


Important News: International

Methane Global Tracker report, 2023

Why in news: The International Energy Agency (IEA) released the annual Methane Global Tracker report in 2023.

1. The report points that energy sector accounts for around 40% of the total average methane emissions from human activity.



- 2. Oil and natural gas companies are known to release methane into the atmosphere when natural gas is flared or vented as well as through leaks.
- **3.** Fossil fuel companies emitted 120 million metric tonnes of methane into the atmosphere in 2022 and have done nothing to find and fix leaking infrastructure.

4. Recommendations:

- Methane cuts (by 75%) from the energy sector are among the cheapest options to limit near-term global warming
- Reducing wastage, eg by leak detection, repair and upgrading leaky equipment would cost less than 3% of the net income received by oil and gas industry in 2022.

5. About Methane:

- It is a greenhouse gas (GHG) responsible for 30% of the warming since preindustrial times, second only to carbon dioxide (CO2).
- It is 80 times more potent at warming than CO2.

6. About IEA:

- International Energy Agency is an autonomous Intergovernmental Organisation established in 1974 in Paris, France.
- It mainly focuses on its energy policies which include economic development, energy security and environmental protection

Windsor framework

Why in news: UK Government recently reached a landmark deal with the European Union (Known as Windsor Framework) on post-Brexit trade rules that will govern Northern Ireland.











- 1. The 'Windsor Framework' will replace the Northern Ireland Protocol (an addendum to the Brexit deal agreed by Boris Johnson and the EU in 2019.)
- 2. The protocol was created to prevent a hard border on the island of Ireland by keeping Northern Ireland aligned with the EU, meaning goods don't need to be checked between the Republic and the province.
- **3.** It improves upon its predecessor via on 3 points –
- **4.** The deal will protect the flow of free trade between Great Britain and Northern Ireland by creating green and red lanes for goods flowing into Northern Ireland.
 - Goods that might end up entering the Republic of Ireland will be placed in the red lane for checks before entering Northern Ireland.
 - Goods destined to remain in Northern Ireland will flow freely.
- **5.** Protect "Northern Ireland's place in the union" by allowing the UK government to determine VAT rates applicable in Northern Ireland, as opposed to the current system where the rates are determined by the EU.
- **6.** A new "Stormont brake" would allow Northern Ireland's devolved government to pull an "emergency brake" on any new EU laws from being imposed on the province.

International Court of Justice

Why in news: A group of 16 countries led by Vanuatu - an island country in the South Pacific Ocean, recently launched an effort to fight the problem of climate change at the United Nations (UN), and the group seeks an advisory opinion from the International Court of Justice (ICJ) on the issue of climate change.



- 1. ICJ is the principal judicial organ of the UN.
- 2. It was established in 1945 by the UN Charter and is lcated at Hague, Netherlands.
- **3.** It is one of the six principal organs of UN.
- 4. Official languages: French and English
- **5.** It looks into two types of cases: legal disputes between States submitted to it by them and requests for advisory opinions on legal questions referred to it by United Nations organs and specialized agencies (advisory proceedings).









- Only member States of UN and other States which have become parties to the Statute of the Court or which have accepted its jurisdiction under certain conditions may register cases.
- The court's judgments in contentious cases are final and binding on the parties to a case and without appeal.
- Advisory opinions are not binding.

6. Composition:

- 15 judges
- elected for terms of office of nine years by United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) and Security Council (UNSC).
- To be elected, a candidate must receive an absolute majority of the votes in both UNGA and UNSC.
- One-third of the composition of the Court is renewed every three years.
- Judges are eligible for re-election.

Senior Mission Leaders' (SML) course

Why in news: Centre seeks nominations for Senior Mission Leaders' course beginning in Japan from June 19





- 2. The SML course is designed to prepare participants to assume roles and responsibilities in a mission's leadership team, such as Special Representative of the Secretary-General (SRSG), Deputy SRSG, Force Commander, Police Commissioner, Director of Mission Support, or Chief of Staff.
- 3. About UN Peacekeeping Force:
 - UN Peacekeeping began in 1948 when the UN Security Council authorized the deployment of UN military observers to the Middle East.
 - It deploys troops and police from around the world, integrating them with civilian peacekeepers to address a range of mandates set by the UN Security Council (UNSC) and the General Assembly in conflict prone areas.
 - Peacekeeping forces are contributed by member states on a voluntary basis.
 - India has been among the largest troop-contributing countries to the UN peacekeeping missions.

India wins GSMA Government Leadership Award 2023

Why in news: GSM Association (GSMA) has conferred Government Leadership Award 2023 to India for implementing best practices in telecom policy and regulation.



1. The GSMA, which represents more than 750 mobile operators and 400 companies in the telecom ecosystem, recognizes one country every year. India was declared winner in the ceremony held at Mobile World Congress Barcelona on 27 Feb, 2023.

2. Important Govt Initiatives in Telecom:

- 'National Broadband Mission',2019: to facilitate universal and equitable access to broadband services across the country, especially in rural and remote areas. The Mission is part of the National Digital Communications Policy, 2018.
- Prime Minister Wi-Fi Access Network Interface (PM-WANI): development of Public Wi-Fi Networks
- Bharat Net Project: It is the world's largest rural broadband connectivity programme using Optical fibre implemented by Bharat Broadband Network Ltd. (BBNL).
- Draft Telecommunication Bill 2022: The Government of India has expressed plans to expand the definition of "telecommunication services" by including Over-the-top (OTT) communication services under the same umbrella, which means that internet-based communications and OTT would both require a licence to offer services.

- **2.** FIFA World Cup is the most prestigious tournament in the world taking place quadrennially.
- **3.** First FIFA WC was held in Uruguay in 1930, Won by Uruguay.








India hosts first meeting of Governing Board of BIMSTEC Energy Centre (BEC)

Why in news: The central government hosted the first meeting of the governing board of BIMSTEC Energy Centre (BEC) on 27 February, 2023 in Bengaluru.





- **2.** The Meeting recommended to add the additional following areas under the specialized Wings of BEC: (a) Cyber Security, (b) Green Hydrogen (c) Energy Transition.
- **3.** The Bay of Bengal Initiative for Multi-Sectoral Technical and Economic Cooperation (BIMSTEC) is a regional multilateral organisation.
- **4.** Its members lie in the littoral and adjacent areas of the Bay of Bengal constituting a contiguous regional unity. Out of the 7 members -
 - Bangladesh
 - Bhutan
 - India
 - Nepal
 - Sri Lanka
 - Mynamar
 - Thailand

Methane Global Tracker report

Why in news: The report said 75 per cent of methane emissions from the energy sector can be reduced with the help of cheap and readily available technology. However, fossil fuel companies have failed to take any substantial action regarding the issue.



- 1. According to the International Energy Agency's (IEA) annual Methane Global Tracker report, fossil fuel companies emitted 120 million metric tonnes of methane into the atmosphere in 2022, only slightly below the record highs seen in 2019.
- 2. It added that these companies have done almost nothing to curb the emissions despite their pledges to find and fix leaking infrastructure.









- **3.** Methane is responsible for 30% of the global warming happening on the earth. It is a greenhouse gas. The potential of methane to warm the earth's surface is 80 times higher than carbon dioxide.
- **4.** The NOAA of the US says that atmospheric levels of methane increased to 17 parts per billion in 2021.
- **5.** The energy sector accounts for around 40 per cent of the total average methane emissions from human activity, as oil and natural gas companies are known to release methane into the atmosphere when natural gas is flared or vented. The greenhouse gas is also released through leaks from valves and other equipment during the drilling, extraction and transportation process.

India, Australia sign deal to recognise qualifications

Why in news: India and Australia signed a framework mechanism for mutual recognition of educational and skill qualifications to ease the mobility of students and professionals between the two countries.



- 1. India and Australia signed a Framework Mechanism for Mutual Recognition of Qualifications that will help ease the mobility of students and professionals between the two countries.
- 2. This agreement is part of the commitment by Prime Ministers of both countries at the 2nd India-Australia Virtual Summit held on 21st March 2022, wherein they had agreed to establish a Joint Taskforce for mutual recognition of qualifications.
- **3.** It has come up with a comprehensive mechanism that covers both education and skill qualifications of the two countries and will help facilitate two way mobility of young people for education and employment purposes by mutually recognizing various levels of education and skill qualifications.
- **4.** In the bilateral meeting the two sides also discussed issues like promoting student mobility and enhancing research and academic collaborations between Indian and Australian universities through the mechanism of Joint/ Dual/ Twinning degrees that have been brought in recently under NEP2020.

Why in news: The discussions at the conference will also cover issues related to operations, combat readiness, logistics, training, human resource development and training.



The Indian Navy remains focused on being a combat-ready, credible, cohesive and future-proof force and continues to assiduously execute its mandate as the maritime security guarantor of the country.

- **2.** Earlier, in Nov 22, INS Trikand had participated in the CMF led Operation Sea Sword 2.
- **3.** She will exercise with participants from over 50 nations and international maritime agencies with the common aim of enhancing maritime security and keeping sea lanes in the region safe for maritime commerce.









- **4.** Participation in exercises like Sea Sword 2 and IMX/CE-23 enables the Indian Navy in strengthening relationships and enhancing interoperability and collective maritime capability with maritime partners in the IOR.
- **5.** It also enables the Navy contribute constructively to regional stability and security.

Mental State of the World Report

Why in news: The third annual mental state of the world report was released recently by a non-profit called Sapien Labs. The report is based on the survey of over 4 lakh participants across 64 countries.



- 1. The report's mental health quotient found that, on a 300-point scale, the score of mental health fell by 33 points on average over the two years of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 2. It found that mental health challenges are more likely among young adults. Individuals between ages 18 and 24 have lower "social self", which measures how an individual perceives themselves and their ability to maintain a meaningful relationship.
- 3. The global average MHQ was 64.
- **4.** The report used the Mental Health Quotient to learn about the mental health of people in different countries. The quotient was calculated based on an online survey. The participants were randomly picked from India, Spain, France, Arab countries, North Africa, Germany, and other western countries.
- **5.** Tanzania had good mental health and topped the list with an MHQ of 93.6. Panama, Puerto Rico, Dominican Republic were in the second, third, and fourth places respectively. The score of the USA was 67.9, Australia: 54.4, Germany: 65.9, France 74.1, UK: 46.2.

UN High Seas Treaty

Why in news: After more than a decade of negotiations, the UN members have agreed (in New York, US) on the first-ever treaty – the UN High Seas Treaty, to protect the world's oceans outside national boundaries.











- 1. 2/3rd of the world's oceans are currently considered international waters/high seas. But until now only about 1% of these waters have been protected.
- 2. Nearly 10% of marine species on the high seas were found to be at risk of extinction mainly due to overfishing and pollution.
- **3.** The treaty places 30% of the world's international waters into protected areas (MPAs) by 2030, and puts more money into marine conservation and new rules for mining at sea.
- **4.** Richer nations have pledged money for the delivery of the treaty. For example, the EU announced nearly 820m euros.
- 5. It also provides for -
 - Arrangements for sharing marine genetic resources, such as biological material from plants and animals in the ocean.
 - Requirements for environmental assessments for deep sea activities like mining.

U.N. takes step towards new way of tracking greenhouse gases

Why in news: The three major greenhouses gases are carbon dioxide, methane and nitrous oxide. Of those, CO₂ accounts for around 66% of the warming effect on the climate.



- The U.N.'s World Meteorological Organisation has come up with a new Global Greenhouse Gas Monitoring Infrastructure that aims to provide better ways of measuring planet-warming pollution and help inform policy choices.
- 2. The GGGMI will engage with the broader scientific community and other UN agencies involved in GHG monitoring activities.
- **3.** The infrastructure will improve our understanding of the carbon cycle and provide critical and timely input to the UNFCCC processes.
- **4.** It will help humans understand climate change and to provide support to mitigation action taken by the Parties to the UNFCCC and the Paris Agreement.
- **5.** The World Meteorological Organization (est. 1950; HQ: Geneva) is a specialized agency of the United Nations responsible for promoting international cooperation on atmospheric science, climatology, hydrology and geophysics








BSE & UN Women India launches a new programme, 'FinEMPOWER'

Why in news: India, Bangladesh, Egypt, France, Morocco and Nepal are co-chairs of the 'Group of Friends to Promote Accountability for Crimes Against Peacekeepers'.



