

TOP STORY

1. AFSPA partially withdrawn from Northeast

The Centre significantly reduced the footprint of the **Armed Forces Special Powers Act (AFSPA), 1958** in the Northeast, withdrawing it entirely from **23 districts in Assam**; and partially from **seven districts in Nagaland, six districts in Manipur, and one district in Assam**.

Once the decision is notified in the gazette, AFSPA remains in force in parts of these three states as well as in parts of Arunachal Pradesh and Jammu & Kashmir.



What is AFSPA?

- It gives powers to the army, state, and central police forces to shoot to kill, search houses and destroy any property that is "likely" to be used by insurgents in areas declared as "disturbed" by the home ministry.
- AFSPA is invoked when a case of militancy or insurgency takes place, and the territorial integrity of India is at risk.
- Security forces can "arrest a person without a warrant", who has committed or is even "about to commit a cognizable offence" even based on "reasonable suspicion".
- It also provides **security forces with legal immunity** for their actions in disturbed areas.
- While the armed forces and the government justify its need to combat militancy and insurgency, critics have pointed out cases of possible human rights violations linked to the act.

Key Provisions of the AFSPA Act



The salient features of the AFSPA act are:

- The Governor of a State and the Central Government are empowered to declare any part or full of any state as a disturbed area if according to their opinion that it has become necessary to disrupt the terrorist activity or any such activity that might impinge on the sovereignty of India or cause insult to the national flag, anthem, or India's Constitution.
- Section (3) of AFSPA provides that, if the governor of a state issues an official notification in The Gazette of India then the Central government has the authority to deploy armed forces for assisting the civilian authorities. Once a region is declared 'disturbed' then it must maintain the status quo for a minimum of three months, as per The Disturbed Areas Act of 1976.
- Section (4) of AFSPA gives special powers to army officers in disturbed areas to shoot (even if it kills) any individual who violates the law / or is suspected to violate the law (this includes assembly of five or more people, carrying of weapons) etc. The only condition is that the officer must give a warning before opening fire.

 WHAT IS ARMED FORCES SPECIAL POWERS ACT?
- Security forces can arrest anybody even without a warrant and carry out searches without consent.
- Once a person is taken into custody, he/she must be handed over to the nearest police station as soon as possible.

Criticism of AFSPA

- Violates Human Rights: The act fails to protect and uphold human rights; this can be witnessed in the case of alleged custodial rape and killings of the Thangjam Manorama by the Assam rifles in 2004. The act reinforces a militarized approach to security which has proved to be not only inefficient but, also counterproductive in tackling security challenges.
- Misuse of Absolute Power: The absolute authority vested in the armed forces to shoot on sight based on mere suspicion and for an offence as basic as violating an order. The power to shoot on sight violates the fundamental right to life, making the soldier on the ground the judge of the value of different lives and people the mere subjects of an officer's discretion.
- Violates Fundamental Rights: The power of arbitrary arrest and detention given to the armed forces goes against the fundamental right vested in Article 22, which provides safeguards for preventive and punitive detentions. The Supreme Court has clearly stated that the person arrested has to be submitted to the court within 24hrs of the FIR.
- Immunity against any Punitive Action: The
 greatest outrage against AFSPA is due to the
 immunity given to the armed forces. No
 prosecution, suit or another legal proceeding
 shall be instituted except with the previous
 sanction of the central government. This
 immunity which protects guards and
 facilitates the armed forces to take
 unwarranted decisions at times is clearly
 questionable.

2. Designating Russia as a 'State Sponsor of Terrorism'

- Ukraine's President Volodymyr Zelenskyy has asked President Joe Biden to designate Russia as a
 "state sponsor of terrorism", which would activate perhaps the harshest suite of sanctions available
 with the United States against the government of President Vladimir Putin.
- Biden did not commit to any specific actions but told Zelenskyy that he was "willing to explore a range
 of proposals to exert greater pressure on Moscow".

Terrorist designation



The US Secretary of State (the minister primarily in charge of foreign relations) has the power to designate countries that "have repeatedly provided support for acts of international terrorism" as "State Sponsors of Terrorism".

The US can place four categories of sanctions on countries that are on this list:

- 1. Restrictions on US foreign assistance
- 2. A ban on defence exports and sales
- 3. Certain controls over exports of dual use items
- 4. Miscellaneous financial and other restrictions

Sanctions can also be placed on countries and persons that engage in certain trade with designated countries.

Countries on the List:

As of now, there are four countries on the list of state sponsors of terrorism.

- 1. Syria (Designated on 29th December 1979)
- 2. Iran (Designated on 19th January 1984),
- 3. North Korea (Designated on 20th November 2017).
- 4. Cuba was re-designated as a state sponsor of terrorism on 12th January 2021

Statutes authorising designation

There are currently three statutes that authorise the Secretary of State to designate a foreign government for repeatedly providing support for acts of international terrorism:

- (i) Section 620A of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, which prohibits the transfer of most aid;
- (ii) Section 40 of the Arms Export Control Act (AECA), which prohibits exports, credits, guarantees, other financial assistance, and export licensing overseen by the State Department; and
- (iii) Section 1754(c) of the Export Controls Act of 2018.

India's Stand on Russia - Ukraine Conflict

- **India's position** on the ongoing conflict in Ukraine has been **steadfast and consistent**.
- Unlike many other leading powers, India has not yet criticised Russia for its invasion of Ukraine and it abstained from the votes at the UN platforms in condemning the Russian aggression.
- India has been pressing for the resolution of the crisis through diplomacy and dialogue.
- India abstained on a US-sponsored United Nations Security Council (UNSC) resolution that deplores in the strongest terms Russia's aggression against Ukraine.



