Important News: India

1. CiSS Application

Why in News:

- The National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR) has launched a "CiSS Application" under Bal Swaraj Portal to help in the process of rehabilitation of children in road conditions.



key points:

- This portal has been launched by NCPCR for CISSS, Bal Swaraj, online tracking, and digital real-time monitoring mechanisms of children in need of care and protection.
- Bal Swaraj Portal has two major functions - COVID Care and CiSS
- COVID Care Link serves children who have lost one or both of their parents to COVID-19 or other causes after March 2020.
- CISS application is used to obtain data on children in road conditions from all states and union territories and track their rescue and rehabilitation process.
- The CISSS initiative has been launched under the direction of the Supreme Court of India.

2. Startup for railways

Why in News:

- Indian Railways Innovation Policy - "Startup for Railways" was launched by Shri Ashwini Vaishnav.

key points:

- Startup Policy for Railways aims at leveraging innovative technologies developed by Indian Startups/MSMEs/Innovators/Entrepreneurs to improve the operational efficiency and safety of Indian Railways.

- The Startup Policy for Railways aims to bring scale and efficiency in the areas of operation, maintenance, and infrastructure creation through the participation of the very large and untapped startup ecosystem.
- Around 160 problem statements have been received so far under Startup for Railways. Initially, 11 problem statements have been identified to tackle the problem through the new innovation policy, which has been uploaded on the portal.

3. Prime Minister's National Trainee Fair organized

Why in News:

- The Prime Minister's National Apprenticeship Mela was organized by the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship at more than 200 places across the country.

key points:

- The Prime Minister's National Apprenticeship Fair will be organized every month by the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship to provide more opportunities for on-field training to the youth and increase employment opportunities in the corporate world.
- Under the Prime Minister's National Apprenticeship Fair, more than a thousand companies from more than 36 sectors participated and trainees were selected for imparting training in the company.
- 5th to 12th class pass certificate holders, skill development certificate holders, ITI diploma holders, or graduate degree holders can appear for interviews for available opportunities under Prime Minister National Trainee Mela.
- Under this scheme, candidates will also be given a certificate of apprenticeship recognized by the National Council of Vocational Education and Training on completion of the training period, so that apprentices can be recognized in industries.

4. 38th India-Indonesia Coordinated Patrol Program

Why in News:

- The 38th India-Indonesia Coordinated Patrol Program (IND-INDO CORPAT) between the Indian Naval units of the Andaman and Nicobar Command (ANC) and the Indonesian Navy has been conducted in the Andaman Sea and Straits of Malacca from June 13 to June 24, June 2022.



key points:

- This is the first coordinated patrol between the two countries after the Kovid epidemic.
- Visit of Indonesian Naval units of ANC at Port Blair from 13th June to 15th June 2022 as part of 38th India-Indonesia Coordinated Patrol Program followed by sea phase at Sabang (Indonesia) in the Andaman Sea and IN from 23rd to 24th June 2022. Includes travel units.
- The 38th India-Indonesia Coordinated Patrol Program is aimed at enhancing understanding and inter-operability between the two navies.
- The 38th India-Indonesia Coordinated Patrol Program aims to facilitate measures to prevent and suppress illegal unreported unregulated (IUU) fishing, drug trafficking.

5. 28th Joint Civil-Military Training Program

Why in News:

- The 28th Joint Civil-Military Training Program was inaugurated by Defense Minister Shri Rajnath Singh at Lal Bahadur Shastri National Academy of Administration (LBSNAA) in Mussoorie, Uttarakhand.



key points:

- The Joint Civil-Military Program was launched in 2001 with the aim of promoting a structured interface between civil servants and officers of the armed forces for a joint understanding of national security.
- The objective of the Joint Civil-Military Training Program is to introduce participants to the challenges of managing national security, the emerging external and internal security environment, and the effects of globalization.
- Under the Joint Civil-Military Training Programme, participants are provided with the opportunity to interact and exchange views on the subject, as well as make them aware of the imperatives of civil-military coordination.
- The Joint Civil-Military Training Program aims to further strengthen national security and enhance greater cooperation of the civil administration and the armed forces to meet the challenges of the future.

**key points:**

- The "Har Ghar Dastak Ke Second Phase" campaign aims to focus on increasing the COVID vaccination coverage for school-going children across states and the precautionary dosage for the elderly.
- The objective of the "Har Ghar Dastak Ke Second Charan" campaign is to achieve 100% coverage among the eligible population to ensure extended protection against COVID.

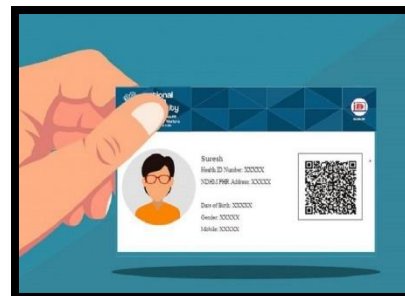

Why in News:

- Under Khelo India Youth Games this year various competitions were organized in Panchkula, Ambala, Chandigarh, Delhi, and Shahbad in Haryana in 25 categories.
- Under Khelo India Youth Games, 8500 players from different states including 528 players from Haryana participated in various games this year.
- In the points table of the Khelo India Youth Games, Haryana stood first with 41 gold, 35 silver, and 42 bronze medals, making a total of 118 medals in this competition, while Maharashtra stood second with 41 gold, 35 silver, and 30 bronze medals. Stay on This year the points table remained
