Important News: State

Union Govt. extends term of J&K Delimitation Commission for second time in a year

- As the Ministry of Law and Justice informed, the Centre extended the term by two months by amending the notification issued on March 6, 2020.
- The panel's term will end on May 6, 2022.
- The delimitation process is crucial for kick-starting the political process in Jammu and Kashmir.

Background

- In 2020, Prime Minister Narendra Modi had said elections would be held in J&K after the delimitation process in the UT was over.
- On March 6, 2020, the government had set up the Delimitation Commission, headed by retired Supreme Court judge Ranjana Prakash Desai, to wind up delimitation within a year.
- As per the Jammu and Kashmir Reorganisation Bill, the number of Assembly seats in J&K would increase from 107 to 114, which is expected to benefit the Jammu region.
- The panel was granted one-year extension last year.

What is Delimitation Commission?

- The Delimitation commission or Boundary commission of India is a commission established by the Government of India under the provisions of the Delimitation Commission Act.
- The main task of the commission is redrawing the boundaries of the various assembly and Lok Sabha constituencies based on a recent census.

- Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi inaugurated (via video conferencing) the newly constructed two additional railway lines between Thane and Diva on Mumbai's busy suburban rail network
- Maharashtra Governor Bhagat Singh Koshyari and Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray also attended the inaugural ceremony virtually.

Key Highlights

- The additional lines have been built at the approximate cost of Rs. 620 crore and has the following components:
 - i. 1.4 km long rail flyover
 - ii. 170-meter-long tunnel
 - iii. 3 major bridges
 - iv. 21 minor bridges

Classical language Status to Marathi









- A delegation led by Marathi Language Minister Subhash Desai is going to Delhi to get the status of a classical language for Marathi. Union Culture Minister G. Kisan reddy and minister of state Arjun Meghwal are scheduled to meet.
- The question of granting elite status to the Marathi language has been pending with the Centre for several years, and the state government has now started pursuing with the Centre for the same. In line with this, a public campaign has been launched under the guidance of Marathi Language Minister Desai.
- Dignitaries from all walks of life have been singled out and participated in this mass campaign to ensure that Marathi gets 'elite' status. This question is now in its final stages.
- The delegation includes Principal Secretary Bhushan Gagrani and writer-director Shrirang Godbole.

Six Classical Status.

Six languages in the country have got 'classical' status.

• Tamil (2004), Sanskrit (2005), Kannada (2008), Telugu (2008), Malayalam (2013) and Oriya (2014).

Criteria

- - High antiquity of the early texts/ records in that language throughout one and a half to 2000 years.
- - A part of the ancient texts in that language is considered a valuable heritage for generations.
- - That language must have an original literary tradition; it should not be taken from other speaking communities.
- - Since classical language and literature are different from modern languages, there may be differences between the classical language and its later form or branches.

Medaram Jatara celebrated

- The biggest tribal fair "Medaram Jatara" celebrated with traditional fervour and zeal.
- The 4-day festival named after a village Medaram village in Mulugu district of Telangana.
- Shri G Kishan Reddy, the Union Minister for Culture, Tourism and Development of the NorthEastern Region (DoNER) attended the Sammakka-Saralamma Medaram Jatara.
- The minister, as per tradition, offered jaggery which is popularly also known as 'Bangaram' (Gold), equal to his weight.









About the festival

- As per the age-old ritual, the tribal priests performed special pujas at Chilakalagutta forest and the Medaram village.
- The devotees huddled around the road worshipping the tribal deities and walked barefoot to offer jaggery to the goddesses.
- As a part of Swadesh Darshan scheme, the Ministry of Tourism undertook projects to develop the Tribal Circuit of Mulugu, Laknavaram, Medavaram, Tadvai, Damaravi, Mallur and Bogatha waterfalls and constructed a guest house in Medaram.
- The Government of India sanctioned approximately 80 crores for the Tribal Circuit in Telangana and this included the construction of tourist amenities centre, amphitheatre, public convenience facilities, cottages, tented accommodation, gazebos, seating Benches, solid waste management infrastructure, solar lights, landscaping and drinking water fountains in Medaram.
- As per the 2011 census, the tribal population of the country is 10.43 crore, constituting 8.6% of the total population. 89.97% of them live in rural areas and 10.03% in urban areas.
- Note: 705 tribal communities constitute approximately 10% of our population.

What is Swadesh Darshan Scheme?

- Swadesh Darshan Scheme is a Central Sector scheme launched in 2014-15 by the Ministry of Tourism and Culture for the integrated development of theme-based tourist circuits.
- It aims to promote, develop, and harness the potential of tourism in India.
- Under the Swadesh Darshan scheme, the Ministry of Tourism provides Central Financial Assistance CFA to State Governments, Union Territory Administrations for the infrastructure development of circuits.
- It is envisioned to synergise with other schemes like Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, Skill India, Make in India etc. with the idea of positioning the tourism sector as a major engine for job creation, the driving force for economic growth, building synergy with various sectors to enable tourism to realize its potential.

About the festival

- This festival highlights the richness of the Indian classical dance styles such as Kathak, Bharathanatyam, Odissi, Kuchipudi, Manipuri, and Kathakali with performances of some of the best exponents in the field.
- Modern Indian dance has been added recently.
- The dances are performed in an open-air auditorium, usually in front of the Chitragupta Temple dedicated to Surya (the Sun God) and the Vishvanatha Temple dedicated to Lord Shiva, belonging to the western group.

Water Taxi Service in Mumbai



- Union Minister of Ports, Shipping and Waterways & AYUSH Sarbananda Sonowal flagged off **Water Taxi Service** for citizens of Mumbai, from Belapur Jetty.
- The Water Taxi services will commence from the Domestic Cruise Terminal (DCT) and will also connect nearby locations at Nerul, Belapur, Elephanta Island and JNPT.
- The newly constructed Belapur jetty, built at a cost of Rs. 8.37 crore was funded in the 50-50 model under the **Sagarmala scheme** of the Ministry of Ports, Shipping and Waterways.