- 1. India has recently launched a "Group of Friends" to promote accountability for crimes against peacekeepers. It was launched during India's presidency of the United Nations Security Council (UNSC).
- 2. "Group of Friends to Promote Accountability for Crimes Against Peacekeepers" is an informal forum that will work to promote accountability for all acts of violence against the United Nations peacekeepers.
- **3.** The Group of Friends involves countries championing the implementation of the provisions of the UNSC resolution 2589, which was adopted in August 2021 under India's UNSC presidency.
- **4.** It seeks to provide capacity building and technical assistance for the host states' authorities to prevent and address such crimes.
- **5.** The forum will actively share information with the Secretary-General and help member states that are hosting or have hosted peacekeeping operations and assist them in bringing the perpetrators to justice.









6. Resolution 2589 calls on the member states that are hosting or having hosted the UN peacekeeping operations to take necessary measures to bring to justice the perpetrators involved in all acts of violence against the United Nations personnel,

India Day Celebrations at PDAC-2023 in Toronto

Why in news: India Day was celebrated at the PDAC-2023 convention in Toronto on Tuesday.

- **1.** Large gathering of prospective investors, mining experts and mineral explorers also attended the program.
- **2.** On this occasion Indian officials gave presentation on the mining opportunities in India, followed by a question answer session.
- **3.** Mines Secretary, Shri Vivek Bhardwaj also had one to one interaction with the dignitaries present on the occasion.
- **4.** Event has concluded with a small Holi celebrations and distribution of sweets and millet items brought from India as part of International Year of Millets initiative by the Government of India.

Russians launch six Kinzhal hypersonic missiles at once for first time on Ukraine

Why in news: Russia used the nuclear-capable Kinzhal missile, which it has described as a hypersonic weapon, on a few occasions in the first weeks of its invasion last year. But the powerful weapon, which Ukraine doesn't have the capability to shoot down, has rarely been seen over the country's skies.



- **1.** The Kh-47M2, nicknamed "Kinzhal" (Dagger), is a nuclear-capable, Russian airlaunched ballistic missile.
- 2. It was one of six "next generation" weapons unveiled by Russian President Putin during a speech in March 2018.
- **3.** A hypersonic missile is a weapon system which flies at least at the speed of Mach 5 i.e. five times the speed of sound and is manoeuvrable.
- **4.** The Kinzhal can reach speeds of up to Mach 10 (12,350 km/hr). It can carry both conventional and nuclear warheads with a payload of up to 480 kg and a thermonuclear option with a 10-50 kt warhead.









5. It has a reported range of 1,500-2,000 km and a launch weight of approximately 4,300 kg. This missile maneuvers during all stages of its flight to overcome hostile air defense systems.

2. 5th ASEAN-India Business summit

Why in news: The 5th Asean-India Business Summit was held at the Berjaya Times Square Hotel in Kuala Lumpur on March 6 this year.




- 1. The summit is part of the Asean-India Year of Friendship (an observation commemorating the 30-year-long engagement between the 10-member bloc and India), is an essential forum for charting the future roadmap for the business and economic engagement between the two parties.
- **2.** It was organized with assistance from the Indian Government, through the External Affairs Ministry's Economic Diplomacy Division and Malaysian Government's International Trade and Industry Ministry.
- **3.** The 5th ASEAN India Business Summit was held under the theme "Strengthening and Moving Forward ASEAN India Economic Relations for the strategic business partnership"
- **4.** The session focused on improving trade ties and expanding business engagement in digital technology partnerships and fintech, among other sectors.

PM Modi, Hasina to launch Rs 377-cr cross-border oil pipeline

Why in news: The 130-km-long friendship pipeline on West Bengal border will transport diesel from Numaligarh Refinery in Assam.





2. The 130-km-long Indo-Bangla Friendship Pipeline (IBFPL) pipeline is part of several bilateral measures to allow Bangladesh to tap into larger volumes of energy to meet its growing domestic demands. It would carry high speed diesel from Numaligarh Refinery Limited (NRL) in Assam.









- **3.** The pipeline would carry fuel from NRL's marketing terminal in Siliguri, West Bengal to the state-run Bangladesh Petroleum Corporation's (BPC) oil depot in Parbatipur city in Dinajpur District of the neighbouring country.
- **4.** One million metric tonnes per annum (MMTPA) can potentially be transported through the pipeline.
- **5.** Only five km of the pipeline would run within Indian territory, the rest would run through Bangladesh.

India, US relaunch commercial dialogue on supply chain, establish semiconductor partnership

Why in news: After three years of stalled commercial dialogue between the two biggest democracies in the world, India and the US, on 10 March re-launched their commercial dialogue to discuss supply chain issues and agree upon a semiconductor partnership initiative.



- 1. US Commerce Secretary Gina Raimondo and Union Minister of Commerce and Industry Piyush Goyal jointly addressed a press conference at the India-USA Commercial Dialogue.
- **2.** The dialogue focused on several emerging areas, including building supply chains, facilitating clean energy cooperation, talent development, and post-pandemic economic recovery for start-ups and small businesses.
- **3.** Both the dignitaries discussed India-US strategic partnership, as well as economic and commercial engagement between the two countries, including through the Initiative on Critical and Emerging Technology (iCET) and the Indo-Pacific Economic Framework (IPEF).
- **4.** iCET aims to elevate and expand Indo-U.S. strategic technology partnership and defense industrial cooperation between the governments, businesses, and academic institutions of the two countries.
- **5.** The initiative will be spearheaded by the National Security Council Secretariat in India and the US National Security Council.

"Reddmatter": New superconductor Material

Why in news: Materials that can conduct electric currents without any loss—so-called superconductors—have been wildly impractical because they typically need to be extremely cooled, to around minus 320 degrees Fahrenheit, and











subjected to extreme pressure to work.

- 1. A group of researchers at the University of Rochester report that they have created a new superconductor that can operate at room temperature and a much lower pressure than previously discovered superconducting materials.
- 2. It can operate at room temperature (21 degrees C) and much lower pressure (10,000 atmospheric pressure) than previously discovered superconducting materials.
- **3.** They named the resulting material "reddmatter," after observing how the material's hue changed from blue to pink to red as it got compressed.
- **4.** It is formed by combining lutetium (a rare earth metal) with hydrogen and nitrogen
- **5.** Applications: The new superconductor could help create lossless electrical grids, and better and cheaper magnets for use in future nuclear fusion reactors, among other things.

India and Australia join hands to develop innovative ecosystem

Why in news: Atal Innovation Mission (AIM), Niti Aayog, and the Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation (CSIRO), Australia's national science agency, have signed a letter of intent to encourage joint cooperation to drive innovation activities in areas of national challenges and shared priorities of both countries.



- 1. The core of the bilateral engagement is the India Australia Innovation and Technology Challenge (IA-ITC) - a program envisioned to bring together the innovation ecosystems of India and Australia to address our shared environmental and economic challenges by supporting cohorts of start-ups and SMEs on their commercialisation pathways and bring to market innovative techbased solutions spanning across circular economy, energy transition and food system resilience etc.
- 2. The program intends to leverage the complementary capabilities and resources of the innovation ecosystem of both the countries.
- **3.** The IA-ITC builds on the success of the India Australia Circular Economy (IACE) hackathon 2021, which witnessed university students, start-ups, and SMEs from both India and Australia develop innovative tech-based solutions for circularity in food system value chain.

World's first 3D-printed rocket-Terran 1

Why in news: The 3d-printed rocket, called Terran 1, was scheduled to launch on a debut flight from Launch Complex 16 at Cape Canaveral Space Force Station in Florida. Despite three attempts, the company was unable to launch the rocket after suffering two last-minute aborts, including on that fired up its engines, and one hold when boat encroached in the offshore safety zone.



- 1. The Terran 1 rocket is built by California aerospace startup Relativity Space. The rocket is 110 feet (33.5 meters) tall with a diameter of 7.5 feet (2.2 meters).
- 2. It is powered by Aeon engines using liquid oxygen and liquid natural gas as propellants. Eighty-five percent of its mass is 3D printed with metal alloys, including the engines.
- **3.** The rocket will eventually be capable of putting up to 2,755 pounds (1,250 kilograms) into low Earth orbit.
- **4.** 3D printing or additive manufacturing is a process of making three-dimensional solid objects from a digital file.
- 5. In an additive process, an object is created by laying down successive layers of material until the object is created. Each of these layers can be seen as a thinly sliced cross-section of the object.

MARITIME PARTNERSHIP EXERCISE (MPX) WITH FRENCH NAVY

Why in news: Indian Navy's indigenously built guided missile frigate, INS Sahyadri participated in a Maritime Partnership Exercise (MPX) with French Navy (FN) ships FS Dixmude, a Mistral Class Amphibious Assault Ship and FS La Fayette, a La Fayette Class Frigate, in the Arabian Sea on 10 – 11 March 2023.



- 1. The exercise witnessed a wide spectrum of evolutions at sea which included cross deck landings, boarding exercises and seamanship evolutions. The seamless conduct of the exercise reaffirmed the interoperability and high level of cooperation between the two navies.
- 2. INS Sahyadri is fitted with state-of –the art weapons and sensors, which makes her capable of detecting and neutralising air, surface and sub-surface threats.
- **3.** The ship is a part of Indian Navy's Eastern Fleet based at Visakhapatnam, under operational control of FOCinC (East).









FACTS-

- **4.** INS Sahyadri (F49) is a Shivalik-class stealth multi-role frigate built for the Indian Navy.
- **5.** The Shivalik class or Project 17 class is a class of multi-role stealth frigates in service with the Indian Navy. They are the first stealth warships built in India. They were designed to have better stealth features and land-attack capabilities than the preceding Talwar-class frigates
- **6.** A total of three ships were built between 2000 and 2010, and all three were in commission by 2012 Shivalik, Satpura and Shayadri.

WHO Global Report on Sodium Intake Reduction.

Why in news: Only 5% of 194 WHO member states are protected by mandatory and comprehensive sodium reduction policies; 73% lack full range of implementing such policies.



- 1. The report allocated a sodium country score from 1 (the lowest level) to 4 (the highest level) to each member state based on the level of implementation of sodium reduction policies and other measures. This is a first-of-its kind step.
- 2. According to the WHO Global Report on Sodium Intake, Reduction two million deaths can be prevented by 2025 and seven million by 2030 if policies recommended by the World Health Organization to reduce sodium intake are implemented,
- **3.** The global average salt intake is estimated to be 10.8 grams per day, more than double the WHO recommendation of fewer than 5 grams of salt per day (one teaspoon).
- **4.** Bread and bread products are the most targeted food category for sodium reduction across the implemented reformulation policies in member states.
- **5.** Sodium (Na) is a chemical element of the alkali metal group(Group 1) of the periodic table. It is a very soft silvery-white metal. It is the most common alkali metal and the sixth most abundant element on Earth, comprising 2.8 per cent of Earth's crust.

Air pollution mission: NASA, Italian space agency to study 11 most populated cities globally, including Delhi

Why in news: NASA and the Italian Space Agency are partnering on the MAIA mission which will use data from an Earth observation satellite to help scientists find correlations between air pollution and health problems in major cities across the world including New Delhi.



- **1.** National Aeronautics and Space Administration and Agenzia Spaziale Italiana (ASI) will build and launch the Multi-Angle Imager for Aerosols (MAIA) missions, NASA announced on March 8, 2023.
- 2. The mission is set to launch before the end of 2024. The observatory will consist of the PLATINO-2 satellite, which ASI will provide and a science instrument that will be built at NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory.
- **3.** The three-year mission will focus on 11 primary target areas: Los Angeles, Atlanta, Boston, Rome, Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, Barcelona, Spain, Beijing, Johannesburg, New Delhi, Taipei, Taiwan and Tel Aviv.
- 4. MAIA is a state-of-the-art satellite instrument producing data that will be used in health studies to examine the health effects of various types of air pollution. The MAIA mission will collect and analyse data from the observatory, sensors on the ground and atmospheric models.
- 5. Its measurements of sunlight reflecting off airborne particles will help researchers determine the abundance, size and optical properties of certain pollutants in the atmosphere.

Doha Political Declaration adopted by world leaders to fast-track progress in least developed countries

Why in news: The declaration is significant since it comes amid simultaneous global risks of rising cost of living and inflation as well as climate change.