- India again abstained from voting at the UNSC on the Russia drafted resolution on the Humanitarian situation in Ukraine.
- India abstained on a vote at the UN Human Rights Council in Geneva.
- India, China and 33 other nations recently abstained from a United Nations General Assembly resolution that censured Russia for its military actions in Ukraine.
- India also abstained from the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) resolution that was related to safety at four nuclear power stations.

1. President Kovind embarks on 2-nation tour

- President Ram Nath Kovind embarked on a two-nation tour to Turkmenistan and the Netherlands.
- During the first leg of the tour, the President is visiting Turkmenistan.
- This will be the first-ever visit of an **Indian President** to Turkmenistan.
- This visit is significant as it is taking place as India marks 30 years of diplomatic relations with Turkmenistan.
- Minister of State in the Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying, and Ministry of Information and Broadcasting Dr. L. Murugan along with Member of Parliament Dilip Ghosh are also accompanying the President on this tour.
- On the second leg, President Kovind will be on a four-day visit to the **Netherlands**.
- Capital of Turkmenistan: Ashgabat

2. Tata Power Renewable commissions 300MW solar plant in Gujarat



- Tata Power Renewables Energy Ltd (TPREL) has commissioned a 300 MW project in Dholera, Gujarat; it is India's largest single-axis solar tracker system.
- The project will **generate 774 million units annually** and **reduce** approximately **704340 MT/year of carbon emission**.
- 1320 Acre area has been used for the installation.
- The renewables capacity in operation for Tata Power is 3,400 MW -

Solar: 2,468 MW and Wind: 932 MW.

3. Bhupender Yadav launched the environment mascot Prakriti

4. India's first Regional Rapid Transit System to be handed over to NCRTC



- India's first semi-high-speed train set for **Regional Rapid Transit System** (RRTS) has been handed over to **National Capital Region Transport** Corporation (NCRTC) at Alstom's Savli plan in Gujarat.
- RRTS train sets are being manufactured under *Make In India* initiative and are capable of running at speed of **180 km per hour.**
- It will be brought to **Duhai Depot in Uttar Pradesh**.
- Implementing agency of India's first RRTS corridor between Delhi-

Ghaziabad-Meerut: NCRTC.

About Regional Rapid Transit System (RRTS)

- RRTS will reduce CO₂ emissions by taking around 1.5 lakh private vehicles off the road.
- Planning Commission formed a Task Force in 2005 to develop a multi modal transit system for Delhi National Capital Region (NCR).
- Task Force identified 8 corridors and prioritised three corridors namely Delhi-Meerut, Delhi-Panipat and Delhi- Alwar.
- RRTS is different from conventional Railway as it will provide reliable, high frequency, point to point regional travel at high speed along dedicated pathway

5. Kangra Tea is likely to get European Union GI Tag

- Kangra Tea is likely to win the European Union Geographical Indication Tag (GI Tag); this tag helps Kangra tea to get an opportunity to enter the European market.
- Kangra tea received the Indian GI tag in 2005.
- Since 1999, the cultivation and development of tea have improved constantly in the **Kangra region of Himachal Pradesh.**
- Other GI tags of Himachal Pradesh: *Chamba Chappal, Chamba Rumal, Kinnauri Shawl, Kangra paintings, Kullu shawl, Basmati.*

6. Atal Innovation Mission extended till 2023





- The Union Cabinet, headed by **Prime Minister Narendra Modi**, has **approved** the extension of the Atal Innovation Mission (AIM) till March 2023.
- Aim: Develop 10,000 Atal Tinkering Labs (ATLs), 101 Atal Incubation Centres (AICs), set up 50 Atal Community Innovation Centres and sponsor 200 entrepreneurs through the Atal New India Challenges
- More than *Rs 2000 crore* will be incurred as the total budgetary expenditure.
- AIM was set up under the NITI Aayog.

7. The 20th NTCA meeting chaired by the Union Minister Bhupender Yadav

- Union Minister for Environment, Forest & Climate Change Bhupender Yadav has chaired the 20th NTCA which was held was held in Pakke tiger reserve in Arunachal Pradesh.
- This is the first-ever NTCA meeting that was held outside of the National Capital.
- In March 2021, the **Air Gun Surrender Abhiyaan** was started in **Arunachal Pradesh**.









• The NTCA has prepared the Forest Fire Audit Protocol for Tiger Reserves, which was released by Bhupender Yadav.

About National Tiger Conservation Authority:

- Statutory body under the Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change.
- Established in 2005
- Constituted under enabling provisions of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972.
- For strengthening tiger conservation
- Project Tiger is a centrally sponsored scheme of the Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change.
- India now has as many as 2,967 tigers in the wild, according to the latest tiger estimation report for 2018. Population of tigers have increased by 33% since the last census in 2014.
- More than half of the tiger are in Madhya Pradesh and Karnataka.

8. Made in India First flight takes off from Dibrugarh in Assam to Pasighat



- First-ever flight of Made in India 17-seater HAL Dornier Do-228 flagged off from Dibrugarh in Assam to Pasighat in Arunachal Pradesh.
- The Centre-run Alliance Air had signed an agreement with the Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) to lease two 17-seater Dornier 228 aircraft.
- This will be the nation's **first commercial airline** to operate an Indianmade aircraft for civil operations.
- The Make in India initiative was launched in 2014 by Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

About Make in India:

- Launched by Prime Minister Narendra Modi of India on September 25, 2014.
- To attract foreign investment for new industrialisation
- It aims to increase in manufacturing sector growth to 12-14% per annum
- Aims to increase the share of manufacturing sector in the country's Gross Domestic Product from 16% to 25% by 2022.
- Aims to create 100 million additional jobs by 2022.
- Dynamically promote export-led growth.

