International Relations

Sweden and Finland approved by the US Senate to join NATO

Why in News:

• The NATO membership of Sweden and Finland was conclusively approved by the US Senate.

key points:

 The proposal for Finland and Sweden's membership in NATO was supported by US President Joe Biden, who sent the proposal to the Senate for consideration in July.



- The application was submitted by Sweden and Finland to join the Western Defense Alliance in the wake of Russia's invasion of Ukraine.
- Earlier, the French National Assembly had also approved the proposal.
- A country requires the support of all 30 NATO member states to become a member of NATO, with Sweden and Finland currently supported by two-thirds of the member states.
- Earlier, Montenegro and North Macedonia were included in NATO in the year 2017 and in the year 2020, with which the number of its member countries has increased to 30.
- NATO, better known as the North Atlantic Treaty Organization, was established on April 4, 1949, in Washington, USA by the 12 founding members.
- NATO is an intergovernmental military organization headquartered in Brussels, the capital of Belgium.
- NATO works on the principle of collective defense, according to which if one or more members are attacked, then this attack is considered an attack on all member countries.
- The principle of collective defense is enshrined in Article 5 of NATO which was implemented after the terrorist attack on the United States.

- According to World Health Organization data, henipavirus can cause severe disease in animals and humans and is classified as a biosafety level 4 virus.
- Symptoms such as fever, fatigue, cough, and nausea are found in a person infected with Langya henipavirus.
- Langya Henipavirus is a member of the 'Contagion' family, whose symptoms are different from the Nipah virus and Hendra virus.

also been organized by the Research and Information System for Developing Countries (RIS) at the ASEAN-India Center (AIC) in New Delhi.









- The theme of this year's ASEAN Day is "Strong Together" which invites the leaders of ASEAN to work collectively to meet the challenges of the 21st century.
- ASEAN was established with the signing of the 1967 ASEAN Declaration, popularly known as the Bangkok Declaration, by the founding nations.
- The founding nations of ASEAN are Indonesia, Malaysia, the Philippines, Singapore, and Thailand.
- The full name of ASEAN is the Association of Southeast Asian Nations, a regional organization of Southeast Asian nations formed to promote political and social stability amid rising tensions among the colonizing nations of the Asia-Pacific, was.
- The Secretariat of ASEAN is located in Jakarta, the capital of Indonesia.
- Indonesia, Malaysia, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, Brunei, Vietnam, Laos, Myanmar, and Cambodia are the member states of ASEAN.

China: launch of reusable spacecraft

Why in News:

 A pilot reusable spacecraft was successfully launched by China with a Long March-2F carrier rocket.

key points:

- The spacecraft, which was launched from China's Jiuquan Satellite Launch Center, will return to a planned landing site after being operated in orbit for some time with the aim of providing technical verification for reuse.
- China's Long March 2F Launch Vehicle primarily launches China's Shenzhou Crew Mission with a payload capacity of about 8 metric tons in low Earth orbit.
- The new spacecraft, similar in size to the US Air Force's X-37B space plane, has been modified to assist in the launch of the Long March 2F and its payload as a 'reusable test spacecraft'.
- Prior to this, China conducted an orbital test of a reusable experimental spacecraft in September 2020 which spent just 2 days in orbit.
- This mission is produced by the Chinese main space agency, CASC.


New Delhi hosts ITU's Regional Standardization Forum

key points:

- The Regional Standardization Forum is a forum for a constructive exchange of ideas, including, inter alia, the role of ITU standards in sustainable digital transformation, harnessing technology for digital and financial inclusion in emerging markets, data value chains, and digital health. Discussions on standardization topics including India's experience in various areas of technology have been included.
- The ITU's Regional Standardization Forum aims to provide insight into the experience of the Asia and Oceania region from policy and regulatory perspectives under various sub-themes.
- This year's meeting of the ITU's Regional Standardization Forum has been attended by over 250 delegates from 20 countries.
- The ITU was established on May 17, 1865, and acts as a specialized agency of the UN.
- It is in charge of information and communication technologies and includes more than 900 professional, international and regional organizations, as well as academic institutions in its 193 member states.

