The article throws light on the socio-economic issue of begging. In response to a petition asking to move all the beggars from intersections, the SC pointed out that government must ensure vaccinations for such homeless people.

Note that there is no such law against begging. However, as per the Bombay Prevention of Begging act, police can seize homeless people and send them to detention centers.

In 2018 the High Court stated the point that nobody begs out of wish. It becomes necessary due to the prevalence of lack of education, unemployment, and poverty.

Today, with heightened economic distress, poverty and homelessness are bound to rise. the situation indicates our failure to provide social protection to all. The crux is that unless we as a society and the government cannot provide a livelihood to all it won't be reasonable to call poor criminals.