- 1. The Fifth United Nations Conference on the Least

 Developed Countries (LDC5) held under the theme "From

 Potential to Prosperity" in Qatar concluded with adoption of the 'Doha Political

 Declaration' by the world leaders.
- 2. It is a 10-year plan to put the world's 46 most vulnerable countries back on track to achieving the UN-mandated Sustainable Development Goals (SDG).
- **3.** DPoA (2022-2031) consisted of six key focus areas:









- eradicating poverty;
- leveraging the potential of science and technology;
- addressing climate change;
- environmental degradation;
- recovering from COVID-19 pandemic;
- building resilience against future shocks for risk-informed sustainable development;
- 4. Least developed countries (LDCs):
 - They are low-income countries confronting severe structural impediments to sustainable development. They are highly vulnerable to economic and environmental shocks.
 - There are currently 46 countries on the list of LDCs which is reviewed every three years by the Committee for Development Policy (CDP) of the UN.
- **5.** These countries, which include 33 African nations, face the challenge of high debt costs while having inadequate liquidity to provide essential services.

India remains biggest arms importer between 2018-22 despite drop in overall imports

Why in news: Russia's share of total Indian arms imports fell from 64% to 45% during 2013–17 and 2018–22.

- 1. According to the SIPRI, India remained the world's largest arms importer for the five-year period between 2018-22 even though its arms imports dropped by 11% between 2013-17 and 2018-22.
- 2. Russia was the largest supplier of arms to India in both 2013–17 and 2018–22, but its share of total Indian arms imports fell from 64% to 45% while France (29%) and the US (11%) emerged as the 2nd and 3rd largest supplier between 2018-22.
- **3.** Among the top 10 arms exporters for the period 2018-22, India was the biggest arms export market to three countries Russia, France and Israel and the second largest export market to South Korea.
- **4.** The U.S. share of global arms exports increased from 33% to 40% while Russia's fell from 22% to 16%.
- **5.** Established in 1966 and based in Stockholm (Sweden), SIPRI (Stockholm International Peace Research Institute) provides data, analysis and recommendations, to policymakers, researchers, media and the interested public.

India-Bhutan satellite ground station inaugurated at Thimphu

Why in news: The ground station will allow the scientists at Bhutan to directly receive the data from the India-Bhutan satellite and process the data in realtime.



- 1. India-Bhutan Satellite is also known as the ISRO Nano Satellite 2 for Bhutan (INS-2B).
- **2.** It was launched as a payload on ISRO's PSLV C54 rocket on November 26, 2022. It has been jointly developed by scientists from both countries.
- **3.** The primary payload on the satellite is the NanoMx multispectral optical imager, is to help Bhutan with natural resource management.
- **4.** The secondary payload was developed by the Department of Information Technology and Telecom in Bhutan, and is an Automatic Packet Reporting System (APRS) repeater to serve the amateur radio community, relaying realtime information about the region.
- 5. The ground station that ISRO worked with the scientists from Bhutan on, is equipped to receive the signals from the satellite.

- **2.** For the first time in the exercise series, both armies participated in a command post Exercise, which involved Battalion and Brigade level planning elements and computer wargaming.
- **3.** First conducted in 2005, this exercise underscores the strong and long-standing bilateral defence relationship between both countries and enhances cooperation between the two armies.
- **4.** The ten-day long joint training that commenced on 05th March fostered common understanding of mechanised warfare in emerging threats and









evolving technologies, developing inter-operability through a computer simulation-based Wargame using joint operational and tactical procedures controlled through a joint command post.

Denmark inaugurates world's first cross-border CO₂ storage site

Why in news: Denmark inaugurates a project to store carbon dioxide 1,800 metres beneath the North Sea, the first country in the world to bury CO₂ imported from abroad.



- 1. The CO₂ graveyard, where the carbon is injected to prevent further warming of the atmosphere, is on the site of an old oil field.
- 2. Led by British chemical giant Ineos and German oil company Wintershall Dea, the "Greensand" project is expected to store up to 8 million tons of CO₂ per year by 2030.
- **3.** First captured at the source, the CO₂ is then liquefied, in Belgium in Greensand's case, then transported, currently by ship but potentially by pipelines, and stored in reservoirs such as geological cavities or depleted oil and gas fields.
- **4.** The North Sea is particularly suitable for this type of project as the region already has pipelines and potential storage sites after decades of oil and gas production.

Bharti-backed OneWeb confirms deploying 40 satellites after SpaceX launch

Why in news: Bharti-backed OneWeb on Friday confirmed successfully deploying 40 satellites put up by a SpaceX rocket that took off from a launch station in Florida. The Launch enables company to expand coverage of communication services worldwide



- 1. This launch is OneWeb's 17th to-date and the penultimate mission, setting up the company set to complete its first-generation (Gen 1) low earth orbit (LEO) satellite constellation and enable global coverage in 2023.
- 2. With 582 satellites now in orbit, OneWeb will complete a global footprint of its Gen 1 constellation with a launch set to take place later this month with Indian Space Research Organisation (Isro).









- **3.** The launch enables OneWeb to continue expanding its connectivity as it grows its fleet of satellites and seeks to initiate services for more partners around the world.
- **4.** OneWeb already has connectivity solutions in key geographies across the globe and is bringing new areas online by partnering with leading providers including VEON, Orange, Galaxy Broadband, Paratus, Telespazio, and more.
- **5.** OneWeb and its partners are focused on the mission to bridge the digital divide and provide internet connectivity to a greater number of unconnected and underserved rural and remote communities and businesses.

IPCC meet in Switzerland: The significance, likely impact

Why in news: The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change, a UN-backed scientific body whose periodic assessments of climate science form the basis of global climate action, is set to finalise what is known as the Synthesis Report.



- 1. The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) is meeting in Switzerland this week to finalise the last report of its sixth assessment cycle, which is expected to set up the tempo for a string of climate change-focused discussions over the next fortnight.
- 2. The Synthesis Report is supposed to be a relatively non-technical summary of the previous reports, aimed largely at policymakers around the world. It is meant to address a wide range of policy-relevant scientific questions related to climate change, but, like all IPCC reports, in a non-prescriptive manner.
- **3.** This will bring an end to the Sixth Assessment Report, a collective work of thousands of scientists over a period of eight years, starting in February 2015.
- **4.** As part of the sixth assessment cycle, the IPCC published three comprehensive reports one on scientific evidence for climate change, the other on impacts and vulnerabilities, and the third exploring mitigation options available. Besides these, special reports on the feasibility of keeping global temperature rise within the 1.5 degree Celsius limit, and the connections between land, ocean and cryosphere, were also released.

US recognises McMahon Line as international boundary between China and Arunachal Pradesh

Why in news: The bipartisan Senators' resolution condemns additional China's provocations, including the People's Republic of China's use of military force to change the status quo along the Line of Actual Control.



- 1. The United States recognises the McMahon Line as the international boundary between China and Arunachal Pradesh, according to a bipartisan Senate resolution which sees Arunachal Pradesh as an integral part of India.
- 2. The resolution, which comes following the biggest clash between the Republic of India and China in the Eastern Sector along the Line of Actual Control in six years, reaffirms that the United States recognises the McMahon Line as the international boundary between China and the Indian state of Arunachal Pradesh.









- **3.** The resolution also pushes back against People's Republic of China (PRC) claims that Arunachal Pradesh is PRC territory, which is a part of the PRC's increasingly aggressive and expansionist policies.
- **4.** The McMahon Line serves as the de facto boundary between China and India in the Eastern Sector.
- **5.** It specifically represents the boundary between Arunachal Pradesh and Tibet, from Bhutan in the west to Myanmar in the east.

India Signs Loan Agreement With World Bank For 781 km Green National Highways In 4 States

Why in news: It will be done using a loan of \$500 million from the World Bank, with a total project cost of US\$1288.24 million (7,662.47 crores).



- 1. Road and Highways Minister Nitin Gadkari revealed that the Government of India and the World Bank have signed a contract for the construction of the Green National Highway Corridors Project (GNHCP) with a total length of 781 km in the states of Himachal Pradesh, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, and Andhra Pradesh.
- 2. The objective of the Green National Highway Corridors Project is to demonstrate safe and green highways keeping in view climate resilience and use of green technologies.
- **3.** To do this, provisions for natural resource conservation will be incorporated using cement-treated sub-base/reclaimed asphalt pavement, the use of local/marginal materials like lime, fly ash, and waste plastic, and bio-engineering measures for slope protection like hydroseeding, coco/jute fiber, among other things.

RBI, UAE central bank sign pact to enhance cooperation

- 2. Central Bank of the United Arab Emirates (CBUAE) and RBI will jointly conduct proof-of-concept (PoC) and pilot(s) of bilateral CBDC bridge to facilitate cross-border CBDC transactions of remittances and trade
- **3.** The central bank said that bilateral engagement of testing cross-border use case of CBDCs is expected to reduce costs and increase efficiency of cross border transactions.
- **4.** The MoU also provides for technical collaboration and knowledge sharing on matters related to Fintech and financial products and services.
- **5.** The apex bank identified eight banks for phase-wise participation in the retail CBDC pilot and the first phase shall commence with four lenders State Bank of India, ICICI Bank, YES Bank, and IDFC First Bank.

ICC judges issue arrest warrant for Vladimir Putin over alleged war crimes

Why in news: The international criminal court (ICC) in The Hague has issued an arrest warrant for Vladimir Putin for overseeing the abduction of Ukrainian children, sending Russia another significant step on the path to becoming a pariah state.



- **1.** The situation between Russia and Ukraine has been poor ever since the annexation of Crimea, a south-eastern Ukrainian province by Russia in 2014.
- **2.** Putin invoked Article 51 of the UN Charter, which enshrines inherent right of individual or collective self-defence in order to protect Article 1 (the right to self-determination of Donbas region).
- **3.** Governed by an international treaty called 'The Rome Statute', the ICC is the world's first permanent international criminal court.
- **4.** It investigates and, where warranted, tries individuals charged with the gravest crimes of concern to the international community: genocide, war crimes, crimes against humanity and the crime of aggression.
- 5. ICC Headquarters at The Hague, the Netherlands.




- **1.** GPT-4 is a large multimodal model created by OpenAl.
- 2. Multimodal models can encompass more than just text GPT-4 also accepts images as input. Meanwhile, GPT-3 and GPT-3.5 only operated in one modality, text, meaning users could only ask questions by typing them out.
- **3.** GPT-4 also "exhibits human-level performance on various professional and academic benchmarks."
- **4.** For example, it can "answer tax-related questions, schedule a meeting among three busy people, or learn a user's creative writing style."
- **5.** ChatGPT is an artificial-intelligence chatbot developed by San Francisco-based Al research company OpenAl in 2022.
- **6.** The technology that underlies ChatGPT is referenced in the second half of its name, GPT, which stands for Generative Pre-trained Transformer.

Global Terrorism Index 2023

Why in news: Afghanistan has topped for the fourth consecutive year, despite attacks and deaths falling by 75 per cent and 58 per cent, respectively.





- 2. India ranked 13th on the index, marking only a marginal decrease from the previous year. Indian respondents refrained from ranking war and terrorism as the top threat to their daily safety, despite the country being one of the 25 worst-hit countries on the index.
- **3.** The Institute for Economics and Peace (IEP) publishes the Global Terrorism Index (GTI), which was created by Steve Killelea, an IT entrepreneur, and IEP founder. Since 2000, the index has provided a thorough overview of the important global trends over time in terrorism. It is an effort to rate the countries of the globe in terms of terrorist activity in a methodical manner.
- **4.** It is based on four parameters:









- Number of terrorist incidents per year.
- Number of fatalities caused by terrorists per year.
- Number of injuries caused by terrorists per year.
- Total property damage caused by terrorism per year.
- **5.** Pakistan saw the second-largest increase in terror-related fatalities globally last year, with a total of 643 dead. The highest year-to-year increase in deaths during the previous ten years was seen in Pakistan.

NASA unveils new spacesuit specially tailored for lunar wear

Why in news: NASA unveiled the first prototype for a newly designed next-generation spacesuit specially tailored and accessorised for the first astronauts expected to venture back to the moon's surface in the next few years.



