Important News: State

Telangana tops in highest number of ODF villages

- **Telangana** stood first in the country in the list of highest number of **open defecation free** (ODF Plus) villages under the Swachh Bharat Mission (Grameen) Phase-II programme till December 31, 2021.
- As many as 13,737 out of 14,200 villages in Telangana are in the ODF Plus list, which is 96.74%.
- The State government has enacted a new Telangana Panchayat Raj Act to ensure holistic development of villages.
- Sanitation drives have often been carried out through the PallePragathiprogramme in villages.
- The implementation of PallePragathiprogramme for holistic development of villages is being uploaded on SBM (G) 2.0 mobile app, which gets reported at the national level dashboard.



'Padhe Bharat' Campaign

- Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan launched a **100 days Reading** Campaign'Padhe Bharat'.
- The launch of the 100 Days Reading Campaign is in alignment with the **National Education Policy (NEP) 2020**.



- Padhe Bharat campaign will focus on children studying in Balvatika to Grade 8.
- The reading campaign will be organised for 100 days (14 weeks) starting from 1st January 2022 to 10th April 2022.
- This campaign has also been aligned with the vision and goals of foundational Literacy and Numeracy mission.
- The 100 days reading campaign will also focus on Indian languages including mother tongue/local/regional languages.
- It is in this regard, **21st February** which is celebrated as **International Mother Tongue Day**, has also been integrated with this campaign.



Electoral Bonds

- Ahead of assembly elections in five states, the government approved issuance of the 19th tranche of **electoral bonds** which will be open for sale from January 1 to 10, 2022.
- Assembly elections for 5 states-- Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh and Goa-- are expected to be announced soon.
- State Bank of India (SBI) has been authorised to issue and encash Electoral Bonds through its 29 Authorized Branches with effect from January 1 to January 10, 2022.

About Electoral Bond:

- Electoral Bond is a financial instrument for making donations to political parties.
- The bonds are issued in multiples of Rs. 1,000, Rs. 10,000, Rs. 1 lakh, Rs. 10 lakh and Rs. 1 crore without any maximum limit.
- SBI is authorised to issue and encash these bonds, which are valid for fifteen days from the date of issuance.
- Donor's name is not mentioned on the bond.

United Nation Security Council (UNSC)

- The United Nation Security Council (UNSC) got five new non-permanent members (Albania, Brazil, Gabon, Ghana and the United Arab Emirates).
- Estonia, Niger, St Vincent and the Grenadines, Tunisia and Vietnam finished their terms recently.
- Albania is joining for the first time while Brazil is taking an 11th turn. Gabon and Ghana each have been on the council three times before and the UAE once.

Sudan's Prime Minister Abdalla Hamdok announces resignation

- Prime Minister of Sudan, Abdalla Hamdok has announced his resignation.
- The 66-year-old Hamdok served as the 15th Prime Minister of Sudan from 2019 to 2022.
- MrHamdok, who was sacked by the military in October 2021 and reinstated a few weeks later as part of a deal, stepped down as anti-military protests continued to rock the country.
- The protesters rejected MrHamdok's deal with the military and demanded the Generals hand over power to an independent civilian authority.

Nuclear-Weapon States

- Five global nuclear powers namely **China**, **France**, **Russia**, **the U.K. and U.S.** pledged to prevent atomic weapons spreading and to avoid nuclear conflict, in a UN Security Council joint statement.
- The statement was issued after the latest review of the **Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons (NPT)** was postponed from its scheduled date of January 4 to later in the year due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

AboutTreaty on the Non-Proliferation of nuclear weapons (NPT):

- The Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of nuclear weapons, commonly known as the Non-Proliferation Treaty or NPT, is an international treaty whose objective is to prevent the spread of nuclear weapons and weapons technology, to promote cooperation in the peaceful uses of nuclear energy.
- The treaty was signed in 1968 and entered into force in 1970. Presently, it has 190 member states.
- India is not a member.

Apple becomes first company to touch \$3 trillion market cap

- **Apple Inc** became the first company to hit a \$3 trillion stock market value.
- On the first day of trading in 2022, the company's shares hit an intraday record high of \$182.88, putting Apple's market value just above \$3 trillion.
- The stock ended the session up 2.5% at \$182.01, with Apple's market capitalization at \$2.99 trillion.

Bollard Pull Tug "Balraj"

- Contract for construction of **50Ton Bollard Pull Tugs** was concluded with **M/sHindustan Shipyard Ltd,** Visakhapatnam on 14 Feb 2019 at a cost of Rs. 260.70 Crores
- Third tug in the series, "Balraj" has been delivered to Naval Dockyard, Visakhapatnam on 31 Dec 2021.
- Tugs "Veeran" and "Balram" were inducted on 22 Oct 2021 and 30 Oct 2021 at Naval Dockyard, Visakhapatnam and Naval Dockyard, Mumbai respectively.
- These tugs have been designed and built under the classification rules of Indian Register for Shipping (IRS) with a service life of 20 years and are capable of assisting large naval ships, including Aircraft Carrier and Submarines in berthing, un-berthing, turning and manoeuvering.

