A good start: On rare diseases and government support for treatment

The article emphasizes the need to secure every citizen's well-being, irrespective of whether they form a part of the majority or not. The recent notification of the National Policy for Rare Diseases 2021 is considered a good start as it offers financial support for the one-time treatment of up to ₹20 lakh.

However, the policy lags on some crucial fronts in its final form. While WHO identifies 7000 rare diseases, the Organization for Rare Diseases India only includes inherited cancers, autoimmune disorders, congenital malformations, Hirschsprung's disease, Gaucher disease, cystic fibrosis, muscular dystrophies and Lysosomal Storage Disorders (LSDs) in the policy.

Though many efforts have been invested in evolving formal definitions to support the development of drugs and improve research on rare diseases, the policy allocates no funds for immediate and lifelong treatment needs.

Suppose the Centre succeeds in working out the cost-sharing agreements with Kerala. In that case, Tamil Nadu and Karnataka, its share of the annual costs can be halved, and this way, it would be able to cement its commitment towards the welfare of citizens.
