NMAT Analysis (12 December 2021): On October 14, 2021, the NMAT 2021 test window opened. NMAT 2021 (Day 5 - 12th December 2021) included 108 questions in total with 36 questions in each section. The paper pattern was similar to the previous NMAT 2021 slots. It was similar to NMAT Analysis 2021 conducted on 15th November, 10th November, 15th October, and 14th October, respectively. Geometry questions were missing in this Window as well. As every candidate has a different aptitude level, they responded differently to the topic-specific questions in each of the parts. We'll go over the following topics in-depth in this NMAT exam analysis:

The NMAT 2021 exam is a Computer Adaptive Test. The overall level of difficulty of NMAT 2021 (December 12) was Easy to Moderate in terms of the questions asked. However, it also depends on the aptitude of the candidate.

Important Highlights of the NMAT 2021 Exam:

- The NMAT 2021 window opened on October 14th, 2021, and closes on December 27th, 2021
- There are two modes of taking the exam- a Computer Based Test at the exam centre and an Online Proctored Exam from Home.
- The total number of questions asked is 108, with 36 questions in each section.
- There were no Geometry Questions

NMAT Exam Analysis 12 December 2021: Difficulty Level

NMAT 2021 (December 12), as per BYJU'S Exam Prep experts, was Easy to Moderate in terms of the level of difficulty. It was a good surprise from previous windows as the October 14th NMAT 2021 was Moderate to Difficult in terms of difficulty level. The students were pleasantly surprised.

NMAT Exam Analysis 12 Dec 2021: Good Attempts /Score

As per the NMAT 2021, Analysis, a score of 232 to 238 is considered good enough to get a call from the good colleges of NMAT.

NMAT Exam Review 2021 (Section-wise)

The section-wise review of NMAT 2021 conducted on 12th December 2021 is as follows:

NMAT Exam Review Language Skills

NMAT 2021 (12th December 2021): Language Skills section was on a similar level like the other NMAT Windows. The difficulty level of this section was the same as the previous NMAT windows we covered, Easy to Moderate.

The difficulty level, on Day 4 (15th November 2021), Day 3 (10th November 2021), Day 2 (15th October 2021), and Day 1 (14th October 2021) of NMAT Analysis was Easy to Moderate.

Language Skills section had 3 Reading Comprehension (RC) passages with 4 questions each. They were easy to solve. The genres of the passages are mentioned below:

1. History of Banking in India

2. Hybrid Schools

3. Economy

Verbal Ability Section was Easy to Moderate in terms of the level of difficulty. 4 questions (all MCQ) were asked in Para jumbles which had 2 questions on 4 sentences and 2 questions on 5 sentences.

NMAT Exam Review Quantitative Skills

NMAT 2021 (12th December 2021): Quantitative Skills section was at an Easy to Moderate level. This was a pleasant surprise for students as NMAT (15th November), (10th November), NMAT (15th October) & NMAT (14th October) windows were all at a Moderate level.

The break-up of the section is mentioned below:

Data Interpretation had 3 sets with 4 questions each. 1 set was tricky to solve. The topics are mentioned below:

- 2 Pie Charts were given and questions were as basis the information on those pie charts about 5 products
- 1 Table set which mentioned information about the people entering and leaving a temple on Monday and Tuesday
- 1 Line Graph with profit and revenue information

In the NMAT 2021 Quantitative Section, no questions were asked on Geometry or Mensuration
NMAT Exam Review Logical Reasoning

NMAT 2021 (12th December 2021): Logical Reasoning section had 36 questions equally divided into 2 sections i.e. Analytical and Verbal Reasoning. The difficulty level of the NMAT 2021 Logical Reasoning section was Easy to Moderate except 1 Input-Output set difficult to solve. 4 Course of Action questions were asked in the Logical Reasoning section out of which 2 were regular Course of Action questions but the other 2 leaned towards Decision Making. However, the level of difficulty on Day 1 of the Analysis (14th October 2021) was Moderate, Day 2 (15th October 2021) was Easy to Moderate and Day 3 & Day 4 (10th & 15th November 2021) was Moderate.