PM Modi to dedicate 2G ethanol plant to the nation in Panipat

Why in News:

 The second generation (2G) ethanol plant constructed at an estimated cost of Rs 900 crore was inaugurated at Panipat, Haryana through video conferencing by Prime Minister Narendra Modi.



key points:

- The objective of this project launched by the Prime Minister is in line with the Prime Minister's constant endeavor to make the energy sector more affordable, accessible, efficient, and sustainable.
- Based on state-of-the-art indigenous technology, this project will consume about two lakh tons of rice straw in a year to generate about 30 million liters of ethanol in a whole year.
- The project aims at providing direct employment to the people involved in plant operation as well as indirect employment in the supply chain for rice straw harvesting, handling, storage, etc.
- The scheme will help in reducing greenhouse gases equivalent to emissions of about 3 lakh tons of carbon dioxide equivalent per year, thereby supplying fuel to about 63,000 cars a year on the country's roads.

- Akasa Air has registered significant growth in the seven years since its launch in 2015 by Vistara, a Tata Sons-Singapore airline joint venture.
- Akasa airline is founded by Rakesh Jhunjhunwala along with aviation stalwarts Vinay Dubey and Aditya Ghosh.
- Vinay Dubey was previously the CEO of Jet Airways till April 2019, while Aditya Ghosh, previously headed IndiGo.

key points:

 Kala Azar also known as Leishmaniasis is a neglected tropical disease affecting more than 100 countries including India.









- Symptoms of leishmaniasis include fever, weight loss, and swelling of the spleen and liver.
- Kala Azar disease is caused by a parasite called Leishmania which is spread by the bites of sand flies.
- There are mainly three types of Leishmaniasis or Kala Azar in which
 - Visceral leishmaniasis, which is considered the most severe form of the disease, affects all parts of the body.
 - Cutaneous leishmaniasis affects skin lesions and severely affects the skin.
 - Mucocutaneous leishmaniasis causes skin and mucosal lesions.
- India's National Health Policy, 2002 had set a target of eliminating Kala-azar by the year 2010, which was revised in the year 2015 due to non-fulfillment.

key points:

 Konaseema district was formed by the Government of Andhra Pradesh by bifurcating Godavari district.











- The right to change the name of any district rests with the respective state government.
- The right to change the name of any district rests with the concerned state government.
- The proposal to change the name of any district is done in three phases-
 - 1. The first step involves making a request in the form of a motion by any Member of the Legislative Assembly (MLA).
 - 2. The second stage involves deliberation on the request to change the name of the city or district.
 - 3. At the final stage, voting is done on the validity of the resolution. If there is a majority in favor of the motion, then the said resolution is declared passed and the name of the district or city is changed and if the majority of votes are not received for any resolution, then the resolution fails.
- A resolution to change the name of any district must be passed by a simple majority.
- Babasaheb Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar was born in the year 1891 in Mhow, Central Province.
- Babasaheb Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar is considered the father of the Indian Constitution and he was the first law minister of India as well as the chairman of the drafting committee for constitution making.

UP government's plan to double farmers' income under Panchamrut Yojana'

Why in News:

 The scheme to double the income of farmers was launched by the Uttar Pradesh government under Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath's Panchamrut Yojana'.



- The Panchamrut scheme has been launched by the UP government with the aim to achieve the goal of doubling farmers' income through the introduction of cost-effective technological measures and the promotion of the co-cropping method.
- Initially, a total of 2028 farmers in the state will be selected for developing model plots before the autumn season under this scheme.









- According to the press note released by the UP government, the Panchamrut scheme is to reduce the production cost of sugarcane as well as include an integrated trench method for sowing sugarcane through five techniques, management, waste mulching, drip irrigation, and co-cropping. have been done.
- UP government's 'Panchamrut Yojana' aims at reducing costs through saving water and optimum use of sugarcane straw and leaves, saving the use of fertilizers and pesticides, promoting the cultivation of more than one crop for higher productivity, and at the same time increasing the income of the farmers.
- Under this scheme, those farmers will also be honored by the government that implementing the Panchamrut scheme.
- The Uttar Pradesh government's Panchamrut Yojana aims to encourage farmers to adopt new farming techniques to reduce the cost of agriculture and increase their income.