9. Anurag Thakur inaugurates 40th 'Hunar Haat'

- Anurag Thakur (Union Minister for Information & Broadcasting and Youth Affairs & Sports) has inaugurated the 40th edition of the 'Hunar Haat' in the presence of Union Minority Affairs Minister Mukhtar Abbas Naqvi.
- The 40th 'Hunar Haat' is a feasible platform to promote 'Swadeshi' products in Mumbai from 16th to 27th April 2022.
- Aatmanirbhar Bharat is being strengthened by initiatives like Hunar Haat.
- In this 40th edition of Hunar Haat, more than a thousand craftsmen and artisans coming from **31 states** have put up **400 stalls**.
- 'Tejas' a skilling programme which has been launched by Govt. of India.
- Under this initiative India will send skilled manpower to UAE. Within a year, 30,000 skilled jobseekers will be sent to UAE.





10. PM Modi's 3-day visit to Gujarat



- PM Modi has begun his three-day visit to Gujarat.
- Prime Minister visited the Command-and-Control Centre for Schools in Gandhinagar. This state-of-the-Art Centre has been named as Vidhya Samiksha Kendra.
- According to official sources, this Centre collects over five hundred crore data sets annually and analyses those meaningfully using big data

analytics, artificial intelligence, and machine learning. This will help to enhance overall learning outcomes for students in the state. The Centre also helps in tracking daily online attendance of teachers and students and undertakes centralised summative and periodic assessments of learning outcomes of students.

- He also laid the WHO Global Centre for Traditional Medicine in Jamnagar in the presence of Mauritius PM Pravind Kumar Jugnauth and DG of WHO Dr. Tedros Ghebreyesus.
- He dedicated the Banas Community Radio Station, to provide farmers key scientific information related to agriculture and animal husbandry.

11. Radio channel for the visually impaired 'Radio Aksh' launched in Nagpur

- India's first-ever radio channel for the visually impaired named 'Radio Aksh' was launched in Nagpur, Maharashtra.
- The Blind Relief Association Nagpur and Samdrushti Kshamata Vikas Avam Anusandhan Mandal jointly launched the pioneers of the concept.



- This initiative will help the visually impaired to gain seamless access to audiobooks and education resources.
- In the initial phase, the Radio Aksh has six hours of content that would be put on repeat mode four times a day.

12. Sugar export jumps 65% in last FY corresponding to the previous year



- Sugar export in India has witnessed an impressive growth of 291% from USD 1,177 million in the financial year 2013-14 to USD 4,600 million in the last financial year.
- The sugar export has **jumped 65% in 2021-22** corresponding to the previous year.
- The growth was achieved despite the logistical challenges posed by COVID-19 pandemic.
- The country had exported sugar worth 1,965 million US dollars in 2019-20, which increased to 2,790 million US dollars in 2020-21.
- Uttar Pradesh, Maharashtra and Karnataka account for nearly 80 percent of the total sugar production in the country.
- The other major sugarcane-producing states are Andhra Pradesh, Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, Odisha, Tamil Nadu, Bihar, Haryana, and Punjab.
- Notably, India is the world's second-largest sugar producer after Brazil.

13. BRO to build world's highest tunnel at Shinku La Pass

- The Border Roads Organisation (BRO) will build the world's highest tunnel at Shinku La Pass at 16,580 feet to connect Himachal Pradesh to Ladakh.
- The construction will begin by July this year and be completed by 2025.
- The Centre has already made 'Project Yojak' of BRO to execute this ambitious project.
- Presently, one must travel 101 km from Manali to Darcha and thereafter, take a turn towards Shinku La Pass and enter Zanskar valley.

14. India's first pure green hydrogen plant commissioned in Jorhat



- Oil India Limited (OIL) has set up India's first 99.999% pure Green Hydrogen with an installed capacity of 10 kg per day at Jorhat Pump Station in Assam.
- The plant produces Green Hydrogen from the electricity generated by the existing 500kW Solar plant using a 100 kW Anion **Exchange Membrane (AEM) Electrolyser array**. The AEM technology is being used for the first time in India.
- The production of plant will increase from 10 kg per day to 30 kg per day in the future.
- The use of AEM technology is being used for the first time in India.
- The company has initiated a detailed study in collaboration with IIT Guwahati on blending of Green Hydrogen with Natural Gas and its effect on the existing infrastructure of OIL. The company also plans to study use cases for commercial applications of the blended fuel.

15. Palli becomes India's first carbon-neutral panchayat

- Palli village in Samba district of Jammu has become the nation's first panchayat to become carbon neutral, fully powered by solar energy.
- This project (500 KW solar plant) with the help of villagers was completed in a record time of three weeks.
- 1,500 solar panels were placed in a total area of 6,408 sq mt to provide clean electricity to 340 houses in the model panchayat under the central government's 'Gram Urja Swaraj' programme.
- J&K Governor: Manoj Sinha

Rashtriya Gram Swaraj Abhiyan

- Initiated by Ministry of Panchayati Raj for the period from 1st April 2022 to 31st March 2026.
- To develop governance capabilities of Panchayati Raj Institutions
- RGSA will comprise Central and State components in the ratio of 60:40 among Centre and States respectively









- Focus majorly on: -
 - Poverty free and enhanced livelihood in villages
 - Healthy Village
 - o Child Friendly Village
 - Water Sufficient Village
 - Clean and Green Village

- Self-Sufficient Infrastructure in Village

16. PM Modi inaugurates 7th edition of Raisina Dialogue



- PM Modi has inaugurated the 7th edition of the Raisina Dialogue in New Delhi.
- Chief Guest: Ursula Von Der Leyen (President of the European Commission)
- Several former PMs of different countries and other officials will also participate in the event.
- Theme Terranova, impassioned, impatient, imperilled
- There are six broad thematic pillars of the Dialogue which include *Rethinking Democracy, End of Multilateralism, Water Caucuses, and Achieving Green Transitions.*

About Raisina Dialogue:

- A multilateral conference committed to address the challenges faced by global community.
- It discusses cooperation on a wide range of pertinent international policy matters.
- It involves heads of state, cabinet ministers and local government officials, as well as major private sector executives, members of the media and academics.
- Hosted by the Observer Research Foundation in collaboration with the Ministry of External Affairs,
 Government of India.