- 1. Branded by Axiom as the "Axiom Extravehicular Mobility Unit," or AxEMU for short, the new suits are more streamlined and flexible than the old Apollo get-ups, with greater range of motion and variability in size and fit.
- **2.** t provides increased mobility, and its design accommodates a broader range of body types, making it more comfortable for astronauts.
- 3. The large clear bubble around the head provides a wider range of visibility and lighting, which will be essential for studying water ice in shadowed craters near the lunar south pole. The suit's headpiece also has a mount for a high-definition camera.
- **4.** Additionally, the AxEMU still uses diapers, which is an effective solution for the astronauts' waste management during their missions.
- **5.** Artemis 1 is aiming to send an uncrewed spacecraft around the moon using a combination of the never-flown Space Launch System rocket, along with the once-flown Orion spacecraft.

Finland Launches Worlds First Battery Made Out Of Sand

Why in news: Researchers from Finland have erected the first completely functional "sand battery" in the world, which can store green power for months at a time.

- 1. In Finland, the first completely functional sand battery has now been installed. It is a technology that could be used to keep homes warm throughout the winter because it can store sustainably generated heat for extended periods of time.
- 2. It functions by heating 100 tonnes of sand using electricity produced by solar or wind energy.
- 3. Polar Night Energy, a company that calls itself an "innovator of seasonal heat storage," created the battery.
- 4. Sand or sand-like materials are used as the store medium in a high-temperature thermal energy storage system known as a "sand battery." Sand acts as a heat reservoir for energy. Its primary function is to serve as a high-power and highcapacity energy storage system for extra wind and solar energy.
- 5. The energy is converted into heat, which can be utilised to heat buildings and other uses.

Why in news: Recently, an Inter-Ministerial delegation from India led by the Department of Commerce participated in the second Indo-Pacific Economic Framework for Prosperity (IPEF) negotiating round in Bali, Indonesia from March 13-19, 2023.



- 1. Negotiators from 13 other countries, including, the United States, Australia, Brunei Darussalam, India, Indonesia, Japan, the Republic of Korea, Malaysia, New Zealand, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, and Vietnam also participated in the Bali negotiating round.
- 2. During the Bali Round, discussions covered all the four pillars of the IPEF: Trade (Pillar I); Supply Chains (Pillar II); Clean Economy (Pillar III); and Fair Economy (Taxation & Anticorruption) (Pillar IV). India participated in the discussions related to Pillars II to IV.
- **3.** Indo-Pacific Economic Framework for Prosperity (IPEF) is an economic initiative launched by United States President Joe Biden on May 23, 2022.
- **4.** IPEF Partners have committed to an aggressive negotiating schedule throughout 2023 with the objective of realizing concrete benefits to enhance a shared vision for economic competitiveness and prosperity in their respective economies.

QS Rankings: IIT Delhi enters list of top 50 institutions

Why in news: The Indian Institute of Technology-Delhi has entered the list of top 50 institutions for engineering in the QS World University Rankings by Subject 2023.

1. As many as 44 programmes offered by Indian higher education institutions in different disciplines have figured in the top 100 globally. Last year, 35 Indian programmes made it to the top 100



- 2. The most represented Indian universities in this edition of the rankings are the University of Delhi (27 entries), IIT-Bombay (25 entries) and IIT-Kharagpur (23 entries).
- **3.** IIT-Bombay has featured among the world's top 100 in mathematics by clinching the 92nd spot, up by 25 places, and IIT-Kanpur ranks among the world's top 100 in engineering-electrical electronic (87th, up by 21 places) and in computer science information systems (96th, up by 13 places).
- **4.** The thirteen edition of the QS World University Rankings by Subject has ranked 66 Indian universities, cumulatively achieving 355 entries, a 18.7 per cent increase compared to last year (299).
- **5.** Five components were used to rank universities including academic reputation, employer reputation research citations per paper, H-index, and international research network. The h-index is a way of measuring both the productivity and impact of the published work of a scientist or scholar.

World's Top 10 Billionaires list released by Hurun research platform

Why in news: According to the recently released Hurun Global Rich List, Mukesh Ambani, the Chairman of Reliance Industries and the richest man in Asia, is the only Indian to be ranked among the top 10 billionaires.



- 1. The report, which was compiled by research platform Hurun in collaboration with real estate group M3M, is titled 'The 2023 M3M Hurun Global Rich List'.
- **2.** The Hurun Global Rich List 2023 ranked 3,112 billionaires, down from 3,384 last year, from 2,356 companies and 69 countries. The number of billionaires dropped by 8% and their total wealth dropped by 10% compared with last year.









- **3.** In terms of number of billionaires, India ranks third in the 2023 M3M Hurun Global Rich List. In terms of number of billionaires, China is almost 5 times bigger than India.
- **4.** The first position in the ranking is held by Elon Musk with a wealth of \$205 billion followed by Jeff Bezos at \$188 billion.
- **5.** Despite experiencing a 20 percent decline in his wealth, Ambani still managed to secure the ninth position globally, with a net worth of \$82 billion.

Egypt joins BRICS bank as new member

Why in news: Egypt, officially became a member of BRICS' New Development Bank (NDB) which includes India, Brazil, Russia, China, and South Africa as member countries. Cairo completed all the necessary procedures to become an eligible member on February 20, 2023.



- 1. The New Development Bank was set up by BRICS nations on the basis of the intergovernmental agreement signed at the sixth BRICS summit in Fortaleza in July 2014.
- 2. Earlier in September, the NDB board also approved similar procedures for United Arab Emirates (UAE), Uruguay, and Bangladesh. All three countries went on to become members of the bank.
- **3.** The vision of the bank is to evolve into a leading provider of solutions for infrastructure and sustainable development for emerging market economies and developing countries.
- **4.** The bank previously received an "AA+" international credit rating from Fitch Ratings and S&P Global Ratings, allowing it to effectively attract long-term funding on international and local capital markets.
- **5.** Since its establishment, the bank has approved numerous projects. More than 90 of them totalled \$32 billion and covered critical areas such as transportation, urban construction, water, clean energy, and digital and social infrastructure.

- **3.** A bio-economy is an economic system that uses renewable biological resources, such as crops, forests, and fisheries, to produce food, energy, and materials.
- 4. A sustainable and circular bio-economy is one that ensures the long-term sustainability of these resources by minimizing waste and maximizing their value through efficient use and reuse. It involves transitioning away from fossil fuels and non-renewable resources and towards a more sustainable and regenerative economic model.

More than quarter of world's population has no safe drinking water: UNESCO

Why in news: More than a quarter, 26 per cent of the world's population, comprising approximately 2 billion people, do not have safe drinking water and 3.6 billion or 46 per cent lack access to safely managed sanitation, according to the report, published by UNESCO on behalf of UN-Water released at the UN 2023 Water Conference in New York.



- 1. The global urban population facing water scarcity is projected to double from 930 million in 2016 to 1.7-2.4 billion people in 2050.
- 2. The growing incidence of extreme and prolonged droughts is also stressing ecosystems, with dire consequences for both plant and animal species, the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) report said.
- **3.** As per the report, between two and three billion people experience water shortages for at least one month per year, posing severe risks to livelihoods, notably through food security and access to electricity.
- 4. The United Nations World Water Development Report is published by UNESCO on behalf of UN-Water and its production is coordinated by the UNESCO World Water Assessment Programme. The report gives insight into the main trends concerning the state, use and management of freshwater and sanitation, based on work by Members and Partners of UN-Water. (ANI)

North Korea tests new nuclear-capable underwater drone

Why in news: The drone, dubbed "Haeil" or Tsunami, is designed to create massive radioactive waves through submarine explosions. North Korean state news agency KCNA claims that the drone can be deployed at any coast and port or towed by a surface ship for operation. The country's leader, Kim Jong-un, was reportedly "greatly satisfied" after the drone was successfully tested.



1. The drone can be deployed from the coast or towed by surface ships and is built to "stealthily infiltrate into operational waters and make a super-scale radioactive tsunami through an underwater explosion" that would destroy naval strike groups and ports.









- 2. The nuclear tsunami drone was launched earlier this week off the coast of Riwon County in South Hamgyong Province.
- **3.** It reportedly cruised underwater for 59 hours at a depth of 80 to 150 metres before detonating at the target location. North Korea also launched four strategic cruise missiles affixed with mock nuclear warheads.
- **4.** It is not confirmed whether North Korea has developed miniature versions of nuclear warheads that can be fitted on smaller weapons like drones. Additionally, there is no indication that the drones are deployment-ready.
- **5.** Despite these uncertainties, experts have warned against downplaying the rising nuclear threat emanating from Pyongyang.

Why in news: "Earth Hour" encourages people to switch off all lights for an hour, from 8:30 pm to 9:30 pm local time to promote awareness of climate change challenges and energy conservation.



- 1. It is a global grassroots movement uniting people to take action on environmental issues and protect the planet. It is organized by World Wildlife Fund (WWF).
- 2. It was started by WWF and partners as a symbolic lights-out event in Sydney in 2007.
- **3.** It takes place on the last Saturday of March every year.
- **4.** This symbolic act, known as the 'lights off' moment, unites people worldwide in a show of support for the planet and serves as a reminder of the environmental issues facing us.
- **5.** WWF It is an international non-governmental organization (NGO) founded in 1961 in Morges, Switzerland, to protect endangered species of wildlife and preserve natural habitats.

Marburg Virus Disease

Why in news: Tanzania has announced its first outbreak of the deadly Marburg virus disease (MVD). This was after five people died and three others were infected with the virus in Tanzania's north-west Kagera region.



- 1. Marburg, like Ebola, is a filovirus; and both diseases are clinically similar. After the onset of symptoms, which can begin anytime between two to 21 days, MVD can manifest itself in the form of high fever, muscle aches and severe headache.
- **2.** Rousettus fruit bats are considered the natural hosts for the Marburg virus. However, as per WHO, African green monkeys imported from Uganda were the source of the first human infection.
- **3.** The disease has an average fatality rate of around 50%. However, it can be as low as 24% or as high as 88% depending on virus strain and case management. It is a zoonotic virus that is initially transmitted from animals to humans.
- 4. Marburg spreads through direct contact (through broken skin or mucous membranes) with infected people's blood, secretions, organs, or other body fluids.
- **5.** There is no approved antiviral treatment or vaccine for MVD as of now. It can be managed with supportive care.

- **1.** G20-CSAR is a government-to-government level initiative conceptualised under the India's G20-Presidency.
- 2. The motivation of this initiative is to bring together the Chief Science Advisers and their equivalents of G20 member countries, as well as the invited countries, to deliberate upon and develop collaborative frameworks for some of the common pressing global science and technology (S&T) policy issues. This initiative will also help in establishing an effective and coherent global science advice mechanism.









- **3.** Chief Scientific Advisers of various countries, including America and Japan, will participate in this meeting. Foreign delegations from more than 100 countries are expected to participate in the three-day event.
- **4.** Underlining the post-pandemic focus during India's G20 Presidency, the discussions at G20 CSAR Meeting will emphasize on the following themes:
 - Opportunities in One Health for better disease control and pandemic preparedness
 - Synergizing global efforts to expand the access to scholarly scientific knowledge
 - Diversity, equity, inclusion, and accessibility in Science and Technology (S&T)
 - An institutional mechanism for inclusive, continuous, and action-oriented Global S&T Policy Dialogue

India to host SCO-National Security Advisors meeting today; Pakistan, China likely to join virtually

Why in news: The Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) is an intergovernmental organization established in 2001 and it comprises eight member states, namely, India, China, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Pakistan, Russia, Tajikistan and Uzbekistan.



- 1. India, as the current chair of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO), is set to host a meeting of National Security Advisors (NSA) and top officials in New Delhi.
- **2.** In 2022, India assumed the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation Chairship for 2023.
- **3.** India became a full member of SCO on June 9 in 2017. There are four Observer States viz Afghanistan, Belarus, Iran and Mongolia and six dialogue partners Armenia, Azerbaijan, Cambodia, Nepal, Sri Lanka and Turkey.
- **4.** The Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) is a major regional powerhouse that was established over two decades ago with the aim of promoting economic, political, and military cooperation among its member nations. The eight-member countries of SCO represent around 42 per cent of the world's total population and 25 per cent of the global GDP.









5. While the SCO summit is set to take place in Goa this summer, India is holding a host of events leading up to it. Notably, the next important SCO meeting will be the defence ministers' meeting scheduled to be held in Delhi from April 27-29.

Scientists Created a New Recyclable Plastic Not Made From Crude Oil

Why in news: In their paper, Allison Christy and Scott Phillips describe making a new type of plastic based on poly(ethyl cyanoacrylate) or PECA, which is prepared from the monomer used to make Super Glue.