Science and Technology

National Air Sports Policy 2022

- The Ministry of Civil Aviation has released draft National Air Sports Policy (NASP) 2022 for public feedback.
- NASP 2022 covers sports like aerobatics, aeromodelling, amateur-built and experimental aircraft, ballooning, drones, gliding, hang gliding and paragliding; microlighting and paramotoring; skydiving and vintage aircraft.
- The vision is to make India one of the top air sports nations by 2030.
- The mission is to provide a safe, affordable, accessible, enjoyable and sustainable air sports ecosystem in India.
- An Air Sports Federation of India (ASFI) will be established as the apex governing body.
- The **Fédération AéronautiqueInternationale (FAI)**, headquartered in Lausanne, Switzerland is the world governing body for air sports.
- To make air sports affordable to the common public, the Government will request the GST Council to consider rationalising the **GST rate** on air sports equipment to 5% or less.

Schemes

Green Energy Corridor Phase-II

- The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs, chaired by the Prime Minister, Narendra Modi, approved the scheme on **Green Energy Corridor (GEC) Phase-II** for **Intra-State Transmission System (InSTS)** for addition of approximately 10,750 circuit kilometres of transmission lines and approx. 27,500 MegaVolt-Amperes (MVA) transformation capacity of substations.
- The scheme will facilitate grid integration and power evacuation of approximately 20 GW of Renewable Energy (RE) power projects in seven States namely, Gujarat, Himachal Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu and Uttar Pradesh.
- The transmission systems will be created over a period of five year from Financial Year 2021-22 to 2025-26.
- The scheme will help in achieving the target of 450 GW installed RE capacity by 2030.
- This scheme is in addition to GEC-Phase-I which is already under implementation in the States of Andhra Pradesh, Gujarat, Himachal Pradesh, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Rajasthan and Tamil Nadu for grid integration and power evacuation of approx. 24 GW of RE power and is expected to be completed by 2022.

Mera Gaon, Meri Dharohar

- Government-promoted CSC (Common Services Centres), SPV (Special Purpose Vehicle), in collaboration with the Ministry of Culture, will undertake the first-ever cultural survey of India's villages through a mobile application.
- The survey, titled 'Mera Gaon, Meri Dharohar', will document the cultural identity at the village level by involving citizens to share what makes their village, block or district unique.
- The entire exercise is expected to be completed by mid-2022.
- As per the agreement signed between the two entities, CSC will develop a mobile application and train the village level entrepreneurs (VLEs) in conducting the survey.
- Over 4 lakh VLEs, managing the CSCs across the country, will conduct the survey in 6.38 lakh villages.

- Common Service Centres are physical facilities for delivering Government of India e-Services to rural and remote locations where availability of computers and Internet was negligible or mostly absent.

Smart cities and Academia Towards Action & Research (SAAR)

- The Smart Cities Mission, Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA) has launched "Smart cities and Academia Towards Action & Research (SAAR)" program.
- It is a joint initiative of **MoHUA**, **National Institute of Urban Affairs (NIUA)** and leading Indian academic institutions of the country.
- Under the program, 15 premier architecture & planning institutes of the country will be working with Smart Cities to document landmark projects undertaken by the Smart Cities Mission.
- The Smart Cities Mission's urban projects are lighthouse projects to other aspiring cities.
- Since the start of the Mission in 2015, the 100 Smart Cities have been developing a total of 5,151 projects with an investment of Rs 2,05,018 crore.
- The first activity envisaged under SAAR is to prepare a compendium of 75 landmark urban projects in India under the Smart City Mission.
- These 75 urban projects are innovative, multi-sectoral, and have been implemented across geographies.

One District One Product brands

- Union Minister for Ministry of Food Processing Industries, Pashupati Kumar Paras launched six, One District One Product (ODOP) brands under the Pradhan Mantri Formalisation of Micro food processing Enterprises (PMFME) Scheme.
- The Ministry of Food Processing Industries has signed an agreement with NAFED for developing 10 brands of selected ODOPs under the branding and marketing component of the PMFME scheme.
- Out of these, six brands namely Amrit Phal, Cori Gold, Kashmiri Mantra, Madhu Mantra, Somdana, and Whole Wheat Cookies of Dilli Bakes were launched.
- All the products will be available at NAFED Bazaars, E-commerce platforms, and prominent retail stores across India.