Why in News:

 The Uttarakhand government has decided to develop one Sanskrit-speaking village in each of the 13 districts of the state.

- Reading of Vedas and Puranas will also be done under this scheme to help citizens to acquire proficiency in Sanskrit.
- To be called a "Sanskrit Village" under this scheme, each of these villages would be designated as a center of ancient Indian culture.
- Sanskrit is the second official language of the state of Uttarakhand while Hindi is the first official language of the state.









- Uttarakhand is the first state in the country that has started such an initiative to promote Sanskrit.
- Prior to the state of Uttarakhand, there is only one Sanskrit-speaking village in the state of Karnataka, Mattur village.

- The new committee constituted by the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) is known as the 'FPI Advisory Committee' or FAC.
- This committee has been constituted by SEBI to simplify investment procedures and suggest new ways to increase investment in the capital markets of India.
- The committee, set up by SEBI, aims to help increase participation in domestic bond markets, and recommend new ways to bring in changes in the existing rules to attract investments and increase transparency.
- The newly constituted 15-member committee also aims to make recommendations to the government on issues related to the custodians.

Why in News:

• Justice Uday Umesh Lalit has been appointed as the 49th Chief Justice of India.

key points:

• Justice Uday Umesh Lalit, a judge of the Supreme Court, has been appointed as the Chief Justice of India by the President in the evercise of the powers conferred by clause (2).



exercise of the powers conferred by clause (2) of Article 124 of the Constitution of India.









- Earlier in August 2014, Justice Uday Umesh Lalit was appointed as a judge of the Supreme Court of India from the Bar Council.
- Under the provisions of Article 124(2) of the Constitution of India, the judges of the Supreme Court are appointed by the President after consultation with the Supreme Court and certain judges of the High Courts in the States (as many judges as the President deems fit for the purpose).
- According to the Indian Constitution, the following qualifications are necessary for the Chief Justice-
 - 1. He should be a citizen of India.
 - 2. He should be a Judge of a High Court for at least 5 years, or he should be an advocate of a High Court or different Courts combined for 10 years, or in the opinion of the President, he should be a respected jurist.
 - 3. The Constitution of India does not specify any minimum age for the appointment of a judge.

Prof. Ramadhar Singh becomes first Indian social psychologist on US Heritage Wall of Fame

Why in News:

 Ramadhar Singh, a professor at Ahmedabad University, has been appointed as the first Indian social psychologist on the US Heritage Wall of Fame of the Society for Personality and Social Psychology (SPSP) in the United States.



- Prof. Ramadhar Singh is currently working as Professor at Amrit Modi School of Management, Ahmedabad University.
- Prof. Ramadhar Singh was awarded the Distinguished Alumnus Award in Psychological Science on March 25, 2022.
- Prior to this appointment, Prof. Ramadhar Singh served as a member of the Society in the year 1990 and as a Fellow of the Society in the year 1992.
- Professor Singh is a successful researcher in psychology and management who, during the 1980s, transformed the dominant American outlook.
- With an aim to advance psychology as a science in Asia, Prof. Ramadhar Singh has played an important role at the national level through the University Grants









Commission (UGC) in India and through the Asian Association of Social Psychology in Asia.

- Internationally, Prof. Ramadhar Singh has served as a Consulting and Associate Editor of several journals and a member of the Advisory Awards Committee of the Association for Psychological Science (APS), US.
- Through his research, Prof. Ramadhar Singh also confirmed the fact how many cognitively rich and dynamic people were in the world.



Jagdeep Dhankhar elected as the 14th Vice President of India

Why in News:

• Jagdeep Dhankhar was elected as the 14th Vice President of India.

- Jagdeep Dhankhar was made a candidate from BJP by NDA.
- Jagdeep Dhankhar will assume his office on August 11 after the tenure of the current Vice President Venkajah Najdu ends.