- 1. Like all plastic polymers, the new product is formed through a process of polymerization where single, repeating monomer units are strung together in a chemical reaction to make one long chain.
- 2. The new recyclable plastic is based on Poly(ethyl cyanoacrylate) or PECA, which is prepared from the monomer used to make Super Glue.
- 3. It has comparable properties to existing plastics and is stable in hot, humid environments. The long polymer chains of the PECA plastic can be thermally 'cracked' at temperatures of 210 °C and the resulting monomers distilled into a clean product to use again.
- **4.** Ethyl cyanoacrylate is a highly reactive monomer that has been used nearly exclusively to make Super Glue and related fast-setting adhesives. It is produced on the ton scale from methanol, chloroacetic acid, and sodium cyanide, which themselves are sourced from hydrogen, nitrogen, methane, carbon monoxide, chlorine, and sodium hydroxide.
- **5.** Polymerization It is a process in which relatively small molecules called monomers combine chemically to produce a very large chainlike or network molecule, called a polymer.

Grievance Appellate Committee (GAC) portal

Why in news: MeitY launched the Grievance Appellate Committee (GAC) portal under the IT Rules, 2021.

- 1. GAC was one of the provisions in the recently amended Information Technology (Intermediary Guidelines and Digital Media Ethics Code) Rules, 2021.
- **2.** GAC will look into user complaints regarding unsatisfactory grievance redressal by social media intermediaries.




- **3.** Three such bodies have been constituted; Each GAC will comprise three government-appointed, full-time members, including a chairperson.
- **4.** Any user aggrieved by a decision of a platform's Grievance Officer can appeal to the GAC within 30 days of the receipt of communication from the Grievance Officer.
- 5. The Committee has to dispose of the appeals within 15 days of receiving them.
- **6.** GAC's decisions will be binding on the intermediary
- 7. GAC portal will be a virtual Digital platform that will operate only online and digitally wherein the entire appeal process, from the filing of the appeal to the decision thereof, shall be conducted digitally.

Adenovirus

Why in news: West Bengal is in the grip of an unprecedented adenovirus outbreak.

1. Adenoviruses are medium-sized, non-enveloped (without an outer lipid bilayer) viruses with an icosahedral nucleocapsid containing a double-stranded DNA genome.



- 2. It is highly contagious, especially in close-contact settings, such as childcare centres, schools, hospitals, and summer camps.
- **3.** It can spread via respiratory droplets making it an air borne disease; it can also spread via the faecal route.
- **4.** Symptoms: common cold or flu-like symptoms, fever, sore throat , acute bronchitis, pneumonia, conjunctivitis, gastroenteritis.
- **5.** There is no specific treatment for an adenovirus infection only supportive care is available.

1. The 11-foot-tall 'robotic elephant', weighing 800 kg and made of an iron frame and rubber coating, was donated to Irinjadappilly Sree Krishna Temple in Thrissur district by People for Ethical Treatment of Animals (PETA) India.

Centre unveils 'VAIBHAV Fellowship' for NRI researchers





- 5. It will help in improving the research ecosystem of India's Higher Educational Institutions by facilitating academic and research collaborations between Indian Institutions and the best institutions in the world via mobility of faculty/researchers from overseas institutions to India.

Govt plans 10 'Clean Plant Centres' to boost fruit crop production

Why in news: In order to increase domestic production, the Center plans to establish 10 "Clean Plant Centers" as the demand for fruits like apple, avocado and blueberry has increased over time.



- 1. These centers will be set up under the 'Atmanirbhar Clean Plant Program', which was announced by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman in the Union Budget 2023-24.
- 2. The Program will be launched with an outlay of 2,200 crores (in the next 7 years till 2030) to boost availability of disease-free, quality planting material for high value horticultural crops.
- 3. Program aims -
 - Enhance the yield of horticulture crops,
 - Disseminate and adopt climate resilient varieties,
 - Protect the ecosystem through proactive virus and disease control measures.









- **4.** The programme will handled by the National Horticulture Board (NHB) which in turn will set up Clean Plant Centers across the country and ensure the global competitiveness of the Indian horticulture sector.
- **5.** The 10 centres will be established for fruit crops like apple, walnut, almond, grapes, mango, pomegranate, etc., and will be fully funded by the Centre.
- **6.** The centres will be implemented in a PPP mode in partnership with research organisations, agriculture universities and private sector partners.
- **7.** The Clean Plant Centres will provide services of disease diagnostic, therapeutics, multiplying of plants and generation of mother plants.

India's academic freedom declined strongly since 2013: Report

Why in news: India among populous countries like China, the United States that fared poorly in the latest academic freedom index.











- 1. The Academic Freedom Index report provides an overview of academic freedom in 179 countries by assessing five indicators.
- **2.** It is based on assessments by more than 2,197 country experts from around the world.
- **3.** The indicators include freedom to research and teach; freedom of academic exchange and dissemination; institutional autonomy of universities; campus integrity; and the freedom of academic and cultural expression.
- **4.** On a scale of 0 (low) to 1 (high), India scored 0.38, lower than Pakistan's 0.43 and the United States' 0.79.
- **5.** A lack of a legal framework to protect academic freedom has enabled attacks on academic freedom under the ruling government,
- **6.** India scored low in campus integrity, which measures the extent to which campuses are free from politically motivated surveillance or security infringements. The country also fared poorly in institutional autonomy and academic and cultural expression related to political issues.

Why in news: The exercise, on March 7 and 8, will have the largest contingent fielded by the Thiruvananthapuram-based Indian Army unit.




- **1.** The maiden joint military exercise, FRINJEX-23, between the Indian Army and French Army will be conducted at the Pangode military station here on March 7 and 8.

Why in news: The regulator IRDAI (Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority of India) had permitted general insurers to issue surety insurance bonds in April 2022.



- 1. Nitin Gadkari had launched the country's first surety bond insurance for infrastructure projects by the private sector player Bajaj Allianz.
- **2.** A surety bond is a legally binding contract entered into by three parties—the principal, the obligee, and the surety.









- **3.** The obligee, usually a government entity, requires the principal, typically a business owner or contractor, to obtain a surety bond as a guarantee against future work performance.
- **4.** Surety bonds are mainly aimed at infrastructure development, mainly to reduce indirect cost for suppliers and work-contractors thereby diversifying their options and acting as a substitute for bank guarantee.
- **5.** Surety bond is provided by the insurance company on behalf of the contractor to the entity which is awarding the project. Surety bonds protect the beneficiary against acts or events that impair the underlying obligations of the principal. They guarantee the performance of a variety of obligations, from construction or service contracts to licensing and commercial undertakings.

India to launch global alliance for big cats, invest \$100 million

Why in news: India has proposed launching a mega global coalition under its leadership to protect the big cats and has pledged support of \$100 million (over Rs 800 crore) in guaranteed funding over five years.



- 1. The government has proposed to set up International Big
 Cat Alliance (IBCA). It will focus on the conservation and
 conservation of the seven big cats: tiger, lion, leopard, snow leopard, puma,
 jaquar and chive.
- 2. Membership in the alliance is open to 97 "range" countries that have natural habitats for these big cats and other countries of interest, international organizations, etc.
- **3.** The alliance's mission is to provide a platform for disseminating information on "standardized practices, capacity building, resource pooling, research and development, awareness generation" on big cat conservation.
- 4. The IBCA's governance structure will comprise -
 - General Assembly consisting of all member countries,
 - A council of at least seven but not more than 15 member countries elected by the General Assembly for a term of 5 years, and
 - A Secretariat.

- 2. The report titled Defiance in the Face of Autocratization has further asserted that "advances in global levels of democracy made over the last 35 years have been wiped out."
- **3.** The report indicates that today there are more closed autocracies than liberal democracies and only 13% of the world's humans (approximately one billion people) live in liberal democracies.









- **4.** The report classifies countries into four regime types based on their score in the Liberal Democratic Index (LDI).
- **5.** The LDI captures both liberal (individual and minority rights) and electoral aspects (free and fair elections) of a democracy based on 71 indicators that make up the Liberal Component Index (LCI) and the Electoral Democracy Index (EDI).
 - Liberal Democracy,
 - Electoral Democracy,
 - Electoral Autocracy, and
 - Closed Autocracy.

- **4.** Through the campaign, the users of digital payments will be encouraged to teach non-users about the ease, safety and convenience of digital payments to fulfil the mission of every citizen a digital payments user.
- **5.** Among various other things, RBI regional offices will conduct "Jan Bhagidari" or mass scale people involvement programmes to enhance awareness on a large scale about the mission and the theme of the campaign and to encourage adoption of digital payments in the process.
- **6.** Further, payment system operators will adopt 75 villages across the country to convert them into digital payment enabled villages.

- **4.** The Swachhotsav aims to increase women's participation in garbage collection and waste management. Today 49% of the waste pickers are women. However, they make 33% less money than the men in the field.
- **5.** The urban solid municipal waste is to increase to 165 million tonnes by 2030. This means we will require more workforce in solid waste management. With the women taking lead here, India will tackle the issues around garbage effortlessly.


- **3.** Urban Local Bodies (ULBs) will evaluate entries & nominate up to 5 applicants to the State via the Swachhatam portal.

- **5.** State can organize public felicitation of nominees as State winners. State nominations will be evaluated at the national level on their innovativeness, impact, uniqueness, sustainability & replicability.

- Besides the ex-officio members, the council has non-official members, representing various stakeholders such as founders of successful startups, veterans who have grown and scaled companies in India
- Programs such as MAARG, National Mentorship Program, Incubator Capacity Development Program, Adoption of NavIC Grand Challenge, Startup Champions 2.0 etc are some of the programs ideated and incubated by NSAC.

Committee to oversee transfer and import of captive wild animals in India: Supreme Court

Why in news: The high-powered committee, led by a former judge, is tasked with the procurement or welfare of wild animals by any rescue or rehabilitation centre or zoo.

- 1. The Supreme Court has increased the jurisdiction and powers of a high-powered committee led by its former judge, Justice Deepak Verma, to conduct necessary checks and undertake fact-finding exercises concerning the import, transfer, procurement, rescue and rehabilitation of wild animals, including those in captivity, across India.
- 2. The ambit of the committee was earlier restricted to Tripura and Gujarat.
- 3. Other Members of the Committee:
 - Director General of Forest
 - Head of Project Elephant Division (MoEF)
 - Member Secretary (Central Zoo Authority of India)
 - Chief Wild Life Warden(s) of the State(s) to which the issue relates will be coopted as Members.

4. Powers and Functions:

- All State and Central authorities shall report the seizure of wild animals or abandonment of captive wild animals to the Committee.
- The Committee shall be at liberty to recommend the transfer of ownership of captive animals or of seized wild animals to any willing rescue center or zoo for their immediate welfare, care, and rehabilitation.
- The Committee is free to conduct necessary checks and to undertake factfinding exercises in any pending or future complaint.

High Price Day Ahead Market (HP-DAM) and Surplus Power Portal (PUShP)

Why in news: The Central Government has launched a High Price Day Ahead Market and Surplus Power Portal (PUShP) - an initiative to ensure greater availability of power during the peak demand season. The portal will allow DISCOMs to indicate their surplus power, which can be requisitioned by those in need.



- 1. The Power Ministry has launched PUDhP portal that aggregates excess generation capacity on a national basis, offering Discoms a better view of the electricity supply and demand scenario.
- 2. PUShP will ensure better utilization of power capacity at a reasonable rate and prevent power producers from charging exorbitant prices.
- **3.** Ministry also launched the High Price Day Ahead Market (HP-DAM) segment on power exchanges, which will offer costly electricity produced by gas-based and imported coal-based (ICB) power plants in the country.
- 4. Indian Energy Exchange (IEX) launched trading in the HP-DAM segment. This will provide a new avenue to the high-variable-cost generators who may not have been able to participate in DAM due to the existing price ceiling of ₹12 per kilowatt-hour (kWh).
- 5. These generators will now be able to sell electricity on IEX with a price range of ₹0 per unit to ₹50.

CBI's 'Operation Trishul' nets 33 fugitives in one year

Why in news: Under its 'Operation Trishul,' the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) has extradited 33 fugitives involved in various criminal activities in the past one year.

