

NMAT Analysis 2021 - 10 November 2021

On October 14, 2021, the NMAT 2021 test window opened. NMAT 2021 (Day 3) included a total of 108 questions distributed across three sections, each with 36 questions. There were no surprises in the paper, and it was similar to the last two NMAT analyses which were conducted on 14th October and 15th October 2021, respectively. Like previous slots, Geometry wasn't asked in the paper. As every candidate has a different aptitude level, they responded differently to the topic-specific questions in each part. We'll go over the following topics in-depth in this NMAT exam analysis:

Overall, the difficulty level of NMAT 2021 (on November 10th, 2021) was easy to moderate in terms of the questions asked. A few questions were lengthy. However, it also depends on the ability of the candidate, as NMAT 2021 is a "Computer-Adaptive" exam. All these sections have been modified following different parameters.

Important Highlights of the NMAT 2021 Exam

- The number of questions stayed the same as last year, at 108. (36 questions in each of the sections)
- The NMAT 2021 test window runs from October 14, 2021, to December 27, 2021, for a total of 88 days.
- Candidates can take the exam either online or in person like they did last time.

NMAT Exam Analysis 2021: Difficulty Level (November 10, 2021)

NMAT 2021 (Day 3) exam had a difficulty level of Easy to Moderate. The difficulty level on Day 1 (14th October 2021) of the NMAT Analysis was Moderate to Difficult, while on Day 2 (15th October 2021) of the NMAT analysis, the overall difficulty level was Easy to Moderate.

NMAT Exam Analysis 2021: Good Attempts/Score

As per the NMAT exam analysis 2021, a score of 232 to 238 is considered good enough to secure admission into prestigious top-ranking colleges accepting NMAT scores.

NMAT Exam Review 2021 (Section-wise)

The section-by-section evaluation of the NMAT 2021 on November 10, 2021, is provided below.

NMAT Exam Review Language Skills

This section had a difficulty level of Easy to Moderate. However, the level of difficulty of the Language Skills section on Day 1 NMAT 2021 Analysis (14th October 2021) was Moderate and on Day 2 (15th October 2021) was Easy to Moderate. There were 3 Rcs of 4 questions each. 2 RC's had a word limit of 170-200 words while the 3rd RC had a 250-word limit. There we a total of 4 questions of Para Jumble out of which 2 questions of 5 sentences and 2 questions of 4 Sentences. There were 5 questions from Analogy and it comprised of Vocab Based Analogies. A detailed topic-wise break-up of questions is mentioned in the table below:

NMAT Exam Review Quantitative Skills

This section was Easy to Moderate in terms of difficulty level. However, the level of difficulty of the Quantitative Skills section on Day 1 of NMAT 2021 Analysis (14th October 2021) and Day 2 (15th October 2021) was Moderate. As NMAT 2021 is an Adaptive exam, the Experts at BYJU'S Exam Prep found that there were few changes in the number of questions asked from a specific topic. For instance, one paper had 1 question on Probability while the other had 2 questions. However, the rest of the paper had a similar pattern. A detailed topic-wise break-up is given below.

NMAT Exam Review Logical Reasoning

This section was Moderate in terms of difficulty level. The level of difficulty on Day 1 of the Analysis (14th October 2021) for the LR section was Moderate and for Day 2 of the NMAT Analysis (15th October 2021) was Easy to Moderate. The topic-wise break-up is given below:

Expected NMAT Cut Off 2021

The projected cut-offs for NMAT 2021 for NMIMS Mumbai are expected to be 232 - 238. (something similar to what we have seen in NMAT 2020). The projected sectional cut-offs are 78 - 82 for Language Skills, 74-77 for Logical Reasoning, and 73-76 for Quantitative Skills. The total cut-off for NMIMS' Bangalore and Hyderabad campuses is projected to be 220+ and 225+, respectively, while other colleges accepting NMAT scores would be around 205+ (Expected).
