India reports its first case of XXB.1.5 Covid variant: Report

Why in news: The new variant is more immune evasive and better at infecting than BQ and XBB.

- 1. India has reported its first case of Omicron variant 'XXB.1.5' which is responsible for the surge in coronavirus cases in New York. The first case of XXB.1.5 has been confirmed in Gujarat.
- COVID-19 OMICRON VARIANT POSITIVE

- 2. More than 40% of Covid-19 cases in the United States are now caused by Omicron XBB15
- **3.** XBB.1.5 is a sub-variant that international scientists have flagged for being responsible for a surge in Covid cases and hospitalisations in New York. XBB itself is a recombinant of two different BA.2 sub-variants of Omicron. But its descendant, XBB.1.5, is believed to have a tighter bind to the ACE2 receptor, which would explain its higher level of transmissibility.
- **4.** XXB1.5 variant is much worse in transmission R value and infection rate than previous variants.
- **5.** Omicron was a new coronavirus variant B 1.1. 529. It was identified in Southern Africa in November 2021.

Indian rupee ends 2022 as worst-performing Asian currency

Why in news: The rupee finished the year at 82.72 to the U.S. currency, down from 74.33 at the end of 2021, while the dollar index was headed for its biggest yearly gain since 2015.



- 1. The Indian rupee ended 2022 as the worst-performing Asian currency with a fall of 11.3%, its biggest annual decline since 2013, as the dollar rocketed on the U.S. Federal Reserve's aggressive monetary policy stance to tame inflation.
- 2. The rupee was also a victim of a rally in oil prices sparked by the Russia-Ukraine conflict, which pushed India's current account deficit to a record high in the September quarter in absolute terms.
- **3.** The rupee finished the year at 82.72 to the U.S. currency, down from 74.33 at the end of 2021, while the dollar index was headed for its biggest yearly gain since 2015.
- **4.** Heading into 2023, market participants believe the rupee would trade with an appreciation bias, finding relief from easing commodity prices and hopeful of foreign investors continuing to buy Indian equities.









5. The current account also includes net income, such as interest and dividends, and transfers from abroad such as foreign aid, which are usually a small fraction of the total, according to the IMF.

Government to launch the Digital India Innovation Fund for Catalyzing deep tech start-ups

Why in news: 'India at the moment is going through an inflection point; the coming decade is going to be the country's Techade'.

- 1. Union Minister of State for Electronics and Information Technology, and Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, Rajeev Chandrasekhar has said that the Centre will soon launch a Digital India Innovation Fund that will support deep tech start-ups in the country.
- **2.** The Minister made these remarks during his address to over 1000 college students as part of the New India for Young India: Techade of Opportunities program at the Catholic Bishop House Campus, Thamarassery, Kerala.
- **3.** Deep technology (deep tech) or hard tech is a classification of organisations, or more typically startup company, with the expressed objective of providing technology solutions based on substantial scientific or engineering challenges.
- **4.** Techade is a portmanteau of technology and decade, which means a decade powered by technology.

- **2.** It is one of the platforms where ideas are invited from individuals, Social Enterprises, Start up, Private Sector, Civil Society, Community Based Organization, Academic Institution, Start-ups, Incubation centres, Investors etc having potential to transform the rural economy.
- **3.** The Mission is looking for ideas and solutions around Focus on Women and Marginalized section of community, Localised Models, Sustainability, Cost Effective solutions and Multi sectoral ideas and solutions etc.
- **4.** Shortlisted ideas will be acknowledged by the Mission and will be provided mentorship support from an expert panel and incubation support to scale up. The top 5 ideas will be rewarded with Rs. 2 Lakh each. Applicants can visit the website www.prajjwalachallenge.com and apply.
- **5.** The Mission so far has mobilised more than 87 Million women in to the Self Hep Groups and their federations.

Stage set for commercial production of goat pox vaccine Lumpi-ProVac

Why in news: The indigenously developed vaccine is going to be a game changer in ongoing effort of government to control and eradicate the Lumpy Skin Disease.



- 1. ICAR has developed indigenous live-attenuated vaccine Lumpi-ProVac for Lumpy Skin Disease.
- 2. Lumpi-ProVacind is safe in animals and induces LSDV-specific antibody-and cell-mediated immune response, besides providing complete protection against lethal LSDV challenge. Lumpi-ProVacind is used for the prophylactic immunization of animals against Lumpy Skin.
- **3.** At present Goat Pox vaccine is used for controlling Lumpy Skin Disease in animals and this has been proven effective against Lumpy.
- **4.** The vaccine is stored at 4°C. The vaccine must be shipped on ice and must be used within a few hours after reconstitution. The patent has been filed by the ICAR for the technology.
- **5.** The Lumpy Skin Disease has been reported in India from 2019 while first case was reported in the state of Odisha. Considering the heavy production losses and mortality of sizable number of cattle, ICAR initiated research on development of indigenous homologous vaccine against Lumpy Skin Disease.

Uttar Pradesh: Bundelkhand to become hub of wildlife tourism with zoo in Jhansi and Bear Reserve in Lalitpur

Why in news: UP Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath's government is making all efforts to promote wildlife tourism in Bundelkhand, which will likely increase the chances of employment and development in the state.



- 1. Bundelkhand region is located in central part of the country, there is a lot of potential to develop wildlife tourism in this region.
- 2. The project to make Chitrakoot-based Ranipur Wildlife Sanctuary a tiger reserce has been approved by the UP cabinet, it is to be developed in an area of about 529 sq km. The tiger reserve is expected to be ready in two years and develop into a major centre of wildlife tourism in Bundelkhand.
- **3.** In order to conserve bears and badgers, the government is ready to set up a bear conservation centre in Lalitpur
- **4.** Steps are also taken to build a zoo in Jhansi's Garhmau, which will be the biggest zoo in Uttar Pradesh. It will be spread across 125 acres in Jhansi.

Centre approves Kalasa-Banduri project in Karnataka

Why in news: Chief Minister Basavaraj Bommai on Thursday announced in the Assembly that the union government has approved Karnataka's detailed project report (DPR) on the Kalasa-Banduri (Mahadayi) project, which was opposed by Goa.