INTERNATIONAL NEWS

1. India-Australia Economic Cooperation and Trade Agreement:

- India and Australia on 2nd April 2022, signed an economic cooperation and trade agreement under which Canberra would provide duty free access in its market for over 95 per cent of Indian goods such as textiles, leather, jewellery, and sports products.
- The ECTA is an interim arrangement and parties will begin negotiations on a full-fledged free trade agreement in the next 75 days and both sides want to deepen the engagement and work towards a Comprehensive Economic Cooperation Agreement (CECA).



- It was inked by Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal and Australian Minister for Trade, Tourism, and Investment Dan Tehan in a virtual ceremony, in the presence of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his Australian counterpart Scott Morrison.
- According to the government estimates the agreement will help in taking bilateral trade from \$27 billion to \$45-50 billion in the next five years.

Note: Australia is the 17th largest trading partner of India, while New Delhi is Canberra's 9th largest partner and Bilateral trade in goods and services stood at \$27.5 billion in 2021.

2. Turkmenistan-Afghanistan-Pakistan-India (TAPI) gas pipeline project:

- President Ram Nath Kovind Visited Turkmenistan and discussed several outstanding issues including strengthening bilateral relations with President of Turkmenistan Seder Berdimuhamedov.
- India has restarted the efforts to revive the much-delayed Turkmenistan-Afghanistan-Pakistan-India (TAPI) pipeline project. The pipeline was also discussed during state visit to Turkmenistan by Indian President Shri Ram Nath Kovind.

About TAPI Pipeline:



- Turkmenistan houses the sixth largest gas reserves in the world with close to 19.5 trillion cubic meters of reserves. Its main importer is China, which imports 35 billion cubic metres annually.
- It has been fourteen years since India, Pakistan and Afghanistan had signed a framework agreement to buy natural gas from Turkmenistan in 2008. However, though some part of the pipeline has been constructed, there has been a delay in construction in Afghanistan due to political instability.
- The 1,814-kilometre partially constructed TAPI pipeline, if and when completed, would transport 33 billion cubic metres of natural gas annually from Galkynysh in Turkmenistan to Fazilka in India.
- Turkmenistan's Foreign Minister Rashid Meredov, on the sidelines of the OIC meet a few days back, had a detailed discussion about TAPI with Pakistan Foreign Minister Shah Mahmood Qureshi.
- The main impediment in the TAPI project is the Asian Development Bank (ADB) pausing the due diligence and processing activities until the Taliban regime is recognised by the UN.





3rd Foreign Ministers' Meeting of the Neighbouring Countries of Afghanistan:

The 3rd Foreign Ministers' Meeting of the Neighbouring Countries of Afghanistan was held Thursday in Tunxi, situated in China's Anhui province.

- Foreign ministers or representatives of China, Iran, Pakistan, Russia, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan and Uzbekistan took part in the conference.
- A joint statement was released at the end of a China-led regional conference on Afghanistan that Turkmenistan will promote the implementation of a stalled gas pipeline that will pass through Afghanistan, Pakistan and culminate in India (TAPI), a move Islamabad has said, in the same declaration, it would support.
- The announcement was part of "The Tunxi Initiative of the Neighbouring Countries of Afghanistan on Supporting Economic Reconstruction in and Practical Cooperation with Afghanistan".
- Four MoUs were also signed during President's Visit:
 - 1. MoU between Financial Monitoring Service at the Ministry of Finance and Economy of Turkmenistan and Financial Intelligence Unit of India.
 - 2. MoU on Cooperation in the field of Disaster Management
 - 3. Programme of Cooperation in the fields of Culture and Arts for the period 2022-2025.
 - 4. MoU between Ministry of Sports and Youth Policy of Turkmenistan and Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports of Government of the Republic of India on Cooperation in Youth Matters.

3. Hungary National Assembly elections:

- Hungary's authoritarian prime minister, Viktor Orban has declared victory in parliamentary elections.
- He is a member of the Fidesz party. He is serving as PM since 2010, and this will be his fourth consecutive term as prime minister.
- He is the country's longest-serving leader since the fall of communism in 1989 and has long been a thorn in the side of the European Union.
- Hungary joined NATO in 1999 and joined the EU in 2004.
- Hungary's Capital: Budapest; Currency: Forint

4. World's biggest electric cruise ship:

- The world's largest electric cruise ship has made its maiden voyage, settling back into port in Yichang in China's central Hubei province after cruising up and down the Yangtze River.
- It is powered by a massive 7,500 kilowatthour marine battery from the world's No. 1 battery manufacturer for electric cars, Contemporary Amperex Technology.
- The ship will go into commercial operations from next month, being used mainly for sightseeing trips. It can travel for around 100 kilometers on a single charge, saving around 530 metric tons of fuel.