- **1.** CBI uses Interpol's Star Global Focal Point Network and analysis of financial crime files to not only trace suspects but also the proceeds of financial crimes.
- **2.** Also, recently, India has called upon G20 countries to adopt multilateral action for faster extradition of 'fugitive economic offenders'.



Who are 'fugitive economic offenders' (FEO)?

3. FEO is defined as an individual against whom a warrant of arrest in relation to a scheduled offence has been issued by any court in India and the value of the offence is at least Rs. 100 crore.









4. Fugitive economic offenders act, 2018 aims to seize the property of economic offenders who have fled the nation to avoid being prosecuted or who refuse to come back to face charges.

Svaya Robotics develops 1st indigenous quadruped robot and exoskeleton in India

Why in news: The robots can carry 25 kg in payload and walk along with the soldier, and added that these robots can be used in nuclear plants and other industries as well.

- 1. As part of the Atmanirbhar Bharat initiative, Hyderabadbased Svaya Robotics has developed India's first indigenous quadruped (fourlegged) robot and exoskeleton for the defence sector.
- 2. The indigenous robots and wearable exoskeletons were developed in collaboration with the DRDO Labs, Research and Development Establishment (R&DE), Pune, and the Defence Bioengineering and Electromedical Laboratory (DEBEL), Bengaluru, as technology demonstrators with their design inputs.
- 3. Quadruped robots are four-legged robots which can walk or run in uneven and rough terrains. For example, in Leh, where soldiers have to navigate through unfavourable conditions, these robots can be used instead. These are also useful in recognising terrorist activities and other unsafe locations and capturing the visuals which can be monitored from any part of the country.
- **4.** Exoskeleton robot is developed to suit Indian soldiers' anthropometry and augment soldier strength for walking long distances.
- **5.** These active exoskeletons, when worn by soldiers, can carry heavy loads without expending much effort.
- **6.** India currently imports these robots from the US and Switzerland to help strengthen the country's defence capabilities.

Atal Innovation Mission launches ATL Sarthi

Why in news: Atal Innovation Mission is establishing Atal Tinkering Laboratories (ATLs) in schools across India to foster curiosity, creativity, and imagination in young minds; and inculcate skills such as design thinking mindset, computational thinking, adaptive learning, physical computing etc.









- 1. Atal Innovation Mission (AIM) NITI Aayog launched ATL Sarthi, a comprehensive self-monitoring framework to strengthen the ever-growing ecosystem of Atal Tinkering Labs (ATL).
- 2. The initiative has four pillars ensuring the performance enhancement of ATLs through regular process improvements like a self-reporting dashboard known as 'MyATL Dashboard' and Compliance SOPs for schools to ensure financial and non-financial compliances, on-ground enablement of ATLs in collaboration with relevant local authorities through Cluster-based Approach and providing ownership to schools to analyze their performance through Performance-Enablement (PE) Matrix.
- **3.** The ATL Cluster aims at providing a self-sustainable model for enablement and monitoring wherein the ATLs and local authorities work in tandem with each other on-ground to form clusters of 20-30 ATLs in a particular region.

Bar council allows foreign lawyers, legal firms to practice in India

Why in news: The Bar Council of India (BCI) allowed foreign lawyers and law firms to practice in India on a reciprocity basis.



- **1.** In this regard, the BCI had notified the Rules for Registration and Regulation of Foreign Lawyers and Foreign Law Firms in India, 2022.
- 2. According to the rules, a foreign lawyer or law firm is not entitled to practice law in India without registering with the BCI. Foreign lawyers will only be allowed to advise on international laws and will not be permitted to appear before any Indian courts and tribunals.
- **3.** Reciprocal laws are statutes of one state that give rights and privileges to the citizens of another state if it extends similar privileges to the citizens of the former.
- **4.** The BCI is a statutory body established under the Advocates Act, 1961, and it regulates legal practice and legal education in India.
 - It also conducts the All India Bar Examination to grant 'Certificate of Practice' to advocates practicing law in India.









• BCI regulates legal professional standards in India including directing the state bar councils, standardizing law education, and course framework at the universities and law colleges in India.

India Venture Capital Report 2023: Important Findings

Why in news: For the second year in a row, India outpaced China in terms of new unicorns created. This is a significant achievement for India, as it demonstrates its growing reputation as a hub for entrepreneurship and innovation.



- 1. Bain & Company's annual India Venture Capital Report 2023 reveals that venture capital investments in India saw a decrease in deal value of 33% from \$38.5 billion to \$25.7 billion in 2022.
- 2. The report highlights macroeconomic uncertainty and recessionary fears as the primary drivers of the decrease in deal value.
- 3. Late-stage large deals were affected the most by the decrease in deal value. This could be attributed to the cautious approach adopted by investors in light of the economic uncertainty. As a result, investors focused on preserving their capital and were more selective with their investments.
- **4.** While early-stage deals continued to see momentum in India. This resulted in a slight expansion in deal volume.
- **5.** The report suggests that SaaS and Fintech continued to see momentum in funding in 2022. This is not surprising as these sectors have been growing rapidly in recent years and are expected to continue their growth trajectory in the future.
- **6.** The report also highlights the emergence of new sectors in India. Sectors such as EV, Agritech, generative AI, space tech, and climate tech gained momentum in 2022. These sectors are expected to play a significant role in India's future growth story.

- **3.** Domestic banks use it to provide international banking services to their clients who have global banking needs.
- **4.** The SRVA is an additional arrangement to the existing system that uses Freely convertible currencies and works as a complimentary system.
- **5.** The existing systems require maintaining balances and position in such currencies like US dollar and pound to facilitate trade.

- **5.** At the Sikkim Sabha, the taskforce members (comprising of delegates from the G20 nations) of the Startup20 Engagement Group will be discussing and deliberating on the first draft of the official policy communiqué. The event will also host a variety of side events, Startup20X events, startups showcase at MG Marg, and delegates visit to the Rumtek Monastery.

- **4.** Reliance acquired Strand Life Sciences in 2021, which developed the genome sequencing kit that is priced at `12,000.
- **5.** PGM will help an individual identify and assess the genes that are implicated in a disease that she currently suffers from as well as diseases that she is predisposed to because of her genes.
- **6.** This can play a big role in healthcare choices, especially relating to precision medicine, which is basically tailoring treatment of a condition in view of how your genetic make-up influences the efficacy of treatment options—for instance, reaction to a specific drug. It will also allow those intending to have children to make informed plans about their child's health.

Indian Army awards contract for procurement of indigenously developed Integrated Mobile Camouflage System for Mechanised Forces

Why in news: The Indian Army recently placed its first order for Integrated Mobile Camouflage Systems (IMCS) for Mechanised Forces with an Indian start-up Hyper Stealth Technologies Private Limited.



- 1. This is the first-ever procurement order of an Innovations for Defence Excellence (iDEX) project by the Indian Army.
- 2. Integrated Mobile Camouflage Systems (IMCS): comprises low emissivity and/or CAM-IIR coatings and mobile camouflage system materials that enable armoured fighting vehicles (AFVs) to blend in with their terrain background.









- **3.** It achieves a reduction in the detection range of AFVs when viewed through a Hand Held Thermal Imager (HHTI)/Battle Field Surveillance Radar (BFSR) tankbased thermal camera under given environmental and weather conditions.
- **4.** It achieves signature management by controlling the Visual, Thermal, infrared, and Radar Signatures of the object. It will provide significant capability enhancement in stealth for AFVs.
- 5. The iDEX initiative was launched by the Government in April 2018.
- **6.** It Aims to achieve self-reliance and foster innovation and technology development in Defence and Aerospace by engaging Industries including MSMEs, start-ups, individual innovators, R&D institutes, and academia.

- **3.** Jhamarkotra's fossils are phosphate-rich because the trapped sediments were mainly phosphate minerals.
- **4.** Zawar is an interesting geo-heritage site that lies some 40 km south of Udaipur. It is the world's oldest known zinc-smelting site.
- **5.** The discovery here of earthen retorts brinjal-shaped, long-necked vessels is particularly significant. Their presence here suggests Zawar had a unique zinc-smelting legacy.
- **6.** Geological Survey of India (GSI) declares geo-heritage sites/ national geological monuments for protection and maintenance.

"Pathways to Atmanirbhar Bharat" Report

Why in news: The study said a rapid expansion of clean energy infrastructure will be needed. "Because of transport, industrial electrification and green hydrogen production, electricity demand could increase nearly five-fold - from 1,300 TWh/year to over 6,600 TWh/year by 2050. This would



require a massive scale-up of renewable energy deployment to 40 GW a year through 2030, ramping up to about 100 GW a year between 2030 and 2050."

- 1. The study titled "Pathways to Atmanirbhar Bharat" was released recently by Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory and The India Energy and Climate Center (IECC). According to this report, India has an opportunity to achieve energy independence by 2047 through investments in clean energy technologies.
- 2. The report highlighted Prime Minister Narendra Modi's Atmanirbhar Bharat push, which includes a target to install 500 GW of renewable energy capacity by 2030 and grow EV sales in India to capture a significant portion of the market. Additionally, the government aims to produce 5 million tonnes of green hydrogen by 2030.
- **3.** The report highlights that clean energy will reduce and inflation-proof India's energy expenditure as renewables, EV batteries, and hydrogen infrastructure are capital assets with rapidly falling costs. A shift to electric transportation will create USD 2.5 trillion in net consumer savings by 2047.
- **4.** The report suggests that the policy ecosystem needs five pillars: deployment mandates for commercial/cost-effective clean technologies that provide economies of scale, financial support for emerging technologies, long-term infrastructure planning, accelerating/scaling domestic manufacturing, and planning for a just transition.

States to get rewards for organic farming

Why in news: The Union government intends to launch a scheme — named PM PRANAM — to reduce the use of chemical fertilizers by incentivising states.



- 1. The scheme-PM programme for restoration, awareness, nourishment and melioration of mother earth (PM Pranam). As part of the scheme, if the
 - promotion of organic farming by a state leads to a decline in the use of chemical fertilizers, then half the subsidy saved on that account will be transferred to the state.
- 2. The scheme will have no separate budget and will be financed through the "savings of existing fertiliser subsidy" under schemes run by the Department of Fertilizers.
- **3.** 50% of subsidy savings will be passed on as a grant to the state that saves the money.
- **4.** 70% of the grant provided under the scheme can be used for asset creation related to the technological adoption of alternate fertilisers and alternate fertiliser production units at the village, block and district levels.
- **5.** The remaining 30% of grant money can be used for rewarding and encouraging farmers, panchayats, farmer producer organisations and self-help groups that are involved in the reduction of fertiliser use and awareness generation.
- **6.** For this purpose, data available on a Fertilizer Ministry dashboard, IFMS (Integrated Fertilizers Management System) will be used.

5. Under this Scheme, funds are provided directly to the District Project Societies headed by the District Magistrate/Collector/Deputy Commissioner who in turn allocates the funds to NGOs/Voluntary Agencies, etc. for running Special Training Centres.

- 3. The goal is to reduce preventable maternal and newborn mortality, morbidity and stillbirths associated with the care around delivery in the Labour room and Maternity OT and ensure respectful maternity care.
- 4. Nodal Ministry: Ministry of Health and Family Welfare
- **5.** At the time of LaQshya certification, compliance with the above-mentioned requirement is verified by the independent empanelled NQAS assessors.

Why in news: The Lok Sabha passed Finance Bill, 2023 with 64 amendments, including one that seeks to set up the much-awaited GST Appellate Tribunal (GSTAT), which will deal with tax disputes, and also lessen the burden on the higher judiciary, which has repeatedly sought the institution of such a body.



- 1. GSTAT will have a "Principal Bench" in New Delhi, with the President, a judicial member, a technical member (centre) and a technical member (state). It will also have state benches.
- 2. The principal bench and state boards would have two technical and two judicial members each, with equal representation from the Centre and states.









- **3.** All four members would not sit for hearing each case. It depends on the threshold or value of dues involved.
- **4.** North-eastern states could opt for one bench for 2-3 states and an additional bench for very far-flung areas.
- **5.** The body aims to resolve the rising number of disputes under GST regime. It will also unclog the pendency of number of cases related to GST in High Courts and other judicial courts.
- **6.** GSTAT is a statutory body under the Central Godds and Service Tax Act, 2017 (SOURCE LIVEMINT)

Sebi proposes regulatory framework for index providers

Why in news: The proposed regulation shall be applicable to index providers (both domestic and foreign) if the users of the index/products based on index are located in India.