- 1. The project proposes to divert water from two tributaries of the Mahadayi river (also known as Mandovi): Kalasa and Banduri to the Malaprabha river (Mandovi flows through Goa, Karnataka and Maharashtra).
- **2.** The entire project aims to construct several dams on the river Mandovi in order to facilitate drinking water for towns in drought-hit northern Karnataka.
- **3.** The Mahadayi Water Disputes Tribunal, which was formed in 2010, had cleared the project in 2018 but with a lower amount of water than sought by Karnataka.
- **4.** The plan is aimed at facilitating drinking water for 13 towns in drought-hit northern Karnataka. These areas together make up the country's second most arid region after Rajasthan.

RBI Financial Stability Report: Gross NPAs of Indian banks fall to seven-year low in September

Why in news: Macro stress tests for credit risk reveal that banks would be able to comply with the minimum capital requirements even under severe stress scenarios, the RBI report said.



- 1. Gross non-performing asset (GNPA) ratio of scheduled commercial banks (SCBs) fell to a seven-year low of 5.0% and net NPA have dropped to ten-year low of 1.3% in September 2022.
- 2. The Buoyant demand for bank credit and early signs of a revival in investment cycle are benefiting from improved asset quality, return to profitability and strong capital and liquidity buffers of banks.
- **3.** Financial Stability Report (FSR) is a biannual report released by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI). The FSR reflects the collective assessment of the Sub-Committee of the Financial Stability and Development Council (FSDC) on risks to financial stability, as also the resilience of the financial system.
- 4. NPA: In most cases, debt is classified as non-performing, when the loan payments have not been made for a minimum period of 90 days.

India Australia Economic and Cooperation Trade Agreement comes into force

Why in news: This is the first major trade agreement with a western country under the Narendra Modi government.

1. The India-Australia Economic and Cooperation Trade Agreement (Ind-Aus ECTA), which is expected to double trade between the two countries to \$50 billion, came into effect on Thursday.



- 2. The Ind-Aus ECTA provides an institutional mechanism to encourage and improve trade between the two countries. It covers almost all the tariff lines dealt by India and Australia.
- **3.** India will benefit from preferential market access provided by Australia on 100% of its tariff lines, including all the labor-intensive sectors of export interest to India, such as Gems and Jewellery, Textiles, leather, footwear, furniture among others.
- **4.** On the other hand, India will be offering preferential access to Australia on over 70% of its tariff lines, including lines of export interest to Australia, which are primarily raw materials and intermediaries such as coal, mineral ores and wines.









5. Australia is an important strategic partner of India. They are also part of the four nation QUAD, Trilateral Supply Chain Initiative and the Indo-Pacific Economic Forum.

At 4.4% of GDP, current account deficit hits 9 year high.

Why in news: According to RBI, net external commercial borrowings by India recorded an outflow of \$0.4 billion in Q2 of 2022-23, compared to an inflow of \$4.3 billion a year ago.



- 1. India's current account deficit (CAD) widened to a nineyear high of 4.4% of gross domestic product (GDP) in the three months to September, up from 2.2% in the June quarter, primarily due to a widening goods trade deficit and an increase in net outgo under investment income.
- 2. The negative surprises in the merchandise trade deficit and primary income outweighed the higher-than-expected services surplus and secondary income flows.
- **3.** The current account balance is the difference between the value of exports of goods and services and the value of imports of goods and services, according to International Monetary Fund (IMF).
- **4.** The current account also includes net income, such as interest and dividends, and transfers from abroad such as foreign aid, which are usually a small fraction of the total, according to the IMF.

What is triple test survey, which UP is to carry out for OBC quota in urban local bodies

Why in news: The Allahabad HC recently ordered the Uttar Pradesh government to hold urban local body elections without reservation for OBCs as the 'triple test' requirement for it had not been met.



- 1. The Allahabad High Court said simply granting reservation on the basis of population misses a very crucial factor for determination of backwardness, and that factor is political representation of the class or group concerned.
- 2. The five-member commission will conduct a survey to ensure that the OBCs are provided reservation on the basis of the triple test, as mandated by the Supreme Court. This is the first time that the triple test exercise will be carried out in Uttar Pradesh.









- **3.** The triple test requires the government to complete three tasks for finalisation of reservation to OBCs in the local bodies. These include:
 - To set up a dedicated commission to conduct a rigorous empirical inquiry into the nature and implications of the backwardness in local bodies;
 - To specify the proportion of reservation required in local bodies in light of recommendations of the commission, so as not to fall foul of overbreadth;
 - To ensure reservation for SCs/STs/OBCs taken together does not exceed an aggregate of 50 per cent of the total seats.
- **4.** These triple test/conditions were outlined by the Supreme Court in the case of Vikas Kishanrao Gawali vs. State of Maharashtra and others, decided on March 4, 2021.

India is all set to go for its first waste-to-hydrogen project

Why in news: Hydrogen generated at a facility in Pune will be utilised locally to help the city lower its emissions, manage waste optimally



- 1. Pune Municipal Corporation (PMC) has collaborated with business management consultant The Green Billions (TGBL) to manage its waste and generate it into useable green hydrogen.
- 2. The new facility will solve two major problems: Inefficient waste management and carbon emissions. Waste management is one of the prime issues in the country, which is blamed for generating the pollution in the surroundings.
- **3.** With this project, Pune city can reduce up to 2.5 million tonnes of carbon dioxide equivalent, over 3.8 million tonnes of waste would be diverted from the landfill/dumping site and more than 180,000 estimated households will be served directly.
- **4.** The waste would be segregated using optical sensor technology. The Refuse-Derived Fuel (RDF) from the waste would later be utilised to generate hydrogen using plasma gasification technology. The technology has been developed while closely working with the Bhabha Atomic Research Institute (BARC) and the Indian Institute of Science, Bengaluru.
- **5.** Green hydrogen is hydrogen produced by splitting water by electrolysis using power from renewable energy sources.