About Sagarmala Programme:







- It is the flagship programme of the Ministry of Shipping to promote port-led development in the country by exploiting India's 7,517 km long coastline, 14,500 km of potentially navigable waterways and its strategic location on key international maritime trade routes.
- It was approved by the Union Cabinet in 2015.

- Recently, West Bengal Governor Jagdeep Dhankhar prorogued the state Legislative Assembly after exercising power vested with him under Article 174 of the Constitution.
- **About Prorogation:** Prorogation is discontinuing a session of the Parliament or a legislative assembly without dissolving it.
- **Article 174:** The article provides powers to the governor to summon, prorogue and dissolve the legislative assembly. The governor can do so only based on conditions as mentioned in Article 163.
- **Article 163:** The Governor should act based on the advice of the chief minister and the council of ministers.

India's first biomass-based hydrogen plant coming up in Madhya Pradesh



- The country's first commercial-scale biomass-based hydrogen plant is coming up in the Khandwa district of Madhya Pradesh.
- The plant will produce a tonne of hydrogen per day, from 30 tonnes of biomass feedstock.
- It will also produce biochar and methane.
- The plant is being put up by a joint venture of Watomo Energies Ltd and Biezel Green Energy with an investment of ₹24 crore.

J&K becomes the first Union Territory to be integrated with National Single Window System









- Jammu & Kashmir became the first Union Territory to be integrated with the **National Single Window System (NSWS).**
- Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha launched the J&K Single Window Clearance System integrated with NSWS.
- NSWS is linked with India Industrial Land Bank (IILB) which hosts 45 industrial parks of J&K. This will help Investors to discover available land parcels in J&K.
- The NSWS, a 2020 budgetary announcement of the Government of India, is a digital platform that serves as a guide for investors to identify and to apply for approvals as per their business requirements.
- The platform was soft launched in September 2021 by the Union Minister for Commerce and Industry, Piyush Goyal.
- NSWS will eliminate the need for investors to visit multiple platforms/offices to gather information and obtain clearances from different stakeholders.

Kerala Governor gives assent to Lok Ayukta Ordinance



Why in News

• Kerala Governor Arif Mohammad Khan to sign an Ordinance seeking to amend the Kerala Lok Ayukta Act, 1999.

Key Points

• Mr. Khan assented to the Ordinance early on Monday. The executive order made it Nonbinding on the "competent authority" to mandatorily eject, sans appeal, any public official found guilty by the Ombudsman.







- The Lok Ayukta Act specifies the Governor as the "competent authority" if the Chief Minister is the public official at fault. In the case of a Minister, the Chief Minister is the competent authority.
- The Act applies at various tiers of the administration, from the Cabinet level and downward. The amended Act makes it obligatory for the competent authority to review the "declaration of guilt" by the Lok Ayukta under Section 14 of the Act before acting against the culpable official.
- The Lok Ayukta would serve for a five year term or till the age of 70, whichever comes first.

Chhattisgarh becomes 35th State/UT to implement One Nation One Ration Card plan



• Chhattisgarh has become the 35th State/UT to implement "One Nation One Ration Card" (ONORC)plan.







- Recently Department of Food & Public Distribution had reviewed the progress of States/UTs towards the implementation of "One Nation One Ration Card" (ONORC) plan and after successful testing of portability transactions, the Department has approved the integration of Chhattisgarh with the existing cluster of portability States/UTs under ONORC.
- Accordingly, the ONORC plan for nation-wide portability of the **National Food Security Act (NFSA)** ration cards has been enabled in the Chhattisgarh State from **2**nd **February 2022**.
- With the integration of Chhattisgarh, the ONORC plan is now operational in **35 States/UTs** covering almost **96.8%** NFSA population (about **77 Crore** NFSA beneficiaries) in the country.
- Since inception of the ONORC plan in August 2019, so far more than 56 Crore portability transactions have been recorded in the States/UTs under ONORC, delivering nearly total 100 LMT foodgrains through both inter-State and intra-State portability transactions equivalent to about Rs. 31,000 Crore in food subsidy.

- The **Geological Survey of India (GSI)** has approved the setting up of the country's first Geo Park at Lamheta village on the banks of the Narmada River in Jabalpur district of Madhya Pradesh.
- The estimated cost of this project is ₹ 35 crore.
- A **Geo Park** is a unified area that advances the protection and use of geological heritage in a sustainable way and promotes the economic well-being of the people who live there.
- This site is already there in the UNESCO geo-heritage tentative list for the conservation of the natural heritage.
- William Henry Sleeman had discovered Dinosaur fossils from this area in 1928.

Empanelment rule removed for central deputation of DIG-level IPS officers



- The Department of Personnel and Training (DoPT) issued an order on Feb 10th, 2022 that those IPS officers coming to the Centre at DIG-level would no longer be required to be empanelled at that level with the Union government.
- The Appointments Committee of the Cabinet has approved the proposal of Ministry of Home Affairs for dispensing with the empanelment at the level of DIG with immediate effect and carrying out the corresponding stipulated amendments, in the existing IPS Tenure Policy.
- It would allow to call any IAS, IPS or IFoS officer on central deputation with or without the state's consent, the Union government can order on DIG-level IPS officers that may not be palatable to the states.

According to previous rules, a DIG-ranked IPS officer with minimum experience of 14 years could be deputed to the Centre only if the Union Home Secretary-led Police Establishment Board empanelled them as DIGs at the Centre. The board chooses the panel on the basis of officers' career and vigilance records.

- Abdul Barkat was injured during the procession that students mobilised on the premises of Dhaka Medical College hostel on 21st Feb, later he died.
- Posthumously he was awarded Ekushey Padak by the Bangladesh Government.