About the Pradhan Mantri Formalisation of Micro food processing Enterprises (PMFME) Scheme:



- Launched under the Aatmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyan, PMFME Scheme is a centrally sponsored scheme that aims to enhance the competitiveness of existing individual microenterprises in the unorganized segment of the food processing industry and to promote formalization of the sector and provide support to Farmer Producer Organizations, Self Help Groups, and Producers Cooperatives along their entire value chain.
- With an outlay of Rs. 10,000 crores over a period of five years from 2020-21 to 2024-25, the scheme envisions to directly assist the 2,00,000 micro food processing units for providing financial, technical, and business support for up-gradation of existing micro food processing enterprises.

- Union Minister Dr Jitendra Singh launched the Web Portal for **PM's Excellence Award** in Public Administration portal for the year 2021-2022.
- After 2014, the process and selection of PM's Excellence Award have been institutionalized and now this is based on the performance of the District, rather than that of the District Collector or individual civil servant.
- The prize money was also doubled this year from Rs.10 lakh to Rs.20 lakh to the awarded District/Organization which is to be utilized for implementation of project/programme or bridging resource gaps in any area of public welfare.
- For the year 2021, the scheme for Prime Minister's Awards for Excellence in Public Administration aims to recognize the contribution of civil servants in:
 - 1) Promoting "Jan Bhagidari" or Peoples' participation in **Poshan Abhivan**
 - 2) Promoting excellence in sports and wellness through **Khelo India scheme**
 - 3) Digital Payments and good governance in PM SVANidhi Yojana
 - 4) Holistic Development through One District One Product scheme
 - 5) Seamless, End-to-End Delivery of Services without Human Intervention

New Appointments

Alka Mittal becomes first woman to head ONGC as CMD

- Alka Mittal has been appointed as the interim Chairman and Managing Director (CMD) of Oil and Natural Gas Corporation (ONGC), making her the first woman to head the country's largest oil and gas producer.
- Alka Mittal became the first woman to join ONGC's board on November 27, 2018.

About Oil and Natural Gas Corporation (ONGC):

- It is the largest government-owned-oil and gas exploration and production corporation in the country, and produces around 70% of India's crude oil (equivalent to around 57% of the country's total demand) and around 84% of its natural gas.
- In November 2010, the Government of India conferred the Maharatna status to ONGC.

Tesla's Autopilot team



Jagannath Temple Act, 1954

- In a historic decision, the **Odisha** state cabinet approved amendments to the **Sri Jagannath Temple Act of 1954**, simplifying issues pertaining to land owned by the Jagannath Temple.
- In the year 1806, the then British government had issued regulations for management of the Jagannath temple which was referred to as the Juggernaut temple by the colonial rulers.
- Under these regulations, pilgrims who visited the temple were expected to pay taxes.
- Three years later, the powers of management of the temple were passed on to the King of Khordha while the colonial government continued to retain some control.
- It was only after India gained Independence that the state of Odisha formally introduced the Jagannath Temple Act in the year 1952, which came into effect in 1954.
- The Act contains provision on land rights of the temple, duties of the sevayat, administrative powers of the Shri Jagannath Temple Managing Committee, rights and privileges of the Raja of Puri and other persons connected with the management and administration of the temple.

Recent Amendments:

- The recent amendment approved by the state cabinet now decentralizes the power to settle land related issues of the temple.
- The cabinet has delegated power to temple administration and concerned officials for sale and lease of land in name of Jagannath temple.

Rock Museum

• Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) Science & Technology; Minister of State (Independent Charge) Earth Sciences, Dr Jitendra Singh inaugurated India's first unique **Open "Rock" Museum** and later addressed the Hyderabad Scientists at the CSIR-National Geophysical Research Institute (NGRI).



- The Open Rock Museum, set up with the aim to educate and enlighten the masses about several lesser known facts, displays around 35 different types of rocks from different parts of India with ages ranging from 3.3 Billion years to around 55 Million years of the Earth's history.
- These rocks also represent the deepest part of the earth up to 175 kms of distance from the surface of the earth.
- Dr Jitendra Singh also released **Earthquake Risk Maps** of Lucknow and Dehradun Cities.
- CSIR-NGRI has made earthquake risk maps for Lucknow and Dehradun cities which are vulnerable for future earthquakes in the Indo-Gangetic plains area.



Captain Harpreet Chandi becomes first Indian-origin woman to trek solo to South Pole

• Captain Harpreet Chandi, a 32-year-old Indian-origin British Sikh Army officer and physiotherapist, also known as Polar Preet, has created history by becoming the first woman to complete a solo unsupported trek to the South Pole.

• **Harpreet Chandi** completed her 700 miles (1,127 kilometres) expedition to the South Pole in 40 days.

VeeranganaLaxmibai Railway Station