India's First Underwater Train and Deepest Metro Station To Be Operational By 2023

Why in news: This is a one-of-a-kind underwater metro train which is built in India and is being compared to Eurostar which joins London and Paris

- 1. India's first underwater train in Kolkata is all set to be fully completed by 2023. The Kolkata Metro Rail Corporation (KMRC) has made a way to pass under the Hooghly River. The East and West corridor will be connected via this twin tunnel over 500 metres. The train will be 13 metres below the Hooghly River.
- 2. The train will be running at a depth equal to a 10-story structure while underwater.
- **3.** The tunnel is will be built with 1.4 m-wide concrete rings, which will be part of the metro station. The tunnel will have hydrophilic gaskets to prevent water from entering the tunnels.
- **4.** The cost of this project is Rs 8,600 crore, roughly.
- The train will help in reducing the duration as well as the time taken for travelling. The Kolkata Green Line at present runs between Phoolbagan and Sector V in just 6.97 kilometres. This train will help in reducing the travel duration between Sector V to Howrah.
- **6.** At present, Hauz Khas in Delhi is one of the deepest metro stations. It has a depth of 29 metres.

Tamil Nadu launches project to protect Nilgiri Tahr, its State Animal

Why in news: Under the project, the government plans to develop a better understanding of the Nilgiri Tahr population through surveys and reintroduce them to their historical habitat.



- **1.** Tamil Nadu is set to implement Project Nilgiri Tahr, aimed at developing a better understanding of its population.
- **2.** The project, to be set up at a cost of $\stackrel{?}{}$ 25.1 crore, will be implemented during the 2022-27 period.
- **3.** Nilgiri Tahr is the only mountain ungulate (animal with hooves) in southern India amongst the 12 species present in India.
- 4. It is the state animal of Tamil Nadu.
- 5. It is endemic to the Western ghats and locally known as 'Varaiaadu'.









6. IUCN status: Endangered.

India, Kazakhstan carry out joint military drill in Meghalaya

Why in news: The 14-day-long joint training exercise culminated with a validation exercise witnessed by the visiting dignitaries.



- 1. With aim to further strengthen positive military relations between India and Kazakhstan, the nations conducted their 6th edition of Army Joint Exercise KazInd 2022 in Meghalaya's Umroi.
- 2. Joint annual training exercise with the Kazakhstan Army was instituted in 2016 as Exercise Prabal Dostyk, which was later upgraded to a company level exercise and renamed as Ex Kazind in 2018.
- **3.** This joint exercise will enable the two armies to train, plan and execute a series of combined tactical drills for neutralising of likely threats that may be encountered in UN peace keeping operations.
- **4.** The scope of this exercise involves a Command Post Exercise (CPX) at the Battalion level and Company level Field Training Exercise (FTX) on subconventional operations.

Government research body transfers vaccine tech for H9N2 avian influenza virus to four companies

Why in news: This vaccine technology has been transferred to Secunderabad-based Globion India, Pune-based Venkateshwara Hatcheries, Gurugram-based Indovax Pvt Ltd and Ahmedabad-based Hester Biosciences.



- 1. The government research body Indian Council of Agricultural Research-National Institute of High Security Animal Diseases (ICAR-NIHSAD) has transferred the first indigenous vaccine technology for the H9N2 avian influenza virus in chickens to to four private companies
- **2.** H9N2 is a subtype of influenza A virus, which causes human influenza as well as bird flu.
- **3.** H9N2 has been found in more than 50 species of wild birds and other mammals including humans, cats, dogs, pigs, etc. Transmission of virus infection is due to direct or indirect contact with infected live or dead poultry.
- **4.** Vaccines will increase income of poultry farmers by reducing economic loss due to disease.









5. The ICAR director general Himanshu Pathak, ICAR-NIHSAD director Aniket Sanyal and Agrinnovate India CEO Praveen Malik were among other senior officials present at the event.

- 2. The Sri Sita Ramachandraswamy temple is a Hindu temple dedicated to Rama, a prominent avatar of the god Vishnu. It is located on the banks of the Godavari River in the town of Bhadrachalam in east Telangana, India
- **3.** The 'National Mission on Pilgrimage Rejuvenation and Spiritual Augmentation Drive' (PRASAD) was launched by the Ministry of Tourism in the year 2014-15 with the objective of holistic development of identified pilgrimage destinations.
- **4.** Ramappa Temple, also known as the Rudreshwara temple, is a Kakatiya style Hindu temple dedicated to the god Shiva, located in Telangana.
- **5.** The medieval Deccan Ramappa Temple which dates back to 1213 AD, was built by the patronage of the Kakatiya ruler Kakati Ganapathi Deva under the authority of his Chief Commander Rudra Samani.
- **6.** In 2021, the temple was inscribed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site as "Kakatiya Rudreshwara (Ramappa) Temple, Telangana".

Dhanu Yatra celebrations

Why in news: The 'Dhanu Yatra' festival began after a gap of two years, in Bargarh at the Odisha.

- 1. The 'Dhanu Yatra' festival, the largest open-air theatre festival, associated with the culture of Odisha.
- 2. Dhanu Yatra, the eleven day long annual extravaganza places Bargarh in the Cultural Map of India. It is at par with the standard of Odishan Heritage and culture. It is an open-air theatre festival stretching more than 5 square K.M and comprising a village and a town in between.
- **3.** The 'Dhanu Yatra' which marks the victory of good over evil, came into existence in Bargarh in 1947-48 as part of the celebration of the country's Independence and is held annually.
- **4.** Theme: The plays in the festival start with the dethroning of Emperor Ugrasen of Mathura by angry Kansa over the marriage of his sister Devaki with Vasudev. The festival will conclude with the death of demon king Kansa and restoration of the throne to Ugrasen.

RESERVE BANK OF INDIA (RBI) RELEASED REPORT ON TREND AND PROGRESS OF BANKING

Why in news: The central bank said this is the first time it is seeing double-digit growth in banks' balance sheets after seven years.



