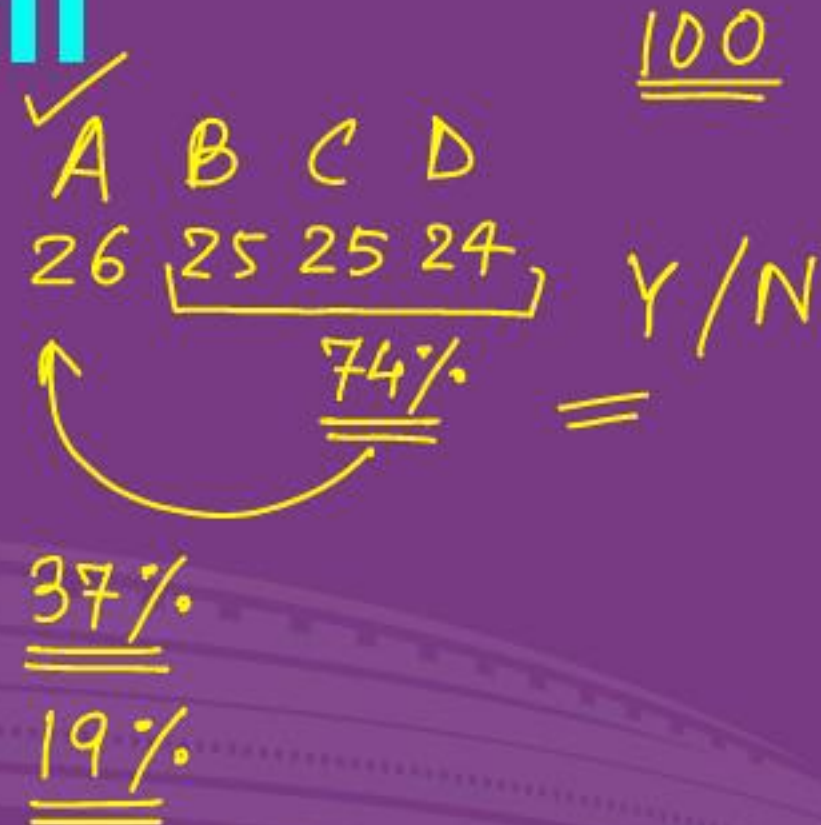

- Ranks 180 countries

*CPI '2021 → released in 2022
(Jan.)*

- Score – 0 to 100 *highly corrupt* *very clean*



Corruption Perception Index

Rankings

- Toppers

- ❖ Denmark = NZ = Finland (88)

- India: 85 (Score = 40)

- Other Countries

- ❖ China: 66; UK: 11; USA: 27

- Worst

- ❖ South Sudan (Score = 12)

Corruption Perception Index

Implications of Corruption

- Violates Article 14
- Can endanger life
- Creates a sense of hopelessness
- Impacts foreign flow of funds
- ✓ Capital flight → 'Brain drain'
- Distorts spending pattern

Corruption Perception Index

Implications

- Reduces revenue
- ✓ Crony capitalism → *illegal nexus*
- Role of money power in elections
- Compromise on national security → defence
- ✓ Rise of extremist ideology 'Maoist'