National Digital University

Key highlights

- Union Budget for 2022-23 aims to help implement the National Education Policy (NEP) effectively.
- The budget focuses on five aspects related to the education sector

 - iii. urban planning and design
 - iv. internationalisation and AVGC (Animation Visual Effects Gaming Comic)
- A move to empower students with better medical and technical education has begun in many states in local languages.

Note: Education in the mother tongue is related to the students' mental development.

- NEP 2020 unequivocally endorses and envisions a substantial increase in public investment in education by both the Central government and all State Governments.
- The Centre and the States will work together to increase the public investment in Education sector to reach 6% of GDP at the earliest.

Govt's new rules for kids on two-wheelers



- The Ministry of Road Transport and Highways has amended **Rule 138 of Central Motor Vehicles Rules** (CMVR), **1989** and has prescribed norms related to safety measures for children below four years of age, riding or being carried on a motor cycle.
- This has been notified under Section 129 of the Motor Vehicles Act, which mandates that the Central Government may, by rules, provide for measures for the safety of children below four years of age, riding or being carried on a motor cycle.
- Further, it specifies use of a safety harness and crash helmet.
- It also restricts the speed of such motor cycles to 40 kmph.
- These rules will come into force after one year from the date of publication of the **Central Motor Vehicles (Second Amendment) Rules, 2022.**

G20 Secretariat for India's Presidency



- The Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, approved the setting up of a G20 Secretariat and its reporting structures.
- It will be responsible for implementation of overall policy decisions and arrangements needed for steering India's forthcoming G20 Presidency.







• India will hold the Presidency of the G20 from 1 December 2022 to 30 November 2023, culminating with the G20 Summit in India in 2023.

About the G20:

- The G20 is made up of 19 countries and the European Union.
- The **19 countries** are Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, China, Germany, France, India, Indonesia, Italy, Japan, Mexico, the Russian Federation, Saudi Arabia, South Africa, South Korea, Turkey, the UK, and the US.

Organisation of the Islamic Cooperation (OIC)



- Recently, India lashed out at the **Organisation of the Islamic Cooperation** (OIC) for being "communal minded" and "hijacked by vested interests" after the grouping called on the UN Human Rights Council to take "necessary measures" on the issue of Muslim girl students being told not to wear the hijab in Karnataka schools.
- The OIC also urged India to "ensure the safety, security and well being of the Muslim community while protecting their way of life".

- It is the world's second largest multilateral body after the UN.
- It counts 57 members, all of which are Islamic countries or Muslim majority members.

Centre reduces agri-cess for Crude Palm Oil









- The Government of India has reduced the agri-cess for Crude Palm Oil (CPO) from 7.5% to 5%.
- After reduction of the agri-cess, the import tax gap between CPO and Refined Palm Oil has increased to 8.25%.
- Another pre-emptive measure taken by the Government to check the prices of edible oils is to extend the current basic rate of import duty of zero percent on Crude Palm Oil, Crude Soyabean oil and Crude Sunflower Oil upto 30th September, 2022.
- The above steps will augment the earlier measure taken by the Government viz. the stock limit order dated 3rd February, 2022 vide which the Government had specified the stock limit quantities on edible oils and oilseeds for a period upto 30th June, 2022 under the Essential Commodities Act, 1955.

Japanese Industrial Townships (JITs) in India



- A Joint Meeting was held between India (Department for Promotion of Industry & Internal Trade (DPIIT) and Japan (Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry (METI) for annual review of progress under **Japanese Industrial Townships (JITs) in India.**
- It is also worth noting that this year marks the 70th anniversary of establishment of diplomatic relations between India and Japan.
- The two countries had established diplomatic relations in April 1952.
- It may be noted that Japan Industrial Townships (JITs) were set up pursuant to the "Action Agenda for the India-Japan Investment and Trade Promotion and Asia-Pacific Economic Integration" signed between METI, Government of Japan and DPIIT, Government of India







in April 2015 to take steps to develop "Japan Industrial Townships" in India especially in Delhi Mumbai Industrial Corridor (DMIC) and Chennai Bengaluru Industrial Corridor (CBIC) regions in order to facilitate Japanese investment to India.

- Japan is the only country that has dedicated country-focused industrial townships across India.
- Currently there are 114 Japanese companies across the JITs.
- As the 5th largest investor, Japan has contributed over USD 36.2 Billion in cumulative investments since 2000, especially in key sectors such as automobiles, Electronics System Design & Manufacturing (ESDM), Medical Devices, Consumer goods, Textiles, Food processing and Chemicals.

National Ropeways Development Programme (Parvatmala)



 Union Finance Minister Smt Nirmala Sitharaman, while presenting Union Budget for 2022-23 announced National Ropeways Development Programme – "Parvatmala".

About "Parvatmala" scheme:

- The scheme will be taken up on PPP mode, which will be a preferred ecologically sustainable alternative in place of conventional roads in difficult hilly areas.
- The idea is to improve connectivity and convenience for commuters, besides promoting tourism.
- This may also cover congested urban areas, where conventional mass transit system is not feasible.
- The Finance Minister announced that contracts for 8 ropeway projects for a length of 60 km would be awarded in 2022-23.
- The scheme is being presently started in regions like Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, Manipur, Jammu & Kashmir and the other North Eastern states.

- **Startup India**, the flagship initiative of the Government of India, intended to catalyse startup culture and build a strong and inclusive ecosystem for innovation and entrepreneurship in India is also supporting in wide publicity of **Powerthon-2022**.

Statue of Equality in Hyderabad









Why in News

• Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the 216-feet tall 'Statue of Equality' commemorating the 11th-century Bhakti Saint Sri Ramanujacharya in Shamshabad of Telangana on Saturday.

Key Points

- The statue is made of 'panchaloha', a combination of five metals: gold, silver, copper, brass, and zinc and is among one of the tallest metallic statues in sitting position, in the world.
- PM to dedicate to the nation 216-feet tall 'Statue of Equality' commemorating the 11th century Bhakti Saint Sri Ramanujacharya.