- A total of 725 MPs registered their votes for the Vice-Presidential election and 63 MPs did not participate in the Vice-Presidential Election 2022.
- Jagdeep Dhankhar got a total of 528 votes in the Vice-Presidential election, while the opposition candidate Margaret Alva could get 208 MPs votes.
- Jagdeep Dhankhar was born on 18 May 1951 in an agricultural household in a remote village in the Jhunjhunu district of Rajasthan.
- Jagdeep Dhankhar completed his schooling at Sainik School Chittorgarh and obtained a law degree from Rajasthan University.
- Jagdeep Dhankhar was working as a Lok Sabha MP from Jhunjhunu from 1989 to 1991 before becoming the Vice President and after that, he took over as the Minister of State for Parliamentary Affairs from 1990 to 1991.
- After this Jagdeep Dhankhar worked as a member of the Legislative Assembly from Krishnagar, Rajasthan from the year 1993 to the year 1998, and from the year 2019 to the present Jagdeep Dhankhar is working as the Governor of West Bengal.









- According to Article 68 of the Indian Constitution, an election to fill a vacancy caused by the termination of the office of the Vice-President must be held before the expiration of the term of the outgoing Vice-President.
- The Election Commission of India superintends, directs, and controls the conduct of the election of the Vice-President under the President and Vice-President's Election Act, 1952 and the President and Vice-President's Election Rules, 1974 as well as Article 324 of the Constitution.

SpaceX Launches South Korea's First Moon Mission, Danuri

Why in News:

 South Korea launched its first lunar mission, which can also be called its first mission away from low Earth orbit.

- The mission, formerly known as Korea Pathfinder Lunar Orbiter, launched by South Korea, is currently known as Danuri.
- Danuri is prevalent as a play on the Korean words for "moon" and "bliss".
- The Danuri mission, launched by South Korea, is operated by the Korean Aerospace Research Institute (KARI).
- Danuri was launched from Cape Canaveral Space Force Station on a SpaceX Falcon 9 rocket by the Korean Aerospace Research Institute.
- Before returning to its destination, Danuri will fly toward the Sun and enter lunar orbit in mid-December using gravity generated by the Sun.
- After reaching the Moon in a 62-mile-high orbit, Danuri will carry out research with six of its science instruments (a magnetometer, a gamma-ray spectrometer, an experimental communication system, and three cameras).









• If South Korea successfully completes this lunar mission, South Korea will become the eighth political body to complete a Moon mission after the United States, the former Soviet Union, China, Japan, India, Luxembourg, and the European Union.

ISRO launches the smallest rocket to display the tricolor in space

Why in News:

 The Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO) launched its first Small Satellite Launch Vehicle, SSLV-D1/EOS-02 from the Sriharikota Satish Dhawan Space Center.



key points:

- This is the first time that the Indian space agency ISRO has demonstrated its capabilities in launching an SSLV to place small satellites in low Earth orbit.
- The SSLV-D1/EOS-02, launched by ISRO, has been developed by a team of students from Earth Observation Satellite and Space Kids India named AzadiSat.
- On the occasion of the 75th anniversary of Indian Independence, girls from government schools across the country participated in the making of this eight-kg CubeSat that will encourage girls to pursue "Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM)" by ISRO. result of efforts.
- The SSLV developed by ISRO uses solid fuel in the first three stages and a liquid propulsion-based velocity trimming module in the fourth stage.
- The newly built AzadiSat requires minimal launch infrastructure as compared to PSLV and GSLV launch vehicles of ISRO.
- AzadiSat also includes a long-range transponder and a solid-state PIN diodebased radiation counter that will be helpful in measuring ionizing radiation in its orbit.
- A ground system built by ISRO Space Kids India has also been employed to engage and interact with AzadiSat in orbit.

- The main demands of the Quit India Movement included the demand to end the British rule in India with immediate effect to get the support of Indians in the Second World War against fascism and to form an interim government after the British left India.



- Under the Nathanna Ku Bima Yojana, the annual premium of the scheme will be borne by the government, for which the government has allocated a budget of more than Rs 29 crore.
