ANSWERS

1. Ans. E.

The sentence is contextually and grammatically correct. Thus, option E is the correct answer.

2. Ans. D.

The error lies in the fourth part of the sentence. By is used to indicate someone's action and with indicates what was used to act and is usually accompanied by something or someone. Thus, 'by' needs to be replaced with 'with' to relate to 'war.'

Thus, option D is the correct answer.'

3. Ans. B.

Solution: The correct option is B.

Reason: Bloom means to come into or be in full beauty. Trees do not bloom. They grow. And here, they were standing in front of the house. Thus, the words A-D needs to be exchanged.

The correct sentence is

"The coral trees **stood** (A) in front of a **house** (B), by **pools** (C) of water and fully **bloomed** (D) **flowers** (E).

4. Ans. C.

Solution: The correct option is C. **Reason:** The correct phrase is "*sky opened up*", which means there was heavy rain. Thus, D-E needs to be exchanged to make the sentence correct.

The correct sentence: On a **sleepy** (A) afternoon, while the sun **continued** (B) to **shine** (C), the skies **opened** (D) up and it **started** (E) to rain.

5. Ans. C.

Solution: The correct option is C. **Reason**: The first part of the sentence is part B as introduces the subject 'bank'. This is followed by part E as banks can sanction loans. This is followed by part D as loans sanctioned cannot be repaid back now.

"Not Only" is always paired with "But Also". Part D ends with But. And part A begins with 'also'. Thus, Part A follows part D. Part C concludes the sentence by stating the properties in which bank invested, the value dropped.

The correct sequence is BEDAC.

6. Ans. A.

Solution: The correct option is A. **Reason:** The first part of the sentence is part A as the subject is 'theft accusation'. The accusation was against someone, here the banker. The second part is thus part B. Now there is an apostrophe in the word 'banker's', signifying possession. "Banker's reputation" makes sense. Thus, part C follows B.

The option with part ABC as a sequence is in option A. Thus, option A is the correct answer.





7. Ans. C.

The correct option is C. The statement talking about a certain amount of sleep that can improve cognition, mood and immune functioning. Thus option C fits the blank perfectly.

8. Ans. B.

The correct option is B.

9. Ans. B.

Guilt: noun

- 1. the fact or state of having committed an offense, crime, violation, or wrong, especially against moral or penal law; culpability.
- 2. a feeling of responsibility or remorse for some offense, crime, etc., whether real wrong, imagined. (as used in statement II) The tone of statement I indicates the correct word to be used in the context of the statement is 'quild': an organization of persons with related interests, goals, especially one formed for mutual aid or protection. (as in a guild of businessmen)

The tone of statement III indicates that the correct word to be used in the context of the statement is 'hilt': (n.) the handle of a sword or dagger.

Thus, option B is the correct answer.

10. Ans. C.

Grant:

- 1. verb (used with object): to bestow or confer, especially by a formal act: (as used in sentence I)
- 2. Noun: something granted, as a privilege or right, a sum of money, or a tract of land. (as used in sentence III)

The tone of sentence II indicates that 'grant' needs to be replaced by 'grunt': verb (used without object): to utter the deep, guttural sound characteristic of a pig.

Thus, the word **'grant'** has been used correctly in both I and III, making option C the correct answer. 11. Ans. A.

The usage is either 'in spite of' or 'despite' to introduce a contradiction in the sentence. The usage of the preposition 'of' after 'despite' is redundant and needs to be omitted. Thus, option A is the correct answer.

12. Ans. C.

When two things joined by the conjunction 'and' refer to two different things, as indicated by 'both', the noun phrase takes a plural verb. Thus, 'is' needs to be replaced with 'are' in the third part of the sentence to maintain subject-verb agreement.

Thus, option C is the correct answer.