Hoysala Temples proposed to be listed under UNESCO World Heritage Sites



- The Union Culture Ministry announced that the Hoysala Temples of Belur, Halebid and Somnathapura in Karnataka have been finalised as India's nomination for consideration as UNESCO World Heritage site for the year 2022-2023.
- The 'Sacred Ensembles of the Hoysala' are on **UNESCO's Tentative list** since 15th April, 2014 and represent one of the highest points of human creative genius and stand testimony to the rich historical and cultural heritage of our country.
- All these three Hoysala temples are protected monuments of the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) and therefore conservation and maintenance will be done by ASI.
- The sacred ensembles of the Hoysalas, built in the 12th-13th centuries and represented here by the three components of Belur, Halebid and Somnathapura, attest to the creativity and skill of the Hoysala artists and architects who built these masterpieces of a kind never seen before or since.
- The Hoysala temples have a basic Darvidian morphology but show strong influences of the Bhumija mode widely used in Central India, the Nagara traditions of northern and western India, and the Karntata Dravida modes favoured by the Kalyani Chalukyas.

India's UNESCO World Heritage Sites:







- The first sites to be inscripted were Ajanta Caves, Ellora Caves, Agra Fort, and Taj Mahal, of which all were inscribed in the 1983 session of the World Heritage Committee.
- The latest site to be inscribed is Dholavira, Gujarat in 2021.
- As of July 2021, 19 of the 36 States and union territories of India are home to the World Heritage Sites, with Maharashtra having the highest number of sites (5).
- At present, there are 40 World Heritage Sites located in India. Out of these, 32 are cultural, 7 are natural, and 1 is mixed (meeting both cultural and natural criteria), as determined by the organization's selection criteria.
- India has the sixth largest number of sites in the world.

Society for Worldwide Interbank Financial Telecommunication (SWIFT)

Context

• The European Union, US, UK and allies have agreed to exclude a number of Russian banks from Swift, an international payment system used by thousands of financial institutions.

About the SWIFT

- The SWIFT system stands for the Society for Worldwide Interbank Financial Telecommunication.
- It is a secure platform for financial institutions to exchange information about global monetary transactions such as money transfers.
- It does not move money; it operates as a middleman to verify information of transactions by providing secure financial messaging services to more than 11,000 banks in over 200 countries.
- It is overseen by the central banks from eleven industrial countries: Canada, France, Germany, Italy, Japan, the Netherlands, Sweden, Switzerland, the United Kingdom, and the United States, besides Belgium.
- It is based in Belgium.

Effects on Russia

- The statement from EU, the US, the UK and others said the move would "ensure that these banks are disconnected from the international financial system and harm their ability to operate globally".
- The aim is for Russian companies to lose access to the normally smooth and instant transactions provided by Swift.
- Payments for its valuable energy and agricultural products will be severely disrupted.
- Banks would be likely to have to deal directly with one another, adding delays and extra costs, and ultimately cutting off revenues for the Russian government.
- Prior to this, only one country had been cut off from SWIFT Iran.


Second Bangladesh Film Festival in Agartala

Russia recognises Ukraine Rebel Regions as independent









- Recently, Russian President Vladimir Putin recognised the Ukraine Rebel Regions in eastern Ukraine Donetsk and Luhansk as independent areas despite calls from the west to put an end to the tensions driven by fears that Russia may attack Ukraine.
- This paved the way to provide them military support a direct challenge to the West that will fuel fears that Russia could imminently invade Ukraine.
- Mr. Putin justified his decision in a far-reaching, pre-recorded speech blaming NATO for the current crisis and calling the U.S.-led alliance an existential threat to Russia.
- Mr. Putin's announcement shatters a 2015 peace deal signed in Minsk requiring Ukrainian authorities to offer a broad self-rule to the rebel regions, which marked a major diplomatic coup for Moscow.
- The Donbass region, comprising the Donetsk and Luhansk oblasts of Ukraine, has been at the centre of the conflict since March 2014 when Moscow (Russia) invaded and annexed the Crimean Peninsula.

MINSK I: Ukraine and the Russian-backed separatists agreed a 12-point ceasefire deal in the Belarusian capital in September 2014. The agreement quickly broke down, with violations by both sides.

MINSK II: Representatives of Russia, Ukraine, the Organisation for Security and Cooperation in Europe (OSCE) and the leaders of two pro-Russian separatist regions signed a 13-point agreement in February 2015.

Context: The first shipment of 10,000 tonnes of wheat from India for the people of Afghanistan will be dispatched via the Attari-Wagah land border crossing.









- The first shipment formally flagged off at Attari-Wagah in the presence of India and Pakistani officials and representatives of the World Food Programme (WFP), which is responsible for distributing the wheat in Afghanistan.
- The shipment is being sent after the Indian and Pakistan sides finalised modalities for transporting the wheat via Pakistan land routes after weeks of negotiations.
- The Indian government signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with WFP on February 12 for the distribution of food grains within Afghanistan
- The Indian side is also exploring the option of sending more wheat to Afghanistan via Iran's Chabahar port.

About Lassa fever:

- The Lassa fever-causing virus is found in West Africa and was first discovered in 1969 in Lassa, Nigeria, the Centers for Disease Control and Pollution (CDC) notes.
- The fever is spread by rats and is primarily found in countries in West Africa including Sierra Leone, Liberia, Guinea, and Nigeria where it is endemic.
- A person can become infected if they come in contact with household items of food that is contaminated with the urine or feces of an infected rat.
- Symptoms typically appear 1-3 weeks after exposure. Mild symptoms include slight fever, fatigue, weakness and headache and more serious symptoms include bleeding, difficulty breathing, vomiting, facial swelling, pain in the chest, back, and abdomen and shock.

