

• Naftali Bennett was sworn-in as the 13th Prime Minister of Israel.

• His victory ended the 12-year power of former Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu

• Netanyahu is the Israel's longest-serving leader.

• Bennett is former defence minister and associated with right-wing Yamina party.

• Mr Bennett will be prime minister until September 2023 as part of a power-sharing deal.

• He will then hand power over to Yair Lapid for a further two years.

2. Ans. D.

• Madhya Pradesh government will launch 'Yuva Shakti Corona Mukti Abhiyan' to make people aware about the COVID pandemic.

• The campaign will be launched with the help of youth power.

• In the Yuva Shakti Corona Mukti Abhiyan, college teachers and around 16 lakh students will be made aware of corona infection by learning Covid appropriate behavior and vaccination.

• This campaign will be run by the Higher Education and Technical Education Department in collaboration with the Public Health and Family Welfare Department.

3. Ans. C.

• In tennis, world No.1 Novak Djokovic clinched his second French open Men's Singles title after beating world No. 5 Stefanos Tsitsipas in the five-sets battle at Roland-Garros last night.

• Fighting back from two sets down, the 34year-old Serb has won the match 6-7 (6-8), 2-6, 6-3, 6-2, 6-4 against 22-year old Tsitsipas to claim his 19th Grand Slam title.

• He is now one short of the men's 20 Grand Slam titles record of Rafael Nadal and Roger Federer.

• The Serbian world number one increased his Grand Slam tally to 19 titles, and is now one adrift of the men's record held by Roger Federer and Rafael Nadal.

• Djokovic has also become the first man in the Open era, and third overall, to win all four Majors at least twice.

• Djokovic reached his sixth French Open final after ending Nadal's four-year reign last Friday while Tsitsipas edged past Alexander Zverev, becoming the first Greek player to reach in the Grand Slam final.

• Czech Barbora Krejcikova completed a singlesdoubles title sweep at the tournament yesterday when she lifted the women's doubles trophy with compatriot Katerina Siniakova, beating Iga Swiatek and Bethanie Mattek-Sands 6-4, 6-2.

• Krejcikova became the first player to win both the women's singles and doubles title in Paris since French woman Mary Pierce completed the feat in 2000.

4. Ans. A.

• Barbora Krejcikova became the first Czech women's singles champion since 1981 after beating Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova.

• The 25-year-old Krejcikova, who was unseeded and ranked 33rd, hadn't made it past the fourth round in at any major before this trip to Paris.

• But after a magical run, beating the likes of Elina Svitolina, Sloane Stephens, Coco Gauff, and Maria Sakkari, she lifted the prestigious Roland Garros trophy after a two-hour-long final.

• Pavlyuchenkova, who played her first major final in her 52nd appearance, bounced back in





the second set but failed to keep her momentum going till the very end.

• Former Indian women volleyball team captain Nirmal Kaur passed away recently due to complications related to Covid-19 infection.

• She was wife of legendary Olympian Milkha Singh

• Milkha Singh himself is being treated for Covid-related complications at the PGI Chandigarh.

• Milkha Singh has been under the observation of a medical team comprising senior doctors of the institute.

• India's Mirabai Chanu, the 2017 world champion in weightlifting, has qualified for the Tokyo Olympics in the women's 49-kg category.

• The International Weightlifting Federation announced that Mirabai has qualified on the basis of her world ranking points.

• The 26-year-old from Manipur lifter is ranked second in the women's 49-kg category.

• As per rules of the IWF, top eight lifters in each of the 14 weight categories, including seven in the women's group, are eligible to compete in Tokyo Games.

7. Ans. D.

• Tokyo Olympic Games bound wrestler Vinesh Phogat won the women's 53kg freestyle gold with an 8-0 win over Khrystyna Bereza of Ukraine at the Poland Ranking Series in Warsaw.

• The gold-winning effort of Vinesh is likely to improve her seeding in the 53kg freestyle event at the Olympics, to be held from July 23 to August 8. • In the final match, Vinesh went up 2-0 in the opening 70 seconds of the bout. With less than two minutes on board, she led 4-0.

• Khrystyna struggled to keep pace with Vinesh in the initial stages of the bout. As the match progressed, the Ukranian made some good moves but Vinesh was quick to wriggle out of the tricky situations.

• With less than two minutes to go for the long whistle, Vinesh unleashed another attack to increase the margin to 6-0.

• Khrystyna tried to reduce the gap in the last 60 seconds of the match but was unsuccessful as Vinesh was in no mood to concede points.

• Vinesh made it 8-0 in the last 30 seconds of the contest to pocket the gold medal. Khrystyna settled for silver.

• During the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) High-Level Meeting (HLM) on HIV/AIDS (Human Immunodeficiency Virus/Acquired ImmunoDeficiency Syndrome), the assembly approved a declaration to end AIDS by 2030.

• The Assembly stated that COVID-19 has increased inequalities and pushed access to AIDS medicines, treatments and diagnosis off track.

• The declaration also committed assembly's 193 member countries to implement

• Reduce annual new HIV infections to under 3, 70, 000 and annual AIDS-related deaths to under 2, 50, 000 by 2025.

• To eliminate all forms of HIV-related stigma and discrmination and for urgent work towards an HIV vaccine and a cure for AIDS.

• Justice Sanjay Yadav took oath as the Chief Justice of Allahabad High Court at Raj Bhavan in Lucknow.





• His oath was administered by Uttar Pradesh Governor Anandiben Patel.

• Allahabad High Court was established in 1866 and is one of the oldest high courts with 160 serving judges.

\* MoHI&PE has decided for the aggregation of electric three-wheelers and electric buses component of the scheme via state run Energy Efficiency Services Ltd (EESL), to bring down the cost of electric 3 Wheelers to that of ICE-3 Wheelers.

\* For Electric Buses, EESL will generate demand in 9 cities with over 4 million-plus population like Delhi, Mumbai, Bangalore, Hyderabad, Ahmedabad, Kolkata, Chennai, Surat, and Pune.

#### 16. Ans. D.

\* The Indian Institute of Technology IIT Ropar has developed a device "Jivan Vayu" which can be used as a substitute for Continuous Positive Airway Pressure (CPAP) machine.

\* this is the nation's first such device which functions even without electricity and is adapted to both kinds of oxygen generation units like CO2 cylinders and oxygen pipelines in hospitals. These provisions are not available in otherwise existing CPAP machines.

\* The device is designed to maintain a FiO2 (fraction of inspired oxygen (FiO2) is the concentration of oxygen in the gas mixture) of above 40 per cent with a PEEP (positive endexpiratory pressure) of 5-20 cm H2O.

\* Additionally, the device houses a viral filter at the air entrainment end with a viral efficacy of 99.99 per cent.




