## Answers \& Explanations

1. Ans. D.

Phrasal verbs composed of verb + preposition such as 'approved of' is followed by gerunds which is not followed in part 4. So, to make the sentence correct one should replace 'to see' with 'seeing'. Hence option D is correct.
2. Ans. C.

The modal verbs are always followed by an infinitive without "to", .i.e., the bare infinitive or V1. In part 3, there is no V1 after modal 'would', hence an additional 'be' is required after the adverb 'really' to make it grammatically correct. So, option C is correct.

## 3. Ans. D.

Some verbs in English do not take the preposition 'to' and 'tell' is one of them. In part 4, 'to' has been used with 'told' and to make it correct it should be removed. So option D is correct.

## 4. Ans. C.

The term 'crucifix' is another word for the cross and is used to symbolize Jesus Christ. 'Crucial' is an adjective meaning essential or necessary. In the given context, the urgency of the sentence suggests that the term 'crucial' is more appropriate.
So the sentence is trying to convey something it is important to replace
the crucifix. So option $C$ is the correct answer.
5. Ans. B.

The correct usage is "longer" as the sentence contains the word "than" representing a comparison between the time taken to return a product to the online store and a local shop. Therefore, the correct answer is B.
6. Ans. E.

No corrections required in the sentence.
7. Ans. E.

Option A gets ruled out as the word "Stationary" is an adjective and it means not moving or standing still. Now consider option B "Stationery", which is a noun and means paper for writing, perfectly fits into the sentence. We know that "letter head" is also an official paper, and as the question says "piece of___" which can take singular noun therefore "letter head" also fits well contextually. Therefore the correct answer is $E$.
8. Ans. B.
'Eminent' means famous or respected.
'Imminent' means about to happen or ready to take place.
'Immanent' means inherent or intrinsic.

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Given the context which talks about dangerous situations, only option II can fit the blank. Thus, option B is the correct answer.
9. Ans. C.

The blank requires an adverb in order to qualify the verb 'singing'. According to this, options A and B are negated because these are adjectives and options D and E are negated because these are nouns. Option C satisfies the grammatical condition mentioned above and brings out a meaningfully coherent sentence.
Hence, option C is the correct answer.
10. Ans. A.

The noun 'dodo bird' must be qualified by an adjective. So, this eliminates option B, C and D as these are all nouns. Option E is eliminated; as it is an adverb. 'Fabled' which means 'famous, especially by reputation' satisfies the grammatical condition mentioned above and hence, option A is the correct answer.

## 11. Ans. C.

Part E contains an adjective "the largest contiguous" that needs a suitable subject in the next part. Only parts B \& C do so. But in the given options, only options C \& D have EB as a part of their answer and none with EC. So, the answer is either C or D. The rest can be negated.

Both options have AC as a part of their answer. So, we only need to determine the position of part $D$. Part A begins with 'although' which usually comes at the beginning of a sentence. So, D cannot be at the beginning.
Hence, the correct answer is C.

## 12. Ans. D.

Usually, there is access to something. Since, part B ends with "access" and part D begins "to gig work", D will come after B. Only options A \& D have BD as a part of their answer. The rest can be negated.
Part C will come after part D as with the right institutional framework we can eliminate barriers to women's access to gig work.
There is only one option with BDC. Hence, the correct answer is D.

## 13. Ans. C.

Here, only C-E can be joined to make a contextually meaningful and grammatically correct sentence. The final sentence is, 'We prided ourselves over achievements which were doctored for public consumption to boost the national morale.'
Hence, C is the right answer choice. Note: Segment A and B do not make sense when being joined with any of the segments in column II.

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## 14. Ans. E.

Here, only $B-E$ can be joined to make a contextually meaningful and grammatically correct sentence. The final sentence is, "Historians researching contemporary events have traditionally banked on newspapers and magazines as primary sources." Hence, E is the right answer choice.
15. Ans. C.

Contextually, A connects with E but there is a grammatical problem in the part E. The phrase "struggling within their family income" is an absurd use of the word 'within.' The correct sentence would have been "struggling with their family income."
$C$ and $D$ could have formed $a$ contextually synonymous sentence but there is a problem in the latter as part C mentions 'satellites' i.e. in plural but part $D$ used the verb in singular.
Only B and F form a contextually relevant and grammatically correct pair.
Therefore, option $C$ is the correct answer to this question.
