

# Weekly One Liners (2 August – 8 August) 2021

#### 8 August

- Rekha Sharma has been reappointed as the Chairperson of National Commission for Women (NCW) for another three years with effect from 7th August 2021.
- Telangana Government's Information Technology, Electronics and Communication (IT,E&C) department has won 'AI Gamechanger' Award in the Xperience-AI Summit.
- DRDO's Chairman G Satheesh Reddy has inaugurated the 2nd Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE) International Conference on Range Technology (ICORT-2021) via videoconferencing.
- Ministry of Civil Aviation has granted drone use permission to National Institute of Science
  Education and Research (NISER), Bhubaneswar. It is a condition exemption
  from Unmanned Aircraft System (UAS) Rules, 2021
- Union Power Minister R.K Singh has launched 'Reform and regulatory knowledge base for power sector' through virtual mode. It is an e certification program to provide regulatory training to the practitioners from diverse backgrounds.
- Former Indian footballer Subramaniam Sankar Narayan (86 years) passed away at his home in Thane, Maharashtra. He played at the 1956 and 1960 Olympics
- India's first indigenous aircraft carrier (IAC) Vikrant has completed its five-day maiden sea trials from August 4, 2021 from Kochi to 8, 2021. Vikrant is expected to be commissioned into Indian Navy in 2022

# 7 August

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi announced the renaming of the Rajiv Gandhi Khel Ratna Award (the country's highest sporting honour) after hockey wizard Major Dhyan Chand.
- India's Javelin throw star Neeraj Chopra (23-years) created history by winning the firstever Gold Medal in the Olympic track and field event.
- National Handloom Day is being organised on August 7 by the Ministry of Textiles through the virtual medium.
- Social Justice and Empowerment Minister Dr Virendra Kumar launched PM-DAKSH
  Portal and PM-DAKSH Mobile App to make the skill development schemes accessible to the
  target groups.
- J&K LG Manoj Sinha flagged off Cyclothon event 'Pedal for Dal' from the shores of the Dal Lake in the run-up to the Independence Day celebrations.
- India's Wrestler Bajrang Punia beat Kazakhstan's Daulet Niyazbekov 8-0 to win the bronze medal in the men's 65kg freestyle event.
- Dhriti Banerjee has been appointed as the first woman Director of Zoological Survey of India (ZSI)
- Manan Bhatt has come up with a new book titled as 'Balakot Air Strike: How India Avenged Pulwama'. The book is published by Garuda Prakashan.

## 6 August

 Indian wrestler Ravi Kumar Dahiya bagged silver medal in 57kg category freestyle final, after losing 4-7, to Russian two-time defending world champion Zavur Uguev, at Tokyo Olympics 2020







- Two Indian economist, Jagdish Bhagwati (Columbia University) and C Rangarajan (Former governor of RBI) have been conferred with inaugural Prof CR Rao Centenary Gold Medal (CGM) by Indian Econometric Society (TIES) Trust.
- Border Roads Organisation (BRO) has constructed World's highest motorable road at Umlingla Pass in eastern Ladakh. It is a 52-km-long tarmac road at Umlingla Pass and has been constructed at an altitude of 19,300 feet.
- Hiroshima Day is being observed every year on August 6 to commemorate the day
  in 1945 when an atomic bomb was dropped on the Japanese city of Hiroshima by United States,
  followed by another drop on the city of Nagasaki on August 9.
- TRIFED in collaboration with Ministry of External Affairs is going to set up an Atmanirbhar Bharat corner in 100 Indian Missions/ Embassies across the world. The corner will be an exclusive platform to promote GI tagged, natural and organic tribal products abroad
- Dept of Expenditure, Ministry of Finance has released over 685 crores to four States for providing grants to the Urban Local Bodies, ULBs. Out of this, Rs 494 crore has been released to UP, Rs 110 crore to Gujarat, Rs 74 crore to Jharkhand and Rs 6 crore to Mizoram.
- Union Territory of Ladakh has launched month-long campaign titled as 'Pani Maah'
  (Water Month) to increase the pace of implementation of Jal Jeevan Mission in UT and to
  inform and engage village communities on the importance of clean water.
- India's nuclear power capacity is expected to reach 22,480 MW from the current 6,780 MW by 2031. Share of nuclear power in the total electricity generation in the country is about 3.1% in 2020-21.
- Indian Naval Ship Khanjar has become first Indian Navy ship to call at the heritage coastal port of Gopalpur in Odisha.
- VO Chidambaranar Port Trust has become the first major port in the country to deploy e-cars. It has inducted three Tata Xpres-T electric vehicles in the first phase.
- Supreme Court has decided that the Governor of a State can pardon prisoners, including death sentence, even before they have served a minimum 14 years of prison sentence.

#### 5 August

- India boxer Lovlina Borgohain (23 years) has won bronze medal after losing by 0-5, to top
  seed Busenaz Surmeneli of Turkey, in the Women's Welter (64-69kg) semi-final bout. She is
  the only third Indian boxer to win a medal at the Olympics after Vijender Singh (2008) and
  MC Mary Kom (2012).
- Indian men's hockey team has defeated Germany to win the bronze medal at Tokyo
  Olympics. This is India's first Olympic medal in hockey since they won gold medal in 1980
  Olympics in Moscow.
- Indo-Russia joint training Exercise titled 'INDRA 2021' commenced at Prudboy Ranges, Volgograd in Russia.
- Germany became 5th country to sign International Solar Alliance (ISA) Framework
   Agreement after amendments to it entered into force on 8th January 2021, opening its
   Membership to all UN Member States.
- Uttarakhand CM Pushkar Singh Dhami has launched earthquake early warning mobile application, titled as 'Uttarakhand Bhookamp Alert'.
- CBIC has launched Indian Customs Compliance Information Portal (CIP) at www.cip.icegate.gov.in/CIP for providing free access to information on all Customs procedures and regulatory compliance for nearly 12,000 Customs Tariff Items.







