Corporal punishment is the use of physical force against a child as a 'corrective' form of enforcing discipline. Usually, teachers who are unable to discipline their students take recourse to physical assault.

Under the Indian Constitution, violence against children is violative of right to live with dignity which is integral to right to life under Article 21.

- very counterproductive in the sense that it can sometimes make children hardened and no longer afraid.
- very hurtful and can cause severe injuries to a child.
- strikes severe fear in the hearts and minds of students and can easily make them drop out of school.
- painful and is inhumane or cruel to use whips or canes to lash someone.
- Human rights organizations and advocates all over the world consider corporeal punishment on children to be a form of child abuse.
- using excessively, it has the tendency of making children very hostile to their teachers or parents. This can lead to some children fighting back – especially when the pain gets too much to take.
- scar children or disfigure them for life – both physically and mentally.
- gets severely injured or dies from the beating