India-Australia Interim Trade Agreement









- India and Australia have announced that they are set to conclude an **Interim Trade Agreement** in March 2022 and a **Comprehensive Economic Cooperation Agreement (CECA)** 12-18 months thereafter.
- An interim or early harvest trade agreement is used to liberalise tariffs on the trade of certain goods between two countries or trading blocs before a comprehensive **FTA** (**Free Trade Agreement**) is concluded.

- India and Australia have also signed a MoU to boost tourism between the two countries.

- India is currently in the process of negotiating FTAs with the UAE, the UK, Canada, the EU and Israel, besides Australia.
- India is also looking to complete an early harvest agreement with the UAE and the UK in the first half of 2022.

A significant number of women account holders in Maharashtra under the Mudra Loan Scheme



- The central government launched the Mudra Loan Scheme from April 2015 to provide loans to small and small scale industries. Through this, an uncollateralized loan of ten lakh rupees is made available through various banks.
- In Maharashtra, 90 lakh women entrepreneurs and organisations have lifted a whopping Rs 34,000 crore from the scheme in three years.
- According to information available on the Mudra portal loans worth Rs 17.32 lakh crore were sanctioned across the country from the inception of the scheme till December 31 2021. The share of women entrepreneurs in this is 44 per cent.
- In Maharashtra, a total of 43.85 lakh account holders were disbursed loans worth Rs 26,438 crore in 2018-19. Of this, the number of women account holders was 31.88 lakh and the amount of loans given to them was 10,823 crore. There was a further increase in the number of women account holders in 2019-20.







- Loans worth Rs 12,165 crore were disbursed to 34 lakh 78 thousand women account holders. In 2020-21, however, the figures show that there has been a decline in the number of borrowers during the corona period. Loans worth Rs 11,106 crore were disbursed to 29.57 lakh women account holders during these years. In these years, however, the number of account holders decreased.
- West Bengal ranks first in the country in disbursement of loans to women account holders through the Mudra scheme. It is followed by Tamil Nadu, Bihar, Karnataka and Maharashtra.

- Telangana had the lowest unemployment rate in January 2022. It was 0.7%. The second lowest was in Gujarat in 1.2%. the third lowest was in Meghalaya, 1.5% followed by Odisha (1.8%).
- Haryana had the highest unemployment rate, 23.4%. The second highest was in Rajasthan (18.9%).
- As of December 2021, the total number of unemployed in India is 53 million. Of this, the majority were women. Around 35% of the Indian population is actively looking for work. This includes 8 million women. Another 17 million people are unemployed. These people are willing to work if work was available. However, they were not actively looking for job opportunities.

Virtual Digital Assets









- Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, in her Budget 2022 speech, announced a 30 percent tax on income from virtual digital assets.

- In the explanatory memorandum of the Finance Bill, the government stated, "To define the term "virtual digital asset", a new clause (47A) is proposed to be inserted to section 2 of the Act.
- As per the proposed new clause, a virtual digital asset is proposed to mean any information or code or number or token (not being Indian currency or any foreign currency), generated through cryptographic means.

Highlights of Union Budget 2022-23:

- Emergency Credit Line Guarantee Scheme (ECLGS) extended up to March 2023. The guarantee cover will be expanded by 50,000 crore rupees.
- Additional credit of 2 lakh crore rupees for MSME to be provided under Credit Guarantee Trust for Micro and Small Enterprises.
- Productivity Linked Incentive in 14 sectors for achieving the vision of AtmaNirbhar Bharat will be strengthened.

Economic Survey 2021-22



- The Union Minister for Finance & Corporate Affairs Smt Nirmala Sitharaman tabled the Economic Survey 2021-22 in Parliament, which states that the year ahead is well poised for a pick-up in private sector investment with the financial system in a good position to provide support to the revival of economy.
- The central **theme** of this year's Economic Survey is the "Agile approach".
- India to witness GDP growth of 8.0-8.5 percent in 2022-23, supported by widespread vaccine coverage, gains from supply-side reforms and easing of regulations, robust export growth, and availability of fiscal space to ramp up capital spending.
- The growth projection for 2022-23 is based on the assumption that there will be no further debilitating pandemic related economic disruption, monsoon will be normal, withdrawal of global liquidity by major central banks will be broadly orderly, oil prices will be in the range of US\$70-\$75/bbl, and global supply chain disruptions will steadily ease over the course of the year.
- The Survey says, the above projection is comparable with the World Bank's and Asian Development Bank's latest forecasts of real GDP growth of 8.7 percent and 7.5 percent respectively for 2022-23.
- As per the IMF's latest World Economic Outlook (WEO) growth projections released on 25th January, 2022, India's real GDP is projected to grow at 9 percent in both 2021-22 and 2022-23 and at 7.1 percent in 2023-24.
- This projects India as the fastest growing major economy in the world in all these three years.
- In conclusion, the Survey is quite optimistic that overall macro-economic stability indicators suggest that the Indian Economy is well placed to take on the challenges of 2022-







23 and one of the reasons that the Indian Economy is in good position is its unique response strategy.

Forex Reserves decline by \$678 million



- According to data released by the **Reserve Bank of India's (RBI)**, India's Forex Reserves (Foreign Exchange Reserves) posted a decline of \$678 million during the week ended 21st January 2022 to reach \$634.287 billion.
- Foreign Currency Assets (FCA) declined by \$1.155 billion to \$569.582 billion in the reporting week.
- Expressed in dollar terms, FCA includes the effect of appreciation or depreciation of non-US units like the euro, pound and yen held in the foreign exchange reserves.
- Meanwhile, gold reserves saw an increase of \$567 million to \$40.337 billion during the week ended January 21, as per the data.
- The Special Drawing Rights (SDRs) with the International Monetary Fund (IMF) fell \$68 million to \$19.152 billion.
- India's reserve position with the IMF also decreased by \$22 million to \$5.216 billion in the reporting week.

- The Tejas is the second supersonic fighter developed by HAL.

- The third submarine, Karanj, is in the last phase of sea trials.