- 1. Report is a statutory publication in compliance with Banking Regulation Act,
 - 1949. It presents performance of banking sector, including co-operative banks and non-banking financial institutions.
- **2.** The Consolidated balance sheet of Scheduled Commercial Banks (SCBs) registered double digit growth in 2021-22, after a gap of seven years.
- **3.** Gross non-performing assets (GNPA) ratio of SCBs has declined from its peak at around 9 percent in 2017-18 to reach 5.8 percent at the end of March 2022.
- **4.** The report highlights that the financial performance of urban co-operative banks showed improvement, characterised by augmented capital buffers, decline in GNPA ratio and improved profitability indicators.









5. The reasons for declining NPA are reduced share of large borrowings, upgradation of loans in private banks and loan write off by PSBs.

Researchers from India, Israel, and US are trying to develop a drug to treat the rare disease 'GNB1 Encephalopathy'

Why in news: Researchers at the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), Madras, Tel Aviv University and Columbia University are studying a rare genetic brain disease called "GNB1 Encephalopathy" and trying to develop a drug to treat it effectively.

- 1. GNB1 Encephalopathy is a rare genetic brain disease caused due to mutations in the GNB1 gene.
- 2. This genetic disorder affects individuals in the foetus stage, with the earliest symptoms being delayed physical and mental development, intellectual disabilities, epilepsy (abnormal brain activity), movement problems and frequent epileptic seizures.
- **3.** Individuals having this genetic disorder will experience seizures due to the abnormal activity of ion channels or neurotransmitter receptors.
- 4. It is caused by the mutation of a single nucleotide in the GNB1 gene that makes one of the G-proteins called Gβ1 protein.
- **5.** Less than 100 cases of GNB1 Encephalopathy have been recorded worldwide. However, the actual number of affected children is probably higher since diagnosis of this genetic disorder is not widely available due to the requirement of sophisticated and expensive procedures.

The tranche 3 loan covers Coimbatore, Madurai, and Thoothukudi.
- **3.** ADB is a regional development bank established on 19th December 1966. It has its Headquarters in Manila, Philippines. It has 68 members, 49 from within Asia.
- **4.** Japan holds the largest proportion of shares in ADB, followed by the USA, because Japan is one of the largest shareholders of the bank, and the president has always been Japanese.
- 5. ADB is an official United Nations Observer.

- **3.** NMMS, a mobile application, was launched by the Ministry of Rural Development in 2021. It aims to bring more transparency, and ensure proper monitoring of schemes. It permits taking real-time attendance of workers at MGNREGA worksites along with geo-tagged photographs.
- **4.** MGNREGA is one of the largest work guarantee programmes in the world launched in 2005 by the Ministry of Rural development.
- **5.** The primary objective of the scheme is to guarantee 100 days of employment in every financial year to adult members of any rural household willing to do public work-related unskilled manual work.

- **5.** Renaming of a state requires an amendment of the Constitution with a simple majority in Parliament.

Scientists freeze Great Barrier Reef coral in world-first trial.

Why in news: Cryogenically frozen coral reefs can be stored and later reintroduced to the wild to protect them against rising ocean temperatures



- 1. The newly developed "cryomesh" technology enables the storage of the coral larvae at -196°C (-320.8°F).
- **2.** This novel mech technology can be manufactured at a lower cost. This is significant since the preceding methods require cutting-edge equipment, including lasers.
- **3.** It is lightweight and ensures better preservation of corals.
- **4.** The technology was initially tested with smaller and larger varieties of Hawaiian corals. The larger varieties of corals failed in the trials.
- **5.** The Great Barrier Reef stretches across 2,300 km area down Australia's northeast coast, covering an area equal to the size of Italy. Due to its ecological significance, it was declared a World Heritage Area by UNESCO.
- **6.** It is suffering major bleaching events because of the rising ocean temperatures caused by climate change. Corals are marine animals that get their color and most of their food from the algae living within them. The increased temperature stresses algae on the coral. This causes the corals to expel the algae and then starve to death.

US to send Patriot missile battery to Ukraine

Why in news: US officials have confirmed the agreement, and an official announcement is expected soon. A look at what the Patriot system is and what it does.



- 1. The Patriot, which stands for Phased Array Tracking Radar for Intercept on Target, is a theater-wide surface-to-air missile defense system built by Raytheon Technologies Corp (RTX.N) and considered one of the most advanced air defense systems in the U.S. arsenal.
- 2. The Patriot is a surface-to-air guided missile system that was first deployed in the 1980s and can target aircraft, cruise missiles and shorter-range ballistic missiles.
- **3.** Each Patriot battery consists of a truck-mounted launching system with eight launchers that can hold up to four missile interceptors each, a ground radar, a control station and a generator.
- **4.** The system was first used in combat during the 1991 Gulf War, with batteries protecting Saudi Arabia, Kuwait and Israel, and later used during the U.S. invasion of Iraq in 2003.
- 5. A Patriot battery can need as many as 90 troops to operate and maintain it, and for months the U.S. was reluctant to provide the complex system because sending forces into Ukraine to operate it is a non-starter for the Biden administration.

UN Security Council Adopts Rare Resolution on Myanmar

Why in news: UNSC 2669 expressed the council's "deep concern" about the actions of the country's military government, and called for an immediate cessation of violence.



- 1. The U.N. Security Council has adopted its first ever resolution on Myanmar in 74 years to demand an end to violence and urge the military junta to release all political prisoners, including ousted leader Aung San Suu Kyi.
- 2. The resolution was adopted with 12 of the 15 members of the UNSC in favor, while India, China, and Russia abstained. The Food and Agriculture Organization of the UN (FAO) coordinates the annual celebration of the Day to foster greater awareness of mountain issues.
- **3.** It also urges "concrete and immediate actions" to implement a peace plan agreed upon by the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) and calls for the military administration to "uphold democratic institutions and processes and









to pursue constructive dialogue and reconciliation in accordance with the will and interests of the people".

- **4.** On 1st December, India assumed the monthly rotating presidency of the UN Security Council (UNSC) for the second time in its two-year tenure as an elected member of the Council in 2021-22.
- **5.** The Security Council was established by the UN Charter in 1945. It is one of the six principal organs of the United Nations. United Nations Security Council Headquarters: New York, United States.