- World Bank has approved USD 250 million project in India titled as Second Dam Rehabilitation and Improvement Project (DRIP-2) agreement for long-term dam safety program and performance of existing dams of India.
- Pakistani climber named **Shehroz Kashif** (19 years) has become the **youngest mountaineer** in the world to reach the summit of K2 (second-highest peak in the world).
- National Handloom Development Corporation has organized Handloom My Pride Expo at Dilli Haat to celebrate the 7th National Handloom Day (August 7).
- APEDA has signed MoU with University of Agricultural Science (UAS) Bangalore to give boost agricultural and processed food products exports especially from Karnataka
- Noted author and Padma Shri awardee **Padma Sachdev (81 years)** passed away in Mumbai. He is the first modern woman poet of Dogri language.

### 4 August

- Ultra-conservative cleric and judiciary chief Ebrahim Raisi has taken over as eighth President of Iran with effect from August 3, 2021. Capital of Iran: Tehran.
- NITI Aayog, along with RMI and RMI India has released report titled as Turning Around
  the Power Distribution Sector that presents reform pathways that can transform power
  distribution sector
- HDFC Bank has launched an overdraft facility for small retailers titled as 'Dukandar Overdraft Scheme' to help shopkeepers and merchants in easing their cash crunch.
- Union Minister for Youth Affairs and Sports, Annrag Singh Thakur has launched the theme song for the Indian Paralympic contingent in New Delhi. The song is titled as "Kar De Kamaal Tu".
- U.S. Men's National Team has defeated Mexico by 1-0 in extra time, to be crowned champion of the 2021 CONCACAF Football Gold Cup in Las Vegas
- Italy's Marcell Jacobs (26 years) has claimed Men's 100 metres gold title at Tokyo Olympics. He achieved the feat in 9.80 seconds, becoming the first Italian to take the most coveted title in athletics
- International Monetary Fund (IMF) has approved allocation of \$650 billion in IMF Special Drawing Rights (SDR) to boost global liquidity
- Seven Indian companies have been placed in 2021 Fortune's Global 500 list, which is an annual ranking of the top 500 enterprises globally, as measured by business revenues. Indian Companies in the list: Reliance Industries (155<sup>th</sup> rank), SBI (205), Indian Oil (212), ONGC (243), Rajesh Exports (348), Tata Motors (357), Bharat Petroleum (394)
- Defence Secretary Ajay Kumar has launched website for 75th Independence Day Celebrations 2021 (IDC 2021), <u>://indianidc2021.mod.gov.in</u> as a part of Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsay.
- Alexander Zverev of Germany (24 years) has defeated Russian Karen Khachanov by 6-3 6-1, to win gold in men's single tennis at Tokyo Olympics

#### 3 August

- Nikol Pashinyan (46 years) has been re-appointed officially as the Prime Minister of Armenia by the President Armen Sarkissian with effect from August 2, 2021.
- Renowned Indian author, **Kunal Basu** has announced to release his new novel titled 'In **An Ideal World**' in early 2022.
- Alpine-Renault team's Esteban Ocon (France) has won Hungarian Grand Prix 2021, which
  was held on August 1, 2021 at Hungaroring in Mogyoród, Hungary.
- Odisha capital's Bhubaneswar has become first city in India to achieve 100% vaccination of its people against COVID-19







- Multiple World Masters Athletics Championship gold medalist, Man Kaur (105 years) passed away due to heart attack. She was referred to as 'Miracle from Chandigarh'.
- Sri Lanka left-arm fast bowling all-rounder, Isuru Udana (3 years) has announced his retirement from international cricket with effect from July 31, 2021, bringing an end to his over decade long career.
- Culture Ministry has launches unique programme to celebrate Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav on Independence Day 2021. In this initiative, people have been invited to sing the National anthem and upload the video on website www.RASHTRAGAAN.IN.
- Ministry of Tourism has identified Eco tourism as one of the Niche Tourism areas for development in India
- Union Minister of Science & Technology has released 'Biotech-PRIDE' (Promotion of Research and Innovation through Data Exchange) Guidelines

# 2 August

- Indian shuttler P V Sindhu has won the bronze medal in the women's singles match in Tokyo Olympics.
- The State Administration Council of Myanmar has been reformed as the 'Caretaker government of Myanmar' headed by the Chief of the Myanmar military Senior General Min Aung Hlaing as the Prime Minister.
- The Indian women's hockey team scripted history by qualifying for the Olympic Games semifinals for the 1st time.
- Italy's Lamont Marcell Jacobs won the gold medal in men's 100m in 9.80s.
- Venezuela's two-time world champion Yulimar Rojas set a new world record as she won Olympic gold in the women's triple jump
- Italian luxury brand Bvlgari has appointed actor Priyanka Chopra Jonas as global brand ambassador.
- A hotline has been set up between the Indian and Chinese armies in the Sikkim sector to further boost confidence along the LAC.
- Bharat Bill Payment System has appointed Noopur Chaturvedi as its new chief executive
  officer.
