## Reboot to reset: On India-U.S. trade ties

The article talks about India-US trade ties. It states that the US is no longer interested in having an FTA. Accordingly, the government can now concentrate on market access. Also, mutual pacts and common quality standards are likely to help exports.

## Don't let kids down: Begin vaccinating them as soon as approvals come through. They have waited too long