International Space Station (ISS)



Context

• A widely circulated comment by the chief of Russian space agency Dimitry Rogozin has ignited fears that the tension following Russia's invasion of Ukraine could have consequences for the International Space Station (ISS).

About International Space Station (ISS)

- It is a manmade space station, or a habitable artificial satellite, in low Earth orbit.
- The ISS has been in operation since 1998 and is expected to continue at least till 2028.







- However, Russia has indicated that it might pull out of the collaboration earlier, possibly by 2024.
- It is a joint project between five participating space agencies:
 - ✓ NASA (United States),
 - ✓ Roscosmos (Russia),
 - ✓ JAXA (Japan),
 - ✓ ESA (Europe),
 - ✓ CSA (Canada)

Facility

• The facility is used for carrying out a variety of zero-gravity experiments, space exploratory studies, and technology development.

Note:

- The ISS is not the first space station to be built and operated.
- Several smaller space stations have been used earlier, the most famous of which has been the Russian Mir space station that operated in the 1980s, and the American Skylab.

Electric vehicle cell launched in Mumbai

- the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation will launch its electric vehicle (EV) cell to bring together government officials, e-mobility experts, and representatives from the electric vehicle industry.
- The EV cell will be placed under the environment department of the municipal corporation.

Bharti Airtel joins SEA-ME-WE-6 undersea cable consortium









- **Bharti Airtel** has joined the **'SEA-ME-WE-6' undersea cable consortium** in a bid to scale up its high-speed global network capacity to serve India's fast-growing digital economy.
- Airtel is participating as a "major investor" in the SEA-ME-WE-6 and is anchoring 20 percent of the overall investment in the cable system, which will go live in 2025.
- Airtel has acquired one Fiber Pair on the main SEA-ME-WE-6 system and will co-build four Fiber Pairs between Singapore Chennai Mumbai as part of the cable system.
- Airtel will land the SEA-ME-WE-6 cable system in India at new landing stations in Mumbai and Chennai.

About SEA-ME-WE 6 undersea cable consortium:

- The SEA-ME-WE 6 (South East Asia-Middle East-West Europe 6, or SMW6) is a 19,200 km submarine cable system between Singapore and France (Marseille), crossing Egypt through terrestrial cables.
- The SMW6 cable system consists of 10 fiber pairs, with 12.6Tbps per fiber pair and 126Tbps system capacity.

"Corbevax", COVID-19 vaccine for children between 12-18 years of age group



- Drugs Controller General of India (DCGI) has granted Emergency Use Authorisation to COVID-19 vaccine Corbevax for children between 12-18 years of age group.
- It is India's first indigenously developed Receptor Binding Domain protein sub-unit COVID-19 vaccine.
- It is developed by Biological E Ltd, the Hyderabad-based pharmaceutical company.







- Corbevax vaccine is administered through an intramuscular route.
- Two doses are scheduled 28 days apart and are stored at 2 to 8 degrees Celsius temperature.

ISRO successfully launches satellite EOS-04



- ISRO successfully launched **earth observation satellite EOS-04** along with two other satellites.
- India's Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle PSLV-C52 successfully injected Earth Observation Satellite EOS-04, into an intended sun synchronous polar orbit of 529 km altitude from Satish Dhawan Space Centre, SHAR, Sriharikota.
- The satellite EOS-04 is a Radar Imaging Satellite designed to provide high-quality images under all weather conditions for applications such as Agriculture, Forestry & Plantations, Soil Moisture & Hydrology and Flood mapping.
- PSLV C52 also placed two small satellites. One of them is a student satellite INSPIREsat-1 developed by Indian Institute of Space Science & Technology in association with Laboratory of Atmospheric & Space Physics at the University of Colorado. Another is a technology demonstrator satellite INS-2TD from ISRO, which is a precursor to India-Bhutan Joint Satellite INS-2B.
- This was the first launch of PSLV since the failure of the EOS-03 mission launched last year.





National Centres of Excellence in Carbon Capture & Utilization



- Two National Centres of Excellence in **Carbon Capture and Utilization (CCU)** are being established in India.
- The two Centres, namely the **National Centre of Excellence in Carbon Capture and Utilization (NCoE-CCU)** at Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Bombay, Mumbai and the **National Centre in Carbon Capture and Utilization (NCCCU)** at Jawaharlal Nehru Centre for Advanced Scientific Research (JNCASR), Bengaluru are being set up with support from the Department of Science & Technology, Govt. of India.
- Carbon Capture and Utilization (CCU) is among one such key pathways to reduce emissions while continuing to develop sustainably at an unprecedented pace. CCU aligns with five of the seventeen sustainable development goals (SDGs), namely, climate action; clean energy, industry, innovation, and infrastructure; responsible consumption and production; and partnerships to achieve the goals.

India's newest mammal: White Cheeked Macaque



• Scientists from the Zoological Survey of India (ZSI) have found a new mammal species in the country — the White Cheeked Macaque.







- Macaque was first discovered in China in 2015, its existence was not known in India before this.
- It is only now that Indian scientists have discovered its presence in the remote Anjaw district in central Arunachal Pradesh.
- The White Cheeked Macaque has distinct white cheeks, long and thick hair on the neck and a longer tail than other Macaque species.
- It is the last mammal to have been discovered in Southeast Asia.

Giant Magnellan Telescope



Why in News

- The location of the telescope is Las Campanas Observatory, which is also the site of the Magellan Telescopes, some 115 km (71 mi) north-northeast of La Serena, Chile and 180 km (112 mi) south of Copiapó, Chile, at an altitude of 2,516 m (8,255 ft).
- It will consist of seven 8.4 m (27.6 ft) diameter primary segments, that will observe optical and near infrared (320–25000 nm) light, with the resolving power of a 24.5 m (80.4 ft) primary mirror and collecting area equivalent to a 22.0 m (72.2 ft) one, which is about 368 square meters.
- The telescope is expected to have a resolving power 10 times greater than the Hubble Space Telescope. As of November 2017, five mirrors had been cast and the construction of the summit facility has begun.
- A total of seven primary mirrors are planned, but it will begin operation with four. The US\$1 billion project is US-led in partnership with Australia, Brazil, and South Korea, with Chile as the host country.