5. Russia Suspended from the U.N. Human Rights Council:

- The United Nations General Assembly on 7th April 2022 suspended Russia from the U.N. Human Rights Council over reports of gross and systematic violations and abuses of human rights in Ukraine.
- The resolution titled 'Suspension of the rights of membership of the Russian Federation in the Human Rights Council' was adopted with 93 votes in favor, 24 against and 58 abstentions, including India.
- Russia, China, Cuba, North Korea, Iran, Syria, Vietnam, were among those who voted against.



- Since January this year, India has abstained on procedural votes and draft resolutions in the UN Security Council, the General Assembly and the Human Rights Council that disapproved of Russian aggression against Ukraine.
- Russia's deputy U.N. Ambassador Gennady Kuzmin described the move as an "illegitimate and politically motivated step" and then announced that Russia had decided to quit the Human Rights Council altogether.

Note: Russia has become the second country after Libya to get suspended from human rights body. Libya was suspended in 2011 because of violence against protesters by forces loyal to then-leader Muammar Gaddafi.

About U.N Human Rights Council: (UNHRC)

- The Human Rights Council consists of 47 Member States, elected directly and individually by secret ballot by the majority of the UNGA members. It is a United Nations body whose mission is to promote and protect human rights around the world.
- The Council was created by the United Nations General Assembly on 15 March 2006 by resolution 60/251. It replaced the United Nations Commission on Human Rights (UNCHR, herein CHR).

6. UN Net-Zero Emissions expert group:

- The High-Level Expert Group on the Net-Zero Emissions Commitments of Non-State Entities was constituted on March 31 to bolster action against stemming global warming.
- The 16-member group will be led by Catherine McKenna, former Canadian Minister of Environment and Climate Change.
- Arunabha Ghosh, CEO, of the Delhi-based Council for Energy Environment and Water has been appointed as a member of a high-level group constituted by United Nations Secretary General, Antonio Guterres. Mr. Ghosh is among three Asians serving on the expert group.
- The Group is expected to draw up an action plan and recommend actions to businesses and non-State actors to accelerate the transition to net-zero, or when carbon emitted by human sources is compensated by sucking carbon out of the atmosphere.
- Currently many countries have committed to a year by which they would be net-zero.
- India, for instance, has a 2070 target and the U.S. has committed to a 2050 date.

Note: Dr Ian Fry has been appointed as the world's first expert on climate change and human rights for three years by UN Human Rights Council. He has negotiated on behalf of least developed countries including at the 2015 Paris climate conference where he helped ensure that human rights were part of the final package.

UNHRC has created the new Special Rapporteur for climate change and human rights position in October 2021.

7. Coalition for Disaster Resilient Infrastructure:

- Madagascar has joined the Coalition for Disaster Resilient Infrastructure (CDRI).
- It has become the 30th country to join the partnership. It was launched by Prime Minister Narendra Modi during his speech at the UN Climate Action Summit in September 2019.
- By becoming a member of CDRI, Madagascar will be able to work together with other member countries to promote resilient infrastructure and help in creating a safe, resilient and sustainable future globally.



- It claims to promote the rapid development of resilient infrastructure to respond to the Sustainable Development Goals' imperatives of expanding universal access to basic services, enabling prosperity and decent work.
- As of April 2022, 30 members, consisting of 23 national governments and 7 organizations have joined CDRI. It is the second major coalition launched by India outside of the UN, the first being the International Solar Alliance. Interim HQ: New Delhi

- 1. Maharashtra's capital city Mumbai has announced a detailed plan to zero out carbon emissions by 2050 which puts it two decades ahead of India's national goal and makes it the first city in South Asia to set such a timeline
- 2. As per the IPCC Report, Global emissions can be halved by 2030 with major transitions in the energy sector, including a substantial reduction in fossil fuel use highlighting that mitigation action needs to be taken now to limit global warming to 1.5 degrees Celsius.
- 3. According to an overview report India intends to grow plantations over 4,68,222 sq km, an area larger than the entire state of Rajasthan, by 2027 in 13 major river basins to meet its international commitment to sequester carbon emissions.
- 4. The 193 members of the United Nations General Assembly adopted a resolution on 15 March stating that the bicycle was a tool for combatting climate change. The Resolution was proposed by Turkmenistan.
- 5. Union Environment Minister Bhupender Yadav has launched 'Prakriti', a mascot to spread greater awareness among the masses about the small changes that can be sustainably adopted in our lifestyle for a better environment.
- 6. Prime Minister Narendra Modi had announced India's pledge to phase out single use plastics by 2022. The Environment Ministry has already announced that all single use plastics would be banned from July 1, 2022.
- 7. The United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) in partnership with the Adaptation Innovation Marketplace (AIM) jointly announced the \$2.2 million grant in climate action for 22 local innovators across 19 countries, including India.

8. Australia, UK, US Alliance to Develop Hypersonic Missiles:

- The United States, United Kingdom, and Australia have announced that they will work together via the recently created security alliance known as AUKUS to develop hypersonic missiles.
- U.S. President Joe Biden, British Prime Minister Boris Johnson, and Australian Prime Minister Scott Morrison announced the plan after holding a check-in on the progress of AUKUS, the Indo-Pacific alliance that was launched by the three countries in September.
- The U.S., Russia, and China have all looked to further develop hypersonic missiles a system so fast that it cannot be intercepted by any current missile defense system.





