

###ANSWERS###

1. Ans. B.

The sentence is grammatically incorrect and error lies in option B. Here, 'powders' should be replaced with 'powder'. Meaning of some noun changes with their singular and plural form. Powder means dust but powders (i.e. in plural form) means doses of medicine. Thus, replace 'powders' with 'powder'.

2. Ans. C.

The sentence is grammatically incorrect and error lies in option C. Here, either......or (i.e. one or another) should be used. It is used in affirmative sentences to offer a choice between two possibilities, or to express a cause-effect relationship. Thus, replace 'and' with 'or'.

3. Ans. B.

The sentence is grammatically incorrect and error lies in option B. After or with superlative degree, we use pronoun 'that' only. Thus, replace pronoun 'which' with 'that'.

4. Ans. C.

The sentence is grammatically incorrect and error lies in option C. The tense of the tag is determined by the tense of the auxiliary/modal verb of the statement that precedes it. And here sentence is in present tense. Also, if the statement is negative, the tag must be positive and if the statement is positive the tag must be negative. Thus, 'doesn't there' should be replaced with 'isn't there' as question tag should be made in accordance to the verb or auxiliary verb used in sentence.

5. Ans. B.

Option "B" is the correct use. Use "as" in place of "that". A few conjunctions are followed by their subordinate parts. See the explanations below

E.g. Not only.....but also





Either....or

Neither Nor

Whether....or etc.

E.g. They will either dance or sing for us.

He has neither danced nor sung.

6. Ans. C.

Option "C" is the correct answer. Use "like" in place of "as". "As" is a conjunction and "like" is a preposition. Conjunction is used to connect two sentences. Preposition is used before a noun or pronoun to show relation between them.

Eg. I have many articles like books, laptop, cellphone and printer etc.

As Mohan works hard, he will achieve everything.

7. Ans. B.

Option "B" is the correct answer. Use "seldom or never/ seldom if ever" in place of "seldom or ever". Seldom is a negative word and ever is a positive word which in not a right construction. To make construction negative both conjunctions should be negatives. Some conjunctions go in pairs. Hence, use "never in place or ever". See the examples below.

Eg. He seldom or never visited this temple.

8. Ans. D.

The given sentence is correct.

9. Ans. C.

Option "C" is the correct answer. Use "than" in place of "when". Always use "than" after "no sooner". Always use "when/ before" after "hardly / scarcely". See the rules and examples below.



E.g. Hardly + had + subject + VIIIrd + object, when/ before + subject + V IInd.

No sooner + had + subject + VIIIrd + object, than + subject + V IInd.

E.g. No sooner had I started to play than it started raining.

E.g. Hardly had the police reached the bank, when the robbers ran away.

10. Ans. C.

It can be inferred from the line where the writer mentions, "You are a passive observer and it is all moving by you boringly in a frame."

11. Ans. C.

The correct answer is option C 'Seeing the scenery through the window frame'

12. Ans. A.

Writer states that while travelling on a motorbike he is in the scene; therefore, he is talking about his own presence, his own self as part of the scene.

13. Ans. A.

Very strong, overwhelming means overpowering, very strong is the only option that is most similar.

14. Ans. D.

The whole passage is about the Ethiopian capital 'Addis Ababa' which is the large nodal centre located in centre of Ethiopia. Therefore, option D is the correct answer.

15. Ans. C.

It can be referred from the line" The name of Ethiopian capital Addis Ababa, as the name indicates (Addis- New, Ababa- Flower)". This option C is the correct answer.

16. Ans. D.





Refer to the last line of the passage "The city has witnessed rapid growth because of its multi-functional nature and being a large nodal centre located in centre of Ethiopia. Option D is the correct answer.

17. Ans. C.

It is clearly interpreted from the introductory part of the passage that the settlement, architecture, and style of buildings and other structures are an outcome of its historical and cultural traditions. Thus, option C is the correct answer.

18. Ans. B.

As it is mentioned in the passage that 'Mercato' has markets which grew with time and is supposed to be the largest market between Cairo and Johannesburg. Thus, option B is the correct answer.

19. Ans. D.

The sentence cannot end with a "we" given in part S as this doesn't make any sense. This eliminates options A and B. The noun "we" will take a verb after it, which is given in part R, i.e. should. This makes SR a pair. The use of relative pronoun "where" in part Q is for the cities. This makes RQ a pair. Hence, option D is the correct answer.

20. Ans. B.

The first part of the sentence ends with a preposition and preposition is always followed by -ing form of verb. Only Q starts with -ing form of verb hence the sequence should start with Q and this case is only possible in option B. Hence option B is correct.

21. Ans. A.

SRQP is the correct logical sequence. Part S introduces the subject Plastic. It is followed by part R which introduces a pledge followed by part Q which describes the outcome of pledge followed by sentence P.

22. Ans. B.

"Would" in P is a modal verb which should be followed by V1. Only R starts with V1, so PR is a pair. It is only present in option B. Hence option B is correct.







23. Ans. A.

The sentence starts with a subject, he (Q) doing an act while praying (P) and the result i.e. (S) followed by (R). Thus, QPSR is the correct sequence.

24. Ans. D.

The sentence starts with the part indicating the focus of the sentence i.e. about the superstar in (R). The continuing part states in what field is Rajinikanth the superstar in (P). This is followed by (Q) which states what he is best known for. Thus, the concluding part would be (S) which tells what is the effect of the long – time fan – following Rajinikanth has enjoyed. Thus, the proper sequence would be RPQS.

25. Ans. C.

The first part should be (P) stating the fact that sweet tastes suppress something. The continuing part should mention what is suppressed by sweet tastes (the feeling of being full), thus (R) will follow, continuing with (Q) mentioning the food rich in what element encourages overeating, which in turn is followed with (S) as it adds another effect of eating the food rich in fructose. Thus, the proper sequence would be PRQS.

26. Ans. D.

The segments are already in their correct positions. Hence, **option D** is the correct answer.

27. Ans. B.

It can easily be inferred that Part P or S cannot begin the sentence. Part R can be followed by either part P or S, but we can see that part P ends with 'as' and due to this part P-Q forms a pair. Therefore 'RPQS' will be the correct order.