Chandrayaan-3









- Recently, Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) Science & Technology Dr Jitendra Singh said in the Lok Sabha that **Chandrayaan-3** is scheduled for launch in August 2022.
- The Chandrayaan 3 mission is the third planned lunar exploration mission by the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO). It follows ISRO's Chandrayaan 2 mission, which successfully deployed its orbiter around the Moon but failed to soft-land its lander.
- Similar to Chandrayaan 2 mission, Chandrayaan-3 will also include a modified lander and rover. The mission will not include an orbiter, due to the success of the Chandrayaan 2 orbiter. It will use the Chandrayaan 2 orbiter to communicate with the earth.

Reintroduction of Cheetah



Why in news







- Recently, an expert team of wildlife officials from Madhya Pradesh, the Indian Forestry department and the Wildlife Institute of India visited Namibia for a site visit for the transfer of Cheetah.
- It has been done under the action plan' launched at the 19th meeting of the National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA).

Provision of Action Plan

- The action plan states that a cohort of around 10-12 young cheetahs that are ideal for reintroduction would be imported from Namibia or South Africa as a founder stock during the first year.
- The animals' lineage and genetic history will be examined to ensure that they are not from an excessively inbred stock and are in the ideal age group so that they make up a suitable founding population.

Steps Taken for Conservation:


- India has signed non-legally binding Memorandums of Understanding (MoU) with Conservation of Migratory Species of Wild Animals (CMS) on the conservation and management of Siberian Cranes (1998), Marine Turtles (2007), Dugongs (2008) and Raptors (2016).
- The Environment Ministry also constituted a 'Task Force for Conservation of Dugongs' to look into issues related to conservation of dugongs and implementation of the 'UNEP/CMS Dugong MoU' in India.
- It also facilitates India to act as the leading nation in the South Asia Sub-region with respect to dugong conservation.

The team was on an expedition surveying amphibian reptile in the forest areas of Attappady.

Key Points

- The new species, named Hemidactylus easai after former director of the Kerala Forest and Reasearch Institute (KFRI) and wildlife conservationist PS Easa, was found in the drier parts of the region.
- The gecko measures 105 mm from snout to vent (10.5 cm) and is a light brown to grey in colour. The genus Hemidactylus goldfuss has 180 species of geckos distributed across the globe and India has 48. Kerala has over 30 species of gecko and with this new addition, there are nine under the Hemidactylus genus.

Two more Ramsar sites announced in India on World Wetlands Day



- Two new Ramsar sites **Khijadiya wildlife sanctuary in Gujarat and Bakhira wildlife sanctuary in Uttar Pradesh** were announced on the occasion of World Wetlands Day.
- India now has a network of 49 Ramsar sites covering an area of 10,93,636 hectares, the highest in South Asia.
- Ramsar sites are wetlands of international importance as per UNESCO's 1971 Convention on Wetlands held in Ramsar, Iran.

Bakhira Wildlife Sanctuary, Uttar Pradesh:

- The Bakhira Wildlife Sanctuary is the largest natural flood plain wetland in the district of Sant Kabir Nagar, Uttar Pradesh. Established in the year 1980, the sanctuary's lake is important for the migratory birds who fly down here in the winter season.
- Migratory birds from Tibet, China, Europe, and Siberia visit the place between November to January. Birds like Indian purple moorhen in addition to more than 30 fish species can be found here.

Khijadia Wildlife Sanctuary, Gujarat:

• Located 12 km away from Jamnagar District headquarters, Khijadia Wildlife Sanctuary is a freshwater wetland, heaven for birds. It supports marine and freshwater birds, has marshy lands, mangroves, prosopis areas, mudflats, salt pans, creeks, forest scrub, sandy beaches, and farmlands bordering the area. The sanctuary is home to 309 species of birds- resident and migratory birds.







• Endangered bird species such as Dalmatian Pelican, Asian Open Bill Stork, Black-Necked Stork, Darter, Black-headed Ibis, Eurasian spoonbill, and Indian Skimmer can be spotted here.

New genus of parasitic flowering plant discovered from Nicobar Islands



- A new genus of a parasitic flowering plant has recently been discovered from the Nicobar group of islands.
- The genus Septemeranthus grows on the plant species Horsfieldia glabra (Blume) Warb.
- The genus belongs to the family Loranthaceae, a hemi-parasite under the sandalwood order Santalales and is of widespread importance.
- The parasitic flowering plants have a modified root structure spread on the stem of the tree and are anchored inside the bark of the host tree.
- The plant was found on the periphery of the tropical forest in one of the biodiversity hotspots referred to as the Nicobar group of islands separated from the Andaman group of Islands by a wide gap of 160 km with heavy tidal flows.
- **Parasitic Plant:** The plant that obtains all or part of its nutrition from another plant (the host) without contributing to the benefit of the host and, in some cases, causing extreme damage to the host.

SWAMITVA Yojana

What is SWAMITVA Yojana?

• SVAMITVA (Survey of Villages and Mapping with Improvised Technology in Village Areas) was launched by Prime Minister on April 24, 2020, as a Central Sector Scheme to promote a socio-economically empowered and self-reliant rural India.

Objective of the scheme:

- Creation of accurate land records for rural planning and reduce property related disputes.
- To bring financial stability to the citizens in rural India by enabling them to use their property as a financial asset for taking loans and other financial benefits.
- Determination of property tax, which would accrue to the GPs directly in States where it is devolved or else, add to the State exchequer.
- Creation of survey infrastructure and GIS maps that can be leveraged by any department for their use.
- To support in preparation of better-quality Gram Panchayat Development Plan (GPDP) by making use of GIS maps

What all aspects are covered in the scheme?