Why in news: Rosatom's nuclear fuel division, TVEL Fuel Company, is the current supplier of TVS-2 M fuel for the two VVER 1,000 MWe reactors generating power in the Kudankulam power plant.



- 1. Russia has offered a more advanced fuel viz. TVS-2M type in place of UTVS type fuel for use in reactors at Unit 1 and 2 at Kudankulam
- **2.** The use of TVS-2M fuel assemblies in KKNPP reactors will allow 18-month operating cycles as against 12-month operating cycle with UTVS Fuel Assemblies presently in use in Unit-2.
- **3.** It will ensure more efficiency, additional power generation due to prolonged operation of the reactor and sizable savings of the foreign exchange needed to buy fresh fuel assemblies from Russia.
- **4.** Presently, India has 22 operating nuclear power reactors, with an installed capacity of 6780 MegaWatt electric (MWe). Some major power plants are:
 - Tarapur Atomic Power Station (TAPS), in Maharashtra
 - Rajasthan Atomic Power Station (RAPS), in Rajasthan
 - Madras Atomic Power Station (MAPS), in Tamil Nadu
 - Kaiga Generating Station (KGS), in Karnataka
 - Kudankulam Nuclear Power Station (KKNPS), in Tamil Nadu
 - Narora Atomic Power Station (NAPS), in Uttar Pradesh
 - Kakrapar Atomic Power Station (KAPS), in Gujarat

Among these, 18 reactors are Pressurised Heavy Water Reactors (PHWRs) and 4 are Light Water Reactors (LWRs).

- **3.** Each Patriot battery consists of a truck-mounted launching system with eight launchers that can hold up to four missile interceptors each, a ground radar, a control station and a generator.
- **4.** The system was first used in combat during the 1991 Gulf War, with batteries protecting Saudi Arabia, Kuwait and Israel, and later used during the U.S. invasion of Iraq in 2003.

UN Security Council Adopts Rare Resolution on Myanmar

Why in news: UNSC 2669 expressed the council's "deep concern" about the actions of the country's military government, and called for an immediate cessation of violence.



- The U.N. Security Council has adopted its first ever resolution on Myanmar in 74 years to demand an end to violence and urge the military junta to release all political prisoners, including ousted leader Aung San Suu Kyi.
- 2. The resolution was adopted with 12 of the 15 members of the UNSC in favor, while India, China, and Russia abstained. The Food and Agriculture Organization of the UN (FAO) coordinates the annual celebration of the Day to foster greater awareness of mountain issues.
- **3.** It also urges "concrete and immediate actions" to implement a peace plan agreed upon by the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) and calls for the military administration to "uphold democratic institutions and processes and to pursue constructive dialogue and reconciliation in accordance with the will and interests of the people".
- **4.** On 1st December, India assumed the monthly rotating presidency of the UN Security Council (UNSC) for the second time in its two-year tenure as an elected member of the Council in 2021-22.









5. The Security Council was established by the UN Charter in 1945. It is one of the six principal organs of the United Nations. United Nations Security Council Headquarters: New York, United States.

- **2.** The PMFBY is also the world's third-largest crop insurance scheme in terms of gross premium.









- **3.** Launched in 2016, the PMFBY provides for comprehensive risk insurance against crop damage due to non-preventable natural risks from pre-sowing to post-harvest for the crops/areas notified by the concerned state government.
- **4.** As per the provisions of the scheme, the actuarial/bid premium rate is charged by the insurance companies. But the farmer has to pay only a maximum premium of 1.5 per cent and 2 per cent for Rabi and Kharif food and oilseed crops, respectively and 5 per cent for commercial/horticultural crops.
- **5.** The remaining part of the actuarial/bidded premium is shared on 50:50 basis by the central and concerned state government except in North Eastern States where it is shared in the ratio of 90:10.
- **6.** It is administered by Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare.

- 1. Three new cultural sites in India, including the iconic Sun Temple at Modhera, historic Vadnagar town in Gujarat, and rock-cut relief sculptures of Unakoti in Tripura, have been added to the tentative list of UNESCO world heritage sites.
- **2.** The UNESCO website describes a tentative list as an "inventory of those properties which each State Party intends to consider for nomination".
- **3.** Vadnagar is a municipality in Mehsana district of Gujarat. It is a multi-layered historic town that has been inhabited continuously for more than 2,700 years, dating back nearly to the 8th century BCE (Before Common Era).
- **4.** Unakoti, the chiselled "Angkor Wat of the North-East," is a series of Shaivite rock sculptures found in the northern region of Tripura. It is renowned as an ancient holy site associated with Shaiva worship.
- 5. The Sun Temple in Modhera, Gujarat, is dedicated to Surya Dev and is situated on the left bank of the Pushpavati River, a tributary of the River Rupan. It is the earliest of such temples, setting trends in architectural and decorative features and perfectly illustrating the Solanki style
- **6.** The 52 "Sites on the Tentative List," as defined by UNESCO, also include Temples in Bishnupur, West Bengal (added to the list in 1998), Mattanchery Palace in Kerala (added in 1998), Wild Ass Sanctuary, and Little Rann of Kutch in Gujarat (added in 2006). So far in 2022, 6 Indian sites have been included to the tentative list.

- 1. Indian Navy Ship (INS) Arnala, the first of 16 anti-submarine warfare shallow water craft (ASW-SWC) being built in India for the Indian Navy, was launched on Tuesday at Larsen & Toubro's (L&T's) Kattupalli shipyard near Chennai.
- 2. The ship has been named 'Arnala' to signify the strategic maritime importance accorded to the island of Arnala, located about 13 kilometres north of Vasai, Maharashtra, by Maratha warrior king Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj.
- **3.** Purpose: To undertake anti-submarine operations in coastal waters and Low-Intensity Maritime Operations (LIMO) including subsurface surveillance in littoral waters.
- **4.** Replaces: Arnala class of ships will replace the Abhay class ASW Ships of the Indian Navy.

Features: The ships have a displacement of 900 tonnes with a maximum speed of 25 knots and endurance of 1800 nautical miles(NM).

