'For' as a root means Completely (used to intensify the meaning of a word)

- **For**bidding Unfriendly or threatening in appearance
- Forfeiture The loss or giving up of something as a penalty for wrongdoing
- **For**elock A lock of hair growing just above the forehead
- Forefather A member of the past generations of one's family or people, an ancestor
- **For**ecast Predict or estimate (a future event or trend)
- **For**mulate create or prepare methodically
- Fortress- A military stronghold, especially a strongly fortified town
- **For**ceps A pair of pincers or tweezers used in surgery or in a laboratory

'Histo' as a root means Tissue

- Un**histo**rical Not in accordance with history or with historical analysis
- Socio**histo**rical Of, relating to, or involving social history
- Schistose (of metamorphic rock) having a laminar structure like that of schist
- Psychohistory The interpretation of historical events with the aid of psychological theory
- **Histo**ricize Treat or represent as historical
- Historians An expert in or student of history, especially that of a particular period, geographical region, or social phenomenon
- **Histo**nes Any of a group of basic proteins found in chromatin
- **Histo**lysis The breaking down of tissues (e.g., during animal metamorphosis)

'Pathos' as a root means suffering, disease, feeling, passion {-path, patho-, -pathy}

- Sym**path**y Feelings of pity and sorrow for someone else's misfortune
- Psycho**path** A person suffering from chronic mental disorder with abnormal
- Empathy The ability to understand and share the feelings of another
- Anti**path**y A deep-seated feeling of aversion
- Apathy Lack of interest, enthusiasm, or concern
- Pathetically Arousing or deserving of sympathetic sadness and compassion
- Idiopathic Of, relating to, or designating a disease having no known cause
- Hydropathy Internal and external use of water as a therapeutic treatment for all forms of disease
- Spathes A large sheathing bract enclosing the flower cluster of certain plants

'Circ' as a root means Ring, Circle/Circus

- **Circ**let A small circle, especially a circular ornament
- Circulation Movement to and fro or around something, especially that of fluid in a closed system
- Recirculates Circulate again
- Circumfluent Flowing round, surrounding
- Microcircuitry An electric circuit consisting of miniaturized components
- Circumjacent Surrounding
- **Circ**a (often preceding a date) approximately
- **Circ**umnavigate To sail 'around'
- Circumvent Go or come 'around'
