- Young Indian Grandmaster **Raunak Sadhwani** (**15 years**) has won **19th Spilimbergo Open chess tournament** here with seven points from nine rounds. He was also **U-10 Commonwealth Champion in 2015** in New Delhi, India.
- Hakainde Hichilema (59 years) has been elected as the new President of Zambia, after defeating incumbent Edgar Lungu. Zambia's Capital: Lusaka.
- Maharashtra CM Uddhav Thackeray has launched e-crop survey initiative with effect from August 15.
- Union Agriculture Minister Narendra Singh Tomar has inaugurated World's second-largest refurbished gene bank at National Bureau of Plant Genetic Resources (NBPGR), Pusa, New Delhi.
- President **Ram Nath Kovind** has conferred **144 Gallantry awards** to armed forces, police and paramilitary personnel on the occasion of Independence Day 2021.
- Komalika Bari became new under-21 recurve world Archery champion at the Youth World Championships in Wroclaw, Poland.

- Vice President, M Venkaiah Naidu has laid foundation stone of Innovation and Development Centre of Jawaharlal Nehru Centre for Advanced Scientific Research (JNCASR), Bengaluru.
- Ministry of Power has circulated **'Draft Electricity (promoting renewable energy through Green Energy Open Access) Rules**, 2021'. These rules are proposed for purchase and consumption of green energy including energy from Waste-to-Energy plants, Renewable Purchase Obligation (RPO), Green energy open access, Nodal Agencies, banking, and cross subsidy surcharge