It will also have over 80% indigenous content, ensuring that large-scale defence production is executed by Indian manufacturing units.

- **4.** Srinivasa Ramanujan was also seen on the 2012 India stamp. The Ramanujan Math Park located in Kuppam, of Andhra Pradesh, was inaugurated on this day in 2017.

Jyotiraditya Scindia launched country's first Green Steel Brand "KALYANI FERRESTA"

Why in news: The steel minister indicated the country may be looking at making it compulsory for steelmakers to dedicate a certain percentage of their capacity to green steel as well as encouraging its usage in government projects.

- 1. Green steel is the manufacturing of steel without the use of fossil fuels. This new phenomenon is about producing steel by using low-carbon energy sources such as hydrogen, coal gasification, or electricity instead of the traditional carbon-intensive manufacturing route of coal-fired plants.
- **2.** This first-of-its-kind steel has been manufactured by a Pune-based Steel company, Kalyani group by using renewable energy resources, leaving zero carbon footprints in the environment.
- 3. The steel industry produces 7 per cent of CO2 emissions internationally, while the Indian steel industry accounts for 12 per cent of such emissions.
- **4.** Sweden has become the first country in the world to manufacture fossil-free steel which is also known as green steel. Green steel has been developed by HYBRIT Technology and the first delivery was done to Volvo AB as a trial run.

- 1. SPI is a comprehensive tool that can serve as a holistic measure of a country's social progress at the national and sub-national levels. The index assesses states and districts based on 12 components across three critical dimensions of social progress Basic Human Needs, Foundations of Wellbeing, and Opportunity.
- 2. Based on the SPI scores, states and districts have been ranked under six tiers of social progress. The tiers are Tier 1: Very High Social Progress; Tier 2: High Social Progress; Tier 3: Upper Middle Social Progress; Tier 4: Lower Middle Social Progress; Tier 5: Low Social Progress; and Tier 6: Very Low Social Progress.









- **3.** It is made by the Institute for Competitiveness and Social Progress Imperative and was submitted to Economic Advisory Council- Prime Minister.
- **4.** Puducherry has the highest SPI score of 65.9 followed by Lakshadweep and Goa. Jharkhand and Bihar scored the lowest, 43.95 and 44.47, respectively.
- **5.** Aizawl (Mizoram), Solan (Himachal Pradesh), and Shimla (Himachal Pradesh) are the top 3 best-performing districts.
- **6.** Mizoram, Himachal Pradesh, Ladakh, and Goa have emerged as the best-performing states for the Foundations of Wellbeing. For the dimension of Basic Human Needs, Goa, Puducherry, Lakshadweep, and Chandigarh are the top four states with the best performance.
- **7.** Lastly, Tamil Nadu has achieved the highest component score of 72.00 for the Opportunity dimension

- **3.** The maximum admissible financial assistance under the Centre of Excellence component of AYURSWASTHYA Yojana, to an organization/institute is Rs.10.00 crores for maximum period of three years.

- **4.** Project 75 (I), approved in 2007, is part of the Indian Navy's 30 year Plan for indigenous submarine construction.
- **5.** Other submarines of the Kalvari class are INS Kalvari, INS Khanderi, INS Karanj, and INS Vela which have already been commissioned into the Navy and INS Vagsheer, which was launched in April earlier this year.

 - **a. Principal:** The party that purchases the bond and undertakes an obligation to perform an act as promised.
 - **b. Surety:** The insurance company or surety company that guarantees the obligation will be performed. If the principal fails to perform the act as promised, the surety is contractually liable for losses sustained.
 - **c. Obligee:** The party who requires, and often receives the benefit of the surety bond. For most surety bonds, the obligee is a local, state or federal government organization.
- 2. With this new instrument of Surety Bonds, the availability of both liquidity and capacity will definitely be boosted; such products stand to strengthen the sector.
- **3.** The product gives the principal a contract of guarantee that contractual terms and other business deals will be concluded in accordance with the mutually agreed terms. In case the contractor doesn't fulfil the contractual terms, the Principal can raise a claim on the surety bond and recover the losses they have incurred.
- **4.** Unlike a bank guarantee, the Surety Bond Insurance does not require large collateral from the contractor thus freeing up significant funds for the contractor,









which they can utilize for the growth of the business. The product will also help in reducing the contractors' debts to a large extent thus addressing their financial worries.

EU Adopts Global Minimum 15% Tax on Big Business

Why in news: The EU has adopted a plan for a global minimum 15% tax on big business. The landmark deal between nearly 140 countries aims to stop governments racing to cut taxes in a bid to attract companies.











- 1. The European Union (EU) is a political and economic union of 27 member states that are located mostly in Europe formed in 1993. Most of the member countries (19 of them) use Euro as their official currency, while 8 of them do not.
- 2. Members of the European Union agreed in principle to implement a minimum tax of 15% on big businesses. Companies like Apple, Facebook, Google and other tech giants profit enormously from the domestic markets while they make minimal contributions to public coffers.
- **3.** To address this issue, almost 140 countries started negotiation under the auspices of the OECD (Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development). The deal has two main elements
 - a. Pillar One, which calls for the redistribution of profits generated by the largest companies to the domicile markets where they actually make their sales instead of simply where they are headquartered.
 - b. Pillar Two, which establishes a global minimum effective tax rate of 15 percent determined on a country-by-country basis.
- **4.** EU members have agreed to implement a minimum tax rate of 15% on big businesses in accordance with Pillar 2 of the global tax agreement framed by the OECD last year. This deal will cover firms with global sales above 20 billion Euros (\$23 billion) and profit margins above 10%.
- **5.** European Union members include Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Croatia, Republic of Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain and Sweden.

India ranked 3rd globally in the publication of scientific papers

Why in news: Union Minister for Science and Technology, Jitendra Singh has revealed that India had jumped from 7th to 3rd in global scientific publications and scholarly output, according to a report by America's.



