Famous Personalities of India and their Nicknames

Famous personalities of India include people from social reformers to musicians, freedom fighters to saints. The nicknames of famous personalities are provided below-

Ashutosh Mukherji (Bengal Kesari)

Ashutosh Mukherji was a mathematician, barrister, jurist, and educator from Bengal. Ashutosh Mukherji was the first Indian student to have a dual degree from Calcutta University, i.e., MSc in Physics and MA in Mathematics. He worked as the 22nd and 26th Vice Chancellor of Calcutta University. Along with being an important personality in the Indian education system, he is also considered a man of courage, high self-respect, great personality, and towering administrative ability.

Vallabhai Patel (Strong Man of India)

Vallabhai Patel, commonly known as the Strong Man of India and Sardar, was an Indian barrister, political leader, and lawyer. He was the first Home Minister of India from 1847 to 1950. He was also the first Deputy Prime Minister of India. He was an integral political leader of India during the Indo-Pakistan War of 1947, along with other critical situations.

Bhagat Singh (Sahid-e-Azam)

Bhagat Singh, nicknamed Sahid-e-Azam, was a revolutionary Indian Freedom Fighter. He was accused of participating in the mistaken murder of a junior police officer serving the British. Later, he was arrested by the British government for bombing the Central Legislative Assembly in Delhi. He influenced the masses in jail and started the hunger strike. But, the British government sentenced him to death at the age of 23.

Mahatma Gandhi (Bapu)

Mahatma Gandhi, also popular by the name of Bapu, was an Indian lawyer who led the country on the path of non-violence to achieve independence. He started Champaran Satyagraha in 1917, Kheda Satyagraha in 1917, Ahmedabad Satyagraha in 1918, Khilafat Movement in 1919, Non-Cooperation Movement in 1920, Dandi March in 1930, Civil-Disobedience Movement in 1930, Gandhi Irwin Pact in 1931, and Quit India Movement in 1942.

Bipin Chandrapal (Bengal Tiger)

Bipin Chandrapal was titled the Bengal Tiger. He was one of the important c. Along with Sri Aurobindo, he was the main architect of the Swadeshi movement. Also, he opposed Bengal's partition by the colonial government.