- 1. The proposed regulation requires the index providers to be legal entities with a minimum net worth of ₹25 crore. It bars an individual or a group of persons from registering as an index provider. It also requires a minimum vintage of five years in index administration.
- 2. Index providers are those institutions that formulate and manage indices.
- **3.** One of the important roles of the index provider is to classify and define markets, as their indices represent a market or a proportion of a market and provide a benchmark of performance for that market or sector.
- **4.** S&P Dow Jones, MSCI, and Bloomberg are some of the globally renowned institutions that provide indices.
- **5.** In India, this activity is generally carried out by subsidiaries of stock exchanges. The most prominent indices in India are the Nifty50 by NSE Indices and Sensex provided by a venture of S&P Dow Jones Indices and BSE Lied.
- **6.** SEBI's proposed regulations adhere to the principles of the International Organization of Securities Commissions (IOSCO), the global standard setter for the securities sector.

Gaj Utsav 2023 - Celebrating 30 Years of Project Elephant

Why in news: The Gaj Utsav 2023 will be inaugurated by President Droupadi Murmu on April 9 at Kaziranga National Park in Assam. This event is significant as Kaziranga is a UNESCO World Heritage site and home to the highest density of tigers in the world.



- 1. This two-day event aims to promote elephant conservation, protect their habitat and corridors, and prevent human-elephant conflicts. It will also ensure the welfare of captive elephants in India.
- 2. In order to conserve elephants, their habitat, and migration routes, reduce conflicts between humans and elephants, and assure the health of captive elephants in India, the government of India created Project Elephant in 1991–1992.
- 3. The Wild Life Preservation Act of 1972 lists elephants as a Schedule I national heritage animal. More than 60% of the world's wild elephant population is in India. They are primarily found in the southern and north-eastern areas of India as well as the east-central and northern regions.
- **4.** In addition to the Gaj Utsav, India is also celebrating the 50th anniversary of Project Tiger in Mysuru, Karnataka. Starting on April 7, this event aims to showcase India's tiger conservation success globally, release the latest tiger census data, and present the government's vision for tiger conservation.
- **5.** Project Tiger, launched in 1973, promotes tiger conservation in India. Approximately 2.4 per cent of India's geographical area is covered by tiger reserves, which serve as repositories for biodiversity conservation, ensure regional water security and carbon sequestration, and contribute to accomplishing India's climate change mitigation targets.

1. This new product will act as an import substitution for use by Industries, Research Laboratories and Academic Institutions as a calibration standard in evaluating









analytical methods, performance of Instruments, and data quality control in routine analysis of bauxite.

- 2. This is the first of its kind CRM in India and 5 th in the World. A CRM is a sample of a material that has been analyzed and certified for its composition, purity, and other important characteristics. It is used as a standard to compare other samples of the same material, ensuring that the results obtained from different laboratories are comparable.
- **3.** BARC, short for Bhabha Atomic Research Centre, is India's premier nuclear research facility. It was founded by Homi Jehangir Bhabha in January 1954 and is headquartered in Trombay, Mumbai, Maharashtra, India.
- **4.** Bauxite is an important ore that is used for making aluminium. It is not a specific mineral but a rock consisting mainly of hydrated aluminium oxides.

India's first cloned desi Gir female calf, Ganga produced at NDRI

Why in news: Recently, the National Dairy Research Institute (NDRI), Karnal has produced cloned female calves of the desi breed Gir.

1. Amid the government push for increasing milk production, the National Dairy Research Institute (NDRI), Karnal has produced the country's first cloned female calf of the desi breed Gir which can produce more than 15 litres of milk per day.



- 2. Under a project by National Dairy Research Institute, Karnal to work on cloning of indigenous cow breeds such as Gir and Sahiwal, India's first cloned Gir female calf named 'Ganga' weighing 32 kg was born and is growing well,
- **3.** Indigenous cattle breeds such as Gir, Sahiwal, Tharparkar, and Red-Sindhi, play a pivotal role in milk production and the growth of the Indian dairy industry.
- **4.** To clone the Gir, oocytes are isolated from live animals using ultrasound-guided needles, and then, matured for 24 hours under control conditions.
- **5.** The somatic cells of elite cows are used as donor genomes, which are fused with OPU-derived enucleated oocytes. Following chemical activation and in-vitro culture, the developed blastocysts are transferred into recipient mothers to deliver the Gir calf.

Why in news: CSE analyses winter pollution data from Delhi, Kolkata-Howrah, Mumbai, Hyderabad, Bengaluru and Chennai; only the national capital has shown improvement.



- 1. All megacities in India, irrespective of their locations in different geo-climatic zones, faced the challenge of worsening PM2.5 levels during the winter season of 2022-23, according to a new analysis by the Delhi-based non-profit Centre for Science and Environment (CSE).
- **2.** The winter period is a special challenge in all cities as adverse meteorological conditions trap pollution and increase concentration and exposure. The impact is worse if the overall pollution in the city is high and worsening.

ABOUT PM2.5

- **3.** The term fine particles, or particulate matter 2.5 (PM5), refers to tiny particles or droplets in the air that are two and half microns or less in width.
- **4.** Particles in the PM5size range are able to travel deeply into the respiratory tract, reaching the lungs.
- **5.** Exposure to fine particles can cause short-term health effects such as eye, nose, throat and lung irritation, coughing, sneezing, runny nose and shortness of breath.
- **6.** Long term exposure to fine particulate matter may be associated with increased rates of chronic bronchitis, reduced lung function and increased mortality from lung cancer and heart disease.

Bobbili Veena likely to be presented to G-20 delegates

Why in news: Bobbili Veena, popularly known as Saraswati Veena, a large plucked string instrument is used in Carnatic music.

- 1. The State government has ordered at least 200 replicas of Bobbili Veena to Sarwasiddi family, which is famous for making the musical instrument, through Andhra Pradesh Handicrafts Development Corporation (APHDC) to present as a token of honour to the delegates.
- 2. The making of the veena began in the 17th century during the reign of Pedda Rayudu, the king of Bobbili Samsthanam who was a great patron of music. It has earned a GI tag in 2012 for its unique design and high-quality craftsmanship.
- **3.** Bobbili Veena is carved from a single piece of jackwood by Sarwasiddi community artisans of Gollapalli under Bobbili Samsthanam.
- **4.** Sarwasiddi hereditary artisans from Gollapalli have been continuing the tradition of making these veenas over the past three centuries. The artisans of Gollapalli have made the veenas by using elephant tusks, stag horns and strings to get 'Sapta Swaras' during Bobbili Raja's regime.
- **5.** They toiled at least 30 days for making of the veena. Later, they replaced the elephant tusks and stag horns with plastic material imported from Mumbai.

1. The 1,507-metre-long platform has been built at a cost of about ₹20 crore.











- **4.** Methanol can be blended with gasoline or used as a standalone fuel in vehicles with modified engines. It has a high octane rating, which means it can improve engine performance and reduce harmful emissions.

- **4.** The Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) is an autonomous body responsible for co-ordinating agricultural education and research in India. The Union Minister of Agriculture serves as its president.









National Institute of Ocean Technology to set up green, self-powered desalination plant in Lakshadweep

Why in news: The NIOT is providing potable water in six islands of Lakshadweep using Low Temperature Thermal Desalination technology. The desalination plant is the first of its kind in the world as it generates drinking water from sea water using indigenous technology using green energy and environmentally friendly processes.



- 1. LTTD exploits the difference in temperature (nearly 15°C) in ocean water at the surface and at depths of about 600 feet. This cold water condenses water at the surface, that is warmer but whose pressure has been lowered using vacuum pumps. Such de-pressurised water can evaporate even at ambient temperatures and this resulting vapour when condensed is free of salts and contaminants and fit to consume.
- 2. In 2005, National Institute of Ocean Technology (NIOT), set up a 100,000 litre-aday plant in Kavaratti, Lakshadweep islands and this has been providing water to about 10,000 residents.
- **3.** Currently the desalination plants, each of which provides at least 100,000 litres of potable water every day, are powered by diesel generator sets.
- **4.** But for the first time in the world, probably, we are setting up a [desalination] plant that will also supply power to the plant.
- **5.** The NIOT was established in 19<mark>93 as an</mark> autonomous society under the Ministry of Earth Sciences.
 - Objective To develop reliable indigenous technologies to solve various engineering problems associated with harvesting of non-living and living resources in the Indian Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ) which is about twothirds of the land area of India.

Barda Wildlife Sanctuary

Why in news: The Gujarat government has proposed a second home for Asiatic lions in Gujarat at Barda Wildlife Sanctuary, about 100km away from their present home at Gir National Park.











- 1. A report on "Lion@2047: A vision for Amrutkal", prepared by the Wildlife Institute of India (WII) for the Gujarat government, has identified Barda as a potential site where a population of 40 adult and sub-adult lions can be accommodated in the larger landscape of Barda-Alech hills and coastal forests.
- 2. The Gujarat government has proposed a second home for Asiatic lions in Gujarat at Barda Wildlife Sanctuary, about 100km away from their present home at Gir National Park, finally pushing ahead with a long-delayed plan to move some lions from their only and very crowded home in the country, a move that would also protect the population from diseases.

- **3.** Barda Wildlife Sanctuary area falls into two districts, Porbandar and Jamnagar in the state of Gujarat.
- 4. IUCN STATUS Endangered.
- **5.** The Project is being implemented in the Gir landscape in Gujaratwhich is the last home of the Asiatic lion.

- **3.** The park is near the endangered bison park at Trishna wildlife sanctuary and Indo-Bangla Maitri Park to commemorate the Bangladesh liberation war.

- **4.** C20 India is an official engagement group of the G20, comprising Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, China, France, Germany, India, Indonesia, Italy, Japan, the Republic of Korea, Mexico, Russia, Saudi Arabia, South Africa, Turkey, the UK, the US, and the European Union.
- **5.** The conference provides an opportunity for civil society organizations from G20 and other countries to highlight their aspirations and concerns to world leaders, promoting global collaboration towards a better world.

'Jharniyojan' portal

Why in news: The Jharkhand government has launched a portal called 'Jharniyojan' to ensure 75% local quota in pvt sector.

- **3.** It applies to all establishments which are in the private sector and where 10 or more people are employed.









4. Central or state government undertakings will not be included in the Act, but the provisions of the Act.

Rajasthan becomes first State to pass Right to Health Bill

Why in news: Right to Health Bill have the provision for mandatory free-of-cost emergency treatment for every resident of the State at both the government hospitals and the privately-run institutions. With this, Rajasthan has become the first and the only State in the country to legislate the right to health.



- 1. The Bill gives every resident of the State the right to emergency treatment care "without prepayment of requisite fee or charges" by any public health institution, health care establishment and designated health care centres.
- 2. As per the Bill, free healthcare services including diagnostics, drugs, emergency transport, emergency care and procedure will be provided at the public institutions and select private facilities subject to conditions which will be formulated now. All citizens of the state will be entitled to emergency and accidental emergency care free of cost.
- 3. In case of medico-legal nature, no private or public hospital can delay treatment on grounds of police clearance.
- **4.** The legislation also stated that after emergency care, transfer of patient and stabilisation, the healthcare provider would be entitled to a requisite free and charges or proper reimbursement from the government if the patient does not pay requisite charges.
- **5.** As per the state government, the Bill intends to, "provide protection and fulfilment of rights and equity in health and well-being under Article 47 (Duty of the state to raise the level of nutrition and the standard of living and to improve public health) of Constitution of India and to secure the Right to Health as per the expanded definition of Article 21 (Protection of life and personal liberty)".

Why in news: The Maharashtra government has given approval for a 75-feet tall 'Statue of Knowledge' dedicated to Dr B. R. Ambedkar in Latur city.

- **1.** The statue has been erected in Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Park and the ceremony will be held a day before his 131st birth anniversary.

- **3.** Using fiber as the primary material, a team of 35 artists has been tirelessly working to construct the statue of Dr. Ambedkar.
- **4.** The lead artist, Akshay Halke, has announced that this is the first statue in the world of Dr. Ambedkar to be created in just 20 days, and it is also the first of its kind in the state.
- **5.** On April 13, a 70-feet tall statue of Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar will be unveiled in Latur city, Maharashtra.
- 6. The unveiling ceremony will take place in the presence of Union ministers Kiren Rijiju and Ramdas Athawale, along with other dignitaries such as former Maharashtra chief minister Devendra Fadnavis and state minister Sanjay Bansode.