- 1. As per the National Science Foundation (NSF)'s Science & Engineering Indicators 2022 report of the United States, India's position globally in scientific publications, has improved from 7th position in 2010 to 3rd position in 2020. India's scholarly output increased from 60,555 papers in 2010 to 1,49,213 papers in 2020.
- 2. The Centre accounts for 45.4 (forty five point four) per cent of the total spending on research in the country, according to the National Science and Technology









Management Information System under the Department of Science and Technology.

- **3.** Overall, the research contribution of centrally funded institutions increased from 62.46% in 2001–2006 to 72.7% in 2016–2020.
- **4.** The report reflects that the IITs, NITs, Indian Institutes of Science Education and Research and Indian Institute of Management (IIMs) showed "rapid growth" in their research output, with a two-fold increase in the number of publications between 2011–2015 and 2016–2020.
- **5.** China leads the world in the publication of the maximum number of scientific papers followed by The United States of America.

Why in news- India amongst top 5 best performing countries on Climate Change.

- 1. India has been ranked amongst top 5 countries in the world, and the best among the G20 countries, based on its Climate Change performance. India jumps 2 spots higher, and is now ranked 8th amongst 59 nations as per Climate Change Performance Index (CCPI, 2023) published by German Watch, New Climate Institute and Climate Action Network International based in Germany.
- **2. Parameters:** CCPI assesses each country's performance in four categories: GHG Emissions (40% of the overall ranking), Renewable Energy (20%), Energy Use (20%) and Climate Policy (20%).
- **3.** Denmark, Sweden, Chile and Morocco were the only four small countries that were ranked above India as 4th, 5th, 6th and 7th respectively. The first, second and third ranks were not awarded to any country.
- **4.** Observations: India earned a high rating in the GHG Emissions and Energy Use categories, while a medium for Climate Policy and Renewable Energy.

As per the rules, the players use a plastic ball instead of a standard cricket ball. It is fitted with ball bearings so that it makes a noise on throwing. The wickets on the ground are made of metal tubes where all three are attached together.
- 4. The Indian national blind cricket team which won the T20 World Cup 2022 consisted of 17 players from 10 States. Among them, 6 players are from B1 category (fully blind), 5 players from B2 category (partially blind) and 6 from B3 category (eye vision upto 6 metres). The Indian team beat Pakistan for the T20 World Cup titles in 2012 and 2017.

 - iv. Subsidy for Beneficiary-led individual house construction/enhancement.









- b. Credit linked subsidy component will be implemented as a Central Sector Scheme while other three components will be implemented as Centrally Sponsored Scheme (CSS).
- c. All statutory towns as per Census 2011 and towns notified subsequently would be eligible for coverage under the Mission. It is implemented by the Union Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA).
- **3.** Pradhan Mantri Awaas Yojana Gramin (PMAY-G): it is implemented by Rural Development Ministry. This scheme is meant for people who do not own a house and people who live in kutcha houses or houses which are severely damaged. The main aim of the scheme is to provide pucca house with some of the basic amenities.

 - Predict the extent of saltwater intrusion into estuaries, wetlands and underground aquifers.









- **4. Radar Technology -** The advanced microwave radar technology enables to collect height-surface measurements of water bodies in high-definition detail over 90% of the globe.
- **5.** The radar instrument operates at the Ka-band frequency of the microwave spectrum. The Ka-band frequency allows scans to penetrate cloud cover and darkness over wide swaths (120km wide) of the Earth.

The evaluation found that 50.3 percent of the candidates were employable a significant increase from the last year's 46.2 percent. The 52.8 percent of women workforce are employable. This is higher than the 47.2 percent of employable men.
- **4.** The current share of women in Indian workforce is 33 percent. This is lesser than the of males at 67 percent. Rajasthan has the highest percentage of employable females who are prepared for the workforce (53.5 percent).
- 5. Uttar Pradesh, Maharashtra and Delhi are expected to have the most employable talent in 2023.
- **6.** Among the domains, B Com, MBA and B Pharm graduates were the most employable. Graduates in the fields of Polytechnic and MCA were the least employable.

2022 Global Food Security Index (GFSI) Report

Why in news: The 2022 Global Food Security Index (GFSI) report was released by the British weekly The Economist. In this report, South Africa overtook Tunisia to become the most food-secure country in Africa.



KEY POINTS

 Democratic republic of Congo(DRC) also ranks among weakest performers while Finland is the most food secure country followed by Ireland, Norway and France in that order.









- 2. The Global Food Security Index (GFSI) considers food affordability, availability, quality and safety, and sustainability and adaptation across 113 countries. The index is a dynamic quantitative and qualitative benchmarking model constructed from 68 unique indicators that measure the drivers of food security across both developing and developed countries.
- **3.** Significant progress was made in global food security from 2012 to 2015, with the overall GFSI score increasing by 6 percent. However, structural challenges have caused the growth of the global food system to slow down. The past 3 years witnessed a reversal in the global trend of the overall food security environment.
- **4.** South Africa, at the 59th position, was recognized as the most food-secure country in Africa.
- **5.** In 2022, the GFSI suffered because of the plummeting of two of its strongest pillars affordability, and quality and safety. The weakness in the other two pillars (availability, and sustainability and adaptation) continued during this year.

- 3. The main reason for the rise is the war between Russia and Ukraine which has driven up among other things energy, food and commodity costs. The price of a litre of petrol has shot up 22 per cent in the last one year on average in local-currency terms amid higher global oil prices.
- **4.** The WCOL is a twice-yearly survey conducted by EIU that compares more than 400 individual prices across more than 200 products and services in 172 cities. In 2021, the number of cities covered increased to 173 when Kyiv was included.

- 5. The theme of this year's International Mountain Day (IMD) on 11 December will be Women move mountains.
- 6. The first international day was celebrated for the first time the following year, 2003. Its roots date back to 1992, when the document "Managing Fragile Ecosystems: Sustainable Mountain Development" (called Chapter 13), was adopted as part of the action plan Agenda 21 of the Conference on Environment and Development.
- **7.** Most recently, the UN proclaimed 2022 the International Year of Sustainable Mountain Development.

