Out of line: On West Bengal Governor's visit to violence-hit areas



Goodbye Farzad-B: But diluting of India-Iran ties could curb New Delhi's strategic options

The article bids goodbye to the Faraz-B gas field negotiations between India and Iran, declined by Iran. This is the second time when Iran has dropped India's deals, with the first being the Chabahar railway link project. The moves lead to anticipating the decline of commercial relations between the named nations.

All this began after Trump pulled the US out of the Iran Nuclear deal and India was forced to do business with Tehran, winding down oil imports.

Though the Biden administration has initiated the talks with Iran on the nuclear deal, the results are yet unclear. The moves may have strategic implications in the future. If the US pulls out from Afghanistan, India would need Iran's help to stabilize the situation there otherwise Pakistan might try and take advantage.

Thus, it would be great if the US can convince and revive the nuclear pact with Iran allow foreign companies to do business with Tehran.


Implication:
