'Liver' & 'Liber' as a root means Free

- **Liberal**- Free from prejudice
- **Libertarian**- A person who advocates liberty, especially with regard to thought or conduct
- **Liberticide** - Destruction of Liberty
- **Deliverance** – State of being freed, release
- **Deliberation**- Long and careful consideration or discussion
- **Unliberated** - Not liberated
- **Neoliberal** - Relating to or denoting a modified form of liberalism tending to favour free-market capitalism
- **Libertine** - Characterized by free indulgence

'Fic & Fect' as a root means Make

- **Beneficiary** - A person designated as the recipient of funds or other property under a will, trust, insurance policy, etc.
- **Deification** - Making a god out of something
- **Confection**- The act or process of making something
- **Personification** - The attribution of human nature or character to animals, inanimate objects, or abstract notions, especially as a rhetorical figure
- **Versification** - The act, art, or practice of composing poetic verse; the construction or measure of verse or poetry; metrical composition.
- **Affectability** – The capacity to be affected or influenced
- **Affection** - A gentle feeling of fondness
- **Confectionary**- Sweets and chocolates considered collectively

Clud-, claud-, claus as a root means to close, to shut

- **Exclusive - Restricted** to the person, group, or area concerned
- **Reclusive - Avoiding** the company of other people
- **Conclude** - Bring or come to an **end**.
- **Aclusion** - Absence of the alignment of the **opposing** teeth surfaces
- **Aquiclude** - An impermeable body of rock or stratum of sediment that acts as a **barrier** to the flow of groundwater
- **Cloister** - Seclude or **shut** up in a convent or monastery
- **Clause** - End of a sentence or a legal argument, - **to close, to shut, to conclude**
- **Claustral** - of or related to a cloister or to a **seclusion** from the world
- **Closable** - That which can be **blocked** against entry or passage

Root - Bel or Belli as a root means war, fight, resistance, opposes

- **Bellic** - Warlike
- **Bellicism** - The policy or practice of resorting to **war** even when it is not necessary and is avoidable.
- **Bellicist** - Adherent of bellicism, advocate of **war**, one who is war-centred or war-oriented.
- **Bellicose** - having or showing a ready disposition to **fight**
- **Belligerent** - Hostile ready to **fight**
- **Bellicosity** - A Natural disposition to **fight**
- **Belligerati** - Literary people, authors — literati — who promote **wars** of aggression.
- **Belligerency** - **Fighting**; acts of overt **warfare**
- **Rebel** - Person who **opposes** and **fights**
- **Rebellious** - **Resisting** control or authority
- **Rebeller** - One who rebels or **opposes**