- **4.** Child Welfare Committees and District Child Protection Officers can ensure proper restoration and rehabilitation of children by digitally monitoring the progress of the case of the child.
- **5.** List of Government implemented schemes will be provided, so that at the time of restoration the Child Welfare Committees can link the child with the schemes to strengthen the family and ensure that child remains with his/her family.
- **6.** The Ministry of Women and Child Development is administering the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015 (JJ Act, 2015) (as amended in 2021) and Rules thereunder, for ensuring safety, security, dignity and well-being of children.
- 7. Under the JJ Act, 2015 (Sections 27-30), the Child Welfare Committees have been empowered to take decisions with regard to the children in need of care and protection for the best interest of the children.

39TH EDITION OF INDIA-INDONESIA COORDINATED PATROL

- **3.** Indian Naval Ship (INS) Karmuk, an indigenously built Missile Corvette participated in the pre-deployment briefing at Belawan, Indonesia.
- **4.** The CORPAT will be executed along the International Maritime Boundary Line (IMBL) from 15 to 16 December 2022 and will conclude with a debrief at Port Blair.









5. CORPATs help build understanding and interoperability between navies, and facilitate institution of measures to prevent and suppress Illegal Unreported Unregulated (IUU) fishing, drug trafficking, maritime terrorism, armed robbery and piracy.

Japanese dengue vaccine QDENGA approved by European Union

1. The European Union has approved Takeda's dengue vaccine, making it the second such vaccine to receive approval from the bloc. Takeda is a Japanese pharmaceutical company.



- 2. According to the WHO, mosquito-borne dengue infects between 100 and 400 million people annually and can result in hemorrhagic fever, though more than 80 percent of cases are mild or asymptomatic.
- **3.** Dengvaxia, the first dengue vaccine in the world, is already available in the European Union, but it is only for people who have already had a confirmed infection.
- **4.** QDENGA (TAK-003) is a dengue vaccine that is based on a live-attenuated dengue serotype 2 virus, which provides the genetic "backbone" for all four dengue virus serotypes and is designed to protect against any of these serotypes.

NASA's Perseverance rover collects first dust samples on Mars

1. NASA's Perseverance rover bottled up two samples of the Martian surface on December 2 and December 6, according to the agency's Jet Propulsion Laboratory (JPL).



- **2.** Scientists will study Martian samples returned to Earth with powerful scientific equipment to look for signs of ancient microbial life.
- **3.** While most of the samples collected will be rock, researchers also want to study Martian regolith (dust) to learn about geological processes on the red planet and help mitigate against challenges that astronauts will face when we send a mission to Mars.
- **4.** The Martian surface is known to contain perchlorate, a toxic chemical that could threaten astronauts' health if large amounts are inhaled or ingested.









535 railway stations covered One Station One Product scheme

- Railways minister Ashwini Vaishnaw on Friday said that 535 railway stations are covered under the One Station One Product (OSOP) scheme
- 2. Ministry of Railways has launched 'One Station One Product' (OSOP) scheme over Indian Railways with objectives to promote 'Vocal for Local' vision of the Government of India, provide a market for



local/indigenous products and create additional income opportunities for the marginalised sections of society

- 3. The Product categories, under this scheme, include the following
 - i. Handicrafts/ Artefacts
 - ii. Textiles and Handlooms
 - iii. Traditional Garments
 - iv. Local agricultural produce/ Processed/semi processed foods.
- **4.** The pilot of the scheme was started on 25.03.2022 and presently 535 stations are covered with 572 OSOP outlets.

Pradhan Mantri National Apprenticeship Mela to be held on December 12

1. The Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship announced that the Pradhan Mantri National Apprenticeship Mela (PMNAM) will be conducted on December 12. Interested people can register for the event at the official website — apprenticeshipindia.gov.in



- 2. PMNAM will be conducted across 197 locations in 25 states and union territories this year. The event will see participation of several local businesses that will provide local youth the opportunity to shape their careers through apprenticeship training

- **4.** Through this fair, candidates will also earn National Council for Vocational Education and Training (NCVET)-recognised certifications post the training session, which will help improve their employability rate.
- **5.** To be eligible for this event, interested candidates should have successfully cleared class 5 to class 12 and must have skill training certificates, or ITI diploma holders or graduates.









KRISHI UDAN 2.0

58 airports covered under Krishi Udan Scheme 2.0

- 1. Krishi Udan Scheme 2.0 was announced on 27 October 2021 enhancing the existing provisions, mainly focusing on transporting perishable food products from the hilly areas, North-Eastern States and tribal areas.
- 2. For facilitating and incentivising movement of agriproduce by air transportation, Airports Authority of India (AAI) provides full waiver of Landing, Parking, Terminal Navigational Landing Charges (TNLC) and Route Navigation Facility Charges (RNFC) for Indian freighters and P2C (Passenger-to-Cargo) Aircraft.
- 3. 58 airports have been included under Krishi Udan 2.0.
- **4.** Krishi Udan Scheme is a convergence scheme where eight Ministries/Departments namely Ministry of Civil Aviation, Department of Agriculture & Farmers' Welfare, Department of Animal Husbandry and Dairying, Department of Fisheries, Ministry of Food Processing Industries, Department of Commerce, Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Ministry of Development of North-Eastern Region would leverage their existing schemes to strengthen the logistics for transportation of Agri-produce.
- **5.** The Scheme aims to ensure seamless, cost-effective, time bound, air transportation and associated logistics for all Agri-produce originating especially from North-East, hilly and tribal regions of the country

Cyclone Mandous ranked 'severe': IMD issues red alert in 13 Tamil Nadu districts

1. India Meteorological Department (IMD) on Friday said the cyclonic storm 'Mandous' has hit the southern Indian states of Tamil Nadu and Puducherry coasts and is likely to cause severe damages.



- **2.** Fishermen have been advised not to venture out in the sea.
- **3.** Fearing heavy rains, all the schools and colleges will be closed on Friday in Puducherry and Karaikal.
- **4.** Under its influence, the states are likely to witness very heavy rains and squally weather with a wind speed of 65-75 kmph gusting to 85 kmph from midnight of today to the early hours of tomorrow.
