Renewed uncertainty: On the economy's bleak prospects

The article focuses on the economic Indices that reflect lowered output levels from sectoral constituents that include - mining, manufacturing, and electricity. This has majorly happened due to the second wave of Covid and renewed local lockdowns. Also, the end-use categories have suffered from severe contractions.

The figures have been on the decline since 2019, signaling the need for infusing investment in production capacity and discretionary consumption.

Also, there has been demand destruction that can be analyzed from the decline in consumer non-durables. A similar slide in figures has been observed in new vehicle registrations supporting the pattern.

The trend is the outcome of several factors like job losses, lower savings, and a surge in healthcare costs. To initiate a step towards recovery the government needs to work on demand-creating fiscal measures and fasten the pace of vaccination.
