Let 12 years ago, the age of A and B were 8x and 7x respectively.

Let the total work be 72 units.

Efficiency of A = 72/24 = 3 units/day

Efficiency of B = 72/18 = 4 units/day

Work done by A in 6 days = 3×3 = 9 units

Time required to finish the remaining work = (72 - 9)/(3+4) = 9 days

Number of girls in school

$$= 200 \times 36\% = 72$$

Number of boys in school

$$= 200 - 72 = 128$$

Each girl's monthly fees

: Total monthly fees

$$= 128 \times 450 + 72 \times 360$$

$$= 57600 + 25920$$

18. Ans. B.

Let the quantity of the milk in the initial mixture = 5x litres

The quantity of the water in the initial mixture = 4x litres

According to the data provided in the question, we get

$$\frac{5x - 5x \times 0.20 + 40}{4x - 4x \times 0.20} = \frac{7}{4}$$

$$\Rightarrow 4(5x - x + 40) = 7(4x - 0.8x)$$

Quantity of the milk in the original mixture = $25 \times 5 = 125$ litres

19. Ans. A.

Let the speed of current be x km/h.

$$\Rightarrow \frac{15}{22+x} = \frac{7}{22-x}$$

 330 - 15x = 154 + 7x

$$\Rightarrow$$

20. Ans. B.

The given sentence mentions that she could get things done in a particular amount of time if she wanted to get it done.

Therefore, in place of the preposition 'at', we use the preposition 'in'.

Preposition 'in' here means needing or using no more time than a particular amount of time.

E.g. :- Can you finish the job in two weeks?



In the given sentence, we have been given with a verb 'worry' that doesn't correspond to any subject prior to it. Therefore, its usage is incorrect here.

In its place, an adjective 'worrying' could be used.

Worrying is an adjective which means making you feel unhappy and frightened.

E.g. :- It's a very worrying situation.

22. Ans. C.

The given blank needs a verb.

Here, photographs were being shown to all on the mantelpiece.

'Display' is a verb which means to arrange something or a collection of things so that the public can see it.

E.g. :- Family photographs were displayed on the wall.

23. Ans. A.

The given blank needs to be filled with a noun.

Here, we have been given with an adjective 'totalitarian' before the given blank.



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The sentence talking about spreading the totalitarian beliefs or principles.

'Ideology' is a noun which means a set of beliefs or principles, especially one on which a political system, party, or organization is based.

E.g. :- The people are caught between two opposing ideologies.

24. Ans. B.

Here, two noun needs to be swapped i.e., ownership and findings.

The sentence mentioned that some cannot claim the property as theirs on discovering some facts. And they may attach their names to show that the property belongs to them i.e., they show their ownership to it.

Note, Finding is a noun which means an information or a fact that is discovered by studying something.

Ownership means the fact that you own something.

25. Ans. D.

Conjunction 'and' doesn't join two different part of speech.

Distress is a noun, and compensate is a verb.

Hare, we are talking about that, in the times of distress and hardship men compensated by finding ways of asserting their dominance.

Note:- Distress is a noun which means a feeling of extreme worry, sadness, or pain.

Hardship is a noun which means (something that causes) difficult or unpleasant conditions of life, or an example of this.

26. Ans. C.

The correct answer is option C.

Reason: The main subject here, is 'central bureaucracy'. So, E will be the start on in order. D should come after E, as it completes the phrase that 'bureaucracy was equipped with something'. And that something is mentioned in B. A will be the next after B, and the last one will be C.

Sentence after rearranging: The central bureaucracy was poorly equipped to deal with the stream of complaints and requests for adjudication and clarification pouring in from the provinces.

27. Ans. D.

The correct answer is option D.



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Reason: The sentence is all about the focus of past studies. Thus, A will be the first one in order. B and C will follow it i.e., verb 'focus' take preposition 'on' after it. E will be the next one after C, as, it mentions the effects of density on something rather than the effects of density on something else.

Sentence after rearranging: Past studies have focused on the effects of density on spoken language processing, rather than the effects of density on the structure of lexical representations.

28. Ans. A.

Devise means to invent a new way of doing something

II and III would take the word 'device' which means:

a clever method for getting the result you want in II and a tool or piece of equipment made for a particular purpose in III.

29. Ans. A.

Note that Lightening means:

- a) to become lighter in weight or to make something lighter
- b) to become or to make something brighter eg., skin lightening cream

Also, lightening is the present participle of the verb lighten. Lightning is the electrical discharge that happens during storms- which is applicable in II and III.

So, only I is correct.



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