Note: The Joe Biden administration, on September 15, announced a new trilateral security partnership for the Indo-Pacific, between Australia, the U.K., and the U.S. (AUKUS). As part of this, Australia will acquire nuclear-powered submarines with help from the U.K. and the U.S

Recent in News:

- The US successfully tested a hypersonic missile in mid-March. The Hypersonic Air-breathing Weapon Concept (HAWC) was launched from a B-52 bomber off the west coast in the first successful test of the Lockheed Martin version of the system.
- 2. The test came days after Russia says it used its own hypersonic missile Kinzhal or Dagger, ballistic missile during its invasion of Ukraine, claiming it targeted an ammunition warehouse in western Ukraine. According to Russian officials 2.000km (1.240 miles) away and san fly factor than 6.000 km/l

9. India-Nepal Relations:

Nepal Prime Minister Sher Bahadur Deuba arrived in India on 1st April for his three-day visit. It was his first such visit abroad after assuming office in July 2021.

Key highlights of the visit:

- 1. Nepal PM Minister Sher Bahadur Deuba said that he discussed the boundary issue with Prime Minister Narendra Modi and urged him to resolve it through bilateral mechanism. India said the general understanding was to address it responsibly and avoid politicisation.
- 2. Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his Nepalese counterpart Sher Bahadur Deuba virtually inaugurated the **Jaynagar-Kurtha railway service** between India and Nepal. The service will criss-cross from Jayanagar in Bihar to Kurtha in Janakpur, Nepal.
- The railway track of the section is 35 kilometres long and it is the first section of the rail line between the two countries. The section was completed last year at ₹619 crore.
- The Jaynagar-Kurtha section is part of the 68.7km Jayanagar-Bijalpura-Bardibas rail link. The link was built under the Modi government's grant assistance of NPR 8.77 billion.
- The MEA said that as part of India's 'Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav' celebrations, India will inaugurate 75 development projects in Nepal this year.
- Both countries agreed to speed up the Pancheswar hydroelectric project on their border in west Nepal. Both sides finalised four pacts to expand ties in areas such as railways, and energy.
- 1. Nepal joining the International Solar Alliance (105th Member Country)
- 2. MoU on enhancing Technical Cooperation in the Railway Sector
- 3. Agreement on Supply of Petroleum Products between IOC and NOC and
- 4. Agreement for sharing of Technical Expertise between IOC and NOC.
- PM Modi and Deuba also launched India's RuPay card in Nepal. The domestic variant of the RuPay card will now work at 1,400 point-of-sale machines in Nepal, and the move is expected to facilitate bilateral tourist flows. Nepal is the fourth country, after Bhutan, Singapore, and the UAE, where RuPay is live.

Note: Vinay Mohan Kwatra, the ambassador to Nepal, has been appointed the new foreign secretary of India.

- The United States of America (USA) Senate has confirmed Ketanji Brown Jackson as the first black woman in US Supreme Court.
- The US Senate has voted 53 to 47 to confirm her appointment. Jackson is the **third black judge** after Thurgood Marshall and Clarence Thomas, and the sixth woman.
- She is the second-youngest member of the court after Judge Barrett, 50. Kamala Harris is also the first Black woman Vice-President in the USA.

11. Kamala Harris's defence advisor:

- Indian American Navy veteran Shanti Sethi has been appointed as USA Vice President Kamala Harris's Defence Adviser.
- Shanti Sethi is the first Indian American commander of a major US Navy combat ship.
- Shanti Sethi commanded the guided-missile destroyer, USS Decatur, from December 2010 to May 2012.

12. World Health Day 2022:

- It is celebrated each year on 7th April and draws attention to a specific health topic of concern to people all over the world.
- The date of 7 April marks the anniversary of the founding of WHO in 1948.
- Theme: 2022: Our Planet, Our Health
- WHO estimates that more than 13 million deaths around the world each year are due to avoidable
 environmental causes. This includes the climate crisis which is the single biggest health threat facing
 humanity. The climate crisis is also a health crisis.
- World Health Day is one of 11 official global health campaigns marked by WHO, along with:

13. Shehbaz Sharif Elected as New Pakistan Prime Minister:

- Pakistan Opposition leader Shehbaz Sharif, the 70-year-old younger brother of former three-time prime minister Nawaz Sharif has been elected as the new Prime Minister of Pakistan.
- Shehbaz, 70, was the only candidate left in the race after former foreign minister Shah Mahmood Qureshi announced that his Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf party will boycott the voting and staged a walkout.



• Pakistan's Prime Minister Imran Khan was deposed by a no confidence vote in parliament. The no-confidence motion required 172 votes in the 342-seat parliament to pass which was supported by 174 politicians.

Note: No Pakistani prime minister has ever completed a five-year term in office in the country's 75-year history National Assembly of Pakistan: It is the lower legislative house of the bicameral Majlis-e-Shura, which also comprises the Senate of Pakistan (upper house). It is a democratically elected body consisting of a total of 342 members who are referred to as Members of the National Assembly (MNAs).

Out of 342 members, 272 members are directly elected members and 70 reserved seats for women and religious minorities.

14. India-U. S 2+2 Dialogue:

- The fourth '2+2' dialogue between India and the United States was held in Washington DC. India's External Affairs and Defence Ministers, S Jaishankar and Rajnath Singh, met their American counterparts, Secretary of State Anthony Blinken and Secretary of Defense Lloyd Austin.
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi and President Joe Biden met virtually on April 11, ahead of the 2+2 dialogue.
- The Ministers reaffirmed their commitment to a free and open Indo-Pacific in which the sovereignty and territorial integrity of all states are respected, and countries are free from military, economic, and political coercion.
- The United States conveyed its full support to India's upcoming G20 Presidency from December 2022 to November 2023.
- The United States welcomed India's announcement at COP26 to intensify its climate action including its long-term vision to achieve net-zero emissions by 2070. Both sides looked forward to further cooperation to support negotiations on ocean plastic pollution launched by the UN Environment Assembly (UNEA 5.2) in February 2022.
- India welcomed the United States' signing of the Framework Agreement of the International Solar Alliance (ISA).

