1. BHARAT campaign

Why in News:

• Under the BHARAT (Banks Heralding Accelerated Rural & Agriculture Transformation) Campaign, Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare has launched a new campaign for banks under Agriculture Infrastructure Fund.

Key Points:

- The campaign involves Rs 7200 crore and it is a month long initiative to get support from members of commercial banks in the public, private sector and other small banks in promoting the Scheme of Agriculture Infrastructure Fund.
- Agriculture Infrastructure Fund. Was launched by Indian government in 2020 to provide a medium-long term debt financing facility for investment in viable projects for post-harvest management infrastructure.
- The scheme will run for a period of 10 years from FY2020 –FY2030.
- The loans provided under it will have an interest subvention of 3 per cent per annum up to a limit of Rs 2 crores.
- Under Credit Guarantee Fund Trust for Micro and Small Enterprises (CGTMSE) scheme, eligible borrowers can avail credit guarantee for a loan up to Rs. 2 crores.

Why in News:

• The parent company of Google, the Alphabet will roll out Bard Chatbot in Europe and Brazil.

Key Points:

- The BARD chatbot is an Artificial Intelligent tool which responds to questions in a human-like way.
- The user can communicate with the chatbots in 40 different languages, including nine Indian languages. The users can also change the tone and style of Bard's responses according to their needs and requirements.



- The Generative AI is a type of artificial intelligence that creates a wide range of data like images, videos, audio, text and 3D models.
- The GENAI learns from existing datasets and uses this knowledge to generate new and unique outputs. Thus producing highly realistic and complex content in very simple manner.

3. Atal Vayo Abhyuday Yojana (AVYAY)

Why in News:

• The Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment has launched Atal Vayo Abhyuday Yojana (AVYAY) to empower senior citizens in India and ensure their social inclusion.









Key Points:

- It is a central sector scheme which was earlier known as the National Action Plan for Senior Citizens.
- The scheme aims to cater to the financial and social needs of elderly people in India to create a inclusive society.
- There are two components of the scheme -
 - Integrated Program for Senior Citizens – to provide for basic amenities and entertainment opportunities.



Atal Vayo Abhyuday Yojana 2023

- State Action Plan for Senior
 Citizens where each state formulates its own action plan for the welfare of senior citizens
- The scheme has 5 schemes subsumed under it -
 - Poshan Abhiyan for the elderly
 - Awareness generation and capacity building for the welfare of senior citizens
 - Scheme on promoting the silver economy
 - Livelihood and skilling initiatives for senior citizens
 - Channelizing CSR funds for elderly care
- Rashtriya Vayoshri Yojana (RVY), which provides assisted living devices to senior citizens suffering from age-related disabilities is also included under this scheme.

Why in News:

Key Points:


6. Dudhwa Tiger Reserve

Key Points:

- The A-WEB was founded in October, 2013 in Seoul, Republic of Korea on the shared vision among its members of achieving sustainable democracy around the world through the strengthening of the processes of election management in member countries.
- India has been closely associated with A-WEB since its inception and has actively participated in capacity-building programs and knowledge-sharing initiatives.
- The India A-WEB Centre has been established in New Delhi to document and research best practices and provide training and capacity building for A-WEB members.
- The A-WEB organizes capacity building programmes for its member EMBs and undertakes Election Visitor and Observation Programmes in various countries to study election management practices and share knowledge with other member EMBs.
