaysia's Lee Zii Jia has won the men's single title as he defeated Denmark's Viktor Axelsen in the finals.
- Japan's Nozomi Okuhara has won the women's single title as she defeated Thailand's Pornpawee Chochuwong in the finals.
- 7. Shreyas Iyer signs up with Lancashire for Royal London Cup 2021
- English county Lancashire announced the overseas signing of India batsman Shreyas Iyer for the 2021 Royal London Cup.
- The top-order batsman is regarded as one of the most attacking and fluent stroke players in Indian cricket and he has played in 21 ODIs and 29 T20 Internationals for his country.
- Note: The first Indian to join the club was wicketkeeper-batsman Farokh Engineer who joined the club in 1968.
- After Engineer retired, four other Indian Murali Kartik, Dinesh Mongia, VVS Laxman, and Sourav Ganguly have represented the club.
- 8. Vijay Hazare Trophy 2021 (20 February to 14 March 2021)
- Final: Mumbai vs Uttar Pradesh
- Mumbai won Vijay Hazare Trophy 2021 title.
- This is Mumbai's fourth Hazare title.
- Note: Mumbai captain Prithvi Shaw became the first cricketer to score 800 runs in a single edition of Vijay Hazare Trophy.
- 9. Virat Kohli becomes first cricketer to score 3,000 runs in T-20 International
- India's Captain Virat Kohli has become the first-ever batsman to score 3,000 runs in T-20 International (T20I).
- Kohli achieved the milestone during the second T20I against England at Narendra Modi Stadium in Ahmedabad.





- He now has 3,001 runs from 87 T20I matches.
- Note: New Zealand's Martin Guptill comes second in the list with 2,839 runs in 99 matches.
- India's Rohit Sharma comes third in the list with 2,773 runs in 108 matches.

10. Thomas Bach re-elected as IOC president

- Olympic champion Thomas Bach has been re-elected for an additional four-year term as President of the **International Olympic Committee (IOC).**
- Facts about the International Olympic Committee (IOC): Headquarters: Lausanne, Switzerland President: Thomas Bach Founded: 23 June 1894
- 11.Bhavani Devi becomes first Indian fencer to qualify for the Tokyo Olympics 2021 Games
- Tamil Nadu's Bhavani Devi, 8-time national champion, secured a spot for the Tokyo Olympics at the World Cup in Hungary.

- Note: Mithali is now the second international cricketer to score 10,000 runs.
- England's Charlotte Edwards is the only other woman cricketer who has achieved this feat.

13. ISL (Indian Super League) 2020-21: Mumbai City FC wins title

- Mumbai City lifted their first-ever Hero Indian Super League (ISL) trophy after beating last season's winners ATK Mohun Bagan 2-1 in the final at the Fatorda Stadium in Margao.
- Note: In February 2021, Mumbai City FC won the ISL League Winners Shield.

14. India to host Asian Boxing Championships 2021

The International Boxing Association announced that Asian Boxing Championships 2021 will be hosted by New Delhi, India from May 21-31.

- It will be the first boxing tournament in Asia to be held in 2021.

- India won the 4- Test match series 3-1
- **Player of the series:** Ravichandran Ashwin.

- Punia had reserved his place in the Tokyo Olympic Games in September 2019 after clinching bronze at the World Championships.

17. PV Sindhu wins silver medal at BWF Swiss Open Super 300, 2021

- Indian Shuttler PV Sindhu won silver medal in the BWF Swiss Open Super 300 (Yonex Swiss Open 2021) at Basel, Switzerland.
- She was defeated by Carolina Marin (Spain) in the final of the **Women's Singles Title**

Note: Viktor Axelsen (Denmark) won **Men's Singles Title** in the BWF Swiss Open Super 300.

18. Vinesh Phogat wins her 2nd gold in Matteo Pellicone Ranking Series event

- Indian wrestler Vinesh Phogat won her second gold medal in the Matteo Pellicone Ranking Series event and reclaimed the **top rank** in the 53-kg category in Rome.
- Vinesh defeated Canada's Diana Mary Helen Weicker.
- Note:Recently, Vinesh had won a gold medal in the women's 53-kg category at XXIV Outstanding Ukrainian Wrestlers and Coaches Memorial in Kyiv, Ukraine.
- Vinesh Phogat is the only Indian woman wrestler who has qualified for the **Tokyo Olympics**.

19. Ravichandran Ashwin declared ICC Men's Player of the Month for February 2021

- India's off-spinner Ravichandran Ashwin was named the ICC Men's Player of the Month for February for his stellar show against England in a four-match Test series.
- England's Tammy Beaumont was adjudged the ICC Women's Player of the Month.
- Note: Rishabh Pant won the ICC Men's Player of the Month award for January 2021.

20. Chess player Koneru Humpy wins BBC ISWOTY award for 2020

• Chess player Koneru Humpy from Andhra Pradesh has won the **BBC Indian Sportswoman of the Year award (ISWOTY)** for 2020.





- Humpy is the **World Rapid Chess champion** having won the title in December 2019.
- She received the Arjuna Award in 2003 and Padma Shri in 2007.
- Note: the BBC Indian Sportswoman of the Year initiative was launched in 2019 to celebrate female achievements in sport and highlight the issues and challenges faced by women in India.

21. Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi delivered the inaugural address at 2nd Khelo India National Winter Games 2021 at Gulmarg

- In the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir, the second edition of Khelo India Winter Games (February 26 March 02, 2021) begins at Gulmarg.

- The Indian trio of Mairaj Ahmed Khan, Angad Vir Singh Bajwa and Gurjoat Khangura won the bronze medal in men's skeet team event at the International Shooting Sport Federation tournament (ISSF) Shotgun World Cup in Cairo, Egypt.
- The Indians defeated the Kazakhstan team of David Pochivalov, Eduard Yechshenko and Alexandr Mukhamediyev.

25. Vinesh Phogat wins Gold in Ukraine wrestling event