What is a 2+2 Dialogue?

- The 2+2 dialogue is a format of meeting of the foreign and defence ministers of India and its allies on strategic and security issues. It enables the partners to better understand and appreciate each other's strategic concerns and sensitivities considering political factors on both sides.
- India has 2+2 dialogues with four key strategic partners: the US, Australia, Japan, and Russia. Besides Russia, the other three countries are also India's partners in the Quad.
- The First India-US 2+2 dialogue was held in the year 2018.
- The inaugural 2+2 dialogue with Australia was held in September 2021.
- India held its first 2+2 dialogue with Russia in December 2021.
- The first India-Japan talks in the 2+2 format were held in 2019 in New Delhi.

- The IPCC's assessment reports are the most comprehensive and widely accepted scientific evaluations of the state of the Earth's climate.
- According to the recent most IPCC (6th) report, it is only possible to avoid warming of 1.5 °C or 2 °C if
 massive and immediate cuts in greenhouse gas emissions are made.
- In 2019, Twitter shared plans to achieve 100 percent carbon-neutral power sourcing in their data centers by the end of 2022.

- Since 2000, malaria cases in the Western Pacific Region have been reduced 39% from 2.8 million to 1.7 million cases.
- The six countries of the Greater Mekong subregion, including Cambodia, China (Yunnan Province), Lao People's Democratic Republic, Myanmar, Thailand and Viet Nam continue to make progress in eliminating malaria, reporting a 97% reduction in malaria between 2000 to 2020.
- China has reported zero indigenous malaria cases since 2017 and was certified malaria-free by WHO in 2021.
- ☐ Malaria disease is caused by a plasmodium parasite, transmitted by the bite of infected mosquitoes.
- The severity of malaria varies based on the species of plasmodium. Usually, people get malaria by being bitten by an infective female Anopheles mosquito. Only Anopheles mosquitoes can transmit malaria and they must have been infected through a previous blood meal taken from an infected person.
- India has made remarkable progress in its fight against malaria. 124 districts have reported zero malaria cases.
- The National Framework for Malaria Elimination (NFME) 2016-2030 outlines India's strategy for elimination of the disease by 2030. The framework has been developed with a vision to eliminate malaria from the country and contribute to improved health and quality of life and alleviation of poverty.

20. Russia Withdraws and Suspended from United Nations World Tourism Organisation

- Russia announced on Wednesday (27th April) said that it has decided to withdraw from the United
 Nations World Tourism Organisation ahead of the scheduled vote on their suspension.
- The UNWTO announced in March that it wanted to suspend Russia over its invasion of Ukraine.
- The UNWTO said the vote will go ahead even though Russia has said it is withdrawing from the body to give member states their say.
- The decision must be approved by two-thirds of its **159 member states** at a two-day extraordinary general assembly which got underway in Madrid on Wednesday.

- On the same day Russian Federation was suspended from the World Tourism Organization (UNWTO), losing with immediate effect its rights and privileges as part of the United Nations specialized agency.
- The Assembly voted in favor of suspension, far exceeding the two-third majority required.
- Effective immediately, the Russian Federation will not be able to exercise the rights or enjoy the privileges of UNWTO membership.
- This means it will not be able to receive services from the Organization, including Technical Assistance, nor will the Russian Federation be able to participate in any UNWTO meetings or events, be permitted to put forward any candidates to serve on UNWTO's statutory bodies, or to vote in elections to UNWTO organs or to propose a candidate to serve as Secretary-General.

21. U.N. agrees to scrutinize Security Council Vetos:

- The 193 member states of the United Nations General Assembly have adopted a resolution requiring
 the five permanent members of the council to justify their use of their veto power.
- The resolution was passed on 26th April by consensus.
- It was put forward by Liechtenstein's U.N. ambassador Christian Wenaweser on behalf of 83 cosponsors.
- The resolution goes into effect immediately and will trigger a General Assembly within 10 days of a veto being used, allowing member states to scrutinize its use and for the nation that employed it to explain why.
- The passing of the resolution follows Russia's invasion of Ukraine and its use of its veto power to strike down a Security Council measure condemning its aggression.
- Britain, China, France, Russia and the United States wield the power to veto Security Council resolutions, a power enshrined in the U.N. Charter in accordance with the five nations having played a key role in the governmental body's founding.

22. Russia cuts off natural gas to 2 NATO nations

- Russia's state energy giant Gazprom has cut off natural gas to two North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) countries- Poland and Bulgaria. Both NATO countries are now receiving gas from their EU neighbours.
- The decision was taken because both countries, which are part of the European Union (EU), refused to pay in Rubles (Russian currency).
- In March, Russian President Vladimir Putin had announced that his government will no longer accept payments in currencies other than the Ruble in retaliation for the sanctions imposed by Western countries against Moscow over its offensive on Ukraine.
- The Kremlin warned on 27th April that natural gas will be cut off to other countries as well if they do not agree to the payment agreement.

- Ursula von der Leyen, the President of the European Commission, called Gazprom's decision of gas cuts in Poland and Bulgaria 'blackmail'.
- Western leaders and analysts portrayed the move by Russia as a bid to divide the Western allies and undermine their unity in support of Ukraine.

Note: Recently Baltic countries, comprising Latvia, Lithuania, and Estonia, have said they are no longer importing Russian gas and oil. Lithuania's energy minister Dainius Kreivys said that the country has become the first in the European Union (EU) to break its dependence on Moscow's gas and oil.