Asia's Largest 4-metre International Liquid Mirror Telescope at Devasthal

Why in news: Union Minister of State for Science & Technology and Earth Sciences (Independent Charge), Personnel, Public Grievances, Pensions, Atomic Energy and Space Dr. Jitendra Singh inaugurated Asia's largest 4-metre International Liquid Mirror telescope.



- 1. Aryabhatta Research Institute of Observational Sciences (AREES) announced that the world-class 4-metre International Liquid Mirror Telescope (IMLT) is now ready to explore distant and deep celestial space. It received its first light in the second week of May 2022.
- 2. This telescope is located at an altitude of 2450 metres in the observatory complex at Deosthal in Nainital district of Uttarakhand (India) at AREES, an autonomous institute under the Department of Science and Technology (DST), Government of India.
- **3.** The telescope was designed and built by Advanced Mechanical and Optical Systems (AMOS) Corporation and the Center Spatial de Liège in Belgium.










- **4.** ILMT is the first liquid mirror telescope specially designed for astronomical observation and is the largest aperture telescope currently available in the country as well as the first optical survey telescope in India.
- **5.** The ILMT is designed to survey the strip of sky it passes over every night, helping to detect transient or variable celestial objects such as supernovae, gravitational lenses, space debris and asteroids.

- **5.** The hills have 2 historical monuments (hill shrines) which are major pilgrimage sites of Odisha.
- **6.** Nrusinghanath temple is located on the northern slope.
- 7. Harishankar temple on the southern side.

Baghel launches "Mukhyamantri Vriksh Sampada Yojana"

Why in news: Under the scheme, the state government will provide 100 per cent subsidy for tree plantation on up to 5 acres of land, and 50 per cent financial subsidy for tree plantation on more than 5 acres of land.

1. Chhattisgarh Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel launched











the state government's ambitious scheme 'Mukhyamantri Vriksh Sampada Yojana', a mega scheme aimed at encouraging commercial plantation.

- **2.** Farmers, willing landowners, government, semi-government, autonomous institutions, private educational institutions, private trusts, panchayats, and land contract holders can reap the benefits of the scheme. The state government has set a target to plant 15 crore trees on 36 thousand acres of land in 5 years.
- **3.** The government will decide the minimum purchase price for the sale of earmarked species of trees.
- **4.** The trees of all species planted in five years are likely to earn Rs 10,000 crore after they get matured. Farmers can earn between Rs 15,000 to Rs 50,000 per acre of land per annum. Moreover, the farmers will also earn extra income through carbon credit, a government communiqué informed.
- **5.** Under the scheme, a total of 30 thousand acres of land of 19653 beneficiaries has been registered for tree-plantation. Interested landowners of all the categories will be eligible under this scheme.

'Call Before u Dig' application

Why in news: It has been built to facilitate coordination between excavation agencies and underground utility owners to prevent damage to utilities due to digging.



- 1. It aims to prevent damage to underlying assets like optical fibre cables that occurs because of uncoordinated digging and excavation, leading to losses of about Rs 3,000 crore every year.
- 2. The CBuD app will connect excavators and asset owners through SMS/Email notifications and click-to-call so that there are planned excavations in the country while ensuring the safety of underground assets.
- **3.** It aims to give excavating companies a point of contact, where they can inquire about existing subsurface utilities before starting excavation work. Utility owners can also find out about impending work at the location.
- **4.** It will save potential business loss and minimise discomfort to the citizens due to reduced disruption in essential services like road, telecom, water, gas and electricity.

- **4.** A small population has also been witnessed in Overa-Aru Wildlife Sanctuary in south Kashmir.

Aravalli Green Wall Project

Why in news: Government launched Aravalli Green Wall Project, a major initiative to green the 5 km buffer area around the Aravalli Hill Range in four states at a function organised to celebrate the International Day of Forests at Tikli Village in Haryana.



- 1. The Aravalli Green Wall Project will not only increase the green cover and biodiversity of the Aravalli through afforestation, reforestation and restoration of water bodies, but also improve the soil fertility, water availability and climate resilience of the region.
- 2. The project will benefit the local communities by providing them with employment opportunities, income generation and ecosystem services.
- **3.** The project covers states of Haryana, Rajasthan, Gujarat and Delhi where the Aravalli hills landscape span over 6 million hectares of land. The project will involve planting native species of trees and shrubs on scrubland, wasteland and degraded forest land, along with rejuvenating and restoring surface water bodies such as ponds, lakes and streams.
- **4.** The Aravalli Green Wall Project has the following objectives:









- Improving the ecological health of the Aravalli range
- To prevent eastward expansion of Thar Desert and to reduce land degradation by creating green barriers that will prevent soil erosion, desertification and dust storms
- This green wall will help in carbon sequestration and mitigating climate change to enhance the biodiversity and ecosystem services of the Aravalli range by planting native tree species in the Aravalli region, providing habitat for wildlife, improving water quality and quantity.
- Promote sustainable development and livelihood opportunities by involving local communities in afforestation, agro-forestry and water conservation activities that will generate income, employment, food security and social benefits.
- The project will be executed by various stakeholders such as central and state governments, forest departments, research institutes, civil society organisations, private sector entities and local communities. Adequate funding, technical skills, policy coordination and public awareness will be called upon to ensure the success of the project.
- Contribute to India's commitments under various international conventions such as UNCCD (United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification), CBD (Convention on Biological Diversity) and UNFCCC (United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change).
- Enhancing India's image as a global leader in environmental protection and green development.

World's highest railway bridge over the Chenab River in Jammu and Kashmir

Why in news: The 111 km stretch from Katra to Banihal is essential, and the 1.3 km long Chenab Bridge is a crucial part of this stretch. Once completed, the entire USBRL Railway project will provide all-weather connectivity and join Jammu and Kashmir to the rest of India.

- 1. The Indian Railways is constructing the world's highest railway bridge in the challenging terrain of the Himalayas, which is expected to be completed in the coming months.
- **2.** The Chenab Bridge, an engineering marvel, is a part of the strategically important Udhampur-Srinagar-Baramullah (USBRL) railway link that will connect Jammu & Kashmir to the rest of India.









- **3.** The Chenab Bridge is 35 meters taller than the Eiffel Tower in Paris, making it the world's highest rail bridge. The 1.3 km long bridge has a design speed of 100 kmph for trains and a lifespan of 120 years.
- **4.** The USBRL project is expected to be completed by December 2023 or January 2024. The Vande Bharat Express train will run over the Chenab bridge, and a maintenance facility for Vande Bharat trains will be established in Badgam.
- **5.** The new Vande Metro, developed for short-distance inter-city travel, will also run between Jammu and Srinagar.

Polavaram Irrigation Project

- **3.** The project envisages the generation of 960 MW of hydropower, drinking water supply to a population of 28.50 lacks in 611 villages
- 4. The ultimate irrigation potential of the project is 4.368 lakh ha.
- **5.** The project has been accorded National project status by the Union Government of India.

This was as the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES) was signed in 1973 on this day.
- **3.** CITES is an international agreement between governments. Its aim is to ensure that international trade in specimens of wild animals and plants does not threaten the survival of the species.
- **4.** Currently, there are 184 parties to the convention, including India. The CITES Secretariat is administered by UNEP (The United Nations Environment Programme) and is located in Geneva, Switzerland. The Conference of the Parties to CITES is the supreme consensus-based decision-making body of the Convention and comprises all its parties.









No Smoking Day 2023 observed on March 8

Why in news: No Smoking Day 2023: Every year on the second Wednesday of March, No Smoking Day is observed. It falls on March 8 this year.

1. This year's theme is: "Stopping smoking improves your brain health". The day is celebrated to help those who wish to quit smoking as well as to raise awareness about the implications of smoking on an individual's health.






International Day of Mathematics or Pi Day



TB spreads through the air when an infected person coughs, sneezes, or talks, and another person inhales the bacteria.









5. Symptoms of TB include persistent coughing, chest pain, fatigue, weight loss, fever, and night sweats. However, not everyone with TB experiences symptoms, and some people may not develop symptoms until the disease is advanced.

- **5.** In countries in the Northern Hemisphere, clocks are usually set ahead one hour in late March or in April and are set back one hour in late September or in October.





Anti-submarine craft INS Androth launched

Why in news: These ships, used to conduct anti-submarine operations and mine laying operations, can attain a maximum speed of 25 knots.



2. Indian Navy launched another Anti-Submarine Warfare Shallow Water Craft (ASWSWC) — the second in a series of eight indigenous ships built by Garden Reach Shipbuilders and Engineers.









- **3.** INS Androth is about 77.6 metres long and 10.5 metres wide, and requires a draught of only 2.7 metres.
- **4.** Primary Role: To conduct anti-submarine operations in coastal waters, low-intensity maritime operations, and mine-laying operations. It is also capable of full-scale sub-surface surveillance of coastal waters and various surface platforms and coordinated ASW operations with aircraft.
- **5.** It carries lightweight torpedoes, ASW rockets and mines, a close-in weapon system (with a 30 mm gun), and 16.7 mm stabilized remote-controlled guns.
- **6.** It will be fitted with hull-mounted sonar and a low-frequency variable depth sonar.

- **4.** The focus personnel exhibited on op-readiness, enhancing interoperability and improving the ability to conduct joint operations will go a long way in bolstering the combined efforts of the IN and RN to strengthen maritime security and uphold a rules-based order in the region.

British Challenger 2 main battle tank recently arrived in Ukraine.

Why in news: The armour of the Challenger-2 is called the Chobham armour or the Dorchester armour and is considered among the best in the world. It has a range of 547 kilometres with a maximum speed of 59 kilometres per hour.



- 1. It is the British Army's main battle tank (MBT). It is a third-generation MBT, the same generation as the Russian T-80 and T-90 tanks.
- 2. It is heavily armoured and highly mobile, designed for use in direct fire zones.
- **3.** Whilst its primary role is to destroy or neutralise armour, Challenger 2 can operate across a spectrum of high-intensity conflict, counter-insurgency and peacekeeping roles.
- 4. Countries using: It is in service with the United Kingdom (386) and Oman (38).
- **5.** It is armed with a rifled Royal Ordnance L30 120-mm main gun, which can deliver main armament rounds up to a range of around four kilometres.

Hunger Funding Gap Report 2023

Why in news: The report By Action Against Hunger found that countries experiencing the worst hunger crises received less hunger funding (by the percentage of appeals filled) than countries with lower rates of hunger.

1. Only 47% of hunger funding needs through the UN humanitarian system are met, leaving a hunger funding gap of 53%, according to the Action Against Hunger 2023 Hunger Funding Gap Report



- 2. In 2022, only 3% of hunger program needs were fully funded and the majority (65%) of appeals were not even fulfilled to the halfway point. In 2021, 7% of hunger programs were fully funded and 57% of were not funded halfway.
- **3.** Countries with Worst Hunger Crisis: Afghanistan, Haiti, Central African Republic, Madagascar, Honduras, Ethiopia, Pakistan, Somalia, Kenya, Mozambique, Guatemala etc.
- **4.** It requires 4 billion USD to stop the hunger crisis in the world. This is approximately equal to the cost of the 2030 Winter Olympics. Wealthy countries should contribute more to reducing hunger levels in the world.

IEA's CO2 Emissions Report 2023

Why in news: According to the CO₂ Emissions in 2022 Report by the International Energy Agency released on March 2, 2023, global energy-related CO₂ emissions increased by less than 1% in 2022.

- 1. The report highlights that this rise in emissions was significantly lower than the exceptional increase of over six per cent in 2021. It recommended stronger steps to accelerate the clean energy transition to achieve energy and climate goals.
- 2. The Carbon emissions from the fuel coal increased by 1.6%. The emissions from oil increased by 2.5%. The aviation sector was the major polluter in this fuel category.
- **3.** In the energy sector, the major emissions came from electricity generators, particularly coal-based electricity generators. Solar energy and wind energy power plants increased throughout the world.









4. According to the report, emissions in China decreased in 2022 due to the COVID lockdown. In the European Union, emissions decreased by 2.5%. This was because, with Russia invading Ukraine, many countries stopped importing gas and oil from Russia and moved towards clean energy. In the US, emissions increased by 0.8%.