The scheme covers multifarious aspects:

- facilitating monetization of properties and enabling bank loan
- reducing property related disputes
- comprehensive village level planning

Implementing authority:

• The Scheme is implemented with the collaborative efforts of the Ministry of Panchayati Raj, State Revenue Department, State Panchayati Raj Department and Survey of India.

How will help revolutionise rural India?

- Scheme is a reformative step towards establishment of clear ownership of property in rural inhabited (Abadi) areas, by mapping of land parcels using drone technology and providing 'Record of Rights' to village household owners with issuance of legal ownership cards (Property cards/Title deeds) to the property owners.
- The scheme is the stepping-stone towards achieving Gram Swaraj in true sense and making rural India Atmanirbhar.

Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samman Nidhi (PM-KISAN) Scheme









Context: Third anniversary of the launch of Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samman Nidhi (PM-KISAN) Scheme is observed across India.

Key Takeaways

- The scheme was launched on 24th of February in 2019.
- It is aimed to provide income support to all landholding farmer's families across the country and enable them to meet expenses related to agriculture as well as domestic needs.
- Under the Scheme, an amount of six thousand rupees per year is transferred in three equal installments of two thousand rupees directly into the bank accounts of the farmers subject to certain exclusion criteria relating to higher-income status.
- The Scheme initially provided income support to all Small and Marginal Farmers' families having cultivable land up to two hectares, but later it was expanded to cover all farmer families irrespective of the size of their landholdings.

So far, over 1.80 lakh crore rupees have been transferred directly into the bank accounts of the farmer families under PM -KISAN Scheme.

Capacity Development Scheme









- The Cabinet has approved the continuation of the **Capacity Development (CD) Scheme** till 31.03.2026 or till further review, whichever is earlier, subject to the adherence to Expenditure Finance Committee (EFC) recommendations and the financial ceilings etc.
- The outlay approved for the continuation of the Scheme during 15th Finance Commission cycle is ₹3179 crore.

Key Points

- The CD Scheme is an Ongoing Central Sector Scheme of the **Ministry of Statistics** and **Programme Implementation (MOSPI)** with an overall objective to augment infrastructural, technical as well as manpower resources for enabling availability of credible and timely official statistics.
- The Scheme comprises Capacity Development (Main) Scheme and two sub schemes viz. Support for Statistical Strengthening (SSS) and Economic Census (EC).

- The estimated total outlay of "New India Literacy Programme" is Rs.1037.90 crore which includes Central share of Rs.700 crore and State share of Rs.337.90 crore respectively for the FYs 2022 -27.

Why in News

• On February 4, 1922, the volunteers of the Non – Cooperation movement proceeded to a local police station. They held a procession. The police fired at the procession. In retaliation, the volunteers set the police station on fire. Some policemen tried to escape the fire. They were caught and beaten to death. This is referred to as the Chauri Chaura incident

Key Points







• Mahatma Gandhiji launched the non – cooperation movement on August 1, 1920. The movement boycotted foreign goods. It mainly included machine made clothes. Also, the people refused to assist rulers who misrule the country. Education and administrative institutions were boycotted.

Note:

- Around 172 people were sentenced to death by the Britishers. But in all 19 were hanged. Mahatma Gandhiji condemned the killing of the policemen. Chauri Chaura support fund was created. Gandhiji stopped the non cooperation movement.
- Gandhiji went on a fast for five days after the incident. He held himself responsible for the incident. He withdrew the non cooperation movement on February 12, 1922.
- PM Modi launched Chauri Chaura centenary celebrations. A postal stamp commemorating the incident was launched. The Uttar Pradesh government is to renovate the Chauri Chaura Shaheed memorial into a heritage tourist spot.





- India scored 6.91 to rank 46th on the Index.









About Coastal Vulnerability Index (CVI):

- The maps determine the coastal risks due to future sea-level rise based on the physical and geological parameters for the Indian coast, the CVI uses the relative risk that physical changes will occur as sea-level rises are quantified based on parameters like: tidal range; wave height; coastal slope; coastal elevation; shoreline change rate; geomorphology; and historical rate of relative sea-level change.
- Coastal vulnerability assessments can be useful information for coastal disaster management and building resilient coastal communities.





extensive list of Hindi films; she also sang in several regional languages including Marathi and Bengali.


Lata Mangeshkar, who belonged to a prominent musical family, also composed music as well as produced a handful of films. She was popularly known as the 'Nightingale of India.'

- An idol of Lord Hanuman, which was stolen a decade ago from Tamil Nadu's Ariyalur district and smuggled abroad scheduled to brought soon.
- Built between the 14th and 15th centuries, during the period of the Vijayanagara empire, the statue was recently found in possession of a private buyer in Australia.
- As per the Archaeological Survey of India, this Anjaneyar (Hanuman) idol was burgled along with Sri Devi idol and Boodevi idol from the Varadharaja Perumal temple in Vellur village, Ariyalur, on April 9, 2012.
- It will be restored to the temple from where it was stolen.

About Vijayanagara Empire

- The Vijayanagara Empire, also called Karnata Kingdom,[3] was based in the Deccan Plateau region in South India.
- It was established in 1336 by the brothers Harihara I and Bukka Raya I of the Sangama dynasty, members of a pastoralist cowherd community, possibly Kuruba, that claimed Yadava lineage.
- The empire rose to prominence as a culmination of attempts by the southern powers to ward off Islamic invasions by the end of the 13th century.
- At its peak, it subjugated almost all of South India's ruling families and pushed the sultans of the Deccan beyond the Tungabhadra-Krishna river doab region, in addition to annexing modern day Odisha (ancient Kalinga) from the Gajapati Kingdom thus becoming a notable power.

Aroma Mission, also popularly referred as "Lavender or Purple Revolution"


• It has started from J&K and transformed the lives of farmers who are able to grow lavender, make lucrative profit and improve their lives.