- HELINA (Helicopter-based NAG) is a third generation 'fire and forget' class which is developed by the Defence Research & Development Laboratory (DRDL), DRDO.

7. Israel successfully tested new laser missile defense system

- Israel said its world-famous **Iron Dome defense system** has been a great success, with a **90**% interception rate against incoming rocket fire.

8. IAF successfully test-fires BrahMos missile from Su30-MkI fighter jet



- The Indian Air Force(IAF) has successfully conducted a test-fire of the live firing of BrahMos supersonic cruise missile from a Su30- MKI fighter aircraft.

9. Global military expenditure: SIPRI: Key Highlights:

- According to new data on global military spending by the Stockholm International Peace Research Institute (SIPRI) total global military expenditure has increased by 0.7 per cent in real terms in 2021, to reach \$2113 billion.
- The five largest spenders in 2021 were the United States, China, India, the United Kingdom and Russia, together accounting for 62 per cent of expenditure.
- European spending in 2021 accounted for 20% of the global total, and China's defense budget, the world's second largest, is estimated to make up 14%.
- The U.S. remains by far the biggest spender, with \$801 billion allocated to the armed forces in 2021.
- Russia increased its military expenditure by 2.9 per cent in 2021, to \$65.9 billion, at a time when it was building up its forces along the Ukrainian border.
- Ukraine's military spending has risen by 72 per cent since the annexation of Crimea in 2014.

Other notable developments:

- In 2021 Iran's military budget increased for the first time in four years, to \$24.6 billion. Funding for the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps continued to grow in 2021—by 14 per cent compared with 2020—and accounted for 34 per cent of Iran's total military spending.
- Eight European North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) members reached the Alliance's target of spending 2 per cent or more of GDP on their armed forces in 2021. This is one fewer than in 2020 but up from two in 2014.
- Nigeria raised its military spending by 56 per cent in 2021, to reach \$4.5 billion. The rise came in response to numerous security challenges such as violent extremism and separatist insurgencies.
- India's military spending of \$76.6 billion ranked third highest in the world. This was up by 0.9 per cent from 2020 and by 33 per cent from 2012. In a push to strengthen the indigenous arms industry, 64 per cent of capital outlays in the military budget of 2021 were earmarked for acquisitions of domestically produced arms.

 potential in the area of textiles, information technology and pharmaceutical among others.

 the two countries. The agreement encompassing trade in goods and services is a balanced and

 countries.



2. GST collection over Rs 1.42 lakh crore in March 2022



- The gross collection of GST has touched an all-time high of over 1,42,095 cr in March 2022.
- The government has collected CGST is 25,830 crore rupees, SGST is 32,378 crores, IGST is 74,470
- In March 2022, revenues from the import of goods were 25% higher, and the revenues from the domestic transaction were 11% higher than in the same month last year.
- GST day is observed on 1 July every year.
- GST implemented by the **101st Constitution Amendment Act, 2016**

What is Goods and Services Tax (GST)?

- A value-added tax levied on most goods and services sold for domestic consumption.
- GST Bill was first introduced in 2014 as Constitution (122nd Amendment) Bill.
- Got an approval in 2016.
- Renumbered in the statute by Rajya Sabha as Constitution (101st Amendment) Act, 2016.





- According to the Article 246A, States have power to tax goods and services.
- GST Council to be formed by the **President** to administer & govern GST. It's **Chairman is Union Finance Minister of India** with ministers nominated by the state governments as its members.
- It is based on the principle of destination-based consumption taxation
- GST to be levied by the Centre is called Central GST (CGST) and that to be levied by the States is called State GST (SGST).
- GST was levied at four rates viz. 5%, 12%, 16% and 28%.

3. RBI sets the WMA limit for states at Rs 47010 cr

- Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has decided to cut the Ways and Means Advances (WMA) for states and Union Territories to Rs 47,010 crore from Rs 51,560 crore.
- WMA are temporary advances that the RBI gives to the government over any mismatch in receipts and payments.
- The change in the limit is effective **from April 1, 2022,** and is subject to review.
- WMA limit for the Government of India for the first half of the financial year 2022-23 has been set at Rs 1,50,000 crore.

About Ways and Means Advance:

- WMA scheme was introduced in 1997
- To meet disparities in the receipts and payments of the government.
- By this, government can avail **immediate** cash from the RBI.
- Government must return the amount within
 90 days.

- Interest is charged at the existing repo rate.
- If repayment exceeds 90 days, it would be treated as an overdraft. Interest= Reporate+2%.
- Limits for WMA are decided by the government and RBI mutually time to time.

4. ADB estimated India's economy to grow by 7.5% in FY23

- Asian Development Bank (ADB) has forecasted 7% combined growth for South Asian countries in 2022.
- India's economy will grow 7.5% in 2022 and 8% in 2023
- Report: Asian Development Outlook (ADO) 2022
- Factors affecting the economy: Covid new variant, Russia-Ukraine crises (higher global oil and commodity prices).





- Mainly by breathing airborne droplets from the affected individuals.
- It can be contacted at any age.

- Usually takes about 3-5 years for symptoms to appear after contact with Leprosy causing bacteria.
- Leprosy is curable with the combination of drugs known as **Multi-Drug Therapy**.
- National Leprosy Eradication Programme achieved the goal of elimination of leprosy as a public health problem in Dec-2005.
- Now it defined as less than 1 case per 10,000 population at the National Level.
- World Leprosy Day (WLD) is celebrated on the last Sunday of January.
- In 2022, World Leprosy Day is **30 January**.
- 2022 WLD Theme was:- *United for Dignity*


